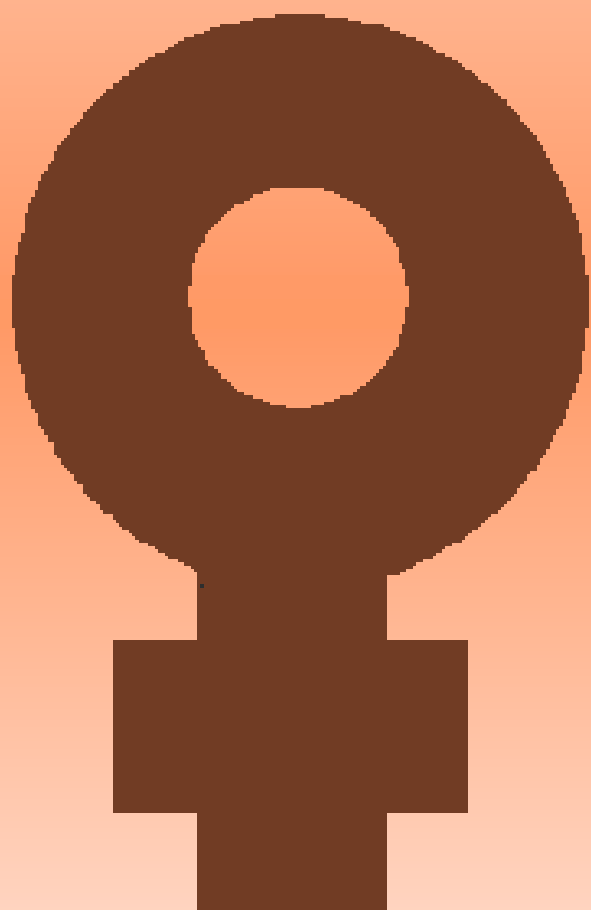

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## **PREFACE**

This publication on Women and Men in CARICOM Member States - Power and Decision Making: 1980-2000, is another attempt to compile gender statistics in a regional publication. The stimulus for this publication was the United Nations Statistical Division (UNSD) and CARICOM – UNSD/CARICOM Project on “Strengthening Capacity in the Compilation of Statistics and Indicators for Conference-Follow-up in the CARICOM Region” which was implemented during the period 2000-2001 with some follow-up work on the forthcoming regional publications occurring during 2002.

Initially, the theme Power and Decision-Making was one of approximately six themes which were identified for data collection in the Project. Eventually, due to the constraints of time, workload and identified areas of concern at the Regional level, these themes were reduced to three, Economy, Education and Health with information also being compiled on population and demographic statistics and indicators to set the context for the interpretation and analysis of the main areas of data.

The CARICOM Secretariat decided to continue the data collection thrust in the area of Power and Decision-Making, in its efforts to complement the main regional publication on Social/Gender Statistics. In this context, this is the second publication that has been produced. The first publication, “Women and Men in CARICOM Member States, 1980,1990 and 2000 Rounds of Censuses” was a compilation of gender statistics on the population for the CARICOM Region over a 20-year span. This publication is available on the Statistics Web Page.

Power and decision-making was one of the areas identified by Caribbean countries for attention in the preparation for the Beijing Conference in 1995. Commonwealth Ministers of Women’s Affairs also identified this issue as important and called on all Commonwealth States to increase women’s participation in decision-making to 30 per cent by 2005. Additionally, The Universal Declaration of Human Rights articulates that everyone has the right to participate in the Government of his or her country. Similarly, in other aspects of the decision-making process and in policy formulation such as senior level government positions, managers of companies and

organizations and the judiciary, the composition of the society should be reflected. While in other spheres of activity in the household and in the community women have demonstrated considerable leadership qualities, the general tendency worldwide is for a low proportion of women to be involved in economic and political decision-making.

Exploratory as it is, this publication seeks to give within the limitations of the data, the status of the situation in Member States with respect to the nature of the inequality that exists in specific areas of the policy and decision-making process and an estimate of how close the Region is to achieving the goal of 30 percent participation of women in decision-making by 2005. The tables include: Parliamentary Assemblies, Public Order and Safety Occupations, Senior Level Positions in the Government Service and Managerial and Other Professional occupations.

Producing this publication was indeed a challenging experience. The main limitations were the absence of data collection in this area on a sustained basis, if at all. The years of data were also not consistent and likewise the data sources. Efforts were also made to obtain up-to-date information for some tables from those countries that have completed the processing of the Year 2000 Round of Population and Housing Censuses. This report therefore includes data for the 2000 period and beyond wherever these were available. As more information becomes available out of the Censuses, these tables will be updated on our Web Page.

However, there is much to be gained from the experiences of compiling this report. The report can in the future stimulate data collection and compilation activities in Member States on a more sustained basis. More importantly, it can inform standard guidelines for data collection on this theme that can be used as models for national data collection efforts. In this regard the table formats of Guyana and Dominica were outstanding for some of the data collected. Other publications to follow will include Labour and Education statistics. Finally, it is hoped that these publications can contribute to the critical need for mainstreaming gender in policies and programmes in the process of development.

The Secretariat expresses its warmest appreciation to the UNSD for making this publication possible through the UNSD/CARICOM Project.

# METHODOLOGY FOR DATA COMPILATION

## PART I NOTES ABOUT THE DATA

### 1. General Comments on Sources of Data

The data presented in this Report were either obtained directly from the National Statistical Offices in Member States or extracted from publications produced by these offices. It should be noted that the data presented were derived from different sources, such as, censuses, surveys and administrative sources. The source of the data used in each table is stated under the table and a detail compilation is found on Page xxvii.

### 2. Parliamentary Assemblies

Across the Region, the composition of Parliament in the Member States differs. As a result, the term *Members of Parliamentary Assembly* is used as a common title to embrace the different formats or names used to describe these assemblies in the Region. For individual Member States, the numbers of persons in key positions in Parliament are presented as reported by the Member States. For the Region as a whole, only the total number of persons in the Parliamentary Assembly of each country is shown.

The format of the tables for individual Member States shows:

Montserrat is a British dependent territory. In this Member State, there is a Legislative Council and an Executive Council. The Executive Councillors are a part of the Legislative Council.

For Trinidad and Tobago, data for Members of the Parliamentary Assembly by Position are presented for three (3) consecutive years - 2000, 2001 and 2002 because this Member State has had three elections in as many years. In the 2001 General Elections, the two (2) major political parties won equal number of seats (18 each) and a Speaker was not elected.

### **3. Senior-Level Positions in the Government Service**

Data are also presented for participation in selected Senior-Level Positions in the Government Service. The positions shown are Head of Public/Civil Service, Permanent Secretaries, Governors of Central Banks, Commissioners of Services, Directors of Departments and Advisors.

Data for the individual Member States are presented as reported. At the level of CARICOM, the summary table shows the total number of persons who occupy certain common Senior-Level Positions in Government Services in the Region.

Two (2) Member States reported Advisory Positions in their Government Services - Dominica and St. Vincent and The Grenadines. In Dominica, there were two (2) persons attached to the Prime Minister's Office who were serving in this capacity while St. Vincent and The Grenadines reported the position of a Fiscal Advisor.

#### **4. Public Order and Safety Occupations**

Data on public order and safety occupations include Judges, Magistrates, Public Prosecutors and Police and Prison Officers.

With respect to the data that are presented on persons in selected public order and safety occupations, it must be noted that data for certain categories that reflect safety and protection, for example, the armed forces and police and prison officers were not available.

#### **5. Persons Employed By Status in Employment**

Available data from the 1980, 1990 and 2000 Rounds of Population and Housing Censuses in the Region were used in the tables showing persons employed by occupation group and selected categories of status in employment. For Dominica, Grenada, Jamaica and Trinidad and Tobago, additional tables were also prepared using available data from labour force surveys conducted in these Member States. Data from the Survey of Living Conditions and Household Surveys conducted in Guyana and Suriname respectively are also presented.

For each Member State and at the aggregated CARICOM level, data are presented for persons employed by status in employment. In these tables, employers and own account workers are separately identified while the “*other*” category is the summation of paid employees, unpaid workers and learners/apprentices. The terms, which are used in these tables, are defined in **Part 11 Concepts and Definitions** found on Page xxxv. The idea was to separate persons owning or operating their own businesses from paid employees.

