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## PREFACE

This publication on **CARICOM's Trade in Selected Agricultural Commodities 2000-2003**, is the second publication of its kind, the first being published in 1998. The publication seeks to provide information to users on Trade in Agricultural Commodities by the Major Headings of the United Nations Standard International Trade Classification (SITC) as well as information on selected commodity details. Unlike the 1998 publication that provided information for a standard set of selected agricultural commodities across Member States, the current publication focuses on the top five agricultural commodities by Member States for the latest year, 2003. The significance of this approach is that the utilization of a standard set of commodities that are considered to be important at the CARICOM level may mask those commodities that are of importance in the individual Member States. The publication is a useful source of information for historical analysis of the agricultural sector of the CARICOM Region.

The publication is divided into four Sections. Section 1 provides information on CARICOM's Imports of Agricultural Commodities by the Major Headings of the SITC and on the value and the percentage distribution of the top five Agricultural Imports from all sources for each Member State. Section 2 provides information on the top five Agricultural Imports from all sources for each Member State by Country of Origin. Section 3 provides information on CARICOM's Domestic Exports of Agricultural Commodities by Major Headings of the SITC and on the value and the percentage distribution of the top five Agricultural Domestic Exports to all destinations for each Member State. Section 4 follows with similar information to Section 2 but on Agricultural Domestic Exports by Country of Destination.

The data presented in this report were extracted from the Merchandise Trade Statistics submitted to the CARICOM Secretariat by the National Statistical Offices of Member States. It should be noted that data were not always available for all Member States for specific years of the period 2000 to 2003. The incomplete nature of the trade data therefore poses some limitations to the analysis and interpretation of the information presented as well as to the lack of timeliness in the production of this regional report. Further details or clarifications on this report are available from the Statistics Sub-Programme of the CARICOM Secretariat. The Secretariat welcomes comments on the data presented in this report as well as any suggestions for the improvement of future publications of this kind.

The CARICOM Secretariat expresses its sincere thanks to the National Statistical Offices in Member States for supplying the data used to compile this report.

The Secretariat also thanks the staff of its Statistics Sub-Programme for compiling and preparing this report.

## GENERAL NOTES

1. The CARICOM totals for each year exclude the countries for which data are not available which would affect the comparability of the data over the period 2000-2003.
2. For imports, data for Antigua and Barbuda is not available for the years 2001 to 2003. For Domestic Exports data are not available for Antigua and Barbuda for the years 2001 to 2003 and for Suriname for the entire period under review.
3. Over the period under review, Member State's *agricultural domestic exports* accounted for almost all of their *agricultural exports*, re-exports being minimal, except for Antigua and Barbuda and Montserrat. For the year, 2000 Antigua and Barbuda's *agricultural domestic exports* accounted for 58.8 *per cent* of its *agricultural exports* while for Montserrat, *agricultural domestic exports* accounted for 76.2 *per cent*, 10.9 *per cent* and 59.2 *per cent* of its *agricultural exports* in 2000, 2001 and 2002 respectively. This report focuses on the Member States *agricultural domestic exports* instead of their total *agricultural exports*.
4. The top five commodities are based on the year, 2003.
5. Because of its all inclusiveness, the commodity, "*other food preparations not elsewhere specified or included*" generally constitutes the top category. The analysis focuses mainly on highlighting the contribution of commodities other than this all inclusive category. This approach applies to the analysis in all sections of this report.
6. In this report, the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) excludes data for the Bahamas and refers only to countries of the Caribbean Common Market (now transformed to CARICOM Single Market and Economy (CSME)). The Bahamas is not part of the Caribbean Common Market.
7. The term MDC, as stated in Article 4 of the Revised Treaty of Chaguaramas Establishing the Caribbean Community including the CARICOM Single Market and Economy, refers to More Developed Countries namely Barbados, Guyana, Jamaica, Suriname and Trinidad and Tobago. The other Member States were designated as Less Developed Countries (LDC) according to the Revised Treaty.

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

### IMPORTS

#### Overview of Total Agricultural Imports

Over the period, 2000-2003, CARICOM's total agricultural imports moved from *EC\$4.4 Bn (US\$1.6 Bn)* in 2000 to *EC\$4.7 Bn (US\$1.7 Bn)* in 2003 contributing on average to *15.3 per cent* of total imports from all sources over the period. *Food and live animals* was the highest contributor to total agricultural imports with *EC\$3.5 Bn (US\$1.3 Bn)* in 2000 and *EC\$3.7 Bn (US\$1.4 Bn)* in 2003, accounting on average for *12.1 per cent* of total imports from all sources over the period. *Food* accounted for almost all of the imports of this section and on average represented approximately *79.0 per cent* of CARICOM's total agricultural imports over the period.

#### Top five Agricultural Imports

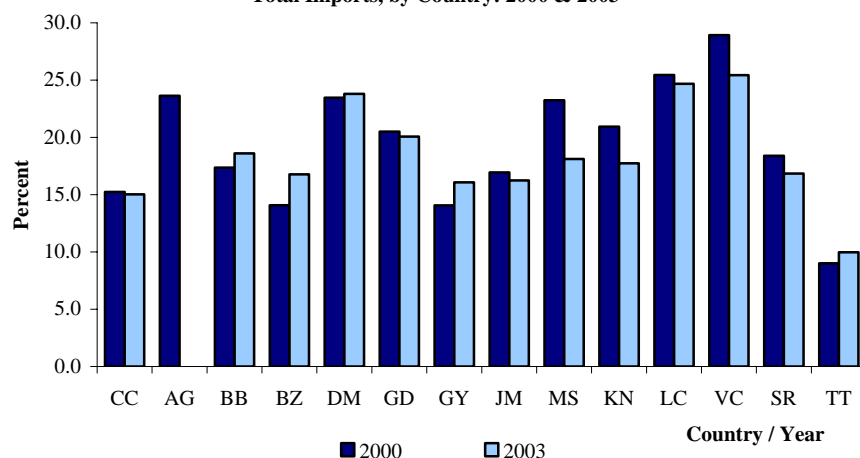
In 2003, the Region's top five agricultural commodities imported were *other food preparations not elsewhere specified (EC\$179.5 Mn)*; *other cane and beet sugar and chemically pure sucrose etc (EC\$141.4 Mn)*; *other cheese (EC\$ 100.2 Mn)*; *durum wheat (EC\$89.8 Mn)* and *other wheat (including spelt) and meslin, unmilled (EC\$85.7 Mn)*.

#### Percentage Contribution of Total Agricultural Imports to Total Imports of Respective Member States

CARICOM's agricultural import as a percent of its total imports decreased from *15.2 per cent* in 2000 to *15.0 per cent* in 2003. The contribution of the MDCs increased from *13.9 per cent* in 2000 to *14.1 per cent* in 2003 while the contribution of the LDCs declined over the period from *21.5 per cent* in 2000 to *21.0 per cent* in 2003.

Figure I shows that for both years 2000 and 2003, the percentage contribution of St. Vincent and the Grenadines' agricultural imports to its total imports was the highest as compared to the other Member States (*28.9 per cent* in 2000 and *25.4 per cent* in 2003). Saint Lucia followed with percentage contribution of *25.4 per cent* and *24.7 per cent* respectively in both years.

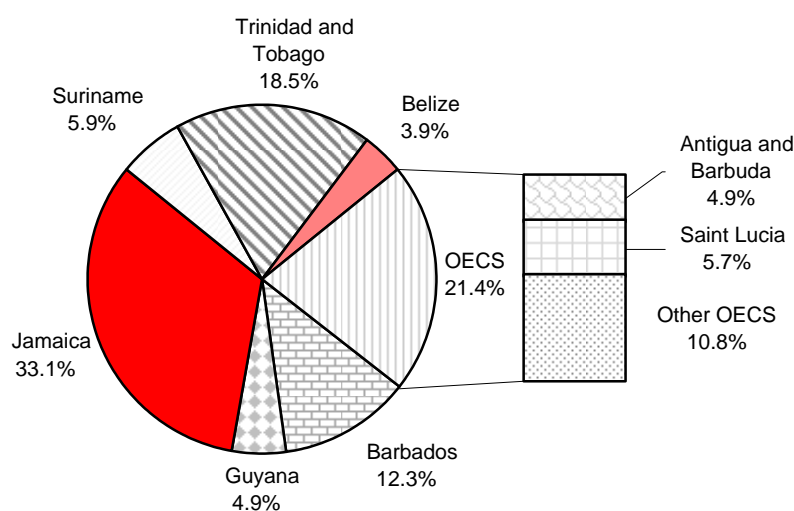
Figure I: CARICOM's Agricultural Imports as a Percent of its Total Imports, by Country: 2000 & 2003



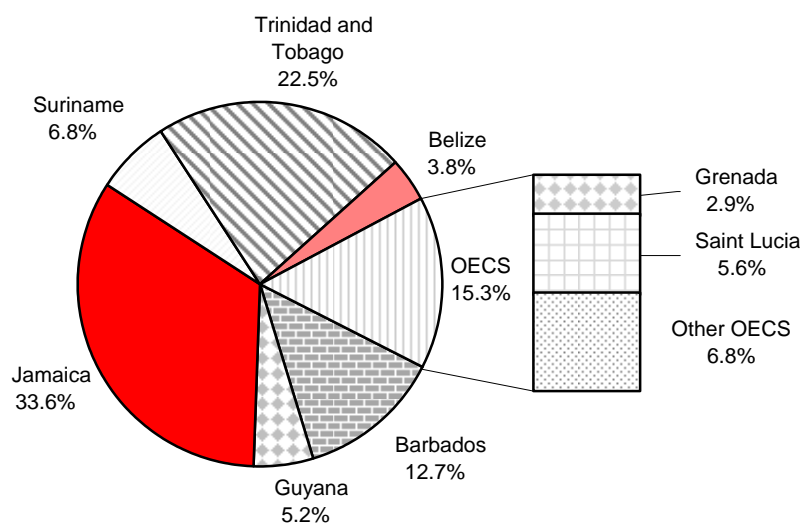
## Percentage Distribution of CARICOM's Total Agricultural Imports by Member States

*Jamaica* and *Trinidad and Tobago* with contributions of 33.1 per cent and 18.5 per cent respectively were the top contributors to CARICOM's Total Agricultural Imports in 2000. *OECS* as a group accounted for 21.4 per cent, of which *Antigua and Barbuda* and *Saint Lucia* represented 4.9 per cent and 5.7 per cent respectively of CARICOM's Total Agricultural Imports. In 2003, the trend continued with *Jamaica* and *Trinidad and Tobago* accounting for contributions of 33.6 per cent and 22.5 per cent respectively of CARICOM's Total Agricultural Imports. *OECS* as a group accounted for 15.3 per cent, of which *Saint Lucia* and *Grenada* represented 5.6 per cent and 2.9 per cent respectively.

**Figure III: Percentage Distribution of CARICOM's Agricultural Imports: 2003**

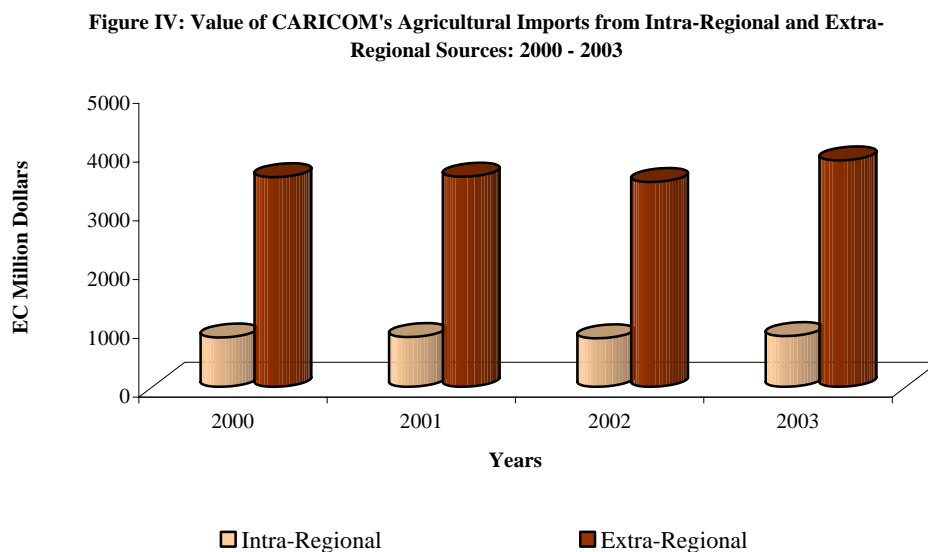


## Percentage Contribution of CARICOM's Intra-Regional and Extra-Regional Markets to its Total Agricultural Imports, of Respective Member States

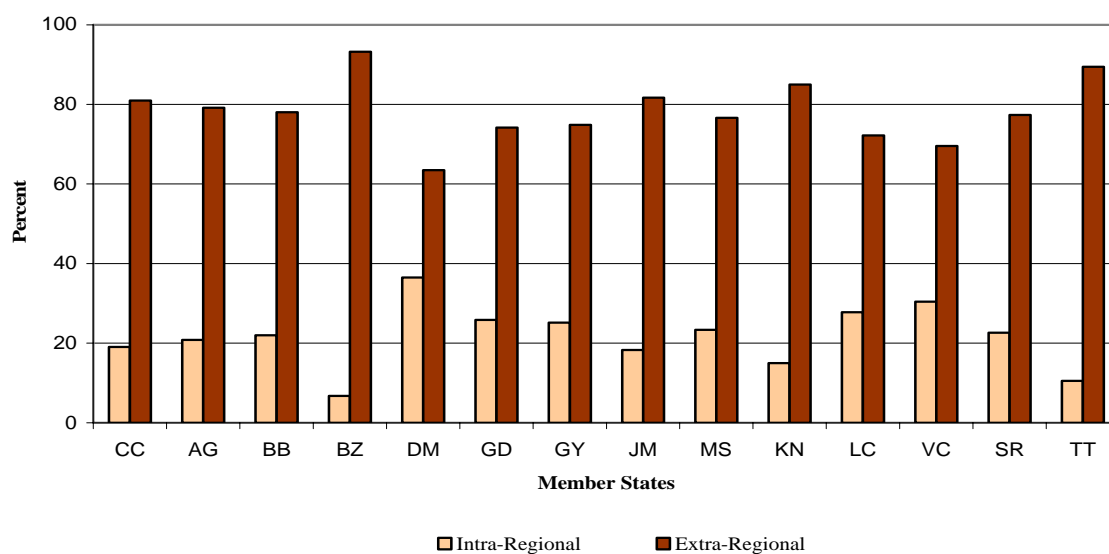
In 2003, the extra-regional market accounted for *81.7 per cent* of CARICOM's total agricultural imports which represents a marginal increase over the contribution recorded in 2000, *81.0 per cent*. The percentage contribution of the intra-regional market declined to *18.3 per cent* in 2003 from *19.0 per cent* in 2000.

The contribution of the extra-regional market to *Belize's* total agricultural imports increased from *93.2 per cent* in 2000 to *94.9 per cent* in 2003 while for *Trinidad and Tobago*, the contribution of the extra-regional market to its total agricultural imports dropped slightly from *89.4 per cent* in 2000 to *89.0 per cent* in 2003.

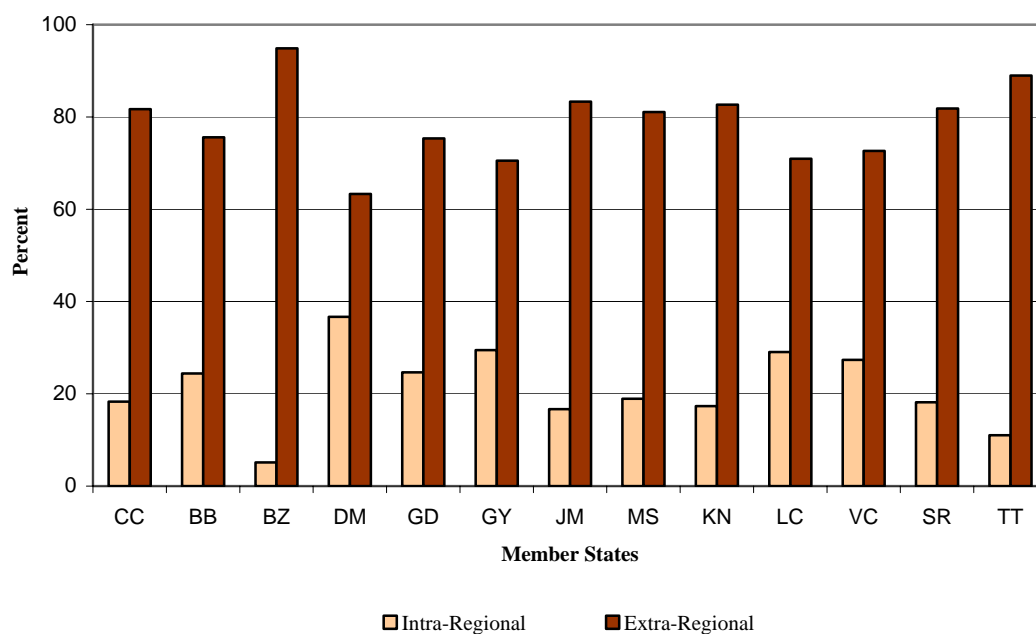
In 2000, the contribution of the intra-regional market to *Dominica's* total agricultural imports increased from *36.5 per cent* to *36.7 per cent* in 2003 while contribution of this market to *St. Vincent and the Grenadines'* total agricultural imports declined from *30.5 per cent* in 2000 to *27.4 per cent* in 2003.

## DOMESTIC EXPORTS

### Overview of Total Agricultural Domestic Exports

Over the period, 2000-2003, CARICOM's total agricultural domestic exports to all destinations experienced a marginal decline moving from EC\$3.0 Bn (US\$1.1 Bn) in 2000 to EC\$2.9 Bn (US\$1.1 Bn) in 2003, contributing an average of 17.3 per cent of total domestic exports to all destinations over the period. *Food and live animals* was the highest contributor to total agricultural domestic exports with EC\$2.5 Bn (US\$0.9 Bn) in 2000 and EC\$2.3 Bn (US\$0.9 Bn) in 2003, accounting on average for 14.1 per cent of CARICOM's total domestic exports to all destinations over the period. *Food* accounted for almost all of the domestic exports of this section and on average comprised approximately 80.0 per cent of CARICOM's total agricultural domestic exports to all destinations.

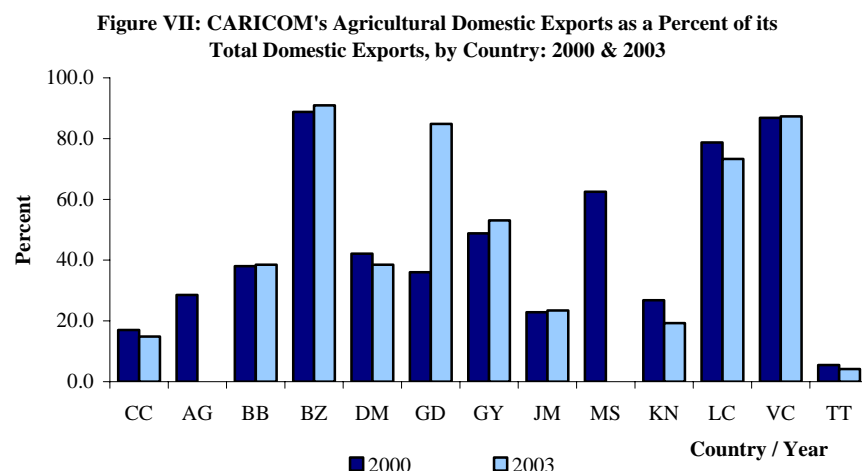
### Top Five Agricultural Domestic Exports

In 2003, the Region's top five agricultural commodities exported were *cane sugar* (EC\$732.5 Mn); *shrimps and prawns, frozen* (EC\$223.7 Mn); *bananas, fresh* (EC\$194.4 Mn); *other rum and tafia* (EC\$133.9 Mn) and *concentrated orange juice* (EC\$91.6 Mn)

### Percentage Contribution of Total Agricultural Domestic Exports to Total Domestic Exports of Respective Member States

CARICOM's agricultural domestic exports as a percent of its total domestic exports decreased over the period from 17.0 per cent in 2000 to 14.8 per cent in 2003. The contribution of the MDCs declined from 13.5 per cent in 2000 to 11.7 per cent in 2003 while the contribution of the LDCs increased from 68.5 per cent in 2000 to 74.1 per cent in 2003.

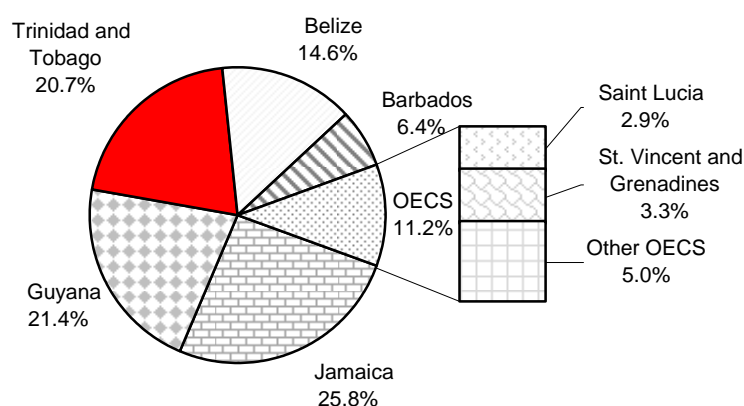
**Figure VII** shows that for both years, 2000 and 2003, the percentage contribution of Belize's agricultural domestic exports to its total domestic exports was the highest as compared to the other Member States (88.8 per cent in 2000 and 91.0 per cent in 2003). St. Vincent and the Grenadines followed with percentage contribution of 86.8 per cent and 87.3 per cent respectively. The contribution of Trinidad and Tobago's agricultural domestic exports was the lowest for both years (5.5 per cent and 4.2 per cent respectively).



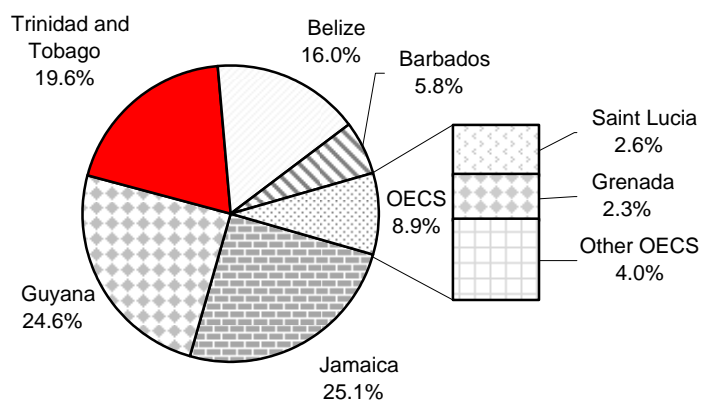
## Percentage Distribution of CARICOM's Total Agricultural Domestic Exports by Member States

*Jamaica, Guyana and Trinidad and Tobago* with contributions of 25.8 per cent, 21.4 per cent and 20.7 per cent respectively, were the major contributors to CARICOM's Total Agricultural Domestic Exports in 2000. OECS as a group accounted for 11.2 per cent of which *St. Vincent and the Grenadines* and *Saint Lucia* and represented 3.3 per cent and 2.9 per cent respectively. In 2003, the trend was the same with *Jamaica, Guyana and Trinidad and Tobago* accounting for contributions of 25.1 per cent, 24.6 per cent and 19.6 per cent respectively of CARICOM's total agricultural domestic exports. The contribution of OECS as a group dropped to 8.9 per cent, of which *Saint Lucia* and *Grenada* accounted for 2.6 per cent and 2.3 per cent respectively.

**Figure IX: Percentage Distribution of CARICOM's Agricultural Domestic Exports: 2003**



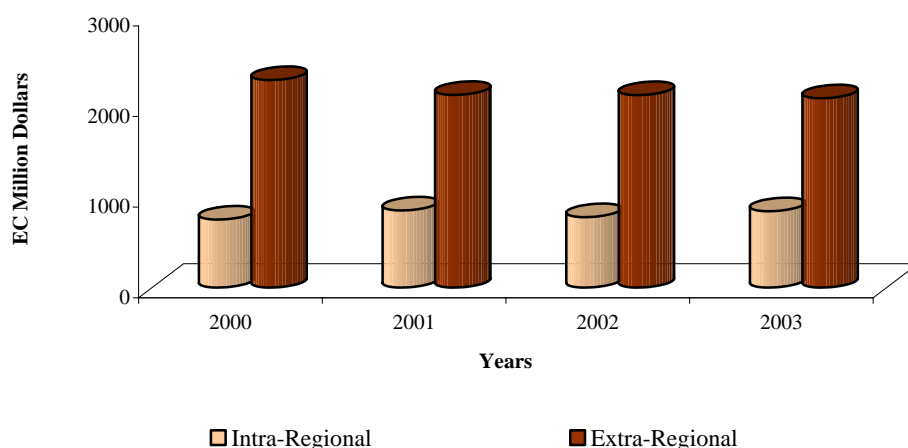
## Percentage Contribution of CARICOM's Intra-Regional and Extra-Regional Markets to its Total Agricultural Domestic Exports, of Respective Member States

Over the period, 2000–2003, the percentage contribution of the extra-regional market to CARICOM's total agricultural domestic exports declined from 75.3 *per cent* in 2000 to 71.3 *per cent* in 2003. This implied that the percentage contribution of the intra-regional market increased from 24.7 *per cent* in 2000 to 28.7 *per cent* in 2003.

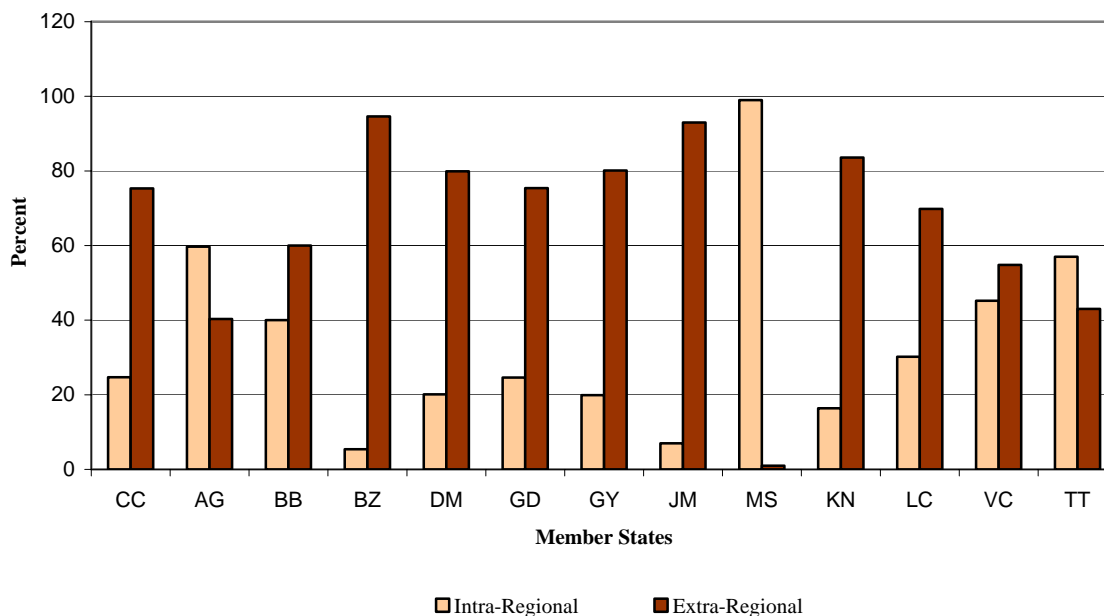
The contribution of the extra-regional market to Belize's total agricultural domestic exports declined from 94.6 *per cent* in 2000 to 90.3 *per cent* in 2003 while for Jamaica, the contribution of this market decreased from 93.0 *per cent* in 2000 to 91.1 *per cent* in 2003. For St. Kitts and Nevis' total agricultural domestic exports, the contribution of the extra-regional market increased from 83.6 *per cent* in 2000 to 94.5 *per cent* in 2003.

