Caribbean Statistics Day in Anguilla will be celebrated on 15th October 2012. Activities to commemorate this even began however on 21 September 2012 with a poetry writing competition - topic: The Statistician. Activities followed this competition such as word creation competition where students between grades three (3) and six (6) were required to use to create as many three letter words as possible from the keyword "Statistician". A radio programme was done on Wednesday 26th September 2012 to promote the upcoming activities for Statistics day / week.

A number of activities continue into the week of Stats Day. These are as follows:

Friday 12th October 2012 - an exhibition will be held at the Anguilla Public Library.

Sunday 14th October 2012 - Pre-recorded prayers will be by a minister from the Methodist Church, one from the Anglican Church, one from the Evangelical Church as well as Seven Day Adventist Pastor.

Monday 15th October 2012 – There will be an official announcement "Today is Statistics Day". A public address will be made by The Honourable Allister Harrison – Governor of Anguilla and will be aired both in the morning and the evening on the radio for the general public. A public address to declare the commencement of Statistics Week will be done by The Hon. Hubert Hughes – Chief Minister of Anguilla. A statement will also be made by CARICOM's Secretary General - Ambassador La Rocque. A Press Release will also be done by the Chief Statistician of Anguilla Statistics Office – Mrs. Lori Rae Alleyne – Franklin. The week will continue with various forms of activities to illustrate the usefulness of statistics.