For the 1980 Round of Censuses, the data presented for Barbados, Belize, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Montserrat, St. Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, St. Vincent and The

Grenadines and Trinidad and Tobago refer to the population 15 years and over not attending school full-time.

With respect to the 1990 Round of Censuses, the data for Antigua and Barbuda, Barbados, Belize, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Montserrat, Saint Lucia, St. Vincent and The Grenadines and Trinidad and Tobago relate to the population 15 years and over, who worked in the week preceding the census.

Data on the labour force in The Bahamas refer to the population 15 years and over who worked in the 12 months preceding the census.

The data for Jamaica that were taken from the Labour Force Reports refer to the population 14 years and over. In the case of Trinidad and Tobago, the data from the Labour Force Surveys relate to the population 15 years and over.

#### **6. Persons Employed By Occupation Group - Legislators, Senior Officials and Managers**

Data are also presented for each Member State and at the CARICOM level for persons employed by occupation status. The total number of persons employed is disaggregated to show legislators, senior officials and managers as one category and the remaining employed persons are grouped under the “*other*” category.

Data from the 1980 Round of Censuses for The Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Montserrat, St. Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, St. Vincent and The Grenadines and Trinidad and Tobago are classified as “administrative and managerial workers” instead of “legislators, senior officials and managers”. The data refer to the population 15 years and over, not attending school (prim/sec) full-time.

For the 1990 Round of Censuses, data for Antigua and Barbuda, Belize, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Jamaica, Montserrat, St. Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, St. Vincent and

The Grenadines and Trinidad and Tobago refer to persons 15 years and over who were employed in the week preceding the census.

The data for The Bahamas and Barbados refer to the population 15 years and over, who worked in the 12 months preceding the census.

The data for Jamaica that is presented for 1984 and 1991 were categorised as professional, technical, administrative, executive, managerial and related occupations. For 1999, the data were classified as professionals, senior officials and technicians.

## **PART II      CONCEPTS AND DEFINITION**

### **1.      The Labour Force**

The Labour Force (or economically active population) comprises all persons above a *specified age* who during a *stated reference period*, either had jobs (the employed), or if they did not have jobs, were willing and able to work (the unemployed).

In the CARICOM Region, different countries used different age cut-off points of the population to define their labour force mainly persons 14 years and over or persons 15 years and over. The reference periods used also varied across the Region, some countries used persons who worked during the week before the census/survey while other countries used the 12-month period preceding the census/survey. In the case of the unemployed, an extended reference period is also used in some Member States.

### **2.      Persons Employed By Status In Employment**

#### **Type of Worker**

**The status of employment** refers to the status of the economically active (both employed and unemployed) with respect to his/her employment. The following categories apply:

**(a) Employer (has own business /farm with paid help)**

A person who operates his or her own economic enterprise or engages independently in a profession or trade, and hires one or more employees.

**(b) Own Account Worker (has own business / farm without paid help)**

A person who operates his or her own economic enterprise or engages independently in a profession or trade, and hires no employees. He may, however be assisted by unpaid workers.

**(c) Paid Employee**

An employee is defined as a person who works for a public or private employer and receives remuneration in wages, salary, commission, tips, piece rates or pay in kind.

**(d) Unpaid Worker**

A person who works in a business or farm which is run for profit, belonging to a relative or other persons and who receives no payment in cash, but who benefits from the operation of the business or farm, because he is a member of the proprietor's household.

**(e) Learner/Apprentice**

A person who is being taught a trade or profession without receipt of any remuneration but contributes to the production of economic goods and/or services.

# **DATA HIGHLIGHTS**



## DATA HIGHLIGHTS

### 1. Members of Parliamentary Assemblies

#### CARICOM

Available data for the Region (**Tables 1.1-1.2**) show that although women are under represented at this level of decision-making, the representation of women in parliamentary assemblies has increased marginally in most of the Member States over the years. However, the data do not represent identical years across all Member States while there were missing data for some countries. For some Member States there were fluctuations in the percentage of persons in parliamentary assemblies who were women while for others there were steady increases shown over the years.

In the 1980s, **Guyana** recorded the highest proportion of persons in parliamentary assemblies who were women, with 15 percent. For other Member States with data for this period the proportion of persons in parliamentary assemblies who were women was under 10 percent. In fact, deriving a total picture for the 1980s show that 11 percent of persons in parliamentary assemblies were women. In the period of the 90s the proportion of persons in parliamentary assemblies who were women increased to 14 percent with Guyana once again having the highest proportion of women in these assemblies (26 percent). In the 2000 period, the representation of women at this level of decision-making was approximately 18 percent for the Region with **Montserrat, Trinidad and Tobago** (data for 2002 used), **The Bahamas and Saint Lucia** contributing to this improved representation.

#### MEMBER STATES

For **Belize**, the proportion of persons in the parliamentary assembly who were women in 1980, 1990 and 2000 were 8 percent, 3 percent and 15 percent respectively. In **Guyana**, the percentages increased from 15 percent in 1981 to 26 percent in 1991 but decreased to 18 percent in 2000. For **St. Kitts and Nevis**, the percentages were 7 percent in each of the years, 1980 and 1990 and 13 percent in 2002. **St. Vincent and the Grenadines** moved from an all male parliamentary assembly in 1980 to 13 percent being women in 1991 and in 2000, this percentage had decreased to 7 percent.



In the most recent period, 2000, **Montserrat** recorded the highest proportion of persons in a parliamentary assembly who were women with 33 percent. This was followed by **The Bahamas** and **Trinidad and Tobago** each with 27 percent in 2002. **Saint Lucia** was the next highest with 21 percent being women in 2001. In **Jamaica** and **St. Vincent and The Grenadines**, the proportion of persons in the parliamentary assemblies who were women was approximately 10 percent or less in the 2000 period.

## **2. Participation in Selected Senior-Level Positions in the Government Service CARICOM**

Data were available for only five (5) Member States (**Tables 1.3-1.4**), **Antigua and Barbuda, Dominica, Guyana, St. Vincent and The Grenadines** and **Trinidad and Tobago** for the 2000 period. In 1980, there were two countries with data on senior-level positions in the government service. For these two countries on average 8 percent of the persons in these senior-level positions in government were women, while in the 1990s the proportion was 16 percent and in the 2000 period, 25 percent on average.

For the three countries (including the two described above) that had data in this same category in the 1990s and 2000 period, on average 13 percent of the persons in senior-level positions in government were women in the 1990s compared to 21 percent in the 2000 period.

Overall for the five Member States with information in the 2000 period, 36 percent of the persons in senior-level positions were women.

Focusing on the actual positions for the 2000 period (**Table 1.5**) men exceeded women in all positions except for Governors of the Central Banks where the distribution was even. However, if the Eastern Caribbean Central Bank is incorporated to represent the Eastern Caribbean Currency Union (ECCU) area, then men are in the majority in this position.

The category, Permanent Secretary, reflected the most significant participation by women for these five Member States in the 2000 period with 45 percent of the positions being held by women.

## MEMBER STATES

For the individual Member States, **Antigua and Barbuda (Table 2.2)** recorded an even distribution of women and men in senior-level positions in government in 2001. In fact for this Member State there were more women as Permanent Secretaries (56 percent women) than men and as many women Directors of Departments as men in 2001.

**Dominica (Tables 6.3-6.4)** showed that senior-level positions in the government services were dominated by men with 92 percent men in 1998 and 88 percent in 2000. **Guyana (Tables 8.3-8.4)** also showed that men dominated senior-level government positions with 100 percent in 1980, 86 percent in 1990 and 79 percent in 2000.

**St. Vincent and the Grenadines (Tables 13.3-13.4)** also appeared to be improving its representation of women in selected categories of senior-level government positions with Permanent Secretaries and Directors of Departments reflecting over 33 percent of the total in each category in 2000. In 1980 and 1990, women accounted for 29 percent and 14 percent respectively of the Permanent Secretaries and for Directors of Departments, women accounted for 13 percent in 1980 and 27 percent in 1990 in this Member State. The overall figures for St. Vincent and The Grenadines show that in 1980, 15 percent of the senior positions in the government services were held by women, in 1990, 19 per cent and in 2000, 29 per cent.