For 2003, the intra-regional market accounted for 74.0 *per cent* of St. Vincent and the Grenadines' total agricultural domestic exports from a contribution of 45.2 *per cent* in 2000. In 2003, this market accounted for 67.3 *per cent* of Trinidad and Tobago's agricultural domestic exports from a contribution of 57.0 *per cent* in 2000.

Figure X: Value of CARICOM's Agricultural Domestic Exports to Intra-Regional and Extra-Regional Destinations: 2000 - 2003

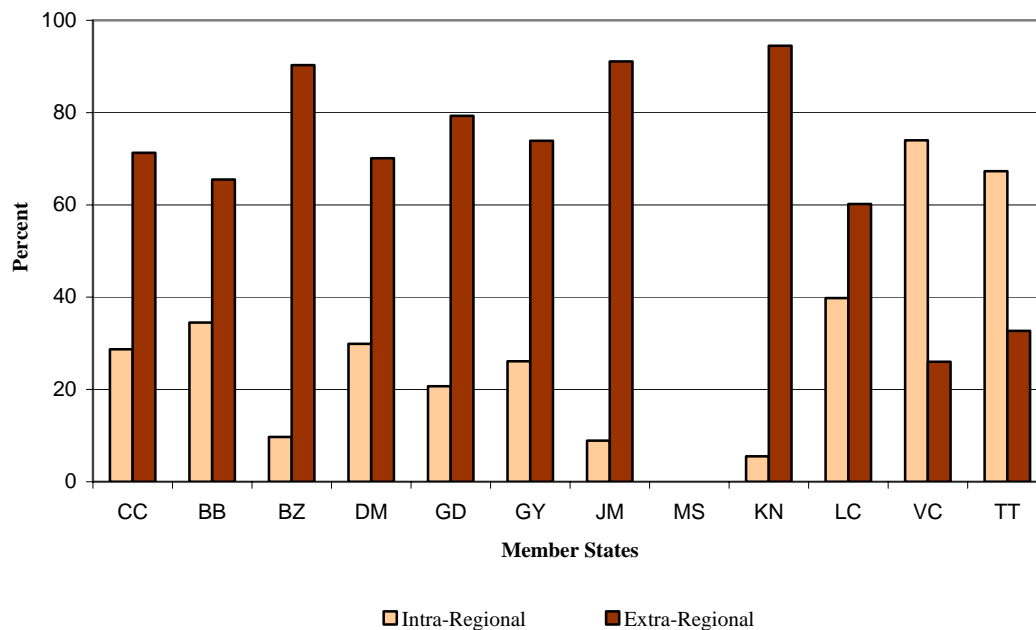

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# AN OVERVIEW OF CARICOM's TOTAL AGRICULTURAL IMPORTS<sup>1</sup>

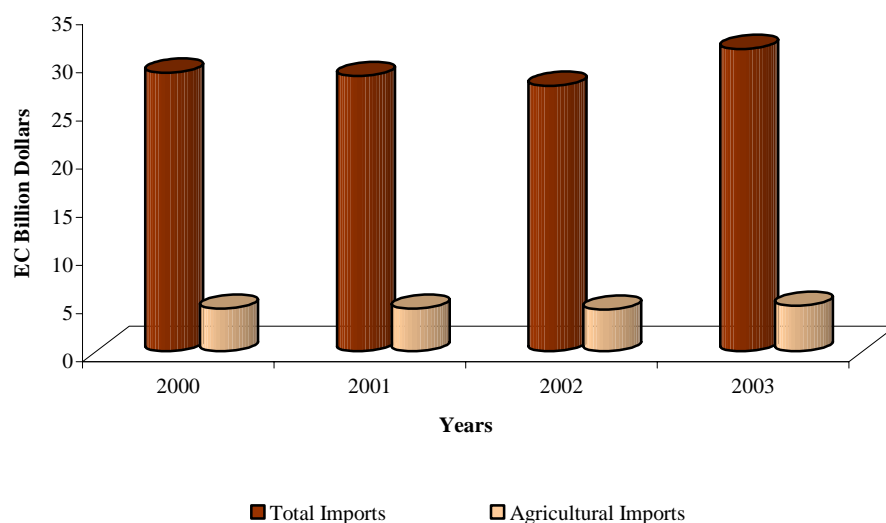
## CARICOM

Over the period, 2000-2003, CARICOM's total agricultural imports moved from *EC\$4.4 Bn (US\$1.6 Bn)* in 2000 to *EC\$4.7 Bn (US\$1.7 Bn)* in 2003 contributing on average to *15.3 per cent* of total imports from all sources over the period. *Food and live animals* was the highest contributor to total agricultural imports with *EC\$3.5 Bn (US\$1.3 Bn)* in 2000 and *EC\$3.7 Bn (US\$1.4 Bn)* in 2003, accounting on average for *12.1 per cent* of total imports from all sources over the period. *Food* accounted for almost all of the imports of the section, *food and live animals* and on average represented approximately *79.0 per cent* of CARICOM's total agricultural imports over the period.

The section, *Beverages and Tobacco* was the next highest category with an average of *1.4 per cent* of total imports over the period (*Tobacco* on average accounted for *1.2 per cent*).

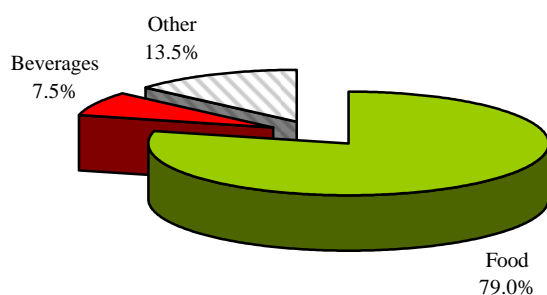
In 2003, imports of *Food (excluding live animals)* and *Beverages* comprised *EC\$4.1 Bn (US\$1.5 Bn)* or *12.9 per cent* of total imports from all sources. Some of the major imports at the division level in 2003 were *cereals and cereal preparations (EC\$777.4 Mn)*, *vegetables and fruit (EC\$572.7 Mn)*, *dairy products and eggs (EC\$508.4 Mn)*, *meat and meat preparations (EC\$431.4 Mn)*. These divisions collectively represented *7.3 per cent* of CARICOM's total imports from all sources (**Table 1.1**).

Total Imports: 2000 - 2003

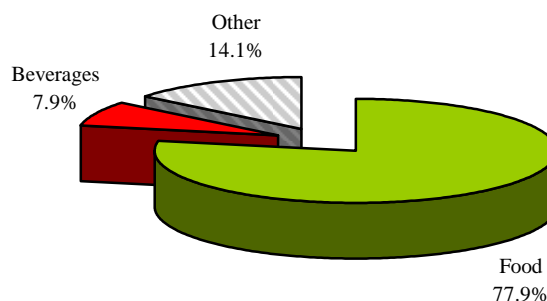

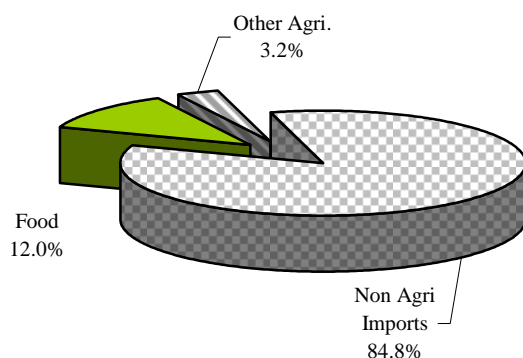
**Figure 1.2: Percentage Distribution of CARICOM's Agricultural Imports: 2000**



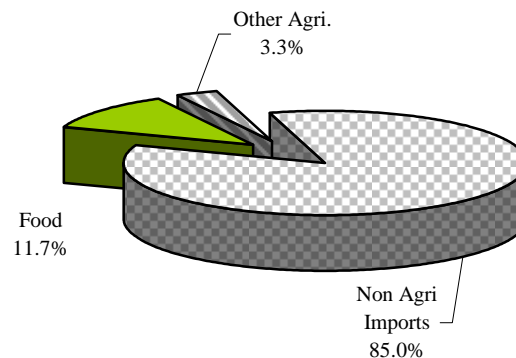
**Figure 1.3: Percentage Distribution of CARICOM's Agricultural Imports: 2003**

**Figure 1.5: CARICOM's Imports of Food as a percent of Total Imports: 2003**



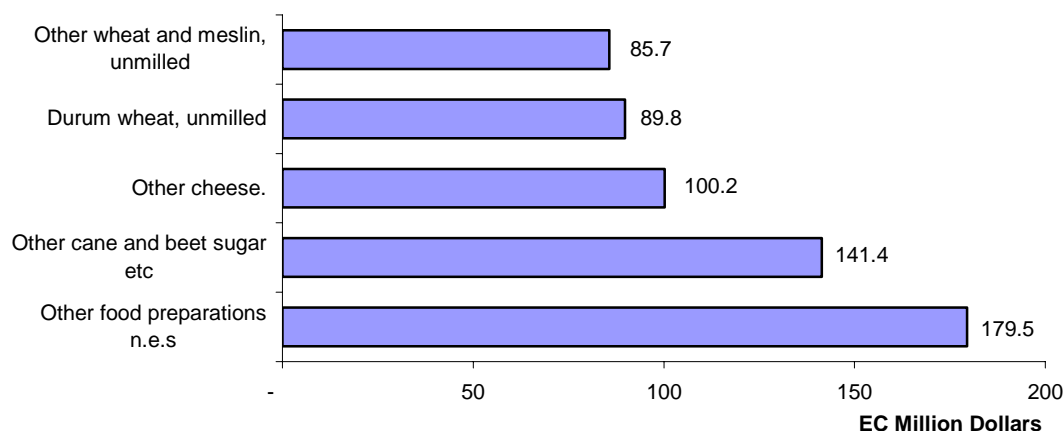
In 2003, the Region's top five agricultural commodities imported were (**Table 1.2**):

- *other food preparations not elsewhere specified (EC\$179.5 Mn);*
- *other cane and beet sugar and chemically pure sucrose etc (EC\$141.4 Mn);*
- *other cheese (EC\$ 100.2 Mn);*
- *durum wheat (EC\$89.8 Mn) and*
- *other wheat (including spelt) and meslin, unmilled (EC\$85.7 Mn).*

The top five agricultural commodities represented *11.1 per cent* of CARICOM's total agricultural imports from all sources in 2000 and *12.7 per cent* of the corresponding total in 2003.

Of these commodities, imports of *other cane and beet sugar and chemically pure sucrose etc* moved from EC\$104.8 Mn in 2000 to EC\$141.4 Mn in 2003 at an average annual growth rate of *10.5 per cent* over the period while imports of *other cheese* decreased from EC\$110.1 Mn in 2000 to EC\$100.2 Mn in 2003 at an average annual growth rate of *-3.1 per cent*. Imports of *durum wheat* advanced from EC\$59.3 Mn in 2000 to EC\$89.8 Mn in 2003 while imports of *other wheat (including spelt) and meslin, unmilled* increased from EC\$68.0 Mn in 2000 to EC\$85.7 Mn in 2003.

## ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA

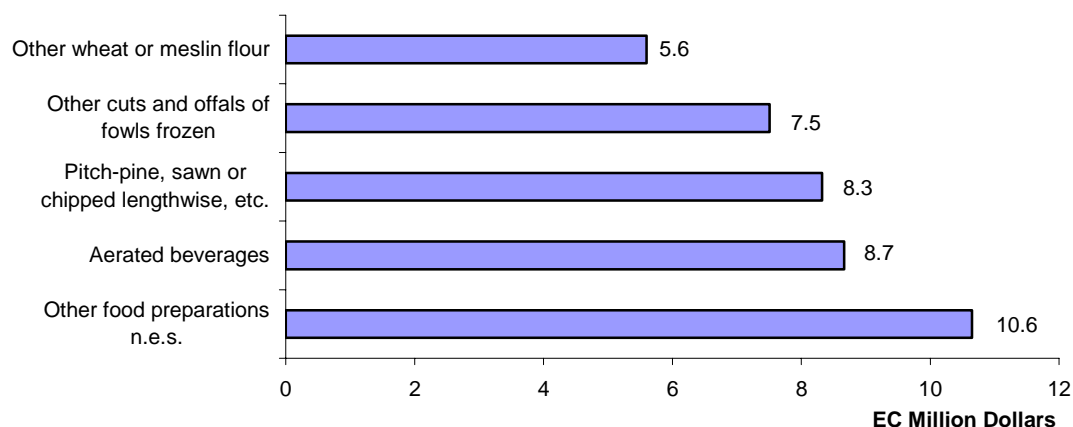
Data for Antigua and Barbuda were available only for the year 2000 for the period under review. Total agricultural imports amounted to EC\$215.9 Mn or 23.6 per cent of total imports from all sources for Antigua and Barbuda in 2000 (**Annex I (a)-(c)**).

The top five agricultural imports for this Member State in 2000 were:

- *other food preparations not elsewhere specified (EC\$10.6 Mn);*
- *aerated beverages (EC\$8.7 Mn);*
- *pitch-pine, sawn or chipped lengthwise, etc (EC\$8.3 Mn);*
- *other cuts and offals of fowls, frozen (EC\$7.5 Mn) and*
- *other wheat or meslin flour (EC\$5.6 Mn)*

These top five agricultural imports from all sources for Antigua and Barbuda in 2000 amounted to EC\$40.8 Mn or 18.9 per cent of its total agricultural imports. *Aerated beverages; pitch-pine, sawn or chipped lengthwise etc*, and *other cuts and offals of fowls frozen* accounted for EC\$24.5 Mn or 11.4 per cent of Antigua and Barbuda's total agricultural imports from all sources (**Table 1.3**).

## BARBADOS

Total agricultural imports amounted to EC\$600.4 Mn or *18.6 per cent* of total imports from all sources for Barbados in 2003, reflecting an increase over the figure registered at the beginning of the period, 2000, EC\$542.0 Mn or *17.4 per cent* of total imports from all sources (**Annex I (a)-(c)**).

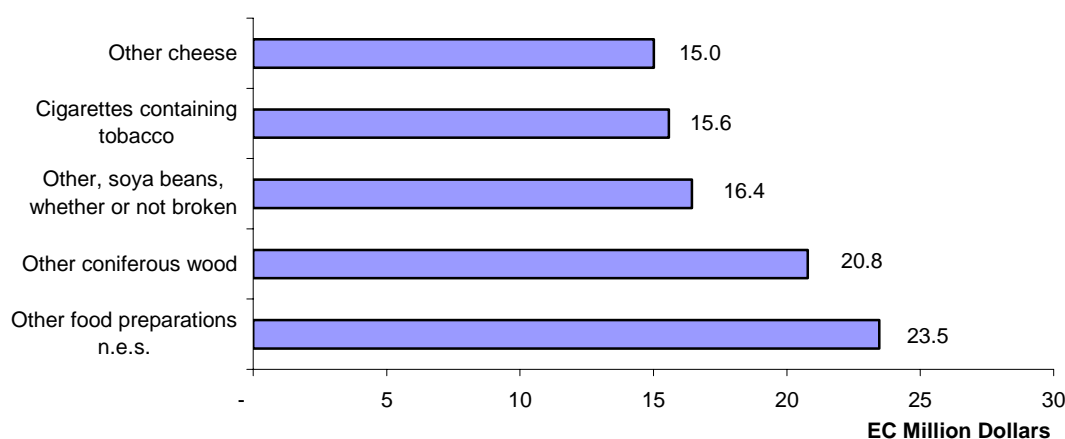
Barbados' top five agricultural commodities in 2003 were:

- *other food preparations not elsewhere specified (EC\$23.5 Mn);*
- *other coniferous wood (EC\$20.8 Mn);*
- *other soya beans whether or not broken (EC\$16.4 Mn);*
- *cigarettes containing tobacco (EC\$15.6 Mn) and*
- *other cheese (EC\$15.0 Mn)*

These top five commodities amounted to EC\$91.3 Mn in 2003 as compared to EC\$69.2 Mn in 2000. Over the period, 2000–2003, the percentage contribution of Barbados' top five agricultural imports to its total agricultural imports moved from *12.8 per cent* in 2000 to *15.2 per cent* in 2003.

Barbados' imports of *other coniferous woods* increased from EC\$16.5 Mn in 2000 to EC\$20.8 Mn in 2003 while imports of *other soya beans, whether or not broken* increased from EC\$14.4 Mn in 2000 to EC\$16.4 Mn in 2003. Imports of *cigarettes containing tobacco* were EC\$15.6 Mn in 2003 from EC\$5.8 Mn in 2000 while imports of *other cheese* declined over the period moving from EC\$17.3 Mn in 2000 to EC\$15.0 Mn in 2003 (**Table 1.4**).

## BELIZE

Total agricultural imports were EC\$179.6 Mn or *16.8 per cent* of total imports from all sources for Belize in 2003. This reflected an increase over the figure for 2000, EC\$169.9 Mn or *14.1 per cent* of total imports from all sources (**Annex I (a)-(c)**).

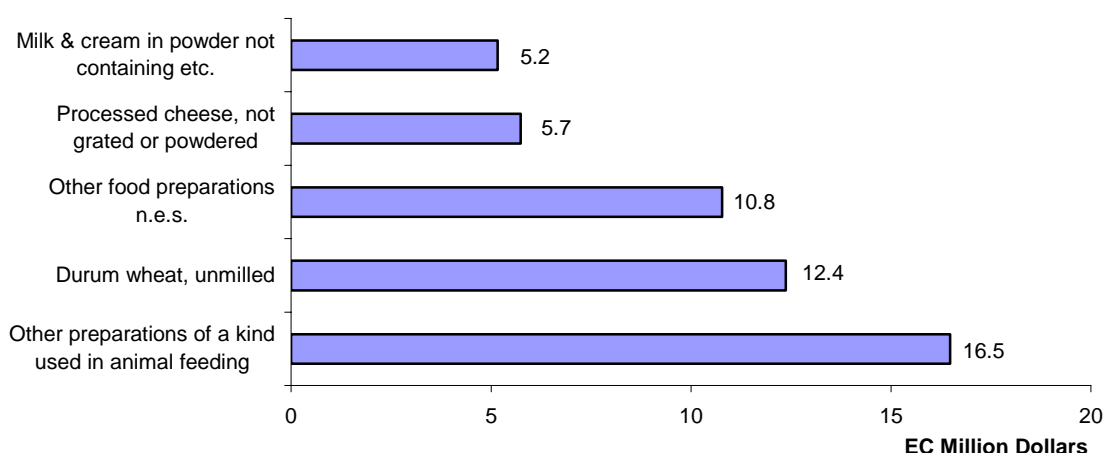
The top five agricultural imports for Belize in 2003 were:

- *other preparations of a kind used for animal feeding (EC\$16.5 Mn);*
- *durum wheat (EC\$12.4 Mn);*
- *other food preparations not elsewhere specified (EC\$10.8 Mn);*
- *processed cheese etc (EC\$5.7 Mn) and*
- *milk and cream in powder not containing added sugar etc (EC\$5.2 Mn)*

Belize's top five agricultural imports accounted for 24.7 *per cent* in 2000 and 28.1 *per cent* in 2003 of its total agricultural imports from all sources.

Imports of *other preparations of a kind used in animal feeding* was over 9.0 *per cent* of Belize's agricultural imports for the entire period 2000-2003, with the highest value being EC\$19.9 Mn in 2001. Imports of *durum wheat* moved from EC\$7.3 Mn in 2000 to EC\$12.4 Mn in 2003 while imports of *processed cheese etc* decreased from EC\$5.8 Mn in 2000 to EC\$5.7 Mn in 2003. For *milk and cream in powder not containing added sugar etc*, imports increase from EC\$4.1 Mn in 2000 to EC\$5.2 Mn in 2003 (**Table 1.5**).

## DOMINICA

For 2003, Dominica's agricultural imports were EC\$81.5 Mn or 23.8 *per cent* of its total imports from all sources, reflecting a decrease over the value registered in 2000, EC\$92.3 Mn or 23.5 *per cent* of total imports from all sources (**Annex I (a)-(c)**).

The top five agricultural imports for Dominica in 2003 were:

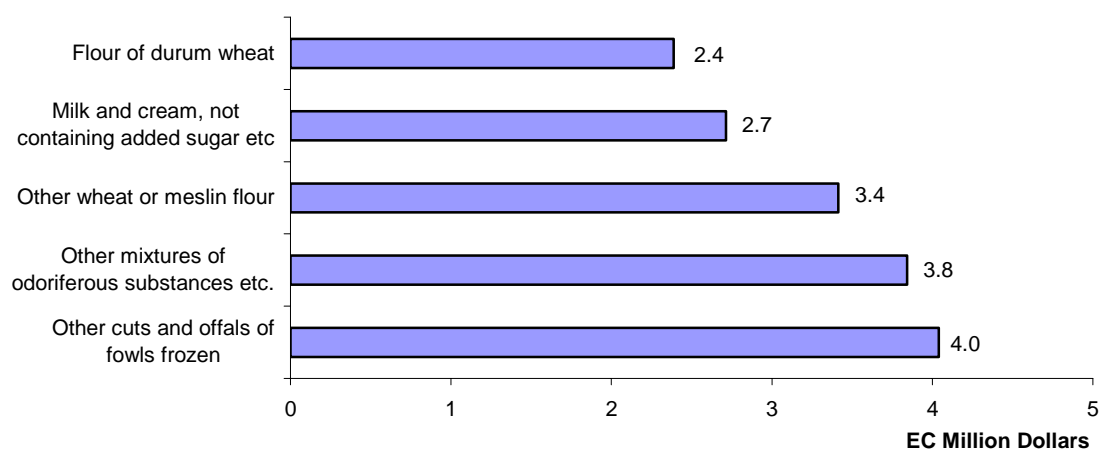
- *other cuts and offals of fowls, frozen (EC\$4.0 Mn);*
- *other mixtures of odoriferous substances and mixtures etc (EC\$3.8 Mn);*
- *other wheat or meslin flour (EC\$3.4 Mn);*
- *milk and cream, not containing added sugar etc (EC\$2.7 Mn) and*
- *flour of durum wheat (EC\$2.4 Mn)*

Dominica's top five agricultural imports as a percentage of its total agricultural imports from all sources increased from 19.8 *per cent* in 2000 to 20.1 *per cent* in 2003.

In 2003, Dominica's imports of *other cuts and offals of fowls, frozen* amounted to EC\$4.0 Mn, which represented a decrease of *13.0 per cent* over the value recorded in 2000 (EC\$4.6 Mn). There was also a decrease in imports of *other mixtures of odoriferous substances and mixtures etc*, from EC\$5.5 Mn in 2000 to the value imported in 2003 (EC\$3.8 Mn), representing a decrease of *30.9 per cent*. Imports of *other wheat or meslin flour* also declined moving from EC\$4.3 Mn in 2000 to EC\$3.4 Mn in 2003.

Imports of *milk and cream, not containing added sugar etc*, increased from EC\$2.1 Mn in 2000 to EC\$2.7 Mn in 2003 while imports of *flour of durum wheat* rose from EC\$2.0 Mn in 2000 to EC\$2.4 Mn in 2003 (**Table 1.6**).

## GRENADA

Total agricultural imports amounted to EC\$137.4 Mn or *20.1 per cent* of total imports from all sources for Grenada in 2003 reflecting an increase over the value recorded in 2000, EC\$132.2 Mn or *20.5 per cent* of total imports from all sources (**Annex I (a)-(c)**).

The top five agricultural imports by Grenada in 2003 were:

- *other cuts and offals of fowls, frozen* (EC\$5.8 Mn);
- *fowl wings frozen* (EC\$5.0 Mn);
- *other cheese* (EC\$4.5 Mn);
- *other food preparations elsewhere specified* (EC\$3.9 Mn) and
- *condensed milk* (EC\$3.9 Mn)

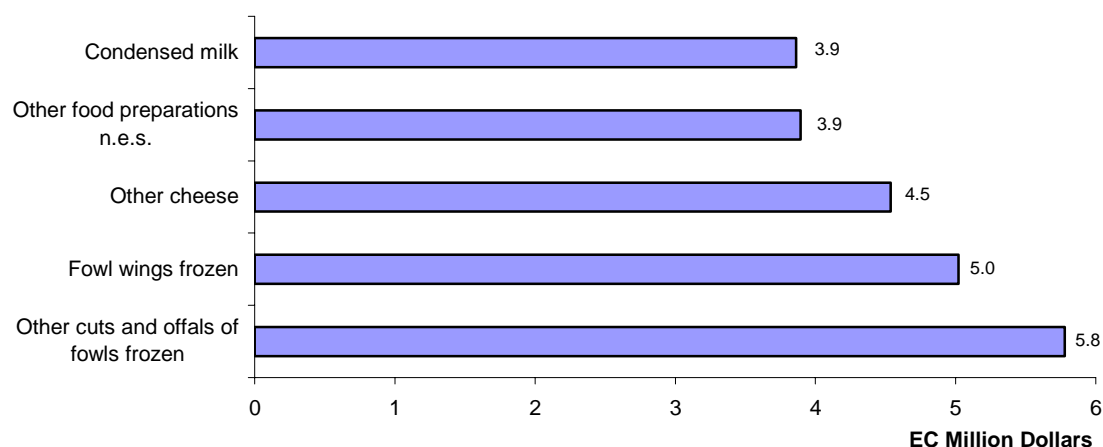
Over the period 2000–2003, Grenada's top five agricultural imports as a percentage of its total agricultural imports declined from *17.5 per cent* in 2000 to *16.8 per cent* in 2003.

Grenada's imports of *other cuts and offals of fowls, frozen* decreased from EC\$6.3 Mn in 2000 to EC\$5.8 Mn in 2003 while its imports of *fowl wings frozen* increased from EC\$4.6 Mn in 2000 to EC\$5.0 Mn in 2003. Imports of *other cheese* while showing some fluctuation remained at almost the same level in 2000 (EC\$4.3 Mn) and in 2003 (EC\$4.5 Mn) while imports of

## GUYANA

Total agricultural imports were EC\$247.4 Mn or *16.1 per cent* of total imports from all sources for Guyana in 2003, representing an increase over the value recorded in 2000, EC\$217.5 Mn or *14.1 per cent* of total imports from all sources (**Annex I (a)-(c)**).

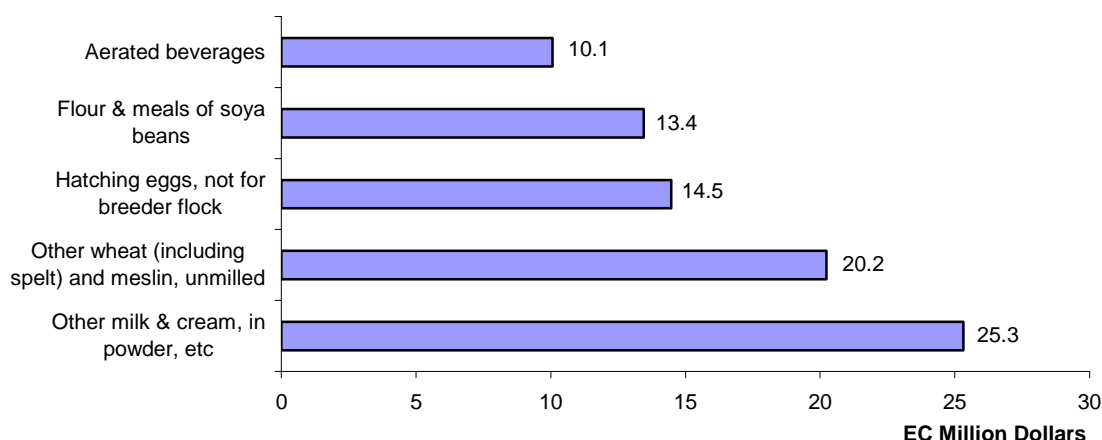
The top five agricultural imports by Guyana in 2003 were:

In 2003, Guyana's imports of *other milk and cream, in powder granules or other solid forms, etc*, (EC\$25.3 Mn) reflected an increase of *11.0 per cent* over the value recorded in 2000 (EC\$22.8 Mn) while its imports of *other wheat (including spelt) and meslin, unmilled* moved from EC\$14.0 Mn in 2000 to EC\$20.2 Mn in 2003, reflecting an increase of *44.3 per cent*. Imports of *hatching eggs, not for breeder flock*, expanded by EC\$9.0 Mn, from EC\$5.5 Mn in 2000 to EC\$14.5 Mn in 2003 while imports of *flour and meals of soya beans*, recorded an increase (EC\$13.3 Mn) over the period moving from EC \$0.1 Mn in 2000 to EC \$13.4 Mn in 2003. Imports of *aerated beverages* also registered an increase moving from EC\$1.2 Mn in 2000 to EC\$10.1 Mn in 2003, an increase of EC\$8.9 Mn (**Table 1.8**).

