

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PREFACE

The publication, Women and Men in CARICOM Member States, Labour Force Statistics, Methodological Guide Volume 11 - 1980-2002, is a companion guide to the publication, Women and Men in CARICOM Member States, Labour Force Statistics Volume 1 - Data series for 1980, 1990 and 2000 Round of Censuses, published by the Statistics Sub-Programme of the CARICOM Secretariat. It provides comprehensive documentation of concepts and definitions, sources of data, coverage and other information used by Member States in the collection and compilation of statistics on the labour force. The actual statistics are captured in Volume 1 and covers a 20-year span: 1980, 1990 and 2000.

Volume 1 is organized under different sections: Section 1 - Methodology for data compilation; Section 2 - Concepts and Definitions; Section 3 - Sources of Data; Section 4 - Data Inconsistencies Survey and Section 5 - References used in compiling Labour Force Statistics. The Section, Sources of Data, is further categorized into three groups: A summary list of databases by Member States; A list of Sources by Key Indicators and a detailed list of reference periods used. Under the Data Inconsistencies, the data discrepancies arising out of using different reference periods are illustrated for the economically active population as well as its components.

Firstly the *Methodological Guide* can assist users to develop an understanding of labour market information and in assessing the degree of reliability of these statistics, leading to more accurate use in policy making, research and other similar activities.

Secondly by documenting the methodologies in use across Member States, it is possible to gauge the degree of comparability of the statistics on the Labour Force and therefore the fundamental issues required to be addressed to achieve more harmonized statistics in this area. It is unlikely in the short term that Member States would have completely harmonized statistics, but this document will assist in advancing the process of harmonization. Evidently harmonization is a pre-requisite to facilitate comparability particularly in the context of the establishment of the

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1. METHODOLOGY FOR DATA COMPILATION

1.1 SOURCES AND METHODS OF COMPILING LABOUR FORCE STATISTICS

The methodology for data compilation presented in this Volume II – "Methodological Guide" serves as a technical guide to the Volume I: "Women and Men in CARICOM Member States Labour Force Statistics Data series for 1980, 1990 and 2000 Round of Censuses". The compilation of concepts and definitions and methodologies in this Methodological Guide were obtained directly from the National Statistical Offices in Member States or extracted from publications produced by these offices. The information presented was derived from the following sources: Population and Housing Censuses, Labour Force Surveys, Household Income and Expenditure Surveys and Living Conditions Surveys. A special effort was made to document all the sources, reference periods and other relevant information for the periods: 1980, 1990 and 2000.

In the compilation of data for Volume I, the priority was given in the presentation of data to the Census as the most common or available source of labour force statistics across Member States, but in some cases the Labour Force Surveys and other similar surveys were used. Primarily for this exercise, data for the three Rounds of Censuses: 1980, 1990, and 2000 were targeted. In the absence of Census data in any given year for Member States, data from the year closest to the census were used from any available source.

In the compilation of data on labour force characteristics, precedence was given, in terms of reference period, to the "current status" which is usually the "past week", over the "usual status" which is the "past 12 months". Preference was also given in the compilation of data, to National Reports over Regional Reports and other sources.

The most important factors affecting data comparability are the concepts and definitions used and the data sources. Labour force statistics obtained from Population Censuses are often based on a restricted number of questions on economic characteristics of individuals and with a minimal of probing.

2. CONCEPTS AND DEFINITIONS

The following concepts and definitions were used in the Censuses carried out by the National Statistical Offices of the CARICOM Member States.

1. Working Population

All persons over a specified age, who had a job at sometime during the twelve-month period preceding the Census.

2. Population

- (a) *de facto* approach: in this approach, persons eligible to be counted are all persons in the country at a particular point in time or reference period which is normally on Census Night (midnight) and who were associated with the household or institution in which they passed Census Night regardless of their usual place of residence;
- (b) *de jure* approach: in this approach, persons who are *usual* residents of the country are eligible to be counted whether they happen to be in the country or not on Census Night. Visitors to the country whose normal place of residence is not in the country are excluded. Within the country, persons are counted at their place of normal residence and not at the place where they happen to be at Census Night.

See our report "Women and Men in CARICOM Member States 1980, 1990 and 2000 Rounds of Population Census" as to which countries used the de jure or de facto approach and for other information related to population statistics.

3. The Labour Force

The Labour Force or economically active population comprises all persons above a *specified age* who during a *stated reference period*, either had jobs (the **employed**), or if they did not have jobs, were willing and able to work (the **unemployed**).

In determining the economically active population, all the Member states used 15 years and over as the age cut-off point except for Jamaica, which used 14 years and over. The reference periods used also varied across the Region, as some countries used persons who worked during the week before the census/survey (current status) while other countries used current status as well as the 12-month period preceding the census/survey (usual status). Suriname used past three months as the reference period for economic activity. In the case of the unemployed, an extended reference period is also used in some Member States (eg. The Bahamas: last four weeks; Suriname: past 3 months).

4. Unemployed Persons

Unemployed persons, who have worked before, are classified according to the *last job held*. In the tables in this report, therefore, the labour force characteristics of the unemployed do not necessarily relate to the types of employment that they are seeking. For example, unemployed persons classified as unpaid workers indicate that these persons were unpaid workers in the last job they held. The **Unemployed** persons were:

- (i) persons who at the time of enumeration had never worked before and were actively seeking work during the reference week.
- (ii) persons who had previously worked, but who at the time of enumeration were not working, but were actively seeking work during the reference period.