For **Trinidad and Tobago (Table 15.3)**, in 2001, 62 percent of the persons holding senior-level positions in the government service were women, which effectively reflected the Permanent Secretaries positions of 63 percent, which were held by women. There were no corresponding data available for previous years for this Member State.

### 3. Persons in Selected Public Order and Safety Occupations

#### CARICOM

Looking at Persons in selected public order and safety occupations which included Judges, Magistrates, Prosecutors and Court Registrars (**Tables 1.6-1.8**), data were available for **Antigua and Barbuda, The Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, St. Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, St. Vincent and the Grenadines and Trinidad and Tobago**. Data for the period of the 1980s, which were available for seven of the eleven countries, showed the dominance

of men in public order and safety occupations. In 1980, 12 percent of persons in these occupations were women. The available figures for 2000-2002 for the Region showed that women accounted for 31 percent of persons in selected public order and safety occupations. For the countries represented in 2000-2002 (**Table 1.8**), men dominated the positions of Judges with 82 percent and Directors of Public Prosecution with 83 percent. Approximately 40 percent of the categories, Magistrates and Prosecutors, were women. **Table 1.7** showed that in **Grenada** there was no change in the proportion of persons who were women in these positions for the periods 1996 and 2000 (13 percent). In **Saint Lucia**, women accounted for 38 percent (1980), 54 percent (1993)) and 29 percent (2001) of the persons in selected public order and safety occupations.

### **MEMBER STATES**

**Antigua and Barbuda** (**Table 2.4**) showed an interesting change from 1980 to 1994 with 100 percent of Judges being men in 1980 as compared to 71 percent being men in 1994. This implies that there were inroads in the number of Judges who were women between 1980 and 1994 for Antigua and Barbuda.

In 1993 for **The Bahamas** (**Tables 3.3-3.4**), the positions of Solicitor General and Principal Legal Draughtsman were held by women, while the Director of Legal Affairs and Chief Counsel were held by men. There were also reduced women-men gaps for the categories Senior Counsel and Counsel, with women dominating the categories of Assistant Counsel. These figures for The Bahamas in 1993 are in contrast to the position in 1980 in which all categories of public order and safety occupations were held by men. Overall for **The Bahamas** in 1993, there were more women than men (56 percent to 44 percent) in these occupations.

For **Belize** (**Table 5.3**), in 2000, the percentages of men and women in the selected public order and safety occupations were fairly close, with an 8 percent gap between women (46 percent) and men. In particular there were more women as Magistrates (67 percent) than men (33 percent).

In **Dominica** (**Tables 6.5-6.6**) the ratio of women to men in these occupations moved from 25 percent women in 1998 to 38 percent women in 2000, a reduction of the women to men gap in these occupations.

For **Saint Lucia (Tables 12.5-12.6)**, the 1980s showed that all Court Registrars and 67 percent of the Magistrates were women, while all the Judges were men. For all of the selected public order and safety occupations in 1980, 38 percent were women. In each of the years, 1990 and 2000 there was one female Judge, which reduced the percentage of Judges who were men from 100 percent in 1980 to 80 percent in these two years. In 1980 and 1993, women dominated the position of Magistrates with 67 percent and 100 percent respectively. However in 2001, the position of Magistrates showed a reversed trend with men occupying 83 percent of these positions.

Public order and safety occupations showed a concentration of men in 1980 and 1990 in **St. Vincent and the Grenadines (Tables 13.5-13.6)**. In 2000 this concentration persisted for the positions of Judges and the Solicitor General. The position of Magistrate however showed that 60 percent of these occupations were held by women in 2000 including that of Chief Magistrate. Additionally, the positions of Director of Public Prosecution and High Court Registrar were also occupied by women in 2000.

Available data for **Trinidad and Tobago (Table 15.5)** for 2001 showed that 77 percent of the Judges were men. In 2001, the position of Director of Public Prosecutor was also held by a man while the post of Solicitor General was occupied by a woman.

In general the data indicates that the number of women entering these professions compared to their male counterparts is increasing over time. However, there are certain categories such as Judges where there is little or no shift from a concentration of men.

#### **4. Employment**

##### **CARICOM**

For most of the Member States, the source of the data used for persons employed by occupation group and status in employment was the results of the 1980 and 1990 Rounds of Population and Housing Censuses. Available data for this series from the Year 2000 Round of Population and Housing Censuses were also included. In the case of **Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Jamaica, Suriname and Trinidad and Tobago**, data were obtained from Labour Force Surveys, Household Surveys and Surveys of Living Conditions.

The 1980 Round of Population and Housing Censuses (**Table 1.12**) revealed that for the Region, the proportion of total persons with jobs who were women was 31 percent. In the 1990 Round of Censuses, this proportion increased to 36 percent for women. Latest available data for the 2000 period for five countries showed that the proportion of total persons with jobs who were women was 44 percent for these countries.

## **MEMBER STATES**

For Member States, although there were fewer women employed than men, the proportion of total persons employed who are women has been increasing over time. For **The Bahamas** (**Table 3.6**) 47 percent and 48 percent of the total persons employed were women in 1990 and 2000 respectively, with the percentage for Antigua and Barbuda (**Table 2.5**) being 46 percent in 1991 and for Barbados 45 percent in 1990 and 47 percent in 2000 (**Table 4.6**).

Both **Belize** and **Guyana** recorded low percentages of women among the employed in the 1980s and 1990s. For **Belize** (**Table 5.5**) in 1980, the percentage of employed persons who were women was 20 percent and in 1991, 24 percent, and to 30 percent in 2000. In the case of **Guyana** (**Table 8.10**), women accounted for 23 percent and 26 percent of the persons employed in 1980 and 1991 respectively. Therefore in the case of these two Member States the majority of employed persons were men. However, recent results from The Survey of Living Conditions conducted in **Guyana** in 1999 (**Table 8.11**) showed that the proportion of employed persons who were women had increased to 33 percent.

### **4.1. Persons Employed by Occupation Group – Legislators, Senior Officials and Managers**

#### **CARICOM**

Data from the 1980 Round of Population and Housing Censuses (**Table 1.10**) revealed that for the Region, the proportion of persons employed as Legislators, Senior Officials and Managers who were women was 17 percent. The 1990 Round of Censuses showed that 37 percent of the persons employed as Legislators, Senior Officials and Managers were women. Comparison of these two Rounds of Censuses therefore shows some inroads with respect to the representation of women at this level of decision-making. For this table, data was not available for **Antigua and Barbuda**, **Jamaica** and **Suriname** for the 1980 Round of Population and Housing Censuses. **Suriname** is

excluded from the data shown for the 1990 Round of Population and Housing Censuses. Available data from the 2000 Rounds of Censuses for **The Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Montserrat and Saint Lucia** showed that the proportion of persons employed as Legislators, Senior Officials and Managers who were women, was 41 percent for these five countries as a whole.

## **MEMBER STATES**

For most Member States, while the proportion of persons employed as Legislators, Senior Officials and Managers who were women generally increased over the last twenty (20) years, men consistently exceeded women in these positions in the Region.

In 1980, **Belize** recorded the lowest percentage of persons employed in this category of workers who were women, 12 percent; this improved to 31 percent and 39 percent in 1991 and 2000 respectively. **Guyana** also showed similar improvement in the proportion of persons employed as Legislators, Senior Officials and Managers who were women, increasing from 13 percent in 1980 to 26 percent in 1991. The Survey of Living Conditions conducted in Guyana in 1999 (**Table 8.11**) revealed that the 33 percent of persons employed were women.

In **Dominica** in 1980, 24 percent of the persons occupying these positions were women; in 1991 and 1999, women had exceeded men in these positions and accounted for 55 percent and 58 percent respectively for these years. Data presented for 1999 (**Table 6.9**) was obtained from the Labour Force Survey.

**Jamaica (Table 9.4)** appeared to be the only Member State in which women consistently exceeded men in this category of occupation for all the periods even though there was a slight fall in the proportion of women in 1999 compared to 1991. Labour Force Surveys in 1984, 1991 and 1999 showed that the proportion of persons employed in this category who were women was 57 percent, 60 percent and 56 percent respectively.