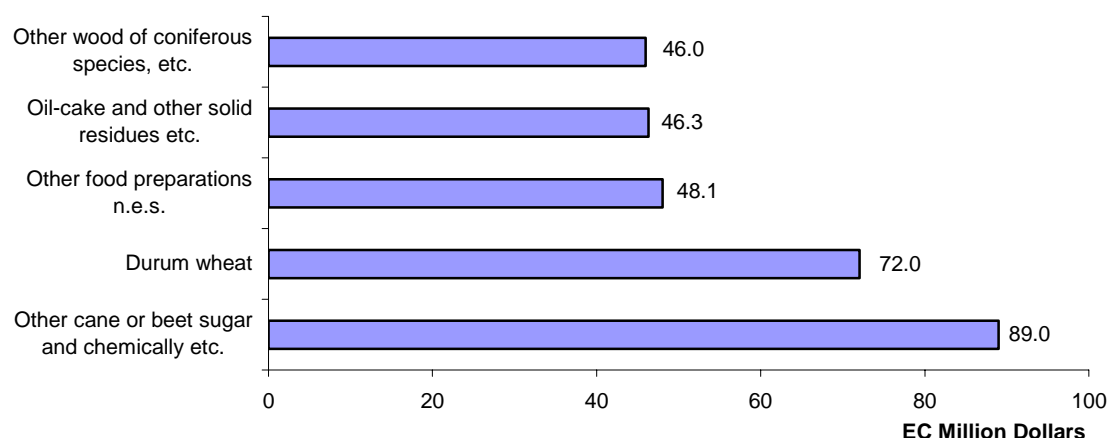

Imports of *oil-cake and other solid residues whether or not ground from soya beans etc* increased from EC\$33.2 Mn in 2000 to EC\$46.3 Mn in 2003 while imports of *other wood of coniferous species, sawn or chipped lengthwise, etc* declined from EC\$58.8 Mn in 2000 to EC\$46.0 Mn in 2003 (**Table 1.9**).

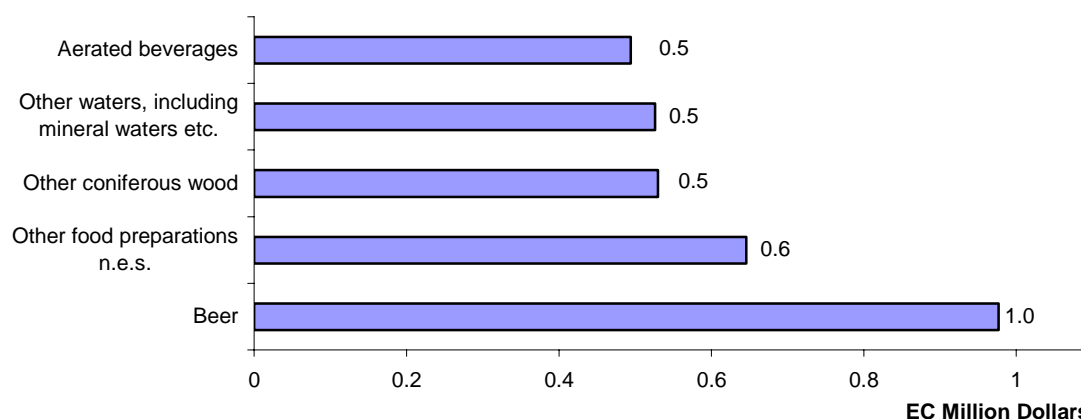

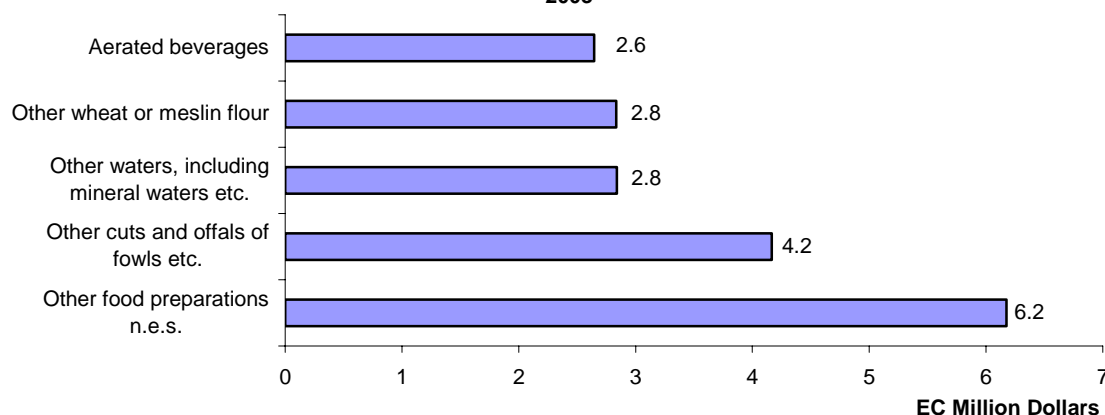

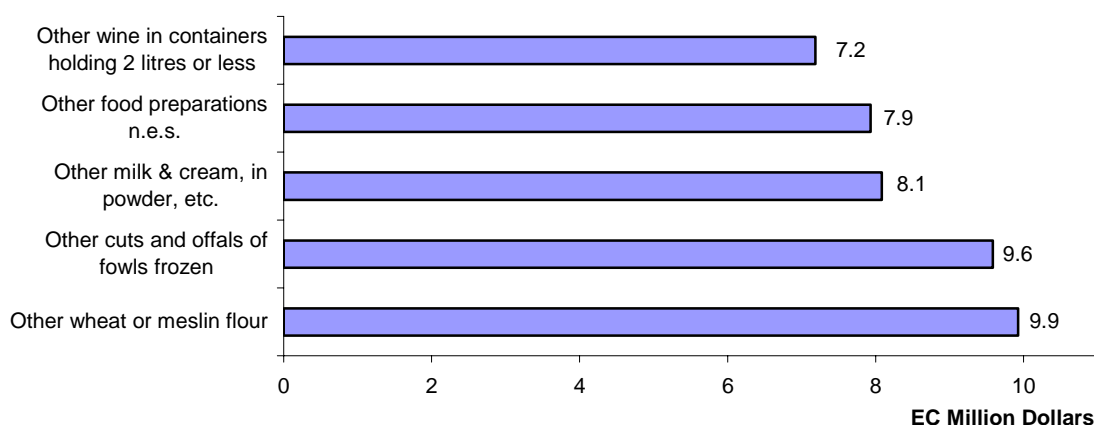

For *other wine in containers holding two litres or less*, imports expanded from EC\$2.5 Mn in 2000 to EC\$7.2 Mn in 2003, an increase of EC\$4.7 Mn (**Table 1.12**).

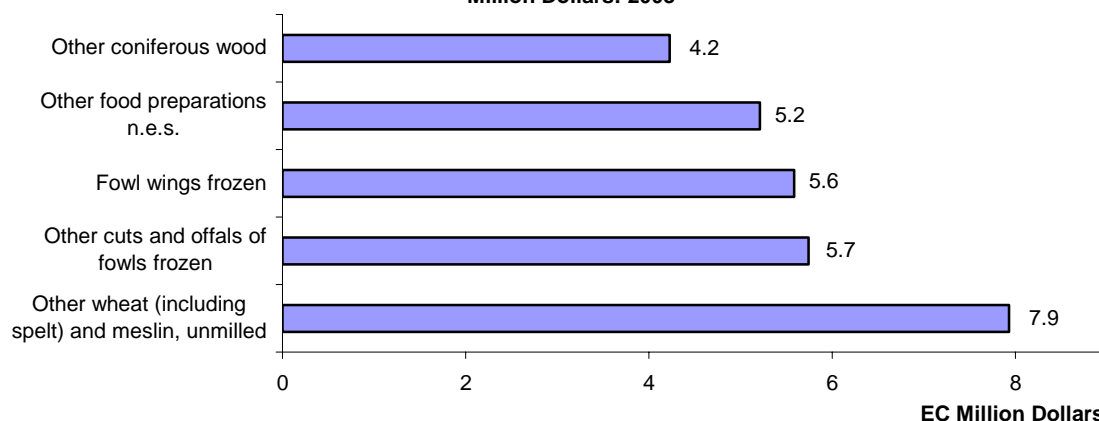

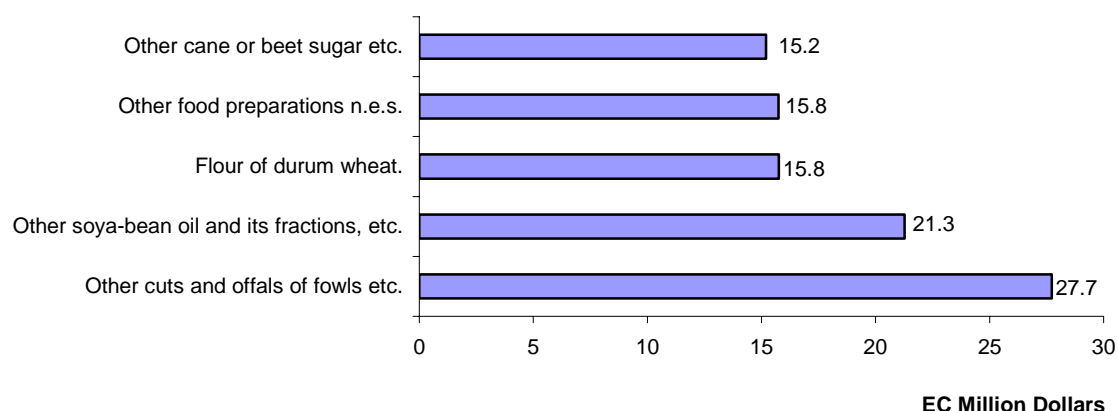

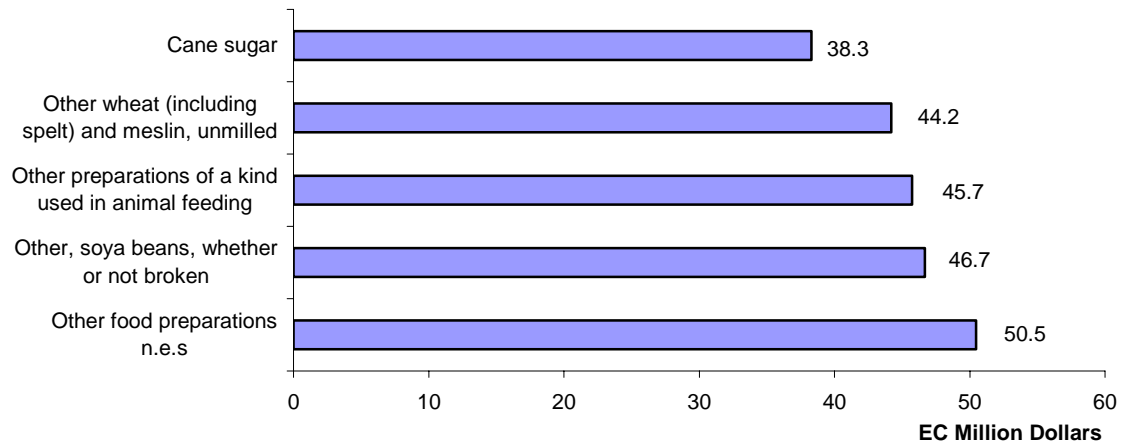

2003**





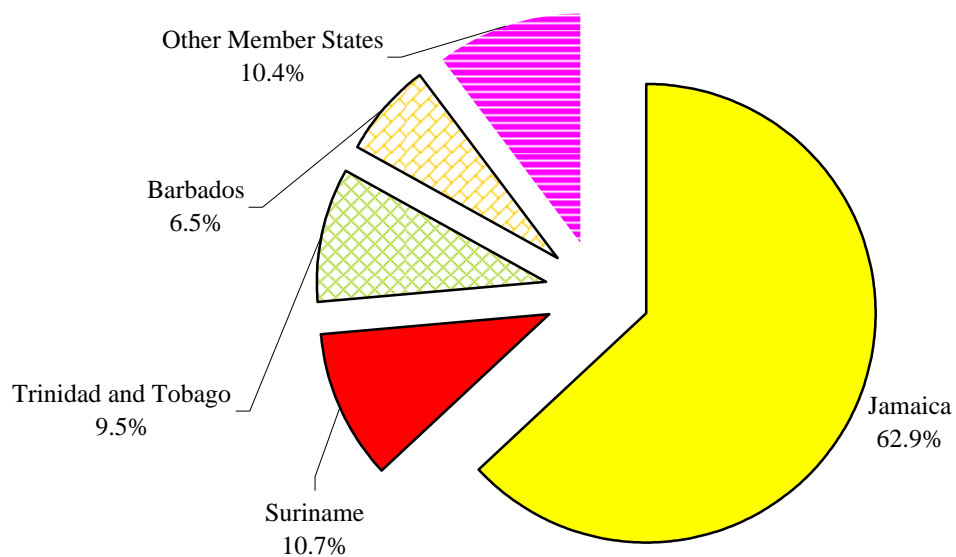

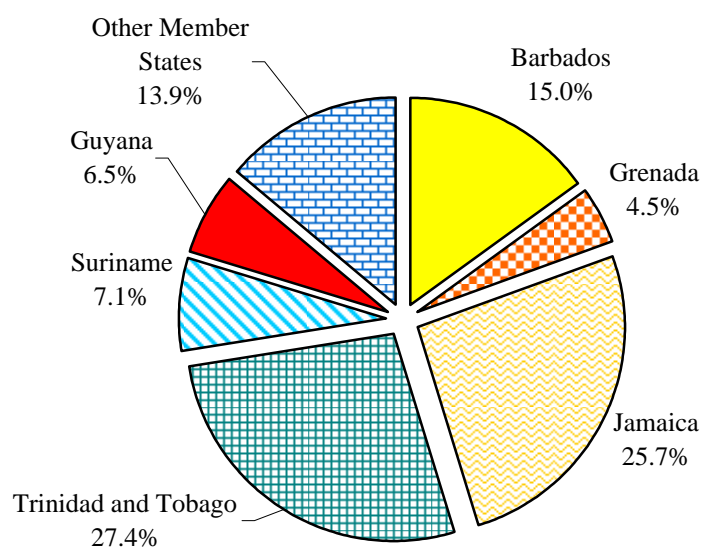

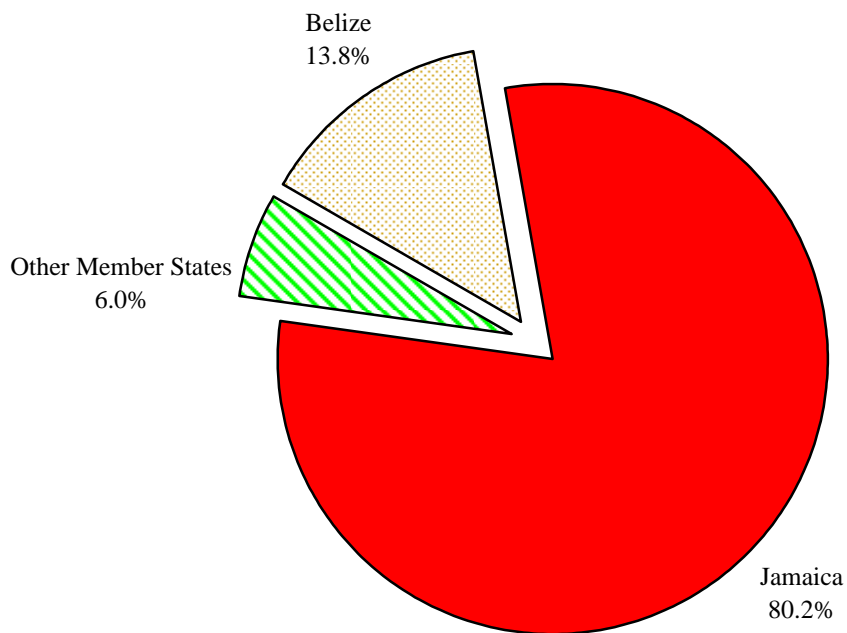
**Figure 1.20: CARICOM's Imports of Other Cane and Beet Sugar and Chemically Pure Sucrose, in solid form, by Country: 2003**



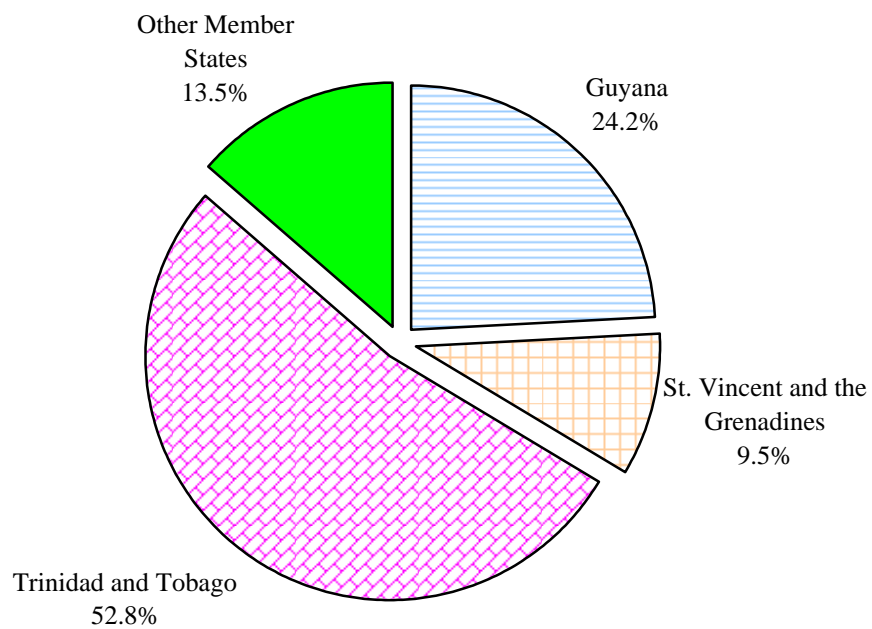
**Figure 1.21: CARICOM's Imports of Other Cheese, by Country : 2003**

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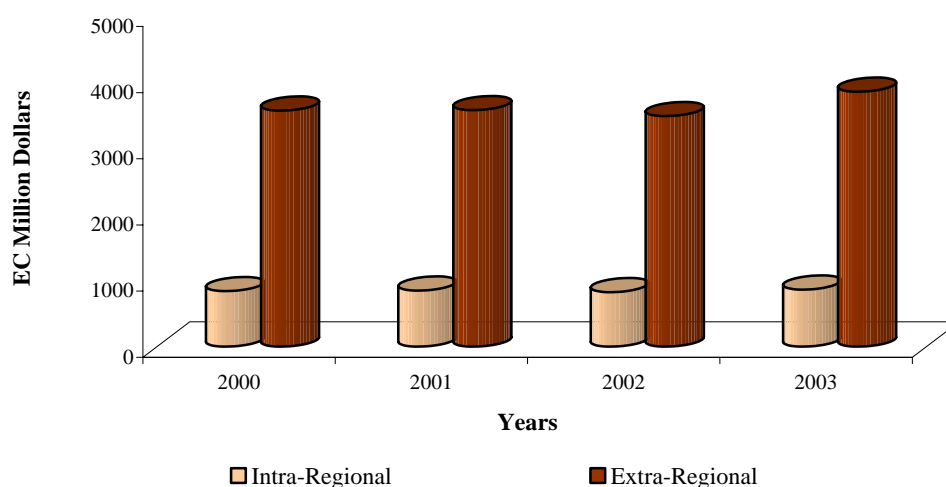


# CARICOM'S AGRICULTURAL IMPORTS BY COUNTRY OF ORIGIN

## CARICOM

For the period, 2000–2003, the dominant source of CARICOM's total agricultural imports was the extra-regional market. In 2000, *81.0 per cent* or EC\$3.6 Bn (US\$1.3 Bn) of CARICOM's agricultural imports came from extra-regional sources while *19.0 per cent* or EC\$0.8 Bn (US\$0.3 Bn) originated from intra-regional sources. The contribution of the intra-regional market as a source of CARICOM's total agricultural imports decreased over time to *18.3 per cent* or EC\$0.9 Bn (US\$0.3 Bn) in 2003, which implied that the extra-regional market contributed *81.7 per cent* or EC\$3.9 Bn (US\$1.4) (**Annex III (a) and (b)**).

CARICOM's imports of *other cane and beet sugar and chemically pure sucrose*, originated mainly from the extra-regional market with *87.8 per cent* of this commodity coming from this market in 2000 and *76.1 per cent* in 2003. In 2000 and 2001, the *United States of America* was the top source of this commodity with percentage contributions of *35.5 per cent* and *27.8 per cent* respectively while in 2002 and 2003 *Colombia* was the main source of this product with percentage contributions of *30.6 per cent* and *35.5 per cent* respectively. For these two years, 2002 and 2003, the contribution of the *United States of America* declined to *22.5 per cent* and *6.8 per cent* respectively. The intra-regional market accounted for *12.2 per cent* of the imports of this commodity in 2000 and *23.9 per cent* in 2003, with *Guyana* accounting for *7.5 per cent* and *16.8 per cent* in the two years respectively.

For imports of *other cheese*, the extra-regional market accounted for almost all of the Region's imports of this commodity over the period, 2000-2003. *New Zealand* was the top supplier with an average contribution of *51.1 per cent* of the Region's imports of this commodity over this period.

The *United States of America* was the dominant source for CARICOM's imports of *durum wheat* and also imports of *other wheat and meslin, unmilled* accounting for almost all of the imports of these commodities over the period (**Table 2.1**).

## ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA

For the period under review, only data for 2000 were available for Antigua and Barbuda. For this year, EC\$170.9 Mn or 79.2 *per cent* of this Member State's agricultural imports originated from the extra-regional market while EC\$44.9 Mn or 20.8 *per cent* were obtained the intra-regional market (**Annex III (a) and (b)**).

**Table 2.2** revealed that for the top five agricultural commodities for 2000, the intra-regional market was the dominant source for Antigua and Barbuda's imports of *aerated beverages* and *other wheat or meslin flour* while the extra-regional market was the main source for the remaining top five agricultural commodities.

For imports of *aerated beverages*, 57.2 *per cent* came from the intra-regional market while 42.8 *per cent* was obtained extra-regionally. *Saint Lucia* with 32.5 *per cent* and *Trinidad and Tobago* with 23.1 *per cent* were the major intra-regional sources for this commodity while the *United States of America* with 27.1 *per cent* was the major extra-regional source in 2000.

Approximately all of the imports of *pitch-pine, sawn or chipped lengthwise, etc* and imports of *other cuts and offals of fowls, frozen*, came from the extra-regional market. The *United States of America* was the dominant market for both commodities accounting for percentage contributions of 78.5 *per cent* and 95.4 *per cent* respectively.

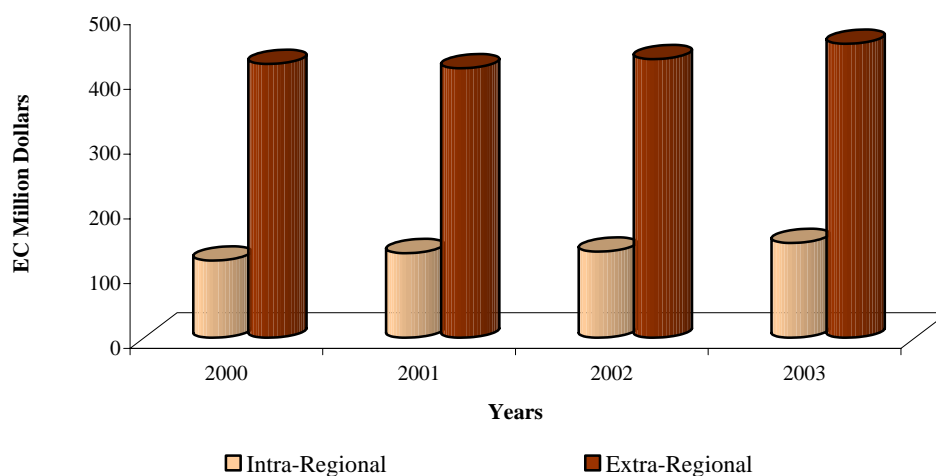
The intra-regional market accounted for 94.2 *per cent* of Antigua and Barbuda's imports of *other wheat or meslin flour*, which implied that the extra-regional market represented 5.8 *per cent*. *St. Vincent and the Grenadines* with 67.8 *per cent* and *Grenada* with 22.5 *per cent* were the major sources of this commodity.

## BARBADOS

For the period, 2000–2003, Barbados' total agricultural imports were obtained mainly from the extra-regional market. In 2000, 78.0 *per cent* (EC\$422.8 Mn) of Barbados' agricultural imports was from extra-regional sources while 22.0 *per cent* (EC\$119.2 Mn) originated from intra-regional sources. The contribution of the intra-regional market as a source for the total agricultural imports increased marginally over the period to 24.4 *per cent* (EC\$146.5 Mn) in 2003, which implied that the extra-regional market contributed 75.6 *per cent* (EC\$453.9 Mn) in this same year (**Annex III (a) and (b)**).

Barbados' top five agricultural imports were obtained mainly from the extra-regional market except for *cigarettes containing tobacco*, which in 2001 to 2003 came mainly from the intra-regional market. In 2000, the extra-regional market was the main source of this commodity accounting for EC\$3.3 Mn (56.1 per cent).

For imports of *other coniferous woods*, the extra-regional market accounted for almost all of this commodity over the period. The *United States of America* was the top supplier for these commodities accounting for an average percentage contribution of 66.5 per cent over the period. In 2003, EC\$11.1 Mn (53.6 per cent) of this commodity was imported from the *United States of America* and EC\$8.9 Mn (42.7 per cent) from *Honduras* as compared to EC\$12.9 Mn (78.1 per cent) in 2000 from the *United States of America* and EC\$2.7 Mn (16.3 per cent) from *Honduras* in this same year.

*Other soya beans, whether or not broken* were imported exclusively from the extra-regional market with almost all originating from the *United States of America* for the entire period.

Throughout the period, *Trinidad and Tobago* was the largest single supplier for imports of *cigarettes containing tobacco*, increasing from EC\$2.5 Mn (43.7 per cent) in 2000 to EC\$11.5 Mn (73.8 per cent) in 2003. For 2000, the *United Kingdom* (37.8 per cent) and the *United States of America* (13.6 per cent) were the top extra-regional suppliers of this commodity but their percentage contributions declined to 17.4 per cent and 5.1 per cent respectively in 2003 due to the expansion of the *Trinidad and Tobago* market as the main source for this commodity.

