


Special Topic Statistical Bulletin - COVID-19

Issue I, 26 March 2020

The Special Topic Statistical Bulletin on COVID-19 in CARICOM Countries, Issue I, provides a synopsis of the trajectory of the disease from the confirmation of the first case in the CARICOM Region on 10 March 2020 to the period ending 26 March 2020. Essentially, the bulletin provides information on the pattern of the disease, graphically summarising the total number of cases, new cases and deaths by date as well as providing information on the patterns for each country and doubling time in days. Future bulletins would provide summary information and country details where there are changes in the data of the latter.

Data are preliminary and will be adjusted as more reliable data are made available. While international data sources were used, these were supplemented by web-scraping of information from official sources of countries including situation updates and official media releases, from ministries of health, government information departments and other similar sources. At least one Member State was able to submit data to support this effort.






CHART 2: ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA




CHART 3: THE BAHAMAS




CHART 4: BARBADOS




CHART 5: BELIZE




CHART 6: DOMINICA




CHART 7: GRENADA




CHART 8: GUYANA




CHART 9: HAITI




CHART 10: JAMAICA




CHART 11: MONTSERRAT




CHART 12: SAINT LUCIA




CHART 13: ST. KITTS AND NEVIS




CHART 14: ST. VINCENT AND THE GRENADINES




CHART 15: SURINAME




CHART 16: TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO




CHART 17: BERMUDA




CHART 18: BRITISH VIRGIN ISLANDS




CHART 19: CAYMAN ISLANDS





CHART 20: TURKS AND CAICOS ISLANDS





Approx. Doubling (1.6) 3 days




Barbados