**The Bahamas, Barbados, Grenada, Montserrat, St. Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia and St. Vincent and The Grenadines (Table 1.10)** also recorded improvements with regard to the proportion of persons employed as Legislators, Senior Officials and Managers who were women in the 1990/91 period compared to the 1980/81 period. In **The Bahamas** and **Barbados**, the

proportion of persons in this occupation group who were women increased from 25 percent to 34 percent and from 19 percent to 34 percent respectively. For **Grenada**, the proportion moved from 19 percent in 1981 to 26 percent in 1991. The results of the 1998 Labour Force Survey (**Table 7.7**) indicated that this proportion was 49 percent.

For other Member States, the proportion of Legislators, Senior Officials and Managers who were women were **Montserrat** (26 percent in 1980, 38 percent in 1991 and 39 percent in 2001), **St. Kitts and Nevis** (14 percent in 1980 and 41 percent in 1991), **Saint Lucia** (17 percent in 1980, 47 percent in 1991 and 49 percent in 2001) and **St. Vincent and The Grenadines** (20 percent in 1980 and 42 percent in 1991).

## **4.2 Persons Employed by Status in Employment**

### **CARICOM**

A comparison of the data from the 1980 and 1990 Rounds of Censuses showed that in the 1990/91 period (**Table 1.14**), there was a small improvement in the proportion of employers and own account workers who were women. With respect to employers, the proportion of women employers increased from 16 percent to 21 percent and for own account women workers, increased from 23 percent to 26 percent between these two periods. Men continue to dominate the positions of employers and own account workers.

### **MEMBER STATES**

**Belize** recorded the lowest proportions of female employers and own account workers; in 1980, 7 percent of employers and 8 percent of own account workers were women. By 1991, there was a small improvement with women accounting for 12 percent of the employers and 14 percent of own account workers.

In **Guyana** for both 1980 and 1991, the proportions of employers who were women was also low and this remained constant at 12 percent. With respect to own account workers, the proportion of these workers who were women increased from 18 percent in 1980 to 20 percent in 1991.

Therefore in the case of both **Belize** and **Guyana** the larger proportion of employers and own account workers tended to be men over the twenty-year period.

The Member States that recorded a high proportion of employers who were women in the 1980s were **Barbados** with 22 percent and **Dominica, Montserrat, St. Kitts and Nevis** and **Saint Lucia** each with 21 percent. By the 1990s, there were more women who were employers and the Member States that recorded a high proportion of employers who are women were **St. Kitts and Nevis** (30 percent), **Antigua and Barbuda** (29 percent), **Barbados** (26 percent) and **Saint Lucia** (25 percent).

In the 1980s, the countries with high proportions of female own account workers were **The Bahamas** (39 percent), **Barbados** (36 percent), **St. Kitts and Nevis** (34 percent) and **Grenada** (30 percent). By the 1990s, the countries that recorded high proportions of female own account workers were **Antigua and Barbuda** (43 percent), **St. Kitts and Nevis** (42 percent), **The Bahamas** (37 percent), **Saint Lucia** (36 percent), and **Grenada** and **Montserrat** (33 percent).

The 1980 and 1990 Rounds of Population and Housing Censuses revealed that generally in the Region the proportion of persons employed as employers and own account workers who were men outnumbered the proportion that were women. The data also revealed that for most Member States there was a reduction of the gap between men and women who occupied these positions. Results for 2000 are forthcoming.

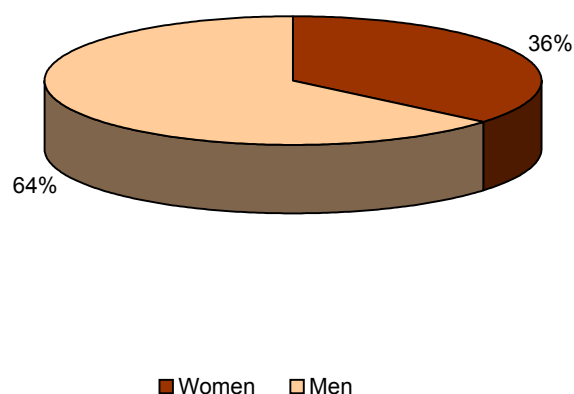

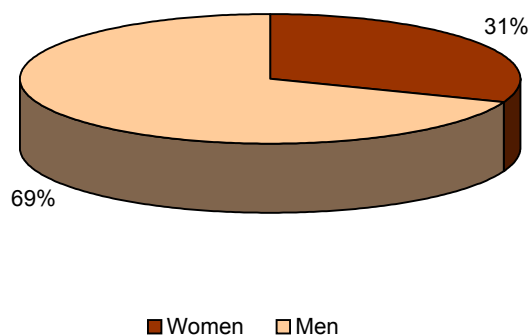

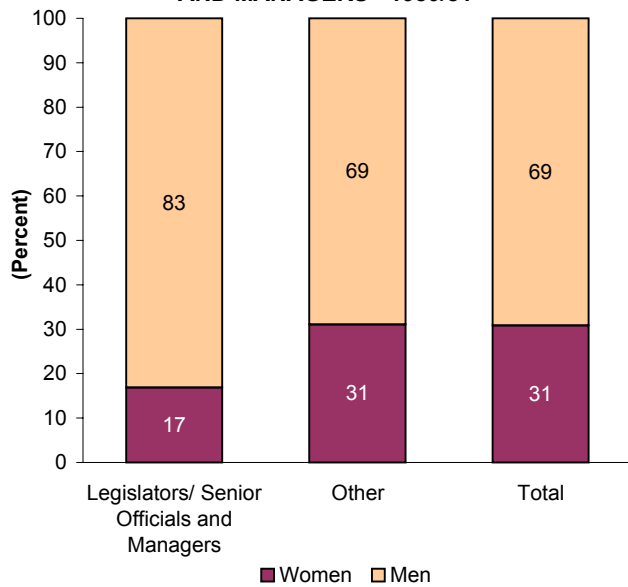

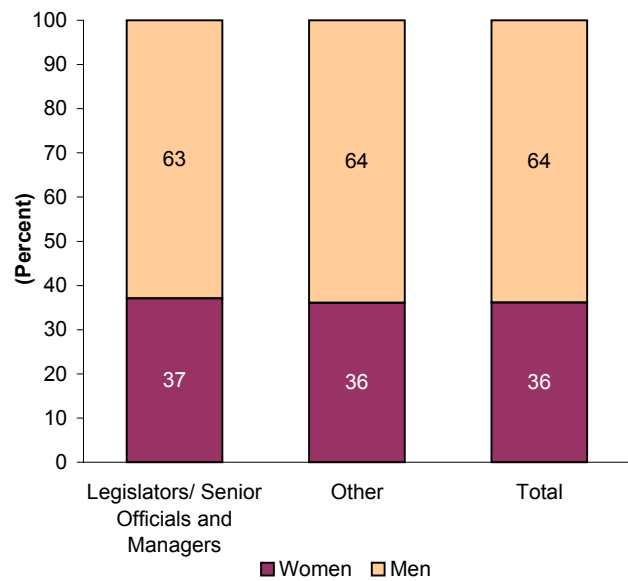

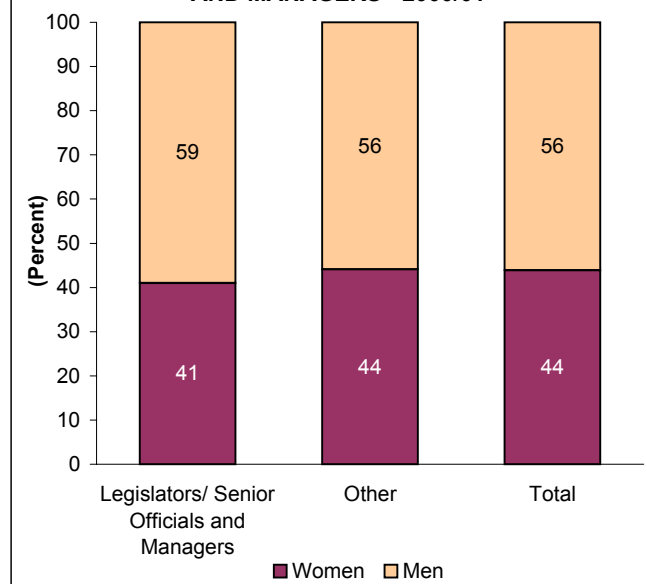
**FIGURE 1.3: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONS EMPLOYED BY OCCUPATION GROUP - LEGISLATORS, SENIOR OFFICIALS AND MANAGERS - 1980/81**