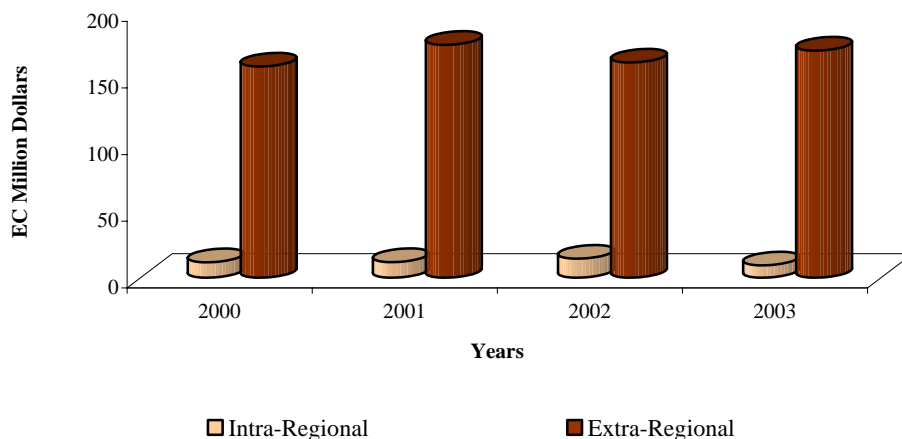
*New Zealand* was the main source for imports of *other cheese* with average percentage contribution of 61.1 per cent over the period (Table 2.3).

## BELIZE

For the period, 2000–2003, Belize's total agricultural imports were mainly obtained from the extra-regional market. In 2000, 93.2 per cent (EC\$158.4 Mn) of Belize's agricultural imports originated from extra-regional sources while 6.8 per cent (EC\$11.5 Mn) was from intra-regional

sources. The percentage contribution of the intra-regional market as a source for the total agricultural imports decreased to *5.1 per cent* (EC\$9.2 Mn) in 2003, which implied that the extra-regional market accounted for *94.9 per cent* (EC\$170.4 Mn) (**Annex III (a) and (b)**).

For 2000 and 2003, the extra-regional market provided all of Belize's imports of *other preparations of a kind used in animal feeding* while in 2001 and 2002 a minimal amount was supplied by the intra-regional market. The *United States of America* was the top supplier of this commodity accounting for *96.5 per cent* in 2000 and *93.5 per cent* in 2003.

The *United States of America* was the major source of Belize's imports of *durum wheat*, accounting for all of the imports for the period 2000 and 2002, *93.0 per cent* in 2001 and *96.9 per cent* in 2003.

For imports of *processed cheese, etc*, *The Netherlands* was the major source for the period 2000-2002 with contributions of *45.9 per cent*, *42.3 per cent* and *37.0 per cent* respectively. In 2003, there was a shift to the *United States of America* as the top source of this commodity with a percentage contribution of *34.6 per cent*. In 2003, *The Netherlands* contributed to *17.2 per cent* of the imports of this commodity.

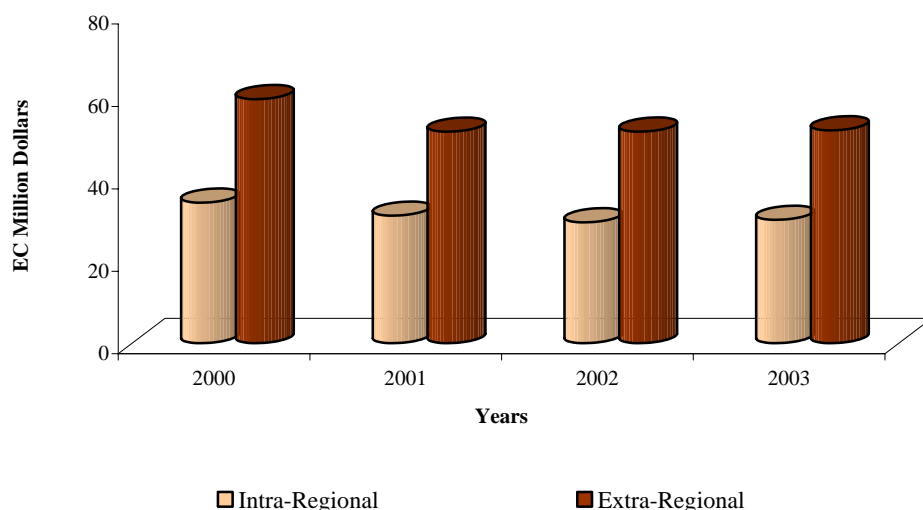
The extra-regional market accounted for all of Belize's imports of *milk and cream in powder not containing added sugar etc* in 2000, 2001 and 2003 while the intra-regional market supplied a minimal amount in 2002. *France* with *49.5 per cent* was the top supplier in 2000 while for the period 2001-2003, there was a shift to *Denmark* as the main source with percentage contributions of *41.0 per cent*, *37.7 per cent* and *40.9 per cent* respectively for these years (**Table 2.4**).

## DOMINICA

For the period, 2000–2003, Dominica's total agricultural imports originated mainly from the extra-regional market. In 2000, *63.5 per cent* (EC\$59.2 Mn) of Dominica's agricultural imports was from extra-regional sources while *36.5 per cent* (EC\$34.1 Mn) originated from intra-regional sources. The contribution of the intra-regional market as a source for the total

agricultural imports increased over time to 36.7 per cent (EC\$29.9 Mn) in 2003, which implied that the extra-regional market contributed 63.3 per cent (EC\$51.6 Mn) (**Annex III (a) and (b)**).

The extra-regional market was the major source for imports of *other cuts and offals of fowls, frozen, other mixtures of odoriferous substances and mixtures, etc* and *milk and cream, not containing added sugar etc* while the intra-regional market was the main source of *other wheat or meslin flour* and *flour of durum wheat*.

Imports of *other cuts and offals of fowls frozen*, originated from the extra-regional market only with the *United States of America* on average accounting for almost all of this commodity.

The extra-regional market accounted for almost all of the imports of *other mixtures of odoriferous substances, etc* with the *United States of America* accounting for an average percentage contribution of 51.1 per cent over the period.

For imports of *other wheat or meslin flour*, the intra-regional market accounted for almost all of this commodity over the period, 2000–2003. The major intra-regional suppliers were *Grenada* with 53.1 per cent and 58.5 per cent in 2000 and 2001 respectively, *Barbados* with 38.1 per cent in 2002 and *St. Vincent and the Grenadines* with 40.8 per cent in 2003.

The dominant market for imports of *milk and cream, not containing added sugar or sweetening matter etc*, was the extra-regional market which on average recorded a contribution of 96.8 per cent over the period. The major suppliers were *The Netherlands* with 32.9 per cent and 43.5 per cent in 2000 and 2001 respectively and *Canada* with 40.9 per cent and 32.1 per cent in 2002 and 2003 respectively.

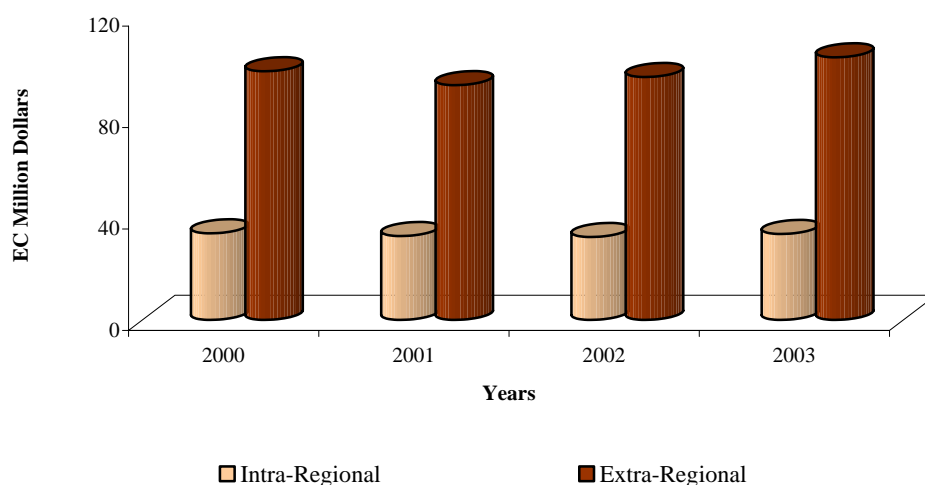
Over the period, 2000–2003, this Member State on average obtained approximately 96.0 per cent of its imports of *flour of durum wheat* intra-regionally with the major suppliers being *St. Vincent and the Grenadines*, 58.2 per cent in 2000, *Grenada*, 77.4 per cent in 2001 and *Barbados* 44.4 per cent and 82.9 per cent in 2002 and 2003 respectively (**Table 2.5**).

## GRENADA

For the period, 2000–2003, Grenada’s total agricultural imports originated mainly from the extra-regional market. In 2000, 74.2 per cent (EC\$98.0 Mn) of Grenada’s agricultural imports was obtained from extra-regional sources while 25.8 per cent (EC\$34.1 Mn) originated from intra-regional sources.

The contribution of the intra-regional market as a source for the total agricultural imports decreased over time to 24.7 per cent (EC\$33.9 Mn) in 2003, which implied that the extra-regional market contributed 75.3 per cent (EC\$103.5 Mn) (**Annex III (a) and (b)**).

**Table 2.6** indicated that almost all of Grenada’s imports of *other cuts and offals of fowls frozen* originated from the extra-regional market. The *United States of America* was the top source accounting on average for 93.5 per cent of Grenada’s imports of this commodity over the period.

The extra-regional market was the major supplier for imports of *fowl’s wings, frozen*; accounting for almost all of its imports throughout the period. The major suppliers of this commodity were *United Kingdom*, 55.9 per cent in 2000, the *United States of America*, 52.7 per cent and 35.6 per cent in 2001 and 2002 respectively and *Brazil*, 53.8 per cent in 2003.

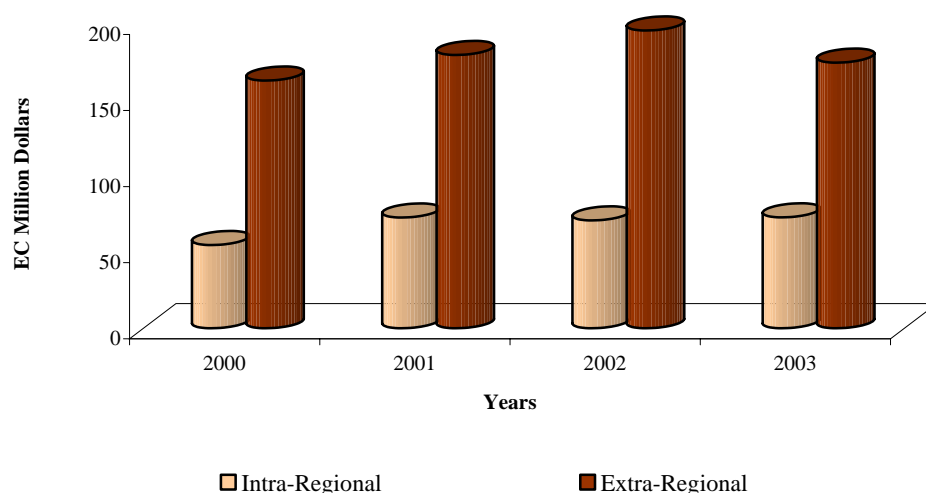
For imports of *other cheese*, the extra-regional market accounted for almost all of the imports of this commodity. *New Zealand* was the major supplier accounting for more than 68.0 per cent throughout the period with the highest percentage contribution, 76.7 per cent recorded in 2003.

The contribution of the intra-regional market to Grenada’s imports of *condensed milk* showed a declining trend moving from 17.4 per cent in 2000 to 1.8 per cent in 2003. This implied that the contribution of the extra-regional market expanded from 82.6 per cent in 2000 to 98.2 per cent in 2003. *The Netherlands* was the major supplier of this commodity with an average percentage contribution of 58.3 per cent over the period. *Trinidad and Tobago* was the main intra-regional supplier of this commodity in 2000 with 17.4 per cent.

## GUYANA

For the period, 2000–2003, Guyana’s total agricultural imports were obtained mainly from the extra-regional market. In 2000, 74.8 *per cent* (EC\$162.8 Mn) of Guyana’s agricultural imports was from extra-regional sources while 25.2 *per cent* (EC\$54.7 Mn) originated from intra-regional sources. The contribution of the intra-regional market as a source for the total agricultural imports increased over time to 29.5 *per cent* (EC\$72.9 Mn) in 2003, which implied that the extra-regional market contributed 70.5 *per cent* (EC\$174.5 Mn) (**Annex III (a) and (b)**).

The extra-regional market was the dominant source for Guyana’s imports of *other milk and cream etc*; *other wheat and meslin* and *hatching eggs etc* while the intra-regional market was the major source of *flour and meals of soya beans* (except in 2002) and *aerated beverages*.

For imports of *other milk and cream etc*, the extra-regional market on average accounted for almost all of this commodity over the period. *The Netherlands* and *New Zealand* were top suppliers of this commodity with a combined percentage contributions of 64.7 *per cent* in 2000 and 56.9 *per cent* in 2003.

The *United States of America* accounted for all of Guyana’s imports of *other wheat and meslin* and on average contributed to almost all of the imports of *hatching eggs, etc* over the period.

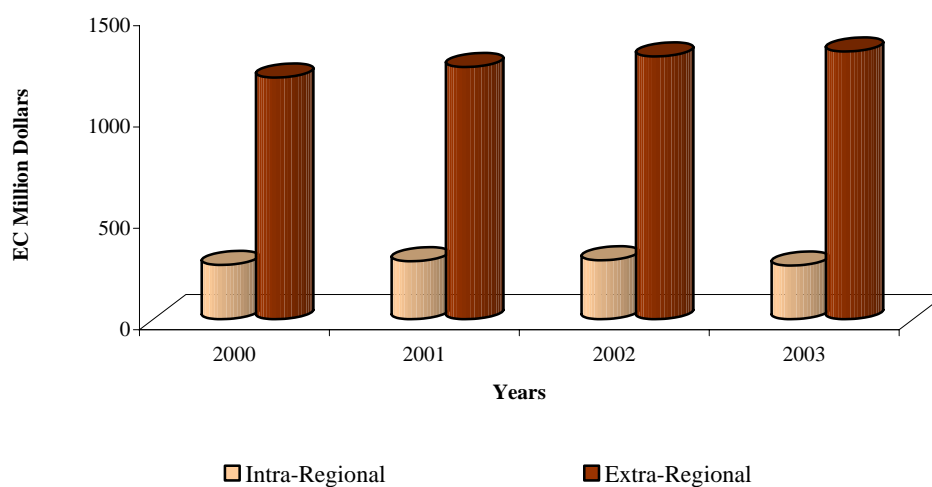
The intra-regional market was the dominant source for imports of *flour and meals of soya beans* and *aerated beverages* with average contributions of 65.5 *per cent* and 92.7 *per cent* respectively over the period. *Trinidad and Tobago* was the top supplier of these commodities accounting on average for 60.9 *per cent* and 92.5 *per cent* respectively over the period (**Tables 2.7**).

## JAMAICA

For the period, 2000–2003, Jamaica’s total agricultural imports were obtained mainly from the extra-regional market. In 2000, 81.7 *per cent* (EC\$1.2 Bn) of Jamaica’s agricultural imports originated from extra-regional sources while 18.3 *per cent* (EC\$0.3 Bn) was from intra-regional sources. The contribution of the intra-regional market as a source for the total agricultural

imports decreased over time to *16.7 per cent* (EC\$0.3 Bn) in 2003, which implied that the extra-regional market contributed *83.3 per cent* (EC\$1.3 Bn) (**Annex III (a) and (b)**).

The extra-regional market accounted for *82.2 per cent* in 2000 of Jamaica's imports of *other cane or beet sugar and chemically pure sucrose, etc* but decreased to *62.0 per cent* in 2003. In 2000 and 2001, the *United States of America* was the top supplier of this commodity accounting for *49.6 per cent* and *39.6 per cent* respectively while in 2002 and 2003 there was a shift to *Colombia* as the main source accounting for *44.8 per cent* and *38.8 per cent* respectively. For these two years the *United States of America* contributed *26.5 per cent* and *7.9 per cent* respectively.

The *United States of America* was the main source for imports of *durum wheat* accounting for almost all of the imports of this commodity over the period. Jamaica's imports of this commodity moved from EC\$32.3 Mn in 2000 to EC\$72.0 Mn in 2003.

For imports of *oil-cake and other solid residues, etc*, the extra-regional market was the dominant source with the *United States of America* on average accounting for almost *91.0 per cent* over the period.

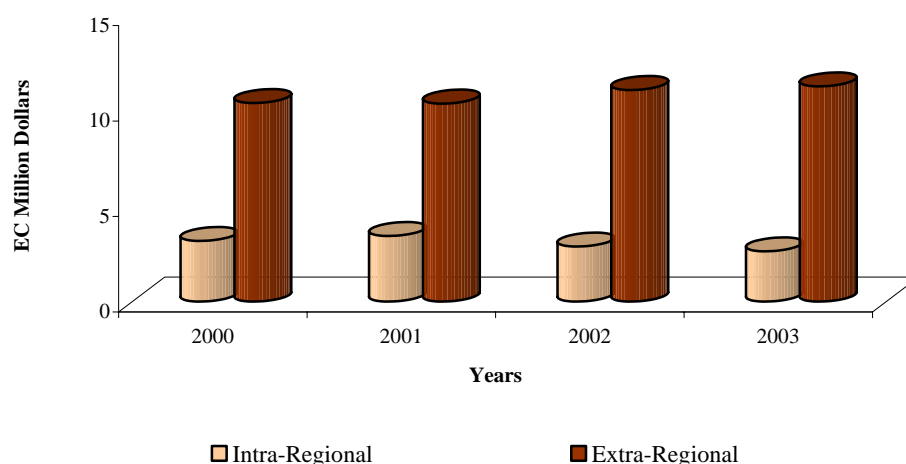
The extra-regional market was also the dominant source for Jamaica's imports of *other coniferous wood sawn or clipped lengthwise, etc* accounting for almost all of the imports of this commodity. Over the period, the *United States of America* was the major supplier with percentage contributions declining from *82.5 per cent* in 2000 to *46.2 per cent* in 2002 followed by *63.5 per cent* in 2003. *Honduras* was another top supplier accounting for *16.7 per cent* in 2000, *53.4 per cent* in 2002 and *35.7 per cent* in 2003 (**Table 2.8**).

## MONTSERRAT

For the period, 2000–2003, Montserrat's total agricultural imports were obtained mainly from the extra-regional market. In 2000, *76.6 per cent* (EC\$10.4 Mn) of Montserrat's agricultural imports was from extra-regional sources while *23.4 per cent* (EC\$3.2 Mn) originated from intra-regional sources. The contribution of the intra-regional market as a source for the total

agricultural imports decreased over time to 18.9 per cent (EC\$2.6 Mn) in 2003, which implied that the extra-regional market contributed 81.1 per cent (EC\$11.3 Mn) (**Annex III (a) and (b)**).

**Table 2.9** revealed that over the period, 2000–2003, there was a shift from the intra-regional market to the extra-regional market for imports of *beer*. The intra-regional market accounted for 57.5 per cent in 2000 but its percentage contribution decreased steadily over the period to 51.6 per cent in 2001, 32.3 per cent in 2002 and 14.7 per cent in 2003. *Saint Lucia* and *Trinidad and Tobago* were the two major intra-regional suppliers with combined contributions of 54.7 per cent in 2000 and 50.5 per cent in 2001 decreasing to 9.9 per cent (*Trinidad and Tobago* only) in 2003. On the other hand, the percentage contribution of the extra-regional market to Montserrat's imports of *beer* expanded from 42.5 per cent in 2000, to 67.7 per cent in 2002 followed by 85.3 per cent in 2003. *The Netherlands* was the major extra-regional source of *beer* imports accounting for 32.9 per cent in 2000 and 62.8 per cent in 2003.

The *United States of America* accounted for almost all of Montserrat's imports of *other coniferous woods* over the period. Imports of this commodity totaled approximately EC\$0.5 Mn in both 2000 and 2003.

For imports of *other waters, including mineral waters and aerated waters etc*, there was a shift from the intra-regional market to the extra-regional market as the main source of imports of these commodities over the period. For this commodity, the percentage contribution of the intra-regional market declined from 71.5 per cent in 2000 to 48.4 per cent in 2003 while the extra-regional market expanded from 28.5 per cent in 2000 to more than 51.0 per cent for 2001-2003. The major suppliers were *St. Kitts and Nevis* (59.1 per cent) in 2000 and the *United States of America* for the period 2001 – 2003, with percentage contributions of 30.6 per cent, 44.8 per cent and 42.9 per cent respectively.

The dominance of the intra-regional and extra-regional market fluctuated over the period for imports of *aerated beverages*. The percentage contribution of the intra-regional market for this commodity moved from 41.8 per cent in 2000 to 46.0 per cent in 2003, with the highest percentage contribution of 52.7 per cent occurring in 2002. The percentage contribution of the extra-regional market moved from 58.2 per cent in 2000 to 47.3 per cent in 2002 and 54.0 per cent in 2003. *Trinidad and Tobago* was the top source of this commodity throughout the period accounting for 39.3 per cent, 47.5 per cent and 39.3 per cent in 2000, 2002 and 2003

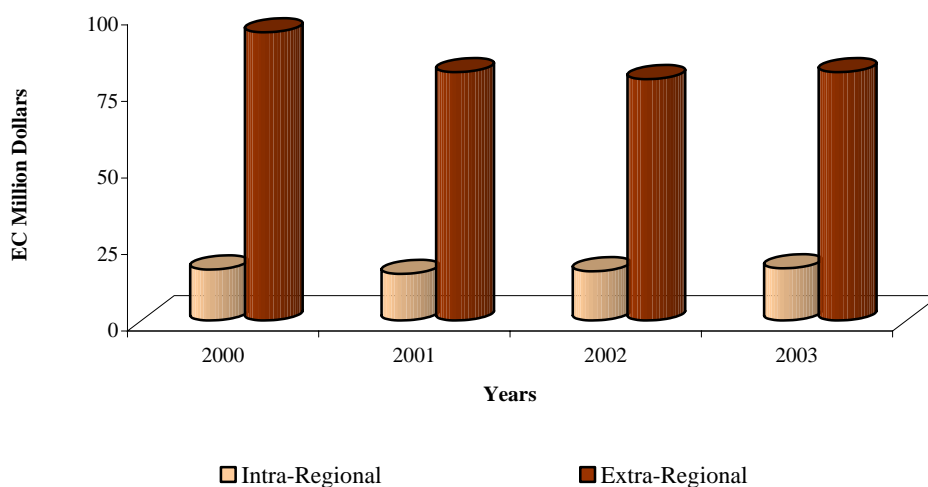


respectively. For the extra-regional market, the *United States of America* and *Puerto Rico* were major suppliers with combined percentage contributions of *51.0 per cent* in 2000 and *50.9 per cent* in 2003.

## ST. KITTS AND NEVIS

For the period, 2000–2003, St. Kitts and Nevis' total agricultural imports originated mainly from the extra-regional market. In 2000, *85.0 per cent* (EC\$94.1 Mn) of St. Kitts and Nevis' agricultural imports was from extra-regional sources while *15.0 per cent* (EC\$16.6 Mn) was obtained from intra-regional sources. The contribution of the intra-regional market as a source for the total agricultural imports increased over time to *17.3 per cent* (EC\$17.0 Mn) in 2003, which implied that the extra-regional market contributed *82.7 per cent* (EC\$81.1 Mn) (**Annex III (a) and (b)**).

For the top five agricultural commodities, the intra-regional market was the dominant source for imports of *other wheat or meslin flour* while the extra-regional market was the main source for the remaining commodities.

Imports of *other cuts and offals of fowls etc* originated only from the extra-regional market with the *United States of America* accounting for almost all of the imports of this commodity over the period.

The intra-regional market on average accounted for *27.7 per cent* of *other waters, including mineral waters and aerated waters, etc* while the extra-regional market contributed to *72.3 per cent* of the imports of this commodity. *Jamaica* and *Trinidad and Tobago* were the top intra-regional suppliers of this commodity with combined percentage contributions of *24.5 per cent* in 2000 and *31.5 per cent* in 2003 while the *United States of America* with percentage contributions of *48.8 per cent* in 2000 and *45.3 per cent* in 2003 was the top extra-regional supplier.

The dominant source for imports of *other wheat or meslin flour* was the intra-regional market. This market on average accounted for *96.4 per cent* of the imports of this commodity with *Grenada* as the top supplier contributing to *89.6 per cent* in 2000 and *89.4 per cent* in 2003.

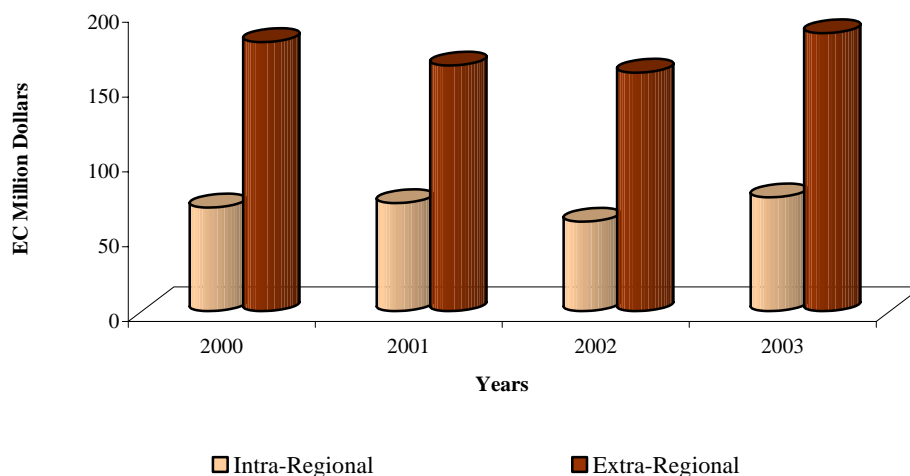


For imports of *aerated beverages*, the intra-regional market on average supplied 42.4 per cent of the commodity while the extra-regional market accounted for 57.6 per cent. The major sources for this commodity were *Trinidad and Tobago* with 30.0 per cent and 26.9 per cent in 2000 and 2001 respectively and the *United States of America* with 23.6 per cent and 31.7 per cent in 2002 and 2003 respectively (**Table 2.10**).

## SAINT LUCIA

For the period, 2000–2003, Saint Lucia’s total agricultural imports were sourced mainly from the extra-regional market. In 2000, 72.2 per cent (EC\$179.8 Mn) of Saint Lucia’s agricultural imports came from extra-regional sources while 27.8 per cent (EC\$69.3 Mn) originated from intra-regional sources. The contribution of the intra-regional market as a source for the total agricultural imports increased over time to 29.0 per cent (EC\$76.0 Mn) in 2003, which implied that the extra-regional market contributed 71.0 per cent (EC\$185.8 Mn) (**Annex III (a) and (b)**).

Of Saint Lucia’s top five agricultural commodities, the intra-regional market was the dominant source for imports of *other wheat or meslin flour* while the extra-regional market was the major source for the remainder of the top five commodities.

For imports of *other wheat or meslin flour*, the intra-regional market on average accounted for 98.5 per cent over the period. The top suppliers were *St. Vincent and the Grenadines* with 47.2 per cent, 39.9 per cent and 51.9 per cent in 2000, 2001 and 2003 respectively and *Grenada* with 52.6 per cent in 2002.

The *United States of America* on average accounted for almost all of Saint Lucia’s imports of *other cuts and offals of fowls, frozen* over the period.

The dominant market for imports of *other milk and cream, in powder, granules or other solid forms, etc* was the extra-regional market which accounted for 86.1 per cent and 75.8 per cent in 2000 and 2003 respectively. For 2000, *France* was the top supplier with 82.5 per cent while in

2003 *Argentina* and *Canada* were the major suppliers accounting 39.5 per cent and 29.0 per cent respectively.