N.B. Data for Belize for the 2000 Census appear to differ significantly from previous Censuses and also does not follow the trend in the Labour Force Survey for the years close to the 2000 Round of Censuses.

5. Employed Persons

The **Employed** persons were:

- (i) person who had jobs and were at work during the reference week
- (ii) persons who had jobs but were absent from work during reference week due to illness, vacation etc.

6. Persons Employed by Status in Employment

Type of Worker

The status in employment or type of worker refers to the following categories of the economically active persons.

(i) Employer (has own business /farm with paid help)

A person, who operates his or her own economic enterprise or engages independently in a profession or trade, and hires one or more employees.

(ii) Paid Employee

An employee is defined as a person who works for a public or private employers and receives remuneration in wages, salary, commission, tips, piece rates or payment in kind.

(iii) Own Account Worker (has own business / farm without paid help)

A person who operates his or her own economic enterprise or engages independently in a profession or trade, and hires no employees (paid help), but may however be assisted by unpaid workers.

(iv) Unpaid Family Worker

A person who works in a business or farm which is run for profit, belonging to a relative or other persons and who receives no payment in cash, but who benefits from the operation of the business or farm, because s(he) is a member of the proprietor's household.

(v) Learner/Apprentice

A person who is being taught a trade or profession without receipt of any remuneration but contributes to the production of economic goods and/or services. (Barbados, Jamaica and Trinidad & Tobago used this category)

7. Persons Unemployed by Status (past 12 months)

Type of Worker

(i) Did no Work

Refers to persons who never worked or had a job but were either seeking work or wanted work and were available during the twelve months preceding the Census.

8. Economically Inactive Population

(ii) Student

These are persons attending primary / secondary school full time. Also includes the university students who were still attending full time.

(iii) Home Duties

These are persons constituting principally, housewives or household member performing domestic duties.

(iv) Retired

Individuals in retirement for most of the week or year preceding the date of enumeration.

(v) Disabled

Individuals who were unable to work or incapacitated through injury or other causes.

(vi) Other

The persons who do not belong to any of the above categories.

9. Head of Household

The head of household is that person who is acknowledged as such by the other members. This is usually but not necessarily the person who bears the chief responsibility for the economic maintenance of the household.

10. Discouraged Workers

"Discouraged workers" are persons in the economically active age group without jobs who may or may not have worked before, but are able and willing to work, and are not actively seeking work because they believe they would not find work. Since these

persons were not seeking work during the four weeks preceding the date of enumeration they were not counted among the unemployed, and are therefore not a part of the labour force.

11. New Entrants

New entrants relate to persons entering the labour force for the first time. They are classified into two groups:

(i) New Entrants with jobs

Persons who worked or had a job for the first time within the past six months.

(ii) New Entrants seeking their first job

Persons who are seeking their first job within the past six months.

12. The Criterion for Employment

The one-hour criterion in the definition of employment covers all types of employment that may exist in a given country, including short -term work, casual labour, stand-by work and other types of irregular employment. It is also a necessary criterion if total employment is to correspond to aggregate production. The one-hour criterion in the definition of employment is also fundamental in defining unemployment as a situation of complete absence of work.

13. Part-time Workers

Part-time workers were determined subjectively (based on an individual's own assessment). To obtain this information employed persons were asked, "Do you work full-time or part-time?"

14. Occupation

Occupation refers to the type of work actually performed by the individuals and is classified according to the International Standard Classification of Occupations (ISCO).

15. Industry

The industry in which individuals are classified relates to the main type of economic activity carried on by the firms or business in which they are employed. Classification by industry is based on the International Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (ISIC).

16. School attendance and Economic Activity

Generally in most Member States for the 1980 Census "students" are defined as those individuals who were for most of the year, full-time students at school (primary/secondary) or university, but who may by the time of the Census, actually have entered the labour force. Only those persons who had completed their full time school education before the Census were included in the tabulations.

In the 1980 Census, the tabulations across most Member States, primary /secondary school students who were 15 years and over and were still attending school *full-time*, were **excluded** from the **Economically Inactive Population.** Only those attending University were included.

On the contrary, in 1990 Census, the students who were 15 years and over still attending school full-time (primary/secondary) at the time of the census were **included** in the category "**Economically Inactive Population**". (The university students, who were still attending university full time at the time of the census were **included** with the tables for 1990 and the 2000 Round of Censuses across all the Member States based on their economic activity.)

In the 2000 Round of Censuses, all Member States adopted similar concepts and definitions in line with the concepts and definitions used in the 1990 Round of Censuses.

17. Year of Data

This report is primarily based on data obtained from the 1980, 1990 and 2000 Rounds of Population and Housing Censuses in the region.

The 1980 Round covered the period 1980-1982, which implies that each individual country would have conducted their Census in a specific year of that period or Round. The 1990 Round the period 1990-1991 was used while in the 2000 Round of Censuses all Member States with the exception of Suriname (2003) conducted their Census during the period 2000-2001.