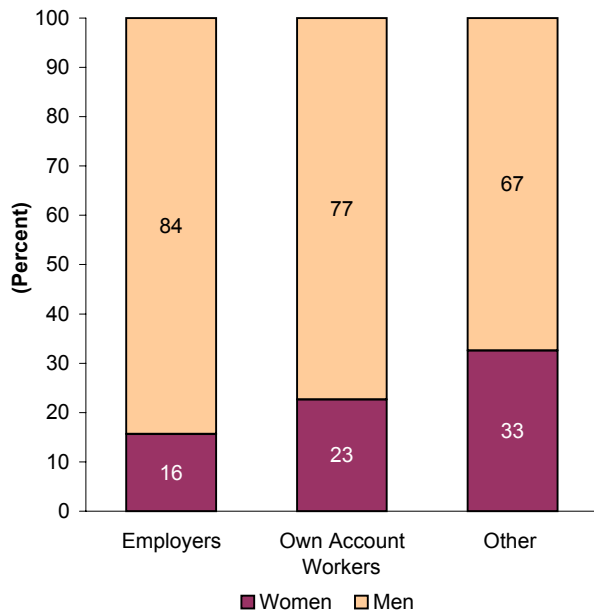

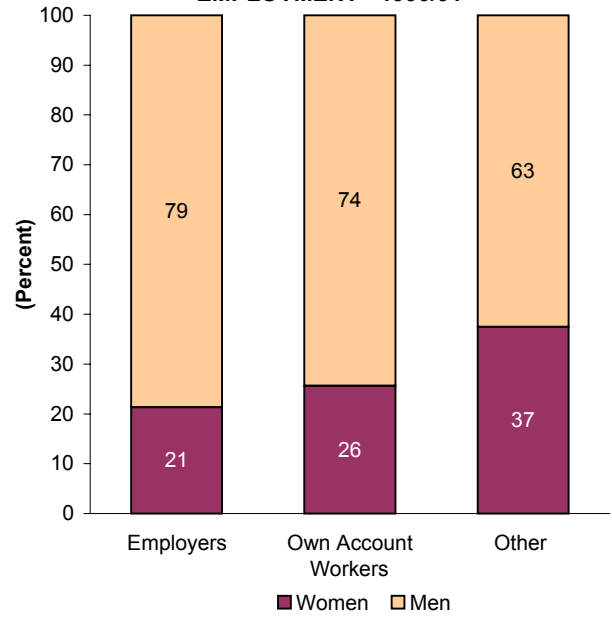

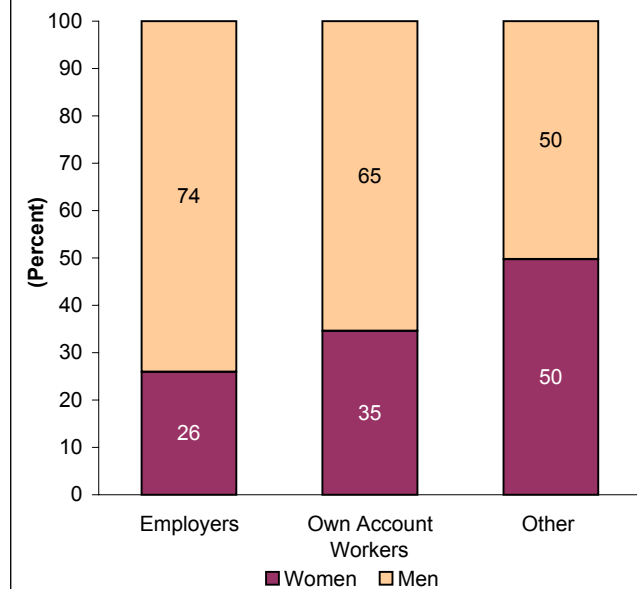
**FIGURE 1.6: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONS EMPLOYED BY STATUS IN EMPLOYMENT - 1980/81**

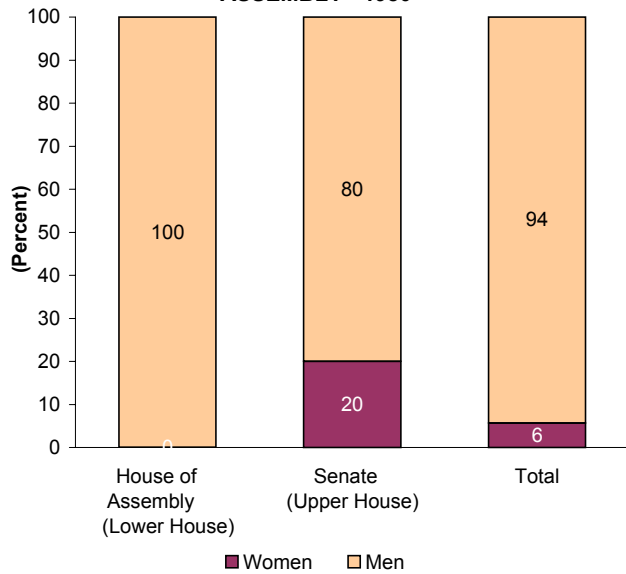

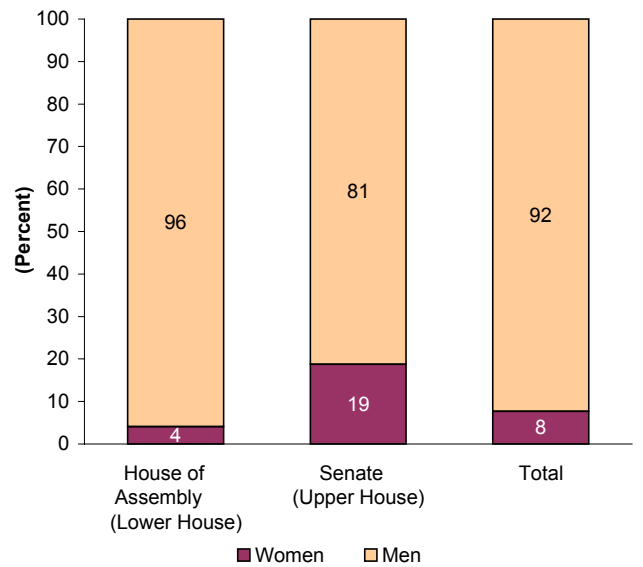

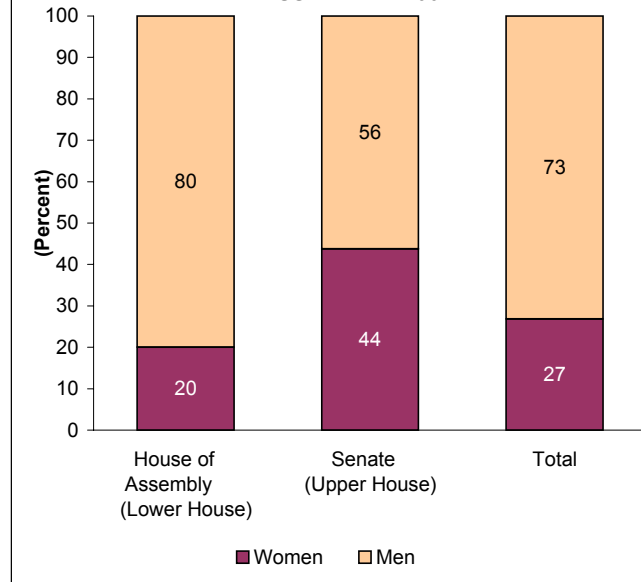
**FIGURE 3.1: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENTARY ASSEMBLY - 1980**