Over the period, the extra-regional market accounted for almost all of this Member State's imports of *other wine in containers holding two litres or less*. For the period 2000– 2002, *France* was the top source of this commodity accounting for approximately 42.0 per cent over the period. In 2003, the *United States of America* accounted for approximately 51.0 per cent of the imports of this commodity. (Table 2.11).

## ST. VINCENT AND THE GRENADINES

For the period, 2000–2003, St Vincent and the Grenadines' total agricultural imports were obtained mainly from the extra-regional market. In 2000, 69.5 per cent (EC\$87.8 Mn) of St. Vincent and the Grenadines' agricultural imports originated from extra-regional sources while 30.5 per cent (EC\$38.4 Mn) was from intra-regional sources. The contribution of the intra-regional market as a source for the total agricultural imports decreased over time to 27.4 per cent (EC\$34.7 Mn) in 2003, which implied that the extra-regional market contributed 72.6 per cent (EC\$92.2 Mn) (Annex III (a) and (b)).

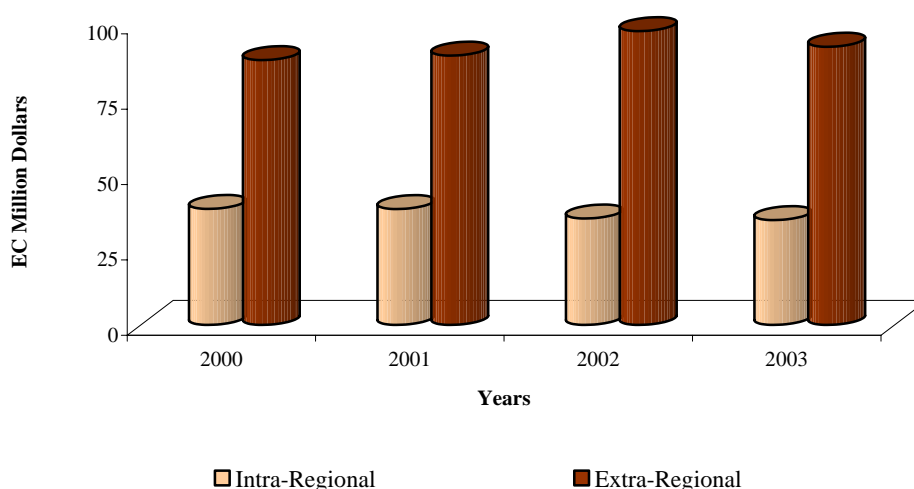


Table 2.12 shows that for 2000–2003, the *United States of America* accounted for almost all of the imports of *other wheat (including spelt)* and *meslin, unmilled* and *other cuts and offals of fowls, frozen*. In 2000, imports of *other wheat (including spelt)* and *meslin, unmilled* amounted to EC\$5.6 Mn, expanding to EC\$7.9 Mn in 2003 while imports of *other cuts and offals of fowls, frozen* were EC\$5.8 Mn in 2000 but declined marginally to EC\$5.7 Mn in 2003.

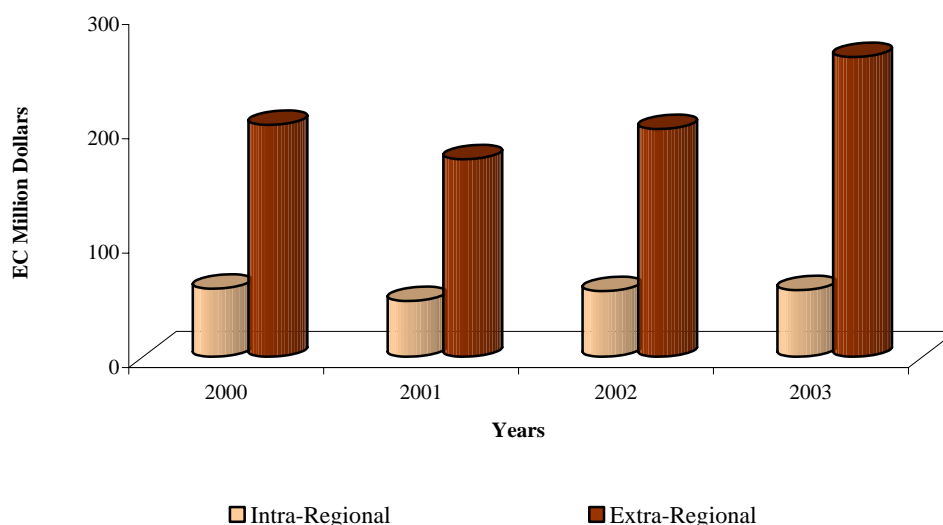
For imports of *fowl wings frozen*, the *United Kingdom* was the major supplier accounting for 91.5 per cent in 2000 and 90.4 per cent in 2003.

Over the period, 2000-2003, approximately all of this Member State's imports of *other coniferous woods* came from the extra-regional market. The top supplier of this commodity was the *United States of America*, which on average accounted for approximately 71.0 per cent over the period.

## SURINAME

For the period, 2000–2003, Suriname’s total agricultural imports were obtained mainly from the extra-regional market. In 2000, 77.3 *per cent* (EC\$202.7 Mn) of Suriname’s agricultural imports came from extra-regional sources while 22.7 *per cent* (EC\$59.4 Mn) originated from intra-regional sources. The contribution of the intra-regional market as a source for the total agricultural imports decreased over time to 18.2 *per cent* (EC\$58.2 Mn) in 2003, which implied that the extra-regional market contributed 81.8 *per cent* (EC\$262.0 Mn) (**Annex III (a) and (b)**).

Of Suriname’s top five agricultural commodities, the intra-regional market was the dominant source for imports of *flour of durum wheat* for 2001 and 2002 while the extra-regional market was the major source for the remaining commodities.

Almost all of Suriname’s imports of *other cuts and offals of fowls etc* originated from the extra-regional market. The *United States of America* with percentage contribution ranging from 97.6 *per cent* in 2000 to 84.3 *per cent* in 2003 was the main source of this commodity.

The extra-regional market contributed to all Suriname’s imports of *other soya-bean oil and its fractions, etc* in 2000 and 97.0 *per cent* in 2003, of which, *The Netherlands* was the main supplier accounting for 95.3 *per cent* in 2000 and 85.1 *per cent* in 2003.

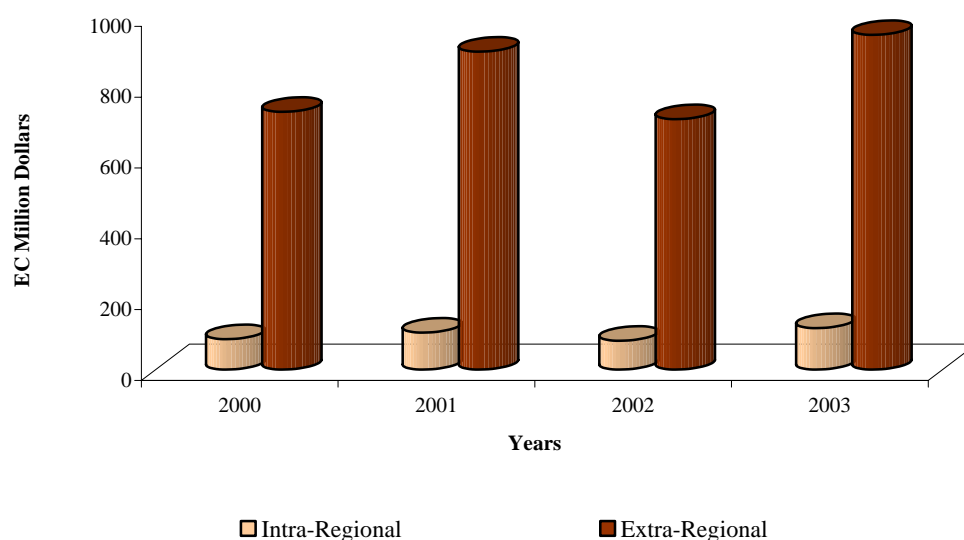
Over the period, 2000-2003, the major suppliers of *flour of durum wheat* fluctuated between the intra-regional and extra-regional markets. The intra-regional market was the dominant supplier of this commodity in 2001 and 2002 accounting for 88.9 *per cent* and 72.8 *per cent* respectively while the extra-regional market captured this position in 2000 and 2003 with contribution of approximately 97.0 *per cent* in both years. For 2001 and 2002, *Trinidad and Tobago* was the major source of this commodity while for 2000 and 2003; *The Netherlands* was the top supplier accounting for 67.1 *per cent* and 94.4 *per cent* respectively.

*Other cane and beet sugar and chemically pure sucrose, etc* were imported exclusively from the extra-regional market with an average of 75.6 per cent originating from *The Netherlands* over the period (Table 2.13).

## TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

For the period, 2000–2003, Trinidad and Tobago’s total agricultural imports were obtained mainly from the extra-regional market. In 2000, 89.4 per cent (EC\$727.9 Mn) of Trinidad and Tobago’s agricultural imports was from extra-regional sources while 10.6 per cent (EC\$85.9 Mn) originated from intra-regional sources. The contribution of the intra-regional market as a source for the total agricultural imports increased marginally over time to 10.6 per cent (EC\$117.2 Mn) in 2003, which implied that the extra-regional market contributed 89.4 per cent (EC\$945.2 Mn) (Annex III (a) and (b)).

Trinidad and Tobago’s top five agricultural imports were obtained mainly from the extra-regional market, except for imports of *cane sugar* which were imported from both intra-regional and extra-regional markets over the period, 2000–2003.

All of this Member State’s imports of *other soya beans, etc* originated from the extra-regional market. For 2000, *Canada* was the top supplier of this commodity accounting for 97.3 per cent while for the period 2001-2003, the *United States of America* was the main source of this commodity accounting for almost all of the imports of this commodity.

For imports of *other preparations of a kind used in animal feeding*, the extra-regional market accounted for 89.7 per cent in 2000 and almost all of the imports of this commodity for the period, 2001-2003. The *United States of America* was dominant market with percentage contributions ranging from 85.9 per cent in 2000 to 90.6 per cent in 2003.

Over the period, the *United States of America* accounted for almost all the imports of *other wheat (including spelt) and meslin, unmilled*. Imports of this commodity increased from EC\$6.7 Mn in 2000 to EC\$44.2 Mn in 2003.

Trinidad and Tobago obtained an average of *61.1 per cent* of imports of *cane sugar* from the intra-regional market while *38.9 per cent* was sourced from the extra-regional market. In 2000, *Colombia* was the major supplier accounting for *41.4 per cent* while for the period, 2001–2003, *Guyana* accounted for *35.9 per cent*, *86.1 per cent* and *86.0 per cent* respectively (**Table 2.14**).

## Section 3

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### CARICOM's Total Agricultural Domestic Exports

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## AN OVERVIEW OF CARICOM's AGRICULTURAL DOMESTIC EXPORTS

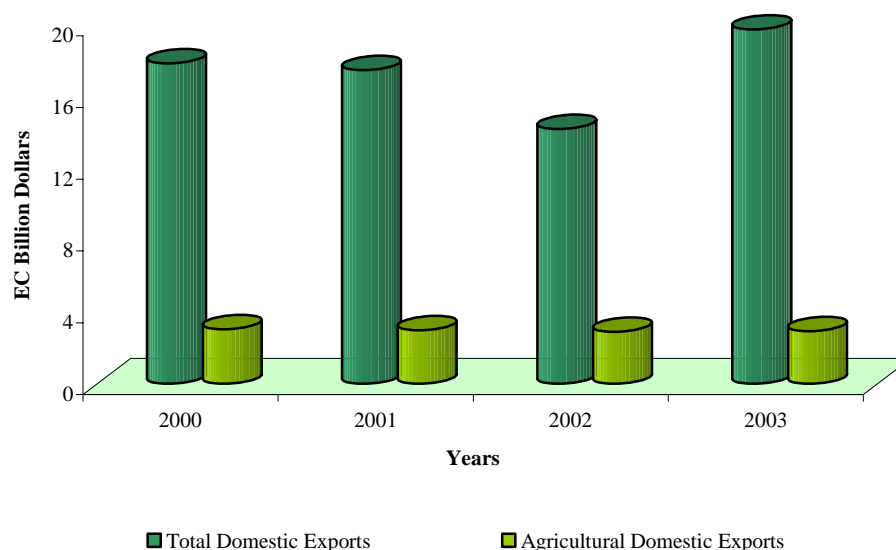
### CARICOM

Over the period, 2000-2003, CARICOM's total agricultural domestic exports to all destinations experienced a decline moving from EC\$3.0 Bn (US\$1.1 Bn) in 2000 to EC\$2.9 Bn (US\$1.1 Bn) in 2003, contributing an average of 17.3 per cent of total domestic exports to all destinations over the period. The section, *food and live animals* was the highest contributor to total agricultural domestic exports with EC\$2.5 Bn (US\$0.9 Bn) in 2000 and EC\$2.3 Bn (US\$0.9 Bn) in 2003, accounting on average for 14.1 per cent of CARICOM's total domestic exports to all destinations over the period. *Food* accounted for almost all of the domestic exports of this section and on average comprised approximately 80.0 per cent of CARICOM's total agricultural domestic exports to all destinations.

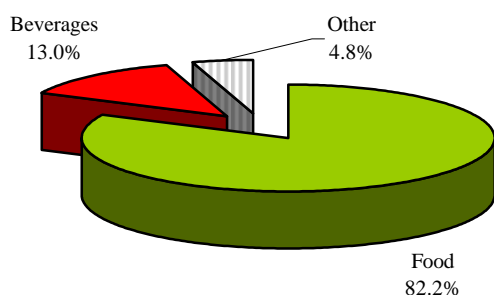
The section, *beverages and tobacco*, was the next highest category exported accounting for an average percentage contribution of 2.7 per cent of total domestic exports to all destinations over the period. *Beverages* on average accounted for 2.5 per cent of total domestic exports to all destinations.

For 2003, some of the major agricultural domestic exports at the division level were *sugar, sugar preparations and honey* (EC\$758.3Mn), *vegetables and fruit* (EC\$549.4Mn) and *beverages* (EC\$445.9Mn). These divisions collectively represented 8.9 per cent of CARICOM's total domestic exports to all destinations (**Table 3.1**).

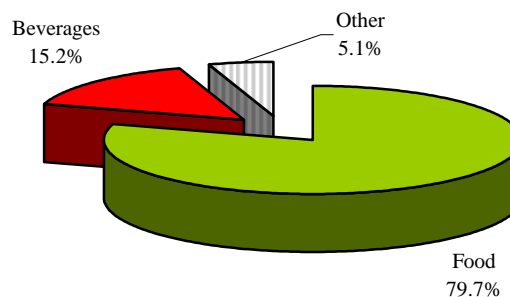
Figure 3.1: Value of CARICOM's Agricultural Domestic Exports and Total Domestic Exports: 2000 - 2003



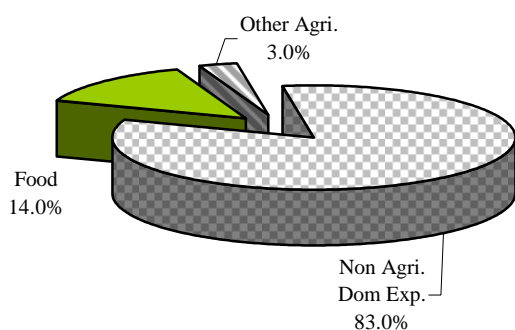
**Figure 3.2: Percentage Distribution of

2000**



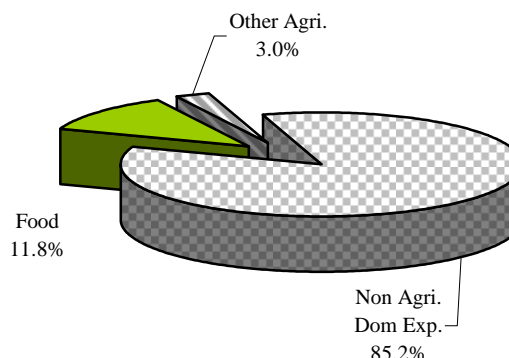
**Figure 3.3: Percentage Distribution of

In 2003, **Table 3.2** revealed that the Region's top five agricultural domestic exports were:

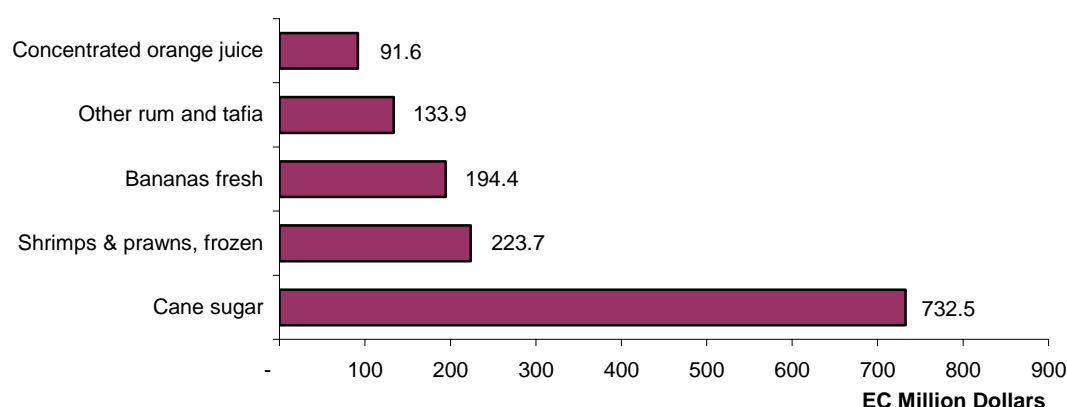
- *cane sugar* (EC\$732.5 Mn);
- *shrimps and prawns, frozen* (EC\$223.7 Mn);
- *bananas, fresh* (EC\$194.4 Mn);
- *other rum and tafia* (EC\$133.9 Mn) and
- *concentrated orange juice* (EC\$91.6 Mn)

The top five agricultural domestic exports represented *49.0 per cent* of CARICOM's total agricultural domestic exports to all destinations in 2000 and *46.9 per cent* of the corresponding total in 2003.

For these top commodities, CARICOM's domestic exports of *cane sugar* decreased from EC\$838.1 Mn in 2000 to EC\$732.5 in 2003 at an average annual growth rate of *-4.4 per cent* while its domestic exports of *shrimps and prawns, frozen* increased from EC\$154.2 Mn in 2000 to EC\$223.7 Mn in 2003 at an average annual growth rate of *13.2 per cent* over the period. Domestic exports of *bananas, fresh* also declined over the period moving from EC\$255.8 Mn in 2000 to EC\$194.4 Mn in 2003 at an average annual growth rate of *-8.7 per cent* while domestic exports of *other rum and tafia* rose from EC\$119.2 Mn in 2000 to EC\$133.9 Mn in 2003 at an

annual growth rate of 3.9 per cent. For concentrated orange juice, domestic exports declined to EC\$91.6 Mn in 2003 from EC\$123.3 Mn in 2000 at an annual growth rate of -9.4 per cent.

## ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA

For the period under review, data for Antigua and Barbuda were available for the year 2000 only. Total agricultural domestic exports amounted to EC\$2.3 Mn or 28.5 per cent of total domestic exports to all destinations for Antigua and Barbuda in 2000<sup>2</sup> (**Annex II (a)-(c)**).

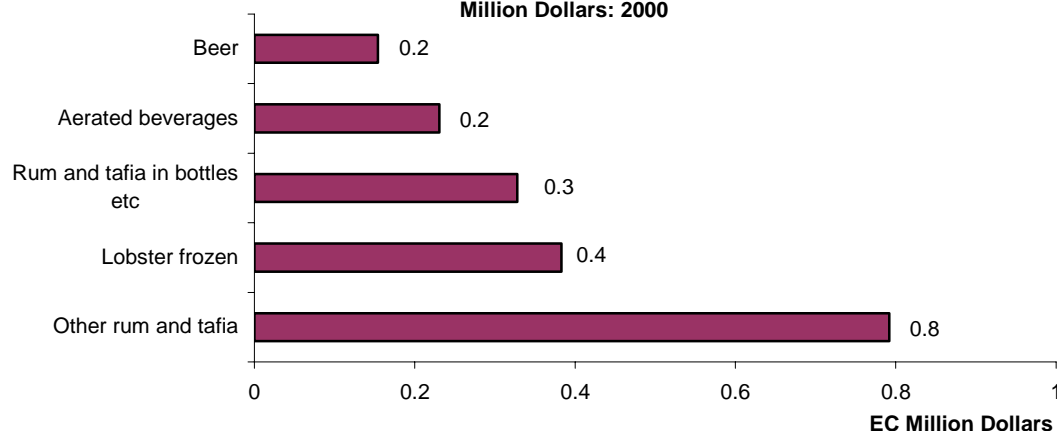
The top five agricultural domestic exports for this Member State in 2000 were:

- *other rum and tafia* (EC\$0.8 Mn);
- *lobster, frozen* (EC\$0.4 Mn);
- *rum and tafia in bottles of a strength not exceeding 46% volume* (EC\$0.3 Mn);
- *aerated beverages* (EC\$0.2 Mn) and
- *beer* (EC\$0.2 Mn)

These top five agricultural domestic exports amounted to EC\$1.9 Mn or 81.1 per cent of Antigua and Barbuda's total agricultural domestic exports to all destinations. *Other rum and tafia* and *lobster, frozen* together accounted for EC\$1.2 Mn or 50.4 per cent of Antigua and Barbuda's total agricultural domestic exports to all destinations (**Table 3.3**).

## BARBADOS

Total agricultural domestic exports were EC\$171.2 Mn or 38.5 *per cent* of total domestic exports to all destinations for Barbados in 2003, representing a decrease over the figure recorded in 2000, EC\$195.3 Mn or 38.0 *per cent* of total domestic exports to all destinations<sup>3</sup> (**Annex II (a)-(c)**).

Barbados' top five agricultural domestic exports in 2003 were:

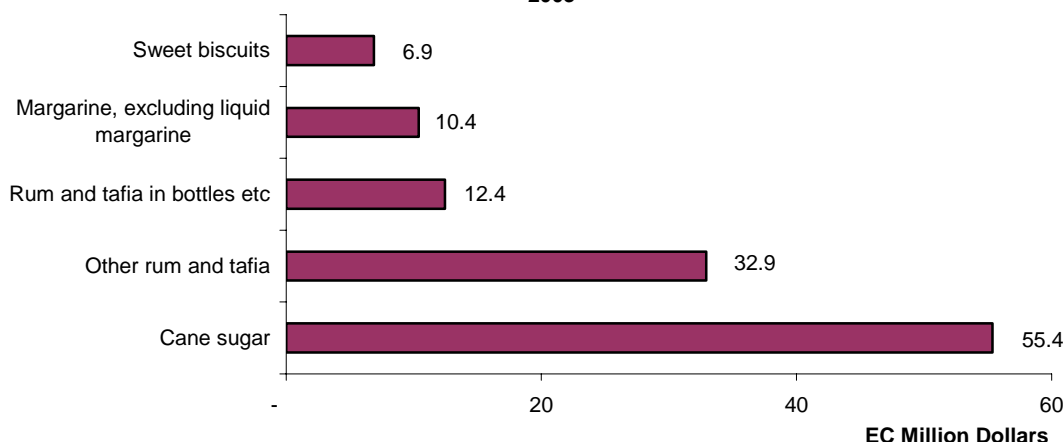
- *cane sugar* (EC\$55.4 Mn);
- *other rum and tafia* (EC\$32.9 Mn);
- *rum and tafia in bottles of a strength not exceeding 46% volume* (EC\$12.4 Mn);
- *margarine, excluding liquid margarine* (EC\$10.4 Mn) and
- *sweet biscuits* (EC\$6.9 Mn)

Over the period, 2000–2003, Barbados' top five agricultural domestic exports amounted to EC\$122.6 Mn or 62.8 *per cent* of its total agricultural domestic exports in 2000 as compared to EC\$118.0 Mn or 68.9 *per cent* of its total agricultural domestic exports in 2003.

For domestic exports of *cane sugar*, earnings decreased from EC\$71.9 Mn in 2000 to EC\$55.4 Mn in 2003 while domestic exports of *other rum and tafia* increased from EC\$23.4 Mn in 2000 to EC\$32.9 in 2003. Domestic exports of *rum and tafia in bottles of a strength not exceeding 46% volume* rose from EC\$9.7 Mn in 2000 to EC\$13.5 Mn in 2002 but decreased to EC\$12.4 Mn in 2003 while domestic exports of *margarine, excluding liquid margarine* stood at EC\$10.4 Mn in 2000 and 2003. For *sweet biscuits*, domestic exports decreased from EC\$7.2 Mn in 2000 to EC\$6.9 Mn in 2003 (**Table 3.4**).

## BELIZE

Total agricultural domestic exports amounted to EC\$468.5 Mn or *91.0 per cent* of total domestic exports to all destinations for Belize in 2003, reflecting an increase over the value registered in 2000, EC\$444.6 Mn or *88.8 per cent* of total domestic exports to all destinations (**Annex II (a)-(c)**).

Belize's top five agricultural domestic exports in 2003 were:

- *shrimps and prawns, frozen* (EC\$125.2 Mn);
- *cane sugar* (EC\$96.2 Mn);
- *concentrated orange juice* (EC\$88.5 Mn);
- *bananas, fresh* (EC\$71.0 Mn) and
- *papaws (papayas)* (EC\$22.6 Mn)

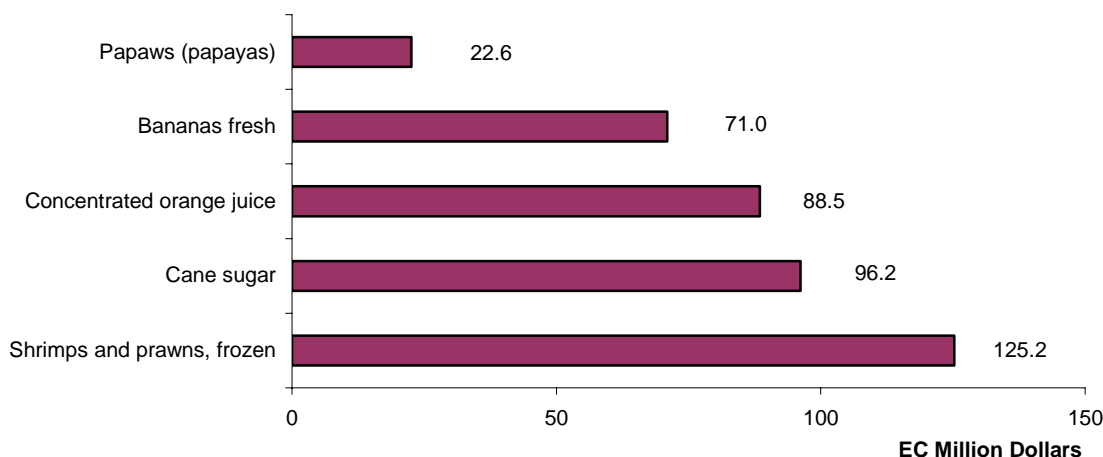
Belize's top five agricultural domestic exports amounted to EC\$349.0 Mn or *78.5 per cent* of its total agricultural domestic exports in 2000 as compared to EC\$403.4 Mn or *86.1 per cent* of its total agricultural domestic exports in 2003.

**Table 3.5** shows that Belize's domestic exports of *shrimps and prawns* increased from EC\$62.6 Mn in 2000 to EC\$125.2 Mn in 2003, which represented *14.1 per cent* and *26.7 per cent* respectively of its total agricultural domestic exports for these years. The average annual growth rate of *shrimps and prawns* over the period was *26.0 per cent*. Earnings from domestic exports of *cane sugar* declined from EC\$100.2 Mn in 2000 to EC\$96.2 Mn in 2003, at an average annual growth rate of *-1.3 per cent* over the period.