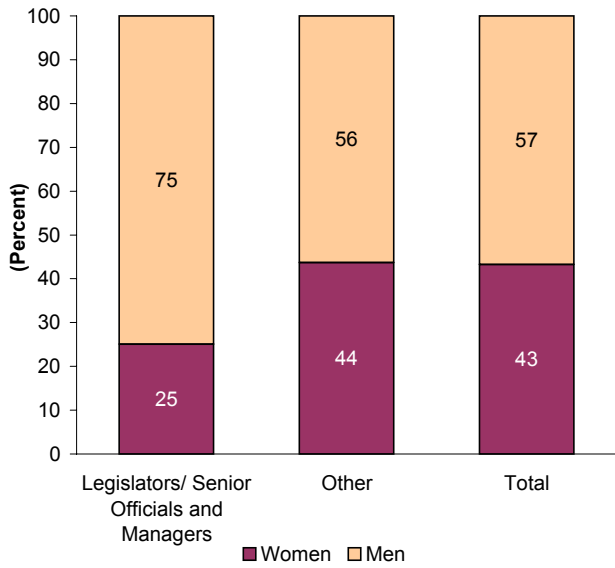

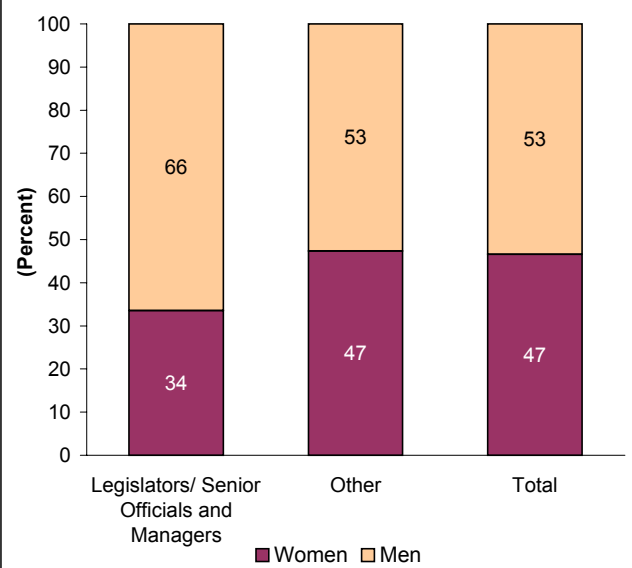

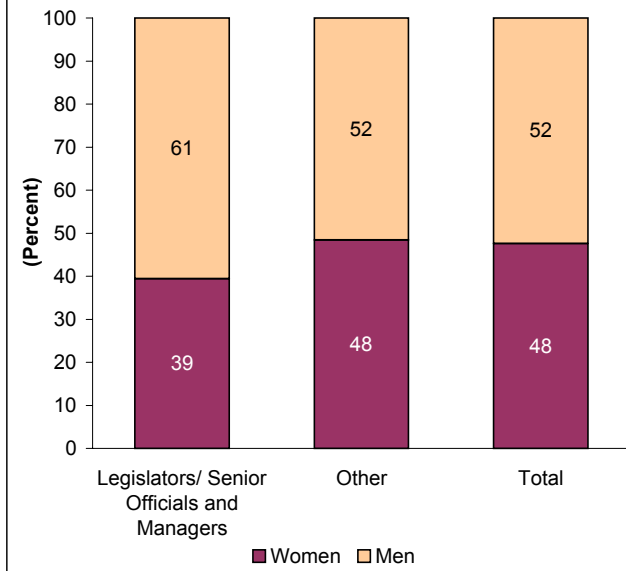
**FIGURE 3.4: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONS EMPLOYED BY OCCUPATION GROUP - LEGISLATORS, SENIOR OFFICIALS AND MANAGERS-1980**

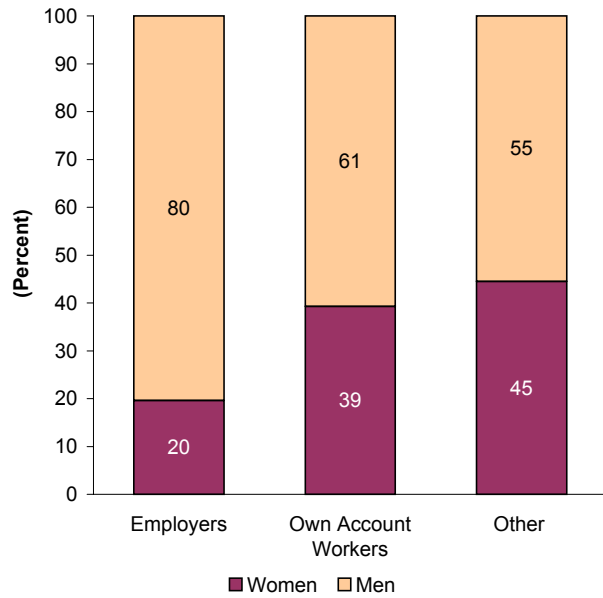

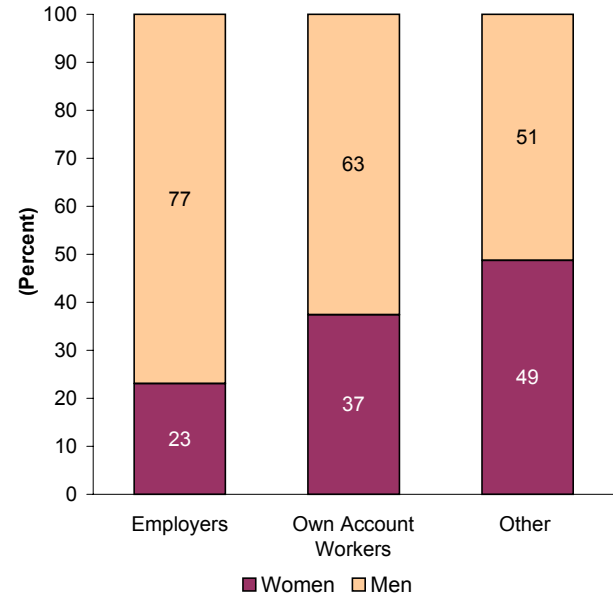

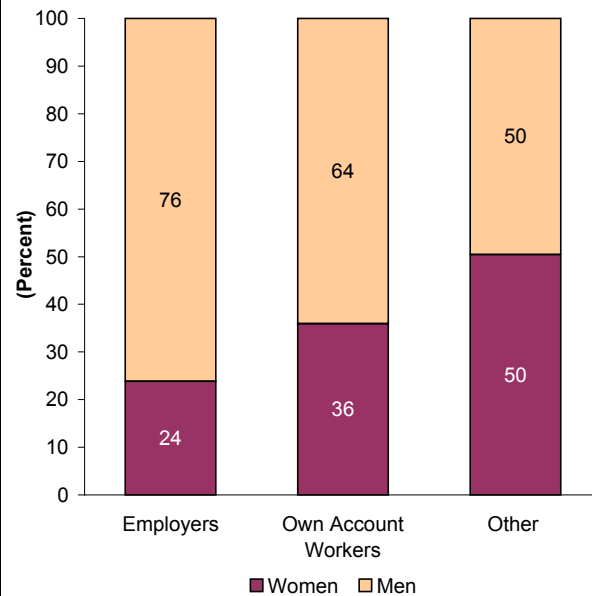
**FIGURE 3.7: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONS EMPLOYED BY STATUS IN EMPLOYMENT - 1980**

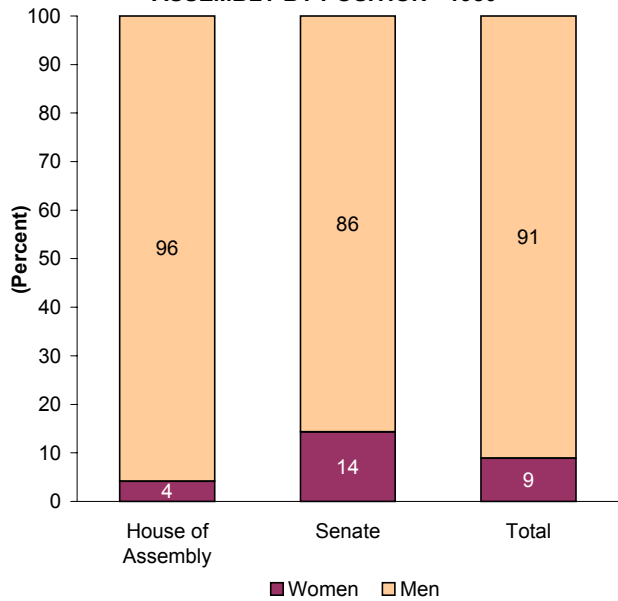

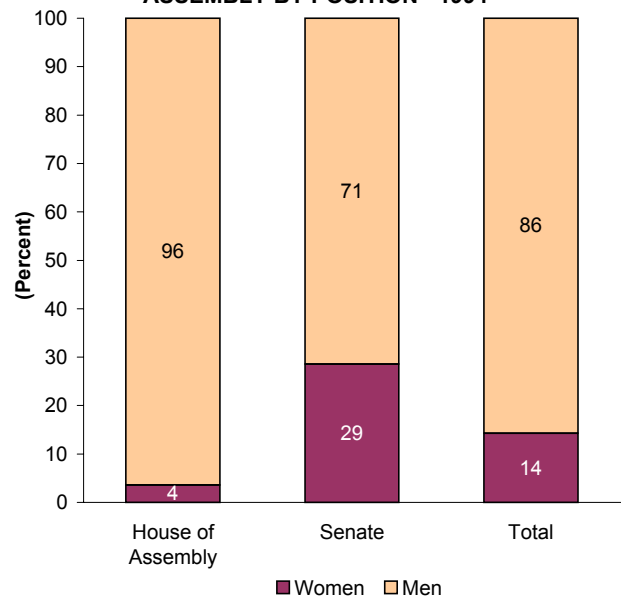

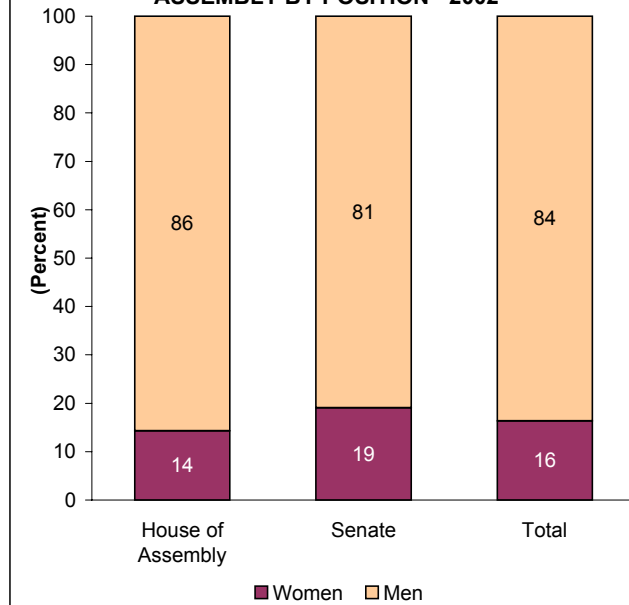
**FIGURE 4.1: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENTARY ASSEMBLY BY POSITION - 1980**

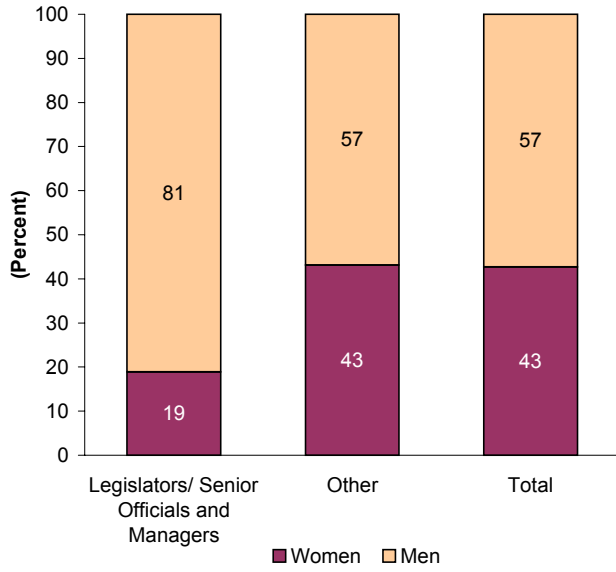

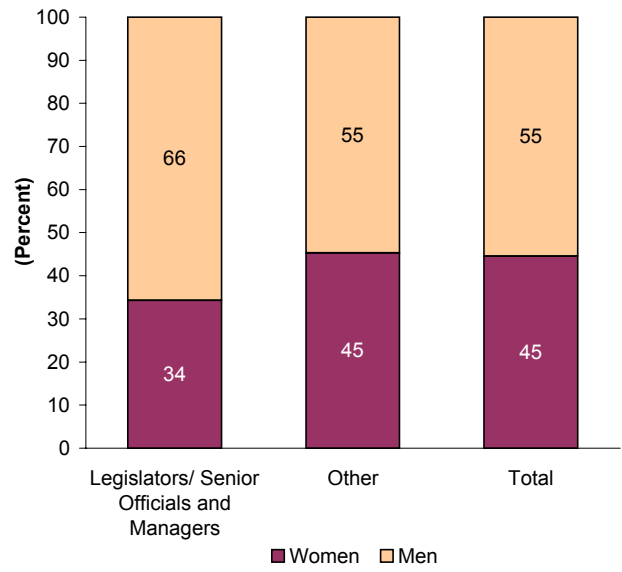

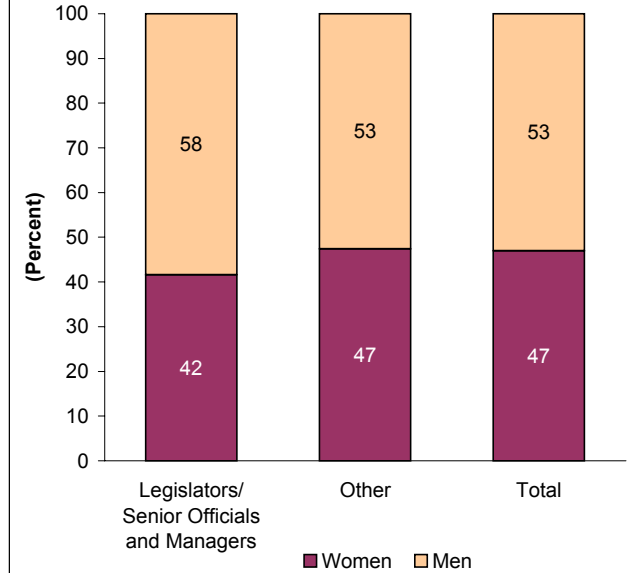
**FIGURE 4.4: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONS EMPLOYED BY OCCUPATION GROUP - LEGISLATORS, SENIOR OFFICIALS AND MANAGERS - 1980**