Domestic exports of *concentrated orange juice* decreased from EC\$118.0 Mn in 2000 to EC\$88.5 Mn in 2003 while domestic exports of *bananas, fresh* rose from EC\$51.0 Mn in 2000 to EC\$71.0 Mn in 2003. For *papaws*, domestic exports in 2003 amounted to EC\$22.6 Mn representing an increase of *31.4 per cent* over the value recorded in 2000 (EC\$17.2 Mn).

## DOMINICA

For 2003, Dominica's agricultural domestic exports amounted to EC\$39.2 Mn or 38.5 per cent of total domestic exports to all destinations, showing a decrease over the figure recorded for 2000, EC\$58.5 Mn or 42.1 per cent of total domestic exports to all destinations<sup>4</sup> (Annex II (a)-(c)).

The top five agricultural domestic exports for Dominica in 2003 were:

- *bananas, fresh* (EC\$15.9 Mn);
- *plantains, fresh* (EC\$3.5 Mn);
- *essential oils of bay* (EC\$2.5 Mn);
- *pepper sauce* (EC\$2.4 Mn) and
- *avocados* (EC\$1.9 Mn)

Dominica's top five agricultural domestic exports amounted to EC\$26.3 Mn or 67.2 per cent of its total agricultural domestic exports in 2003 decreasing from 45.6 Mn or 77.9 per cent of its total agricultural domestic exports in 2000.

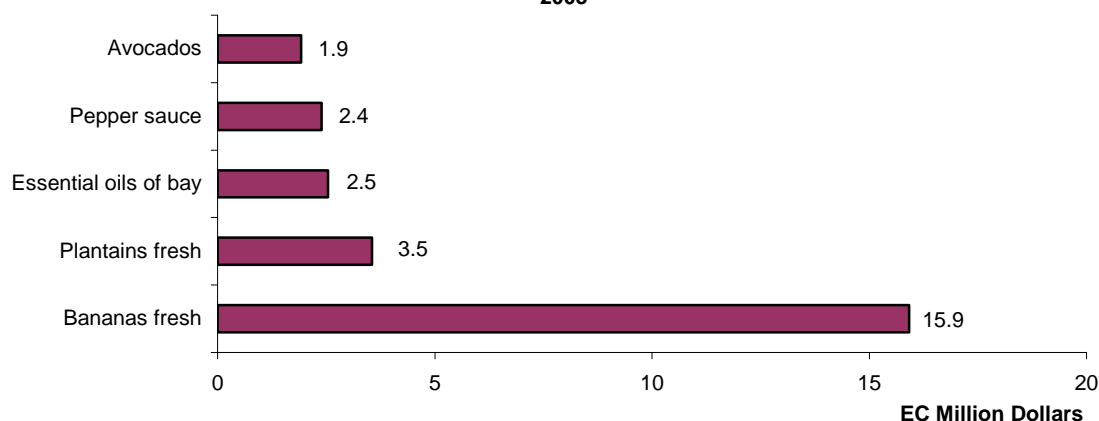
In 2003, Dominica's domestic exports of *bananas, fresh*, amounted to EC\$15.9 Mn which represented a decrease of 53.0 per cent over the value recorded in 2000 (EC\$33.8 Mn). Domestic exports of *bananas, fresh* decreased to 40.6 per cent of total agricultural domestic exports in 2003 from 57.8 per cent in 2000. Domestic exports of *plantains, fresh* decreased over the period moving from EC\$4.1 Mn in 2000 to EC\$3.5 Mn in 2003, representing approximately 15.0 per cent decline over its 2000 value.

Domestic exports of *essential oils of bay* in 2003, were EC\$2.5 Mn representing a decrease of 13.8 per cent over the value registered in 2000 (EC\$2.9 Mn) while for *pepper sauce*, domestic exports decreased from EC\$3.5 in 2000 to EC\$2.4 Mn in 2003, a reduction of approximately 31.0 per cent.

Of the top five commodities, domestic exports of *avocados* was the only commodity that increased over the period moving from EC\$1.3 Mn in 2000 to EC\$1.9 Mn in 2003 (**Table 3.6**).

## GRENADA

Total agricultural domestic exports were EC\$66.6 Mn or 84.8 *per cent* of total domestic exports to all destinations for Grenada in 2003, reflecting a decrease over the figure recorded in 2000, EC\$68.7 Mn or 36.0 *per cent* of total domestic exports to all destinations (**Annex II (a)-(c)**).

The top five agricultural domestic exports for Grenada in 2003 were:

- *nutmeg* (EC\$26.9 Mn);
- *other wheat or meslin flour* (EC\$8.8 Mn);
- *essential oils of nutmeg* (EC\$6.7 Mn);
- *other albacore or long finned tunas* (EC\$4.4 Mn);
- *raw cocoa beans, whole or broken, etc* (EC\$3.3 Mn)

Total value of Grenada's top five agricultural domestic exports amounted to EC\$53.9 Mn or 78.5 *per cent* its total agricultural domestic exports in 2000 as compared to EC\$50.2 Mn or 75.3 *per cent* its total agricultural domestic exports in 2003.

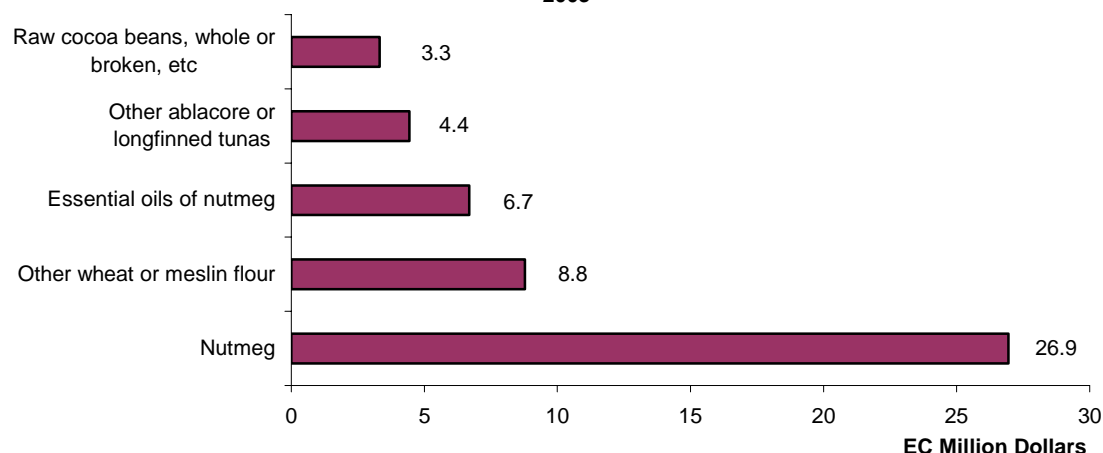
Grenada's domestic exports of *nutmeg* decreased from EC\$32.2 Mn in 2000 to EC\$26.9 Mn in 2003 which represented 46.8 *per cent* and 40.5 *per cent* respectively of its total agricultural domestic exports to all destinations for these years. Its domestic exports of *other wheat or meslin flour* also declined from EC\$12.3 Mn in 2000 to EC\$8.8 Mn in 2003 representing 18.0 *per cent* and 13.2 *per cent* respectively of its total agricultural domestic exports to all destinations.

In 2003, domestic exports of *essential oils of nutmeg* amounted to EC\$6.7 Mn, an increase of EC\$5.5 Mn over the value recorded in 2000 (EC\$1.2 Mn).

Over the period, Grenada's domestic exports of *other albacore or long finned tunas*, increased from EC\$3.9 Mn in 2000 to EC\$4.4 Mn in 2003 while its domestic exports of *raw cocoa beans*,

*whole or broken, raw or roasted* decreased from EC\$4.3 Mn in 2000 to EC\$3.3 Mn in 2003 (**Table 3.7**).

## GUYANA

Total agricultural domestic exports amounted to EC\$720.4 Mn or *53.1 per cent* of total domestic exports to all destinations for Guyana in 2003, representing an increase over the value registered in 2000, EC\$649.3 Mn or *48.8 per cent* of total domestic exports to all destinations<sup>5</sup> (**Annex II (a)-(c)**).

The top five agricultural domestic exports for Guyana in 2003 were:

- *cane sugar* (EC\$347.7 Mn);
- *shrimps and prawns, frozen* (EC\$95.7 Mn);
- *other semi-milled white rice* (EC\$66.5 Mn);
- *other white rice* (EC\$28.5 Mn) and
- *other fish fillets and other fish meat etc* (EC\$21.6 Mn)

Guyana's top five agricultural domestic exports amounted to EC\$560.0 Mn or *77.7 per cent* of its total agricultural domestic exports in 2003 increasing from EC\$513.6 Mn or *79.1 per cent* of its total agricultural domestic exports in 2000.

**Table 3.8** shows that for 2003, Guyana's domestic exports of *cane sugar* were EC\$347.7 Mn in 2003 representing *6.4 per cent* increase over the value recorded in 2000 (EC\$326.7 Mn). This commodity on average accounted for *46.4 per cent* of Guyana's total agricultural domestic exports over the period, 2000–2003.

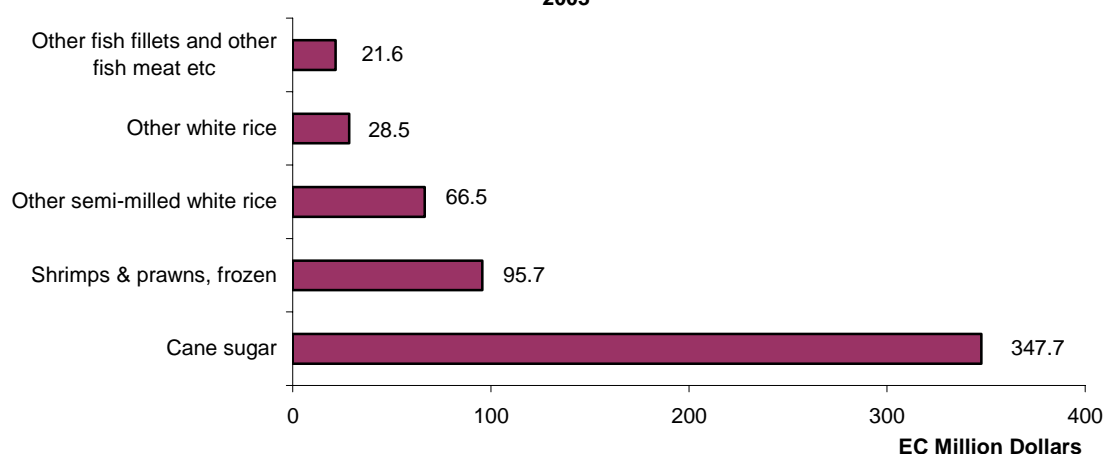
For domestic exports of *shrimps and prawns, frozen*, earnings amounted to EC\$95.7 Mn in 2003 which represents an increase of *7.6 per cent* (EC\$7.3 Mn) over the value registered in 2000 (EC\$88.4 Mn). The values registered in 2000 and 2003 accounted for *13.6 per cent* and *13.3 per cent* respectively of Guyana's total agricultural domestic exports to all destinations.

Domestic exports of *other semi-milled white rice* rose over the period from EC\$45.7 Mn in 2000 to EC\$66.5 Mn in 2003 while domestic exports of *other white rice* dropped from EC\$36.3 Mn in 2000 to EC\$28.5 Mn in 2003.

In 2003, domestic exports of *other fish fillets and other fish meat etc* amounted to EC\$21.6 Mn, representing an increase of approximately 32.0 per cent over the value recorded in 2000 (EC\$16.4 Mn).

## JAMAICA

Total agricultural domestic exports for Jamaica in 2003 amounted to EC\$736.6 Mn or 23.4 per cent of total domestic exports to all destinations, showing a decrease over the figure recorded in 2000, EC\$783.2 Mn or 22.9 per cent of total domestic exports to all destinations<sup>6</sup> (**Annex II (a)-(c)**).

The top five agricultural domestic exports for Jamaica in 2003 were:

- *cane sugar* (EC\$179.0 Mn);
- *beans for blending* (EC\$69.2 Mn);
- *other rum and tafia* (EC\$52.9 Mn);
- *bananas, fresh* (EC\$50.9 Mn) and
- *beer* (EC\$40.0 Mn)

Jamaica's top five agricultural domestic exports amounted to EC\$461.3 Mn in 2000 decreasing to EC\$392.1 Mn in 2003. These commodities together accounted for 58.9 per cent in 2000 and 53.2 per cent in 2003 of its total agricultural domestic exports to all destinations.

For 2000-2003, Jamaica's domestic exports of *cane sugar* earned EC\$224.9 Mn in 2000, declining to EC\$179.0 Mn in 2003. This commodity on average accounted for 25.8 per cent of its total agricultural domestic exports over the period.

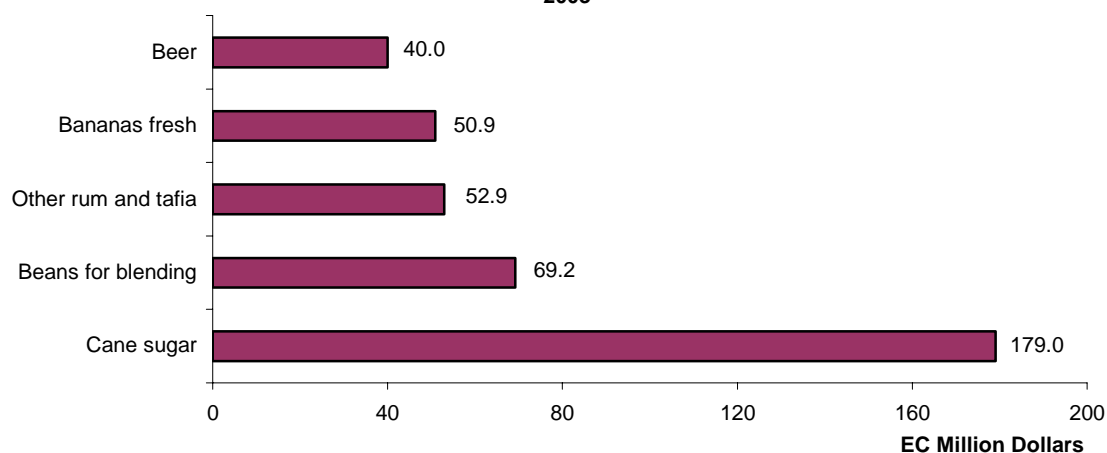

For *beans for blending*, domestic exports amounted to EC\$87.2 Mn in 2000 but decreased to EC\$69.2 Mn in 2003, which represented *11.1 per cent* and *9.4 per cent* respectively of total agricultural domestic exports in the respective years.

Domestic exports of *other rum and tafia* declined from EC\$55.9 Mn in 2000 to EC\$52.9 Mn in 2003, representing a decrease of *5.4 per cent* over the value recorded in 2000 while domestic exports of *bananas, fresh* amounted to EC\$50.9 Mn in 2003 from EC\$61.8 Mn in 2000, a decline of *17.6 per cent*.

In 2003, Jamaica's domestic exports of *beer* rose to EC\$40.0 Mn from EC\$31.4 Mn in 2000, representing an increase of *27.4 per cent* (**Table 3.9**).

## MONTSERRAT

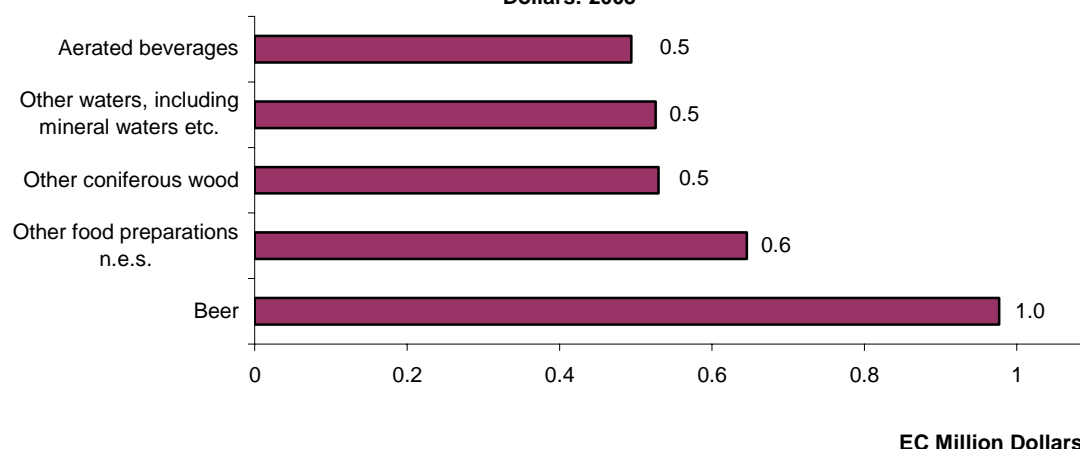
For 2003, there were no agricultural commodities in Montserrat's domestic exports. For 2002, Montserrat's agricultural domestic exports amounted to EC\$2,000 or *40.0 per cent* of its total domestic exports to all destinations. This represented a decline over the value recorded in 2000, EC\$15,000 or *62.5 per cent* of total domestic exports to all destinations (**Annex II (a)-(c)**).

The top five agricultural domestic exports for Montserrat in 2002 were:

- *dogs;*
- *lime juice concentrated;*
- *other waters including natural or artificial waters;*
- *guava jams and jellies;*
- *rum and tafia in bottles of a strength not exceeding 46% volume*

Montserrat's top five agricultural domestic exports amounted to EC\$2.0 Mn in 2002 as compared to a negligible value in 2000. The percentage contribution of these top five agricultural commodities to Montserrat's total agricultural domestic exports represented *97.5 per cent* and *1.3 per cent* in 2003 and 2000 respectively (**Table 3.10**).

## ST. KITTS AND NEVIS

Agricultural domestic exports for St. Kitts and Nevis were EC\$23.5 Mn or *19.3 per cent* of total domestic exports to all destinations in 2003, reflecting an increase over the figure recorded in 2000, EC\$21.1 Mn or *26.8 per cent* of total domestic exports to all destinations<sup>7</sup> (**Annex II (a)-(c)**).

The top five agricultural domestic exports for St. Kitts and Nevis in 2003 were:

- *cane sugar (EC\$19.5 Mn);*
- *other cotton waste etc (EC\$0.7 Mn);*
- *aerated beverages (EC\$0.7 Mn);*
- *conch, frozen (EC\$0.6 Mn) and*
- *margarine, excluding liquid margarine (EC\$0.5 Mn)*

St. Kitts and Nevis' top five agricultural domestic exports amounted to EC\$17.9 Mn or *84.7 per cent* of its total agricultural domestic exports in 2000 as compared to EC\$22.1 Mn or *94.0 per cent* of its total agricultural domestic exports in 2003.

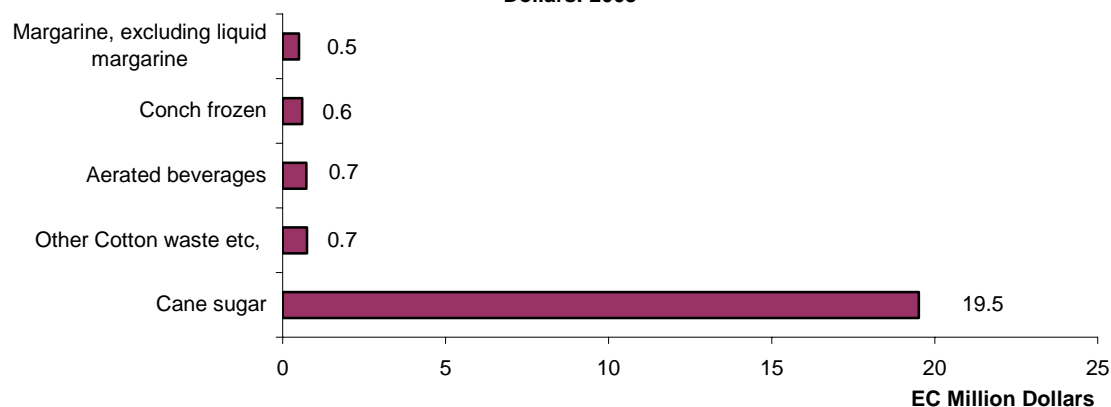
For *cane sugar*, St. Kitts and Nevis' domestic exports grew steadily over the period moving from EC\$15.8 Mn to EC\$19.5 Mn in 2003. The percentage contribution of this commodity on average accounted for *82.8 per cent* of St. Kitts and Nevis' total agricultural domestic exports over the period 2000-2003.

*Other cotton waste etc (EC\$0.7 Mn)* was exported only in 2003 while domestic exports of *aerated beverages* decreased from EC\$0.8 Mn in 2000 to EC\$0.7 Mn in 2003 representing *3.6 per cent* and *3.1 per cent* respectively of St. Kitts and Nevis' total agricultural domestic exports to all destinations.

Domestic exports of *conch*, frozen rose slightly from EC\$0.5 Mn in 2000 to EC\$0.6 Mn in 2003 while domestic exports of *margarine, excluding liquid margarine* dropped from EC\$0.8 Mn in 2000 to EC\$0.5 Mn in 2003 (**Table 3.11**).

## SAINT LUCIA

For 2003, Saint Lucia's agricultural domestic exports amounted to EC\$76.8 Mn or 73.3 *per cent* of total domestic exports to all destinations, reflecting a decrease over the value recorded in 2000, EC\$87.1 Mn or 78.7 *per cent* of total agricultural domestic exports to all destinations<sup>8</sup> (**Annex II (a)-(c)**).

The top five agricultural domestic exports for Saint Lucia in 2003 were:

- *bananas, fresh* (EC\$44.0 Mn);
- *beer* (EC\$22.6 Mn);
- *aerated beverages* (EC\$2.7 Mn);
- *liqueurs and cordials* (EC\$2.0 Mn) and
- *other rum and tafia* (EC\$1.1 Mn)

Saint Lucia's top five agricultural domestic exports amounted to EC\$82.7 Mn in 2000 as compared to EC\$72.4 Mn in 2003. Over the period 2000–2003, Saint Lucia's top five agricultural domestic exports represented over 94.0 *per cent* of its total agricultural domestic exports to all destinations with the highest percentage contribution of 95.2 *per cent* recorded in 2001.

Domestic exports of *bananas, fresh* increased from EC\$58.9 Mn in 2000 to EC\$91.3 Mn in 2001 but declined steadily thereafter to EC\$44.0 Mn in 2003 representing percentage contribution of 67.6 *per cent* in 2000 and 57.3 *per cent* in 2003.

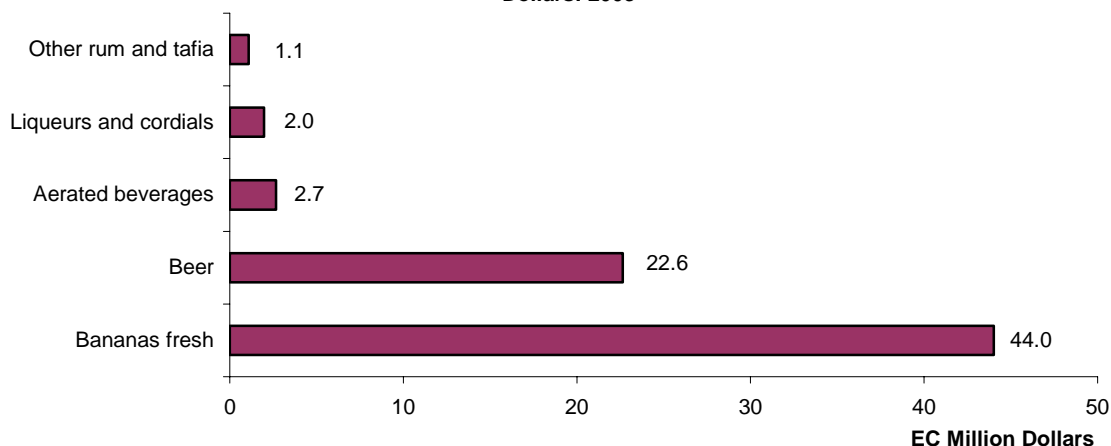
Saint Lucia's domestic exports of *beer* totaled EC\$20.0 Mn in 2000 and increased EC\$22.6 Mn in 2003, representing 22.9 *per cent* and 29.5 *per cent* respectively of its total agricultural

domestic exports. For *aerated beverages*, domestic exports declined from EC\$3.8 Mn in 2000 to EC\$2.7 Mn in 2003.

For *liqueurs and cordials* and *other rum and tafia*, domestic exports rose from a negligible amount in 2000 to EC\$2.0 Mn and EC\$1.1 Mn respectively in 2003 (**Table 3.12**).

## ST. VINCENT AND THE GRENADINES

Agricultural domestic exports amounted to EC\$55.1 Mn or 87.3 *per cent* of total domestic exports to all destinations for St Vincent and the Grenadines in 2003, showing a decrease over the figure registered in 2000, EC\$101.7 Mn or 86.8 *per cent* of its total agricultural domestic exports to all destinations<sup>9</sup> (**Annex II (a)-(c)**).

The top five agricultural domestic exports for St Vincent and the Grenadines in 2003 were:

- *wheat or meslin flour of durum wheat* (EC\$12.8 Mn);
- *bananas fresh* (EC\$12.0 Mn);
- *wholly milled parboiled rice in packages etc* (EC\$5.6 Mn);
- *dasheens* (EC\$3.5 Mn) and
- *malt beverages* (EC\$3.3 Mn)

Over the period, St Vincent and the Grenadines' top five agricultural domestic exports decreased from EC\$76.8 Mn or 75.5 *per cent* of its total agricultural domestic exports in 2000 to EC\$37.1 Mn or 67.4 *per cent* of its total agricultural domestic exports in 2003.

Domestic exports of *wheat or meslin flour of durum wheat* decreased from EC\$14.8 Mn in 2000 to EC\$12.8 Mn in 2003, representing 14.5 *per cent* and 23.2 *per cent* of this Member State's total agricultural domestic exports in the respective years.

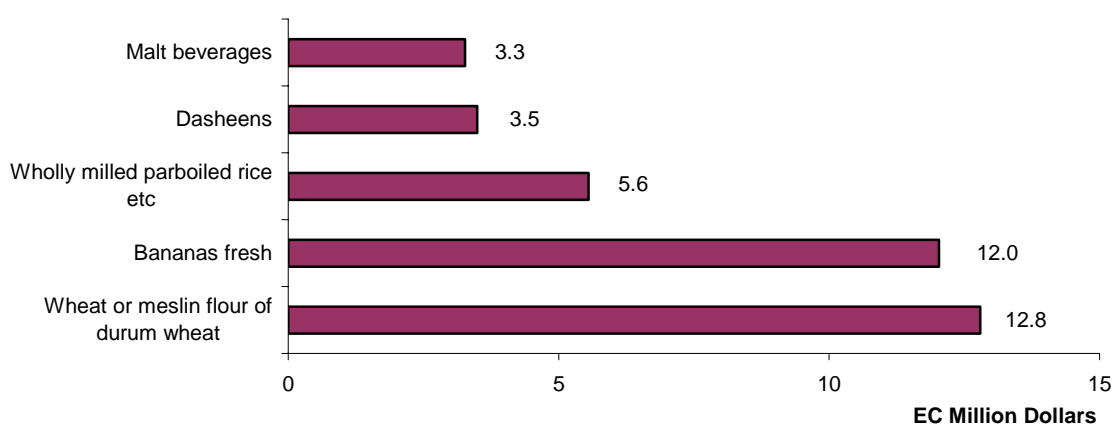


For *bananas, fresh*, earnings from domestic exports of this commodity amounted to EC\$12.0 Mn in 2003, which represents a decrease of 75.8 *per cent* of its earnings in 2000 (EC\$49.5 Mn). These values accounted for percentage contributions of 48.7 *per cent* in 2000 and 21.8 *per cent* in 2003 of total agricultural domestic exports.

Domestic exports of *wholly milled parboiled rice etc.* decreased from EC\$6.0 Mn in 2000 to EC\$5.6 Mn in 2003, a drop of 6.7 *per cent* while domestic exports of *dasheens* stood at EC\$3.5 Mn in both 2000 and 2003.

In 2003, domestic exports of *malt beverages* rose by 6.5 *per cent*, from EC\$3.1 Mn in 2000 to EC\$3.3 Mn in 2003 (**Table 3.13**).

## TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

Total agricultural domestic exports were EC\$573.8 Mn or 4.2 *per cent* of total domestic exports to all destinations for Trinidad and Tobago in 2003, declining from EC\$628.4 Mn or 5.5 *per cent* of total domestic exports to all destinations in 2000. As compared to other Member States, Trinidad and Tobago reflected the smallest contribution for its agricultural domestic exports to total domestic exports to all destinations<sup>10</sup> (**Annex II (a)-(c)**).

The top five agricultural domestic exports for Trinidad and Tobago in 2003 were:

- *aerated beverages* (EC\$75.7 Mn);
- *cigarettes containing tobacco* (EC\$40.7 Mn);
- *cane sugar* (EC\$34.8 Mn);
- *other rum and tafia* (EC\$28.3 Mn) and
- *oil-cake and other solid residues, etc.* (EC\$23.0 Mn).

Over the period, Trinidad and Tobago's top five agricultural domestic exports decreased from EC\$258.3 Mn or 41.1 *per cent* of its total agricultural domestic exports in 2000 to EC\$202.5 Mn or 35.3 *per cent* of its total agricultural domestic exports in 2003.

Analysis of **Table 3.14** indicated that Trinidad and Tobago's domestic exports of *aerated beverages* declined from EC\$84.3 Mn in 2000 to EC\$75.7 Mn in 2003 while for its domestic exports of *cigarettes containing tobacco*, earnings increased from EC\$25.0 Mn in 2000 to EC\$40.7 Mn in 2003, representing an increase of 62.8 *per cent* over its 2000 value.

Domestic exports of *cane sugar* decreased from EC\$98.5 Mn in 2000 to EC\$34.8 Mn in 2003 representing a decline of 64.7 *per cent* over the value recorded in 2000 while domestic exports of *other rum and tafia* dropped from EC\$30.2 Mn in 2000 to EC\$28.3 Mn in 2003, a decrease of 6.4 *per cent*.

For *oil-cake and other solid residues, whether or not ground etc*, domestic exports rose from EC\$20.3 Mn in 2000 to EC\$34.4 Mn in 2001 but declined thereafter to EC\$23.0 Mn in 2003.

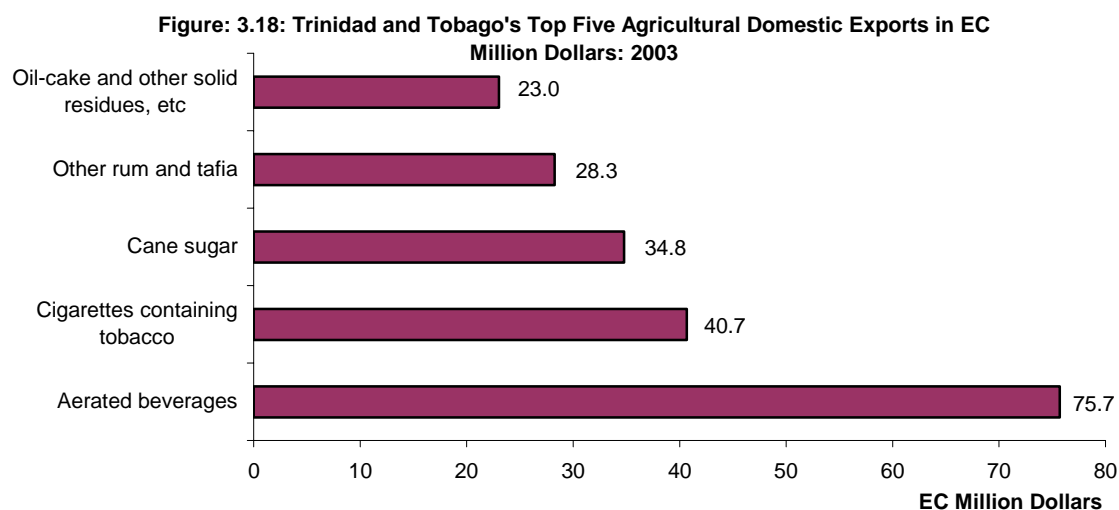


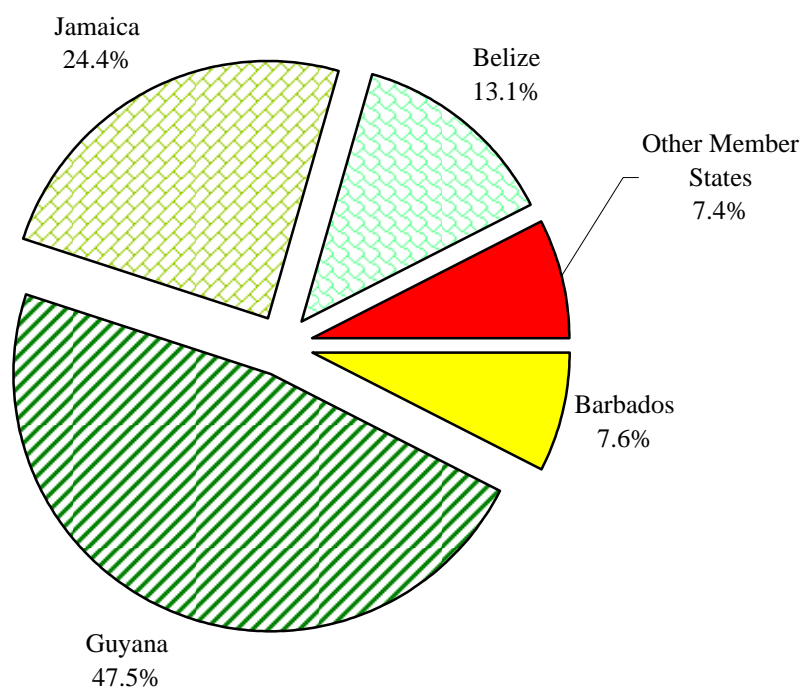

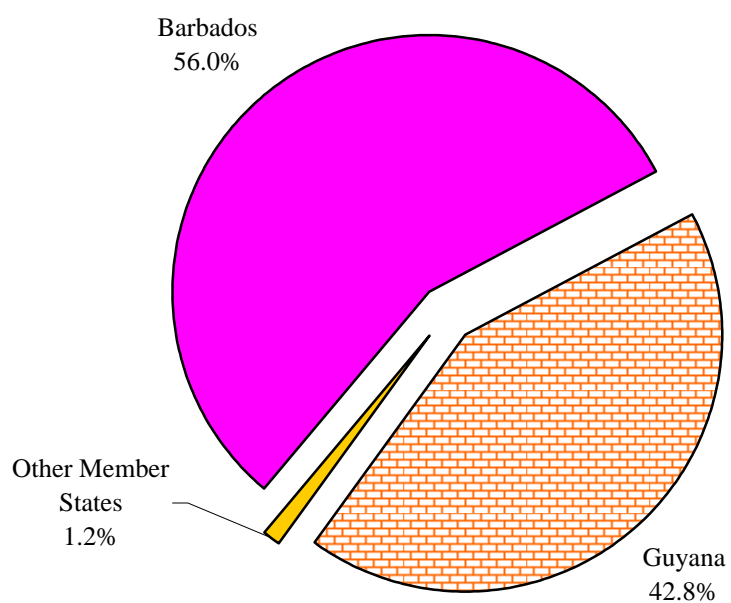

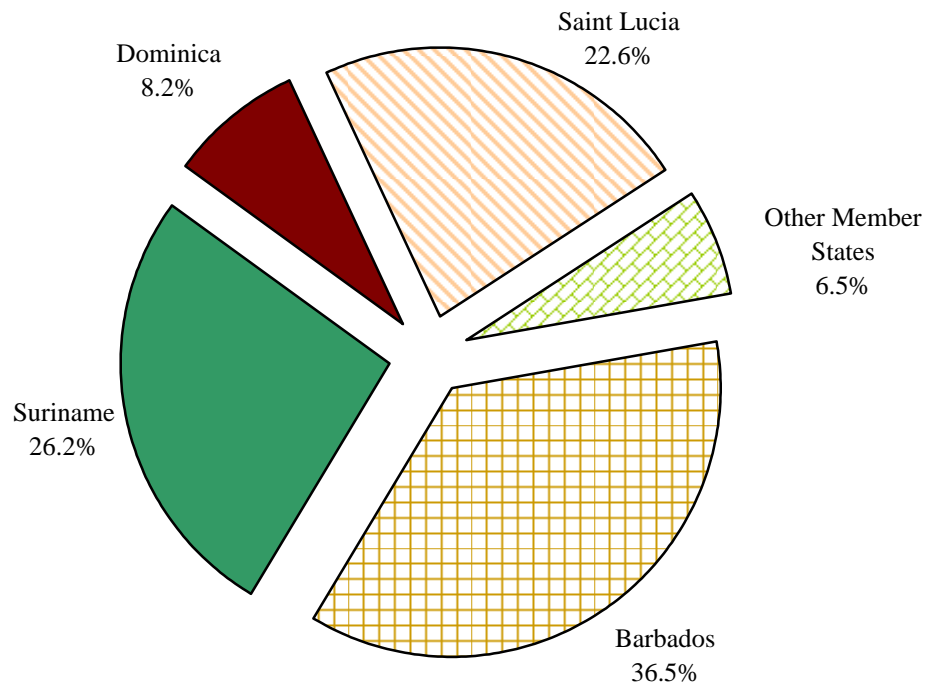
**Figure 3.19: CARICOM's Domestic Exports of Cane Sugar, by Country: 2003**



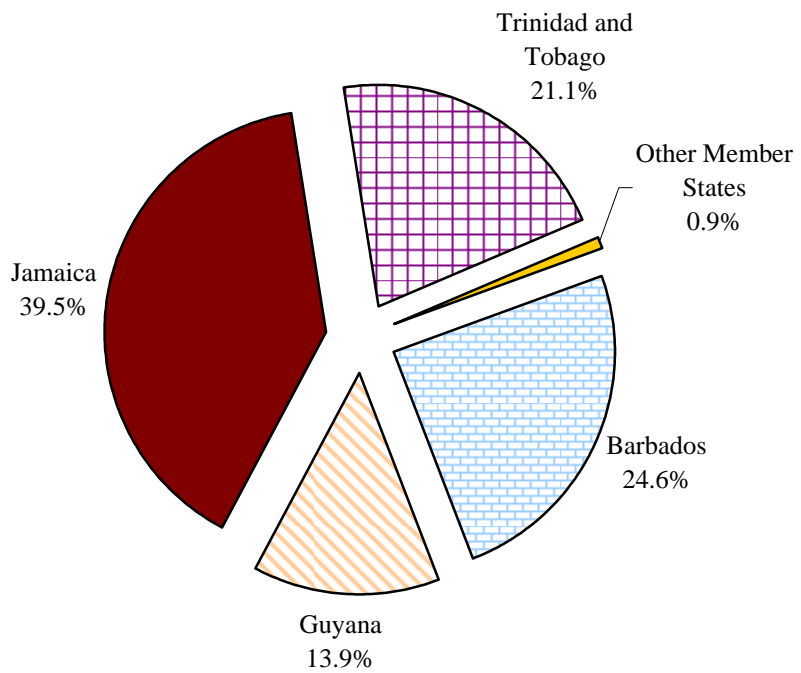
**Figure 3.20: CARICOM's Domestic Exports of Shrimps and Prawns, frozen, by Country: 2003**



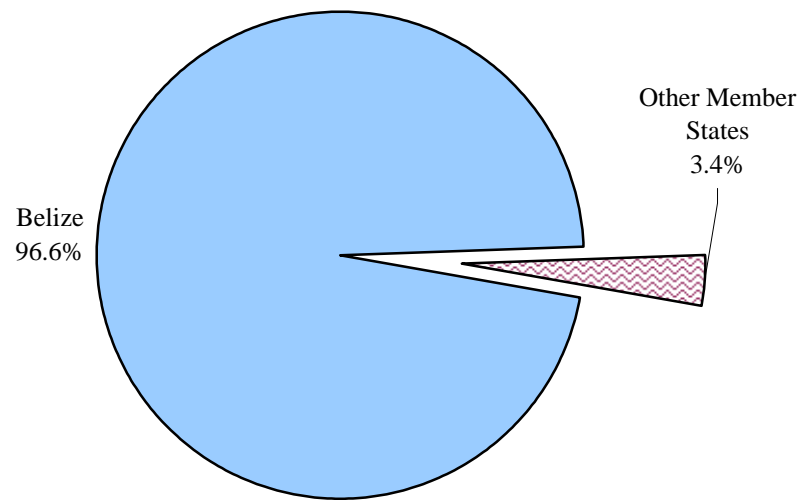
**Figure 3.21: CARICOM's Domestic Exports of Bananas, fresh, by Country: 2003**

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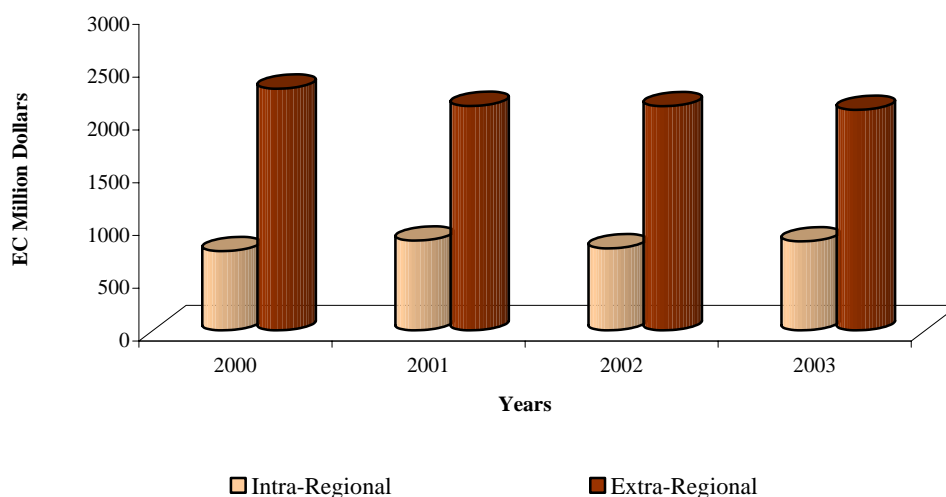


## CARICOM's AGRICULTURAL DOMESTIC EXPORTS BY COUNTRY OF DESTINATION

### CARICOM

Over the period, 2000–2003, the extra-regional market was the main destination for CARICOM's agricultural domestic exports. In 2000, 75.3 *per cent* (EC\$2.3 Bn) of the Region's agricultural domestic exports was exported to extra-regional destinations while 24.7 *per cent* (EC\$0.8 Bn) was exported to intra-regional destinations. In 2003, the contribution of the intra-regional market as a destination for total agricultural domestic exports expanded to 28.7 *per cent* (EC\$0.8 Bn) which implied that the extra-regional market declined to 71.3 *per cent* (EC\$2.1 Bn) (**Annex IV (a) and (b)**).

For CARICOM's domestic exports of *cane sugar*, the percentage contribution of the extra-regional market decreased from 95.2 *per cent* in 2000 to 88.7 *per cent* in 2003. This implied an increase in the intra-regional domestic exports which moved from 4.8 *per cent* in 2000 to 11.3 *per cent* in 2003. The *United Kingdom* accounting for 78.4 *per cent* in 2000 and 70.6 *per cent* in 2003 was the top destination for this commodity.

The contribution of the extra-regional market for domestic exports of *shrimps and prawn, frozen* moved from 93.4 *per cent* in 2000 to 91.8 *per cent* in 2003. The *United States of America* was the top destination accounting for 92.6 *per cent* in 2000 and 87.9 *per cent* in 2003.

The *United Kingdom* was the dominant destination for domestic exports of *bananas, fresh*, accounting for an average percentage contribution of 95.4 *per cent* over the period.

The extra-regional market accounted for 96.2 *per cent* in 2000 and 97.6 *per cent* in 2003 of CARICOM's domestic exports of *other rum and tafia*. In 2000, the top destination was *The Bahamas* with 17.7 *per cent* while for the period 2001–2003, the *United States of America* accounted for 21.6 *per cent*, 20.6 *per cent* and 20.8 *per cent* respectively for these years. *United*

*Kingdom* followed closely with contributions of 21.2 per cent, 20.0 per cent and 18.7 per cent respectively for the years, 2001-2003.

For domestic exports of *concentrated orange juice*, the extra-regional market was the dominant destination declining from 90.6 per cent in 2000 to 68.9 per cent in 2003. The top destination was the *United States of America* which accounted for 67.1 per cent in 2000 and 55.6 per cent in 2003 of the Region's domestic exports of this commodity. On the other hand, the contribution of intra-regional market rose from 9.4 per cent in 2000 to 31.1 per cent in 2003 of which *Jamaica* and *Trinidad and Tobago* were the top intra-regional destinations and collectively accounted for 5.0 per cent and 24.3 per cent in 2000 and 2003 respectively (**Table 4.1**).

## ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA

Data for Antigua and Barbuda were available for the year 2000 only for the period under review. For this year, the extra-regional market contributed to 40.3 per cent of Antigua and Barbuda's total agricultural domestic exports while the intra-regional market comprised 59.7 per cent (**Annex IV (a) and (b)**).

**Table 4.2** shows that for the top five agricultural domestic exports for 2000, the intra-regional market was the dominant destination for Antigua and Barbuda's domestic exports of *other rum and tafia*, *rum and tafia in bottles of a strength not exceeding 46% volume* and *beer* while the extra-regional market was the dominant destination for its domestic exports of *lobster, frozen* and *aerated beverages*.

*St. Kitts and Nevis* accounted for almost all of this Member State's domestic exports of *other rum and tafia*.

For *lobster, frozen*, *Guadeloupe* was the dominant extra-regional market accounting for 90.3 per cent of the domestic exports of this commodity.

*St. Kitts and Nevis* and *Saint Lucia*, with percentage contributions of 38.1 per cent and 19.5 per cent respectively, were the top destinations for *rum and tafia in bottles of a strength not exceeding 46% volume*.

For *aerated beverages*, *US Virgin Islands* was the dominant extra-regional destination accounting for approximately 78.0 per cent of Antigua and Barbuda's domestic exports of this commodity.

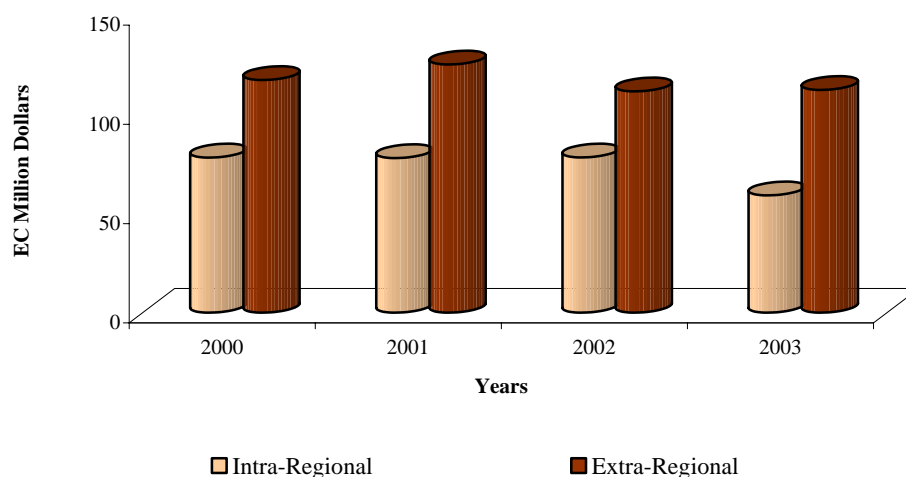
The intra-regional market accounted for 75.6 per cent of Antigua and Barbuda's domestic exports of *beer*, of which *Saint Lucia*, the top destination accounted for 44.6 per cent.

## BARBADOS

Over the period, 2000–2003, Barbados' total agricultural domestic exports were mainly to the extra-regional market. In 2000, 60.0 per cent or EC\$117.2 Mn of Barbados' agricultural domestic exports

was exported to extra-regional destinations while 40.0 per cent or EC\$78.1 Mn was exported to intra-regional destinations. In 2003, the contribution of the intra-regional market as a destination for total agricultural domestic exports decreased to 34.5 per cent or EC\$59.0 Mn which implied that the extra-regional market increased to 65.5 per cent or EC\$112.1 Mn (**Annex IV (a) and (b)**).

For Barbados' top five agricultural domestic exports, the extra-regional market was the dominant market for its domestic exports of *cane sugar*, *other rum and tafia* and *rum and tafia in bottles of a strength not exceeding 46% volume* while the intra-regional market was the major destination for its domestic exports of *margarine, excluding liquid* and *sweet biscuits*.

The *United Kingdom* accounted for almost all of this Member State's domestic exports of *cane sugar* over the period.

The extra-regional market, with percentage contributions ranging from 97.4 per cent in 2000 to almost 100 per cent in 2003 was the dominant destination for *other rum and tafia*. The *United States of America*, the top destination represented 33.5 per cent of exports of this commodity in 2000 and 55.3 per cent in 2003.

For domestic exports of *other rum and tafia in bottles of a strength not exceeding 46% volume*, the extra-regional market accounted for 86.5 per cent of this commodity in 2000 and 87.6 per cent in 2003. The *United States of America* was the top destination for this commodity with an average percentage contribution of 21.9 per cent over the period.

Over the period, almost all (approximately 98 per cent) of the domestic exports of *margarine, excluding liquid margarine* was exported to the intra-regional market. *Trinidad and Tobago*, the top destination accounted for 29.4 per cent in 2000 and 28.7 per cent in 2003.

The percentage contribution of the intra-regional market for domestic exports of *sweet biscuits* declined from 87.4 per cent in 2000 to 76.0 per cent in 2003. *Jamaica* and *Trinidad and Tobago*

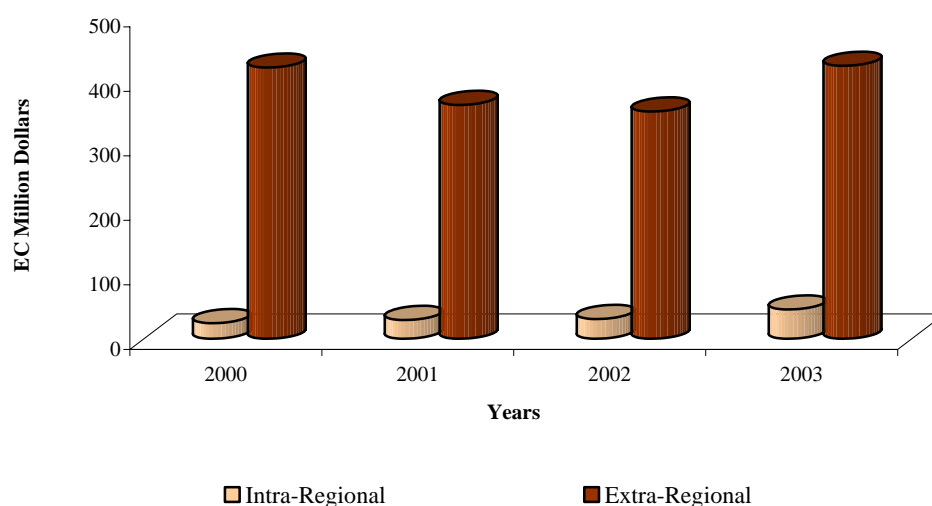


were the top destinations with combined percentage contribution of 53.0 per cent and 49.3 per cent in 2000 and 2003 respectively (**Table 4.3**).

## BELIZE

Over the period, 2000–2003, Belize’s total agricultural domestic exports were mainly to the extra-regional market. In 2000, 94.6 per cent or EC\$420.5 Mn of Belize’s agricultural domestic exports was exported to extra-regional destinations while 5.4 per cent or EC\$24.2 Mn was exported to intra-regional destinations. In 2003, the contribution of the intra-regional market as a destination for total agricultural domestic exports increased to 9.7 per cent or EC\$45.3 Mn which implied that the extra-regional market declined to 90.3 per cent or EC\$423.2 Mn (**Annex IV (a) and (b)**).

The extra-regional market on average accounted for almost all of the domestic exports of *shrimps and prawn, frozen* over the period, with the *United States of America* on average accounting for 94.7 per cent over the period, 2000-2003.

For *cane sugar*, the dominant destination was the *United Kingdom* which on average accounted for 93.4 per cent of the domestic exports of this commodity

For domestic exports of *concentrated orange juice*, an average of 80.8 per cent was to the extra-regional market, of which the *United States of America* represented 62.0 per cent.

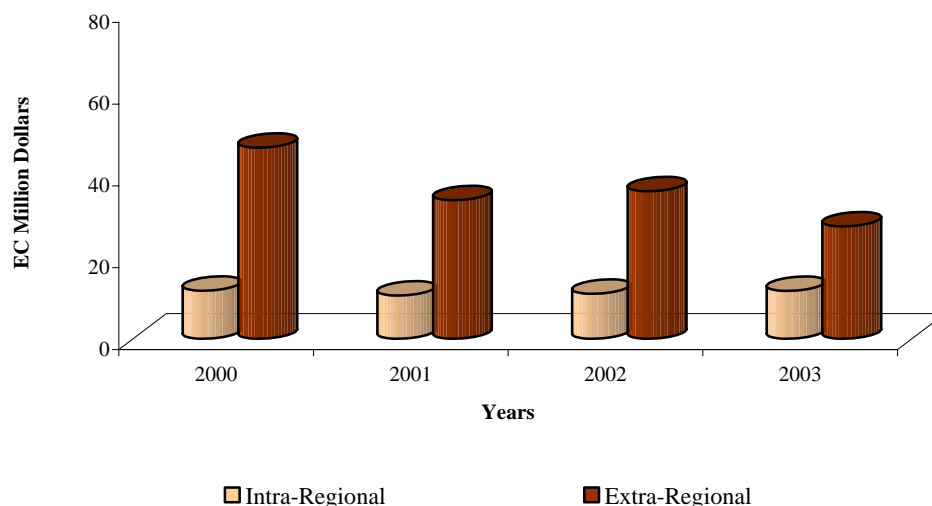
The extra-regional market accounted for all of Belize’s domestic exports of *bananas* for the period under review. The *United Kingdom* with average percentage contribution of 64.1 per cent over the period, 2000-2003 was the top destination for this commodity.

The *United States of America* accounted for almost all of this Member State's domestic exports of *papaws* over the period (**Table 4.4**).

## DOMINICA

For the period, 2000–2003, the majority of Dominica's total agricultural domestic exports went to the extra-regional market. In 2000, 79.9 *per cent* or EC\$46.7 Mn of Dominica's agricultural domestic exports went to the extra-regional destinations while 20.1 *per cent* or EC\$11.7 Mn went to intra-regional destinations. In 2003, the contribution of the intra-regional market as a destination for total agricultural domestic exports increased to 29.9 *per cent* or EC\$11.7 Mn which implied that the extra-regional market declined to 70.1 *per cent* or 27.5 Mn (**Annex IV (a) and (b)**).

Analysis of **Table 4.5** shows that for Dominica's top five agricultural domestic exports the extra-regional market was the dominant destination for *bananas, fresh, plantains, fresh, essential oils of bay* and *pepper sauce* while the intra-regional market was the dominant destination for *avocados*.

Over the period, 2000-2003, the *United Kingdom* on average accounted for 90.1 *per cent* of Dominica's domestic exports of *bananas, fresh*.

For domestic exports of *plantains, fresh*, the extra-regional market on average accounted for 58.6 *per cent* of the domestic exports of this commodity over the period. *Guadeloupe* with percentage contributions of 38.5 *per cent*, 31.5 *per cent* and 24.4 *per cent* in 2000, 2001 and 2003 respectively and *Netherlands Antilles* with 24.7 *per cent* in 2002 were the major destinations for this commodity.

The extra-regional market accounted for almost all of the domestic exports of *essential oils of bay* over the period. The top destination was the *United States of America* which on average accounted for 84.7 *per cent* for the period under review.

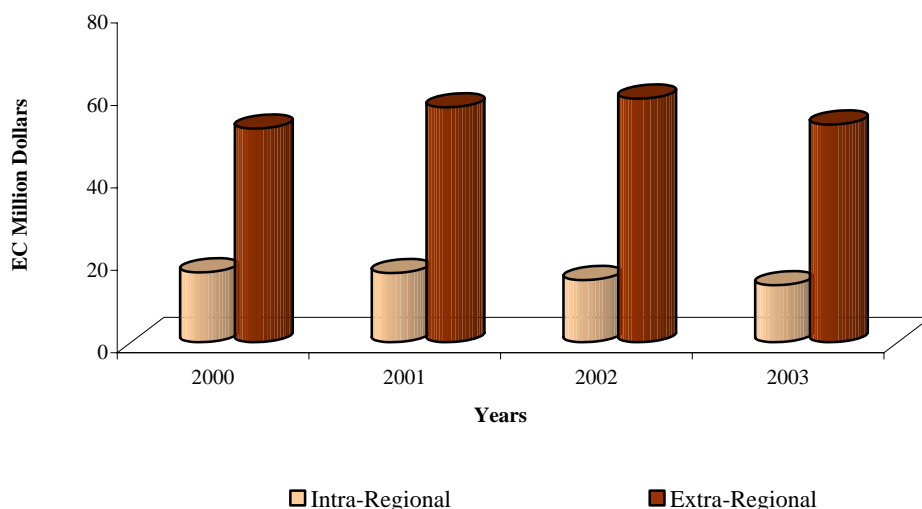
The *United Kingdom* on average accounted for *91.8 per cent* of this Member State's domestic exports of *pepper sauce* over the period under review. Dominica's domestic exports of *pepper sauce* moved from EC\$3.5 Mn in 2000 to EC\$2.4 Mn in 2003.

For the period under review, an average of *54.9 per cent* of this Member State's domestic exports of *avocados* went to the intra-regional market. *Antigua and Barbuda* with an average percentage contribution of *44.3 per cent* was the top destination for this commodity.

## GRENADA

Over the period, 2000–2003, Grenada's total agricultural domestic exports were mainly to the extra-regional market. In 2000, *75.4 per cent* or EC\$51.8 Mn of Grenada's agricultural domestic exports went to extra-regional destinations while *24.6 per cent* or EC\$16.9 Mn went to intra-regional destinations. In 2003, the contribution of the intra-regional market as a destination for total agricultural domestic exports decreased to *20.7 per cent* or EC\$13.8 Mn which implied that the extra-regional market rose to *79.3 per cent* or EC\$52.8 Mn (**Annex IV (a) and (b)**).

For Grenada's top five agricultural domestic exports, the intra-regional market was the dominant destination for *other wheat or meslin flour* while the extra-regional market was the dominant destination for the remainder of the top five commodities over the period 2000-2003.

The extra-regional market on average accounted for almost all of this Member State's domestic exports of *nutmeg* over the period. *The Netherlands*, the top destination of this commodity on average accounted for *33.6 per cent*.

For the period under review, almost all of Grenada's domestic exports of *other wheat or meslin flour* went to the intra-regional market. *Saint Lucia*, the top destination on average accounted for *38.4 per cent* over the period.

The extra-regional market accounted for almost all of the domestic exports of *essential oils of nutmeg* over the period. The top destinations were the *United Kingdom* with 89.9 per cent in 2000, *Germany* with 42.8 per cent in 2001 and the *United States of America* with 80.3 per cent and 94.6 per cent in 2002 and 2003 respectively.

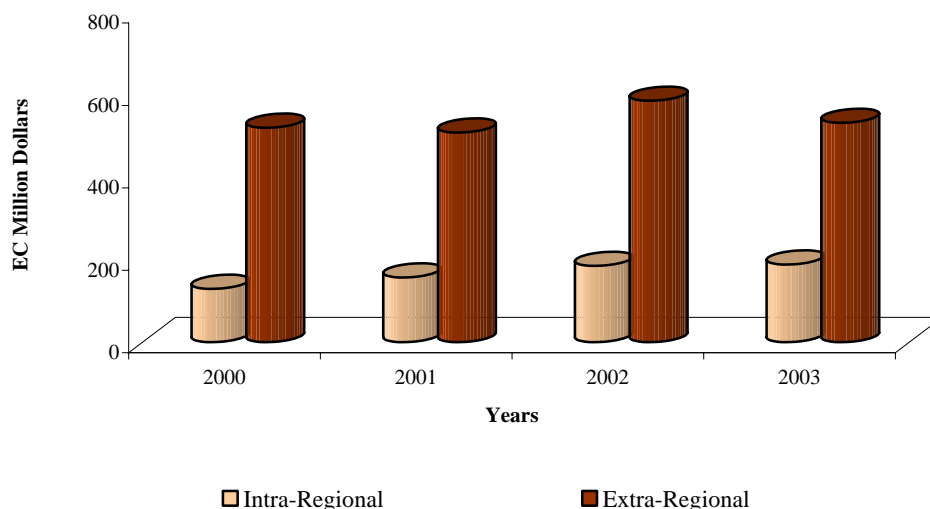
The *United States of America* accounted for almost all of this Member State's domestic exports of *other albacore or long finned tunas*.

The extra-regional market on average accounted for almost all of Grenada's domestic exports of *raw cocoa beans, whole or broken, raw or roasted* of which *The Netherlands*, the top destination contributed to 55.8 per cent (**Table 4.6**).

## GUYANA

For the period, 2000–2003, the extra-regional market accounted for the majority of Guyana's total agricultural domestic exports. In 2000, 80.1 per cent or EC\$520.1 Mn of Guyana's agricultural domestic exports went to extra-regional destinations while 19.9 per cent or EC\$129.2 Mn went to intra-regional destinations. In 2003, the contribution of the intra-regional market as a destination for total agricultural domestic exports increased to 26.1 per cent or EC\$188.3 Mn which implied that the extra-regional market dropped to 73.9 per cent or EC\$532.1 Mn (**Annex IV (a) and (b)**).

**Table 4.7** shows that for the top five agricultural domestic exports for Guyana, the extra-regional market was the dominant destination for *cane sugar*, *shrimps and prawns, frozen* and *other semi-milled white rice* while the intra-regional market was the dominant destination for *other white rice* and *other fish fillets and meat etc*.

Over the period, 2000-2003, an average of 84.7 *per cent* of this Member State's domestic exports of *cane sugar* went to the extra-regional market. The *United Kingdom* was the top destination of this commodity accounting for an average percentage contribution of 64.5 *per cent* over the period.

The dominance of the extra-regional market was also reflected in the domestic exports of *shrimps and prawns, frozen* which on average accounted for 90.6 *per cent* of domestic exports of this commodity over the period. The *United States of America* with an average of 89.4 *per cent* was the top destination for this commodity.

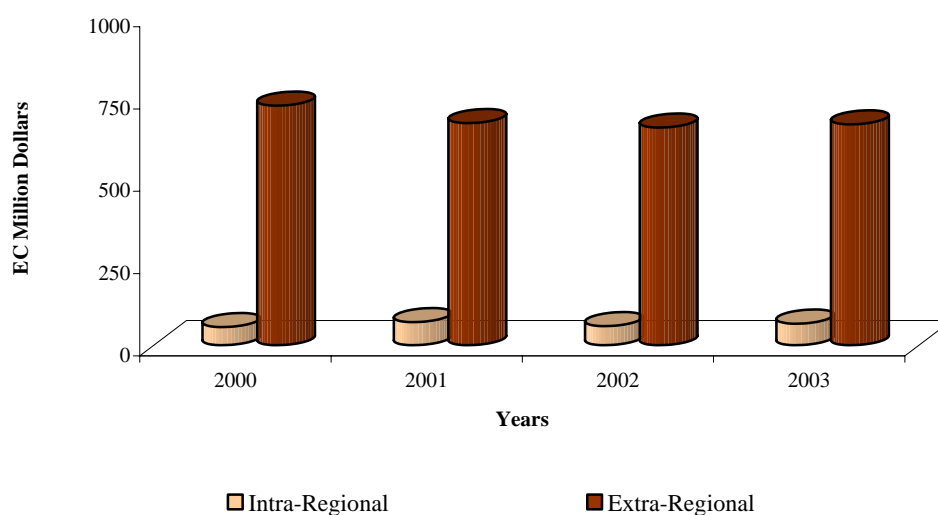
The extra-regional market on average represented 97.8 *per cent* of Guyana's domestic exports of *other semi-milled white rice* over the period. *Portugal* with an average percentage contribution of 47.2 *per cent* was the top destination for this commodity.

For domestic exports of *other white rice* and *other fish fillets etc*, the intra-regional market accounted for average percentage contributions of 84.7 *per cent* and 72.4 *per cent* respectively. *Jamaica*, the top destination for both commodities, on average contributed 75.9 *per cent* and 69.9 *per cent* respectively.

## JAMAICA

Over the period, 2000–2003, Jamaica's total agricultural domestic exports were mainly to the extra-regional market. In 2000, 93.0 *per cent* or EC\$728.1 Mn of Jamaica's agricultural domestic exports went to extra-regional destinations while 7.0 *per cent* or EC\$55.1 Mn went to intra-regional destinations. In 2003, the contribution of the intra-regional market as a destination for total agricultural domestic exports rose to 8.9 *per cent* or EC\$65.5 Mn which implied that the extra-regional market decreased to 91.1 *per cent* or EC\$671.1 Mn (**Annex IV (a) and (b)**).

For domestic exports of *cane sugar*, the *United Kingdom* was the dominant destination throughout the period accounting for an average contribution of *90.1 per cent*. Jamaica's domestic exports of *cane sugar* moved from EC\$224.9 Mn in 2000 to EC\$179.0 Mn in 2003.

Almost all of the domestic exports of *beans for blending* went to the extra-regional market. *Japan*, with average percentage contribution of *85.3 per cent* over the period was the top destination for this commodity.

Jamaica's domestic exports of *other rum and tafia* were almost entirely to the extra-regional market. The major destinations were *Mexico* with *29.4 per cent* and *28.5 per cent* in 2000 and 2002 respectively, the *United Kingdom* with *24.3 per cent* in 2001 and *Canada* with *24.6 per cent* in 2003.

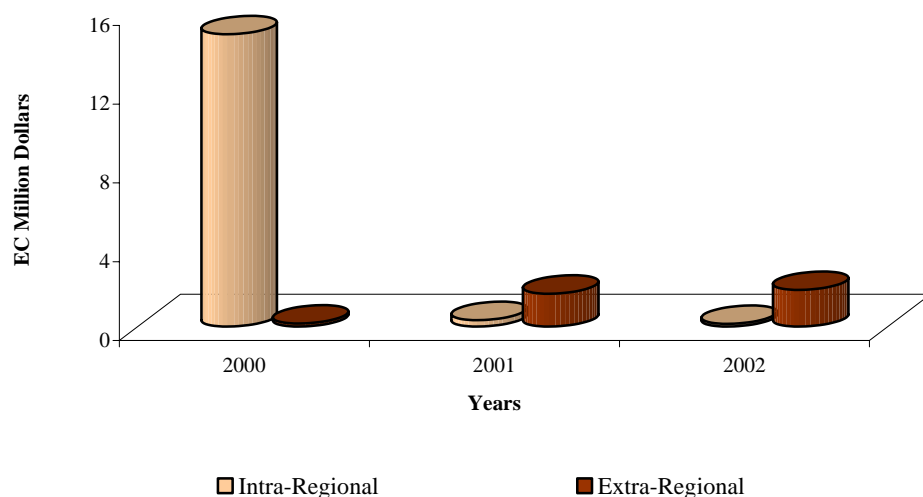
The *United Kingdom* was the major market for this Member State's domestic exports of *bananas, fresh* over the period. Domestic exports of *bananas, fresh* decreased from EC\$61.8 Mn in 2000 to EC\$50.9 Mn in 2003.

The dominance of the extra-regional was also reflected in the domestic exports of *beer*. This market accounted for almost all of the domestic exports of this commodity with the *United States of America*, the top destination representing an average of *90.4 per cent* over the period (**Table 4.8**).

## MONTSERRAT

For 2003, there were no agricultural commodities in Montserrat's domestic exports. In 2000, the majority of Montserrat's agricultural domestic exports went to the intra-regional market. In 2002, the contribution of the intra-regional market as a destination for total agricultural domestic exports declined to *7.0 per cent* which implied that the extra-regional market increased to *93.0 per cent* (**Annex IV (a) and (b)**)

Over the period 2000–2002, the intra-regional market was the dominant destination for *rum and tafia, in bottles of a strength not exceeding 46% volume* while the extra-regional market was the top destination for the remainder of the top five commodities (**Table 4.9**).

The *United States of America* was the dominant destination for Montserrat's domestic exports of *dogs*, accounting for all of this commodity in 2000, 65.2 per cent in 2001 and 96.8 per cent in 2002.

The *US Virgin Islands* was the dominant destination for *lime juice, concentrated* accounting for all of the domestic exports in 2001 and 96.4 per cent in 2002.

All of this Member State's domestic exports of *other water including natural or artificial waters etc* went to the *Netherlands Antilles*.

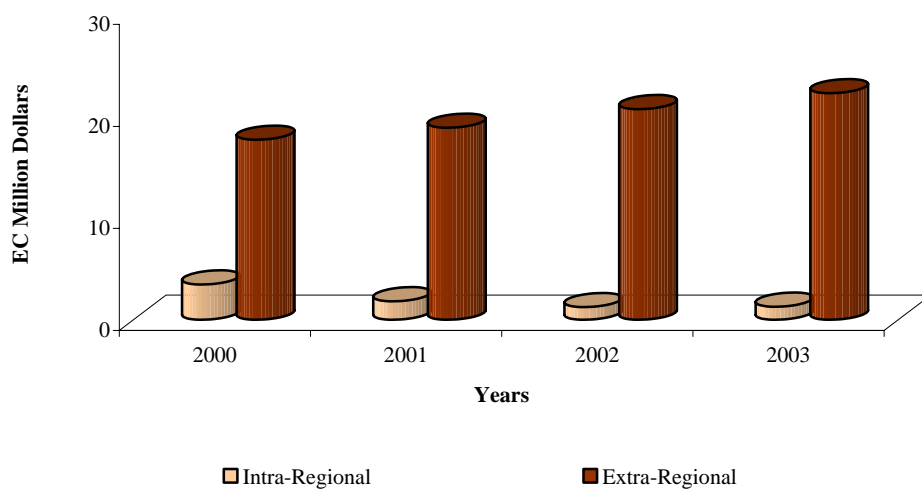
For domestic exports of *guava jams and jellies*, the dominant destinations were *Antigua and Barbuda* (100.0 per cent) in 2000 and the *US Virgin Islands* with 64.4 per cent in 2001 and 94.7 per cent in 2002.

*Dominica* accounted for all of this Member State's domestic exports *rum and tafia in bottles of a strength not exceeding 46% volume*.

## ST. KITTS AND NEVIS

Over the period, 2000–2003, St. Kitts and Nevis' total agricultural domestic exports were mainly to the extra-regional market. In 2000, 83.6 per cent or EC\$17.6 Mn of St. Kitts and Nevis' agricultural domestic exports went to extra-regional destinations while 16.4 per cent or EC\$3.5 Mn went to intra-regional destinations. In 2003, the contribution of the intra-regional market as a destination for total agricultural domestic exports declined to 5.5 per cent or EC\$1.3 Mn which implied that the extra-regional market increased to 94.5 per cent or EC\$22.2 Mn (**Annex IV (a) and (b)**).

Of the top five agricultural commodities, the extra-regional market was the dominant destination for *cane sugar, other cotton waste etc and conch, frozen* while the intra-regional market was the dominant destination for *margarine, excluding liquid margarine*. For *aerated beverages* the intra-regional market was the dominant destination in 2000 and 2002 while the extra-regional market was the dominant destination in 2001 and 2003.

The *United Kingdom* accounted for almost all of St. Kitts and Nevis' domestic exports of *cane sugar* over the period.

For *other cotton waste excluding yarn waste and garneted*, the *United States of America* accounted for all of this Member State's domestic exports of this commodity.

Over the period 2000-2003, the top destinations for *aerated beverages* were *Trinidad and Tobago* with *66.9 per cent* in 2000 and the *Netherlands Antilles* accounting for *25.4 per cent, 23.1 per cent* and *38.1 per cent* in 2001, 2002 and 2003 respectively.

The *Netherlands Antilles* with an average percentage contribution of *69.2 per cent* over the period was the major destination for *conch, frozen*. This commodity was only exported to the extra-regional market.

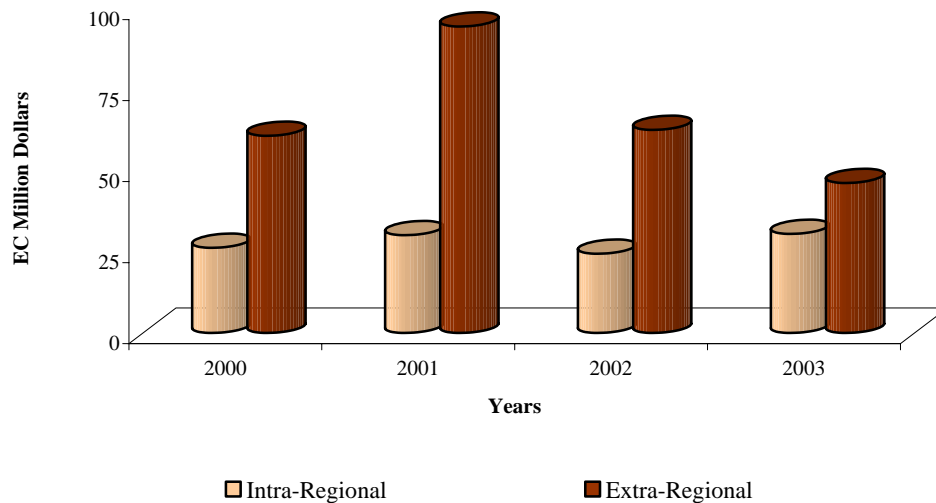
For domestic exports of *margarine, excluding liquid margarine*, the intra-regional market was the dominant destination accounting for an average percentage contribution of *68.3 per cent* over the period of which *Dominica* represented *51.4 per cent* (**Table 4.10**).

## SAINT LUCIA

Over the period, 2000–2003, Saint Lucia's total agricultural domestic exports were mainly to the extra-regional market. In 2000, *69.8 per cent* or EC\$60.9 Mn of Saint Lucia's agricultural domestic exports went to extra-regional destinations while *30.2 per cent* or EC\$26.3 Mn went to intra-regional destinations. In 2003, the contribution of the intra-regional market as a destination for total agricultural domestic exports increased to *39.8 per cent* or EC\$30.6 Mn which implied that the extra-regional market declined to *60.2 per cent* or EC\$46.3 Mn (**Annex IV (a) and (b)**).

**Table 4.11** shows that the extra-regional market was the dominant destination for Saint Lucia's domestic exports of *bananas, fresh* and *other rum and tafia* while the intra-regional market was the dominant destination for the remaining top five commodities, which includes *beer, aerated beverages, liqueurs and cordials*.

The *United Kingdom* was the dominant market for Saint Lucia's domestic exports of *bananas, fresh* accounting for approximately 98 per cent over the period.

For 2000-2003, the intra-regional market accounted for almost all of this Member State's domestic exports of *beer. Barbados*, the top destination of this commodity on average accounted for 46.7 per cent over the period.

For domestic exports of *aerated beverages*, the intra-regional market on average accounted for 96.0 per cent over the period. For 2000 and 2001, *Antigua and Barbuda* was the major destination accounting for 68.9 per cent and 53.2 per cent respectively while for 2002 and 2003, *St. Vincent and the Grenadines* was the top destination which accounted for 42.0 per cent and 38.0 per cent respectively.

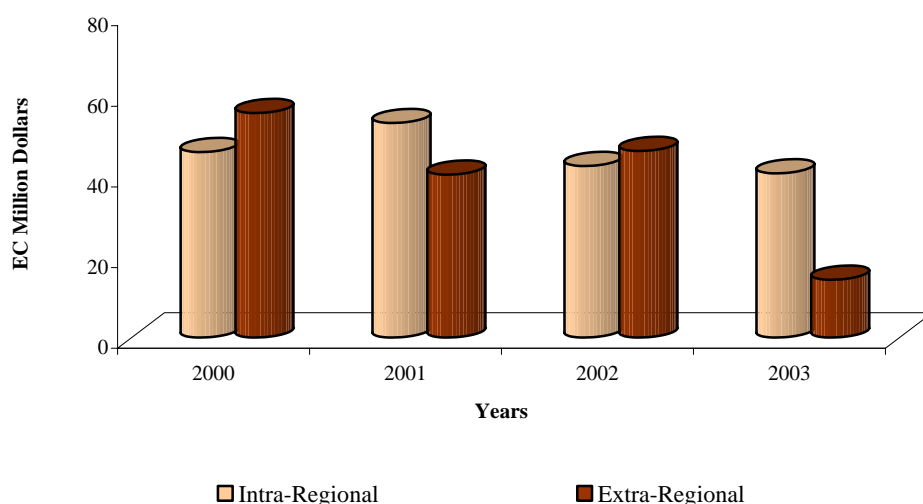
Over the period under review, an average of 96.0 per cent of the domestic exports of *liqueurs and cordials* went to the intra-regional market. The major destinations of this commodity were *Grenada* with 100.0 per cent and 33.7 per cent in 2000 and 2001 respectively and *Barbados* with 34.6 per cent and 29.9 per cent in 2002 and 2003 respectively.

For 2000, *Barbados* accounted for almost all of the domestic exports of *other rum and tafia* while for the period 2001-2003, the *United Kingdom* was the dominant destination with percentage contribution increasing from 84.7 per cent in 2001 to 89.5 per cent in 2003.

## ST. VINCENT AND THE GRENADINES

Over the period, 2000–2003, the intra-regional market on average was the dominant destination for St. Vincent and the Grenadines' total agricultural domestic exports. In 2000, *54.8 per cent* or EC\$55.7 Mn of St. Vincent and the Grenadines' agricultural domestic exports went to extra-regional destinations while *45.2 per cent* or EC\$46.0 Mn went to the intra-regional market. In 2003, the contribution of the intra-regional market as a destination for total agricultural domestic exports expanded to *74.0 per cent* or EC\$40.7 Mn which implied that the extra-regional market dropped to *26.0 per cent* or EC\$14.4 Mn (**Annex IV (a) and (b)**).

**Table 4.12** indicated that for St. Vincent and the Grenadines' top five agricultural domestic exports, the extra-regional market was the major destination for *bananas, fresh* while the intra-regional market was the main destination for the remainder of the top five commodities.

Of these commodities, the intra-regional market accounted for almost all of St. Vincent and the Grenadines' domestic exports of *wheat or meslin flour of durum wheat* over the period, 2000-2003. *Saint Lucia* with an average percentage contribution of *39.9 per cent* over the period was the top destination of this commodity.

For domestic exports of *bananas, fresh*, the *United Kingdom* was the dominant destination accounting for approximately *90.0 per cent* over the period.

On average, *88.3 per cent* of this Member State's domestic exports of *wholly milled parboiled rice in packages etc.* went to the intra-regional market with *Jamaica*, the top destination accounting for *38.3 per cent*.

Over the period, 2000-2003, the intra-regional market on average accounted for *61.1 per cent* of this Member State's domestic exports of *dasheens*. *Trinidad and Tobago* was the top destination of this

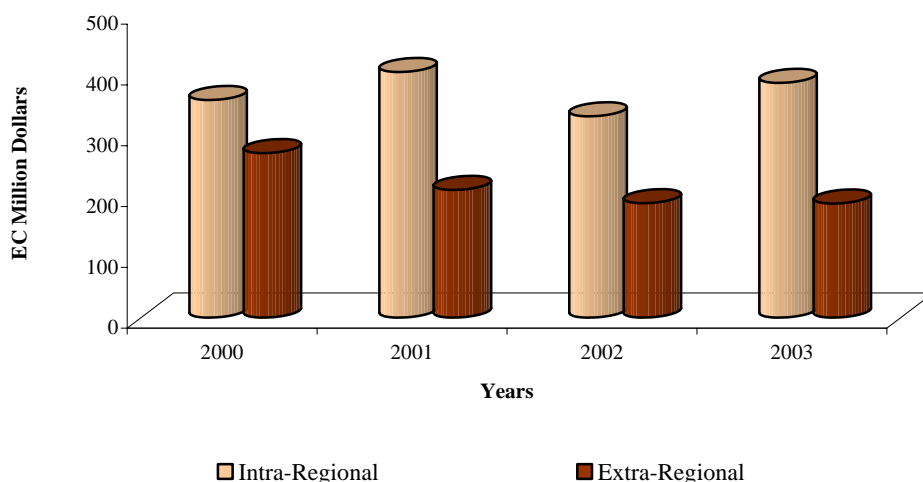
commodity accounting for an average of 56.4 *per cent* of the domestic exports of this commodity over the period.

Throughout the period, 2000-2003, all of the domestic exports of *malt beverage* went to the intra-regional market. The top destination was *Barbados* with an average percentage contribution of 93.3 *per cent* over the period.

## TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

Over the period, 2000–2003, the intra-regional market was the main destination for Trinidad and Tobago’s total agricultural domestic exports. In 2000, 43.0 *per cent* or EC\$270.5 Mn of this Member State’s agricultural domestic exports went to the extra-regional market while 57.0 *per cent* or EC\$357.9 Mn went to the intra-regional market. In 2003, the contribution of the intra-regional market as a destination for total agricultural domestic exports increased to 67.3 *per cent* or EC\$386.0 Mn which implied that the extra-regional market declined to 32.7 *per cent* or EC\$187.7 Mn (**Annex IV (a) and (b)**).

Throughout the period, 2000–2003, the intra-regional market was the dominant destination for *aerated beverages, cigarettes, oil cakes and other solid residues, etc.* while the extra-regional market was the dominant destination for *cane sugar and other rum and tafia*.

The intra-regional market, with an average percentage contribution of 80.7 *per cent* over the period was the dominant destination for Trinidad and Tobago’s domestic exports of *aerated beverages*. *Jamaica* was the top destination recording an average percentage contribution of 46.3 *per cent* over the period.

For domestic exports of *cigarettes containing tobacco*, the intra-regional market accounted for almost all of the exports of this commodity with the top destinations being *Guyana* with 41.0 *per*

cent in 2000 to *Suriname* with 38.0 per cent and 41.2 per cent in 2001 and 2002 respectively and *Barbados* with 30.4 per cent in 2003.

Over the period, almost all of the domestic exports of *cane sugar* went to the extra-regional market. The *United Kingdom* was the top destination of this commodity with an average percentage contribution of 81.7 per cent over the period.

The extra-regional market on average accounted for 88.2 per cent of this Member State's domestic exports of *other rum and tafia* over the period. For 2000 and 2001, *The Bahamas* was the top destination for this commodity with percentage contributions of 69.5 per cent and 40.0 per cent respectively while for 2002 and 2003 *Colombia* was the top destination with percentage contributions of 33.2 per cent and 67.1 per cent respectively.

Over the period, an average of 63.7 per cent of domestic exports of *oil-cake and other solid residues* went to the intra-regional market. The top destinations were *Jamaica* with 35.3 per cent, 53.6 per cent and 43.6 per cent for 2000–2002 respectively and *Guyana* with 60.0 per cent in 2003 (**Table 4.13**).