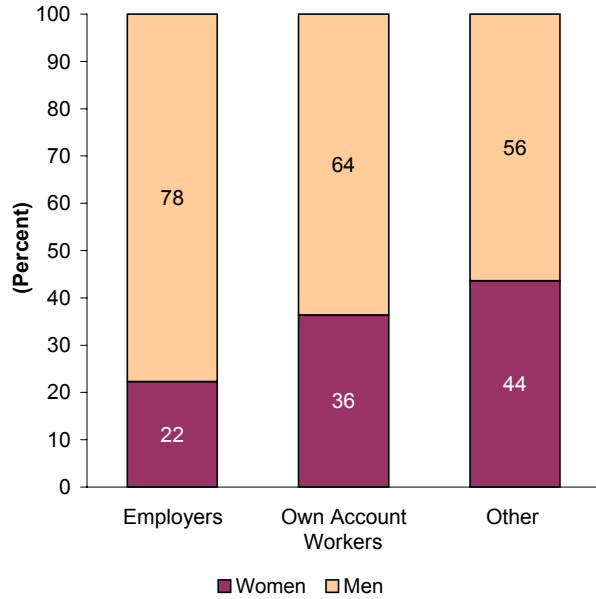

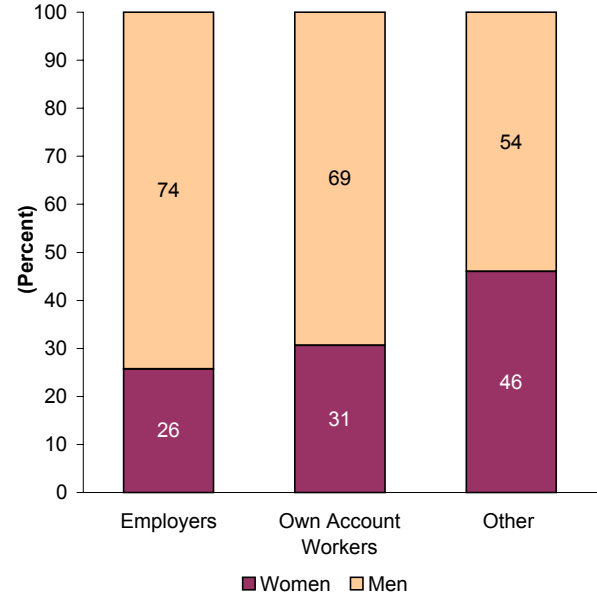

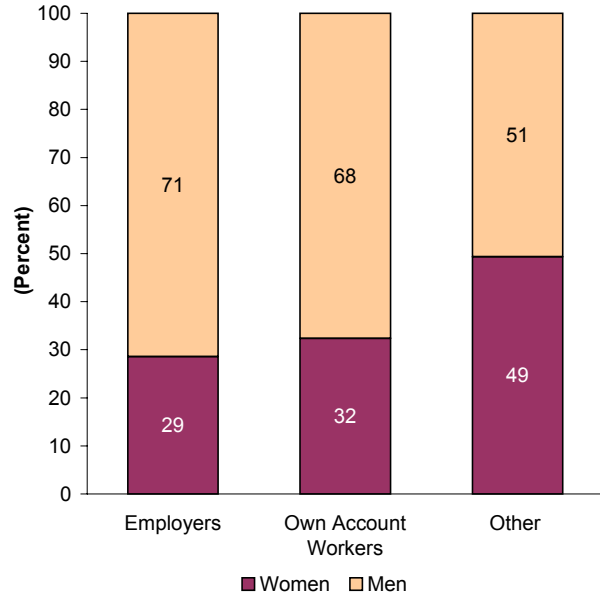
**FIGURE 4.7: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONS EMPLOYED BY STATUS IN EMPLOYMENT - 1980**

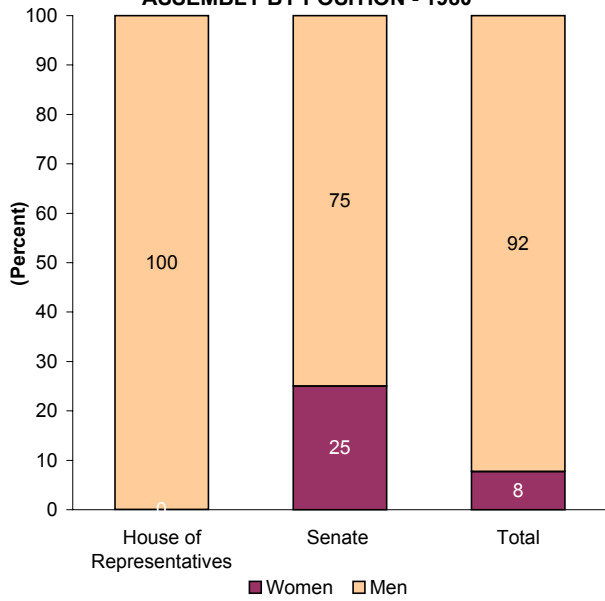

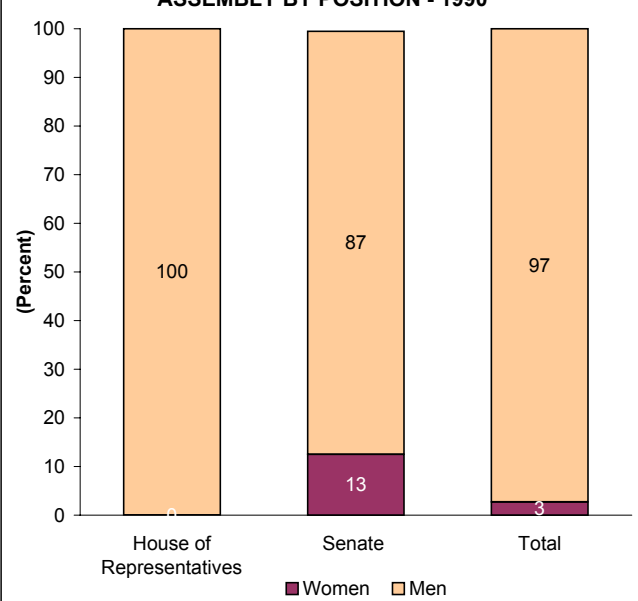

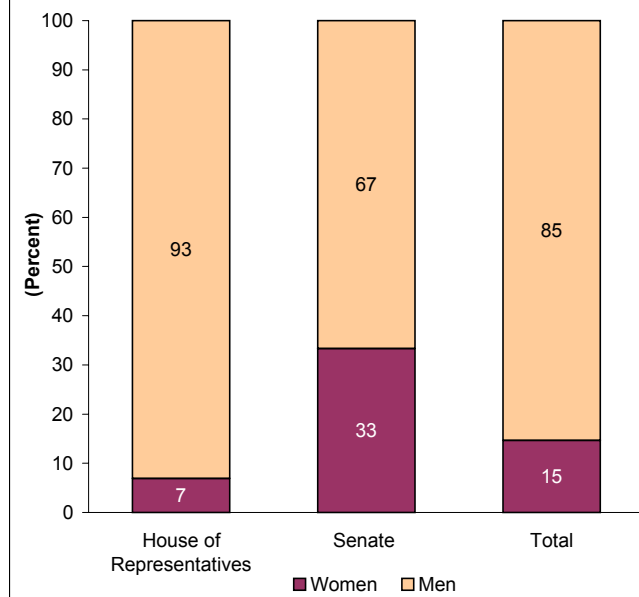
**FIGURE 5.1: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENTARY ASSEMBLY BY POSITION - 1980**

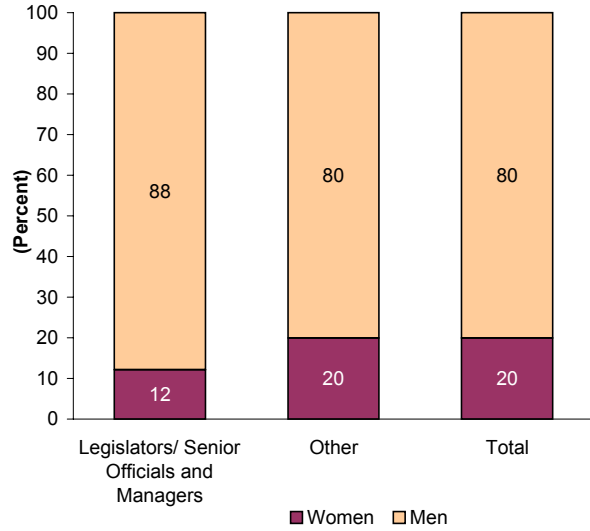

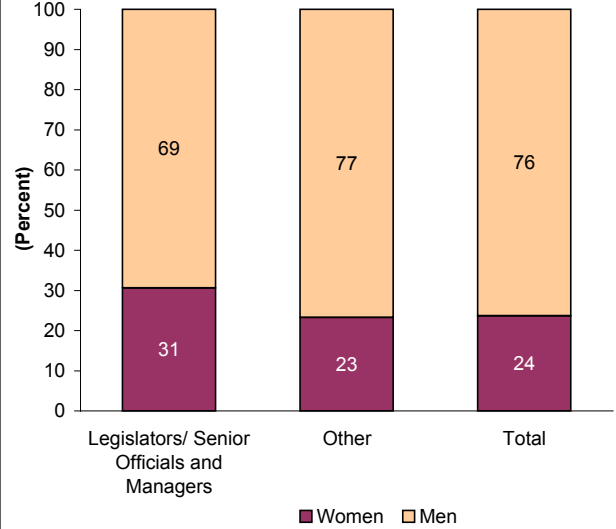

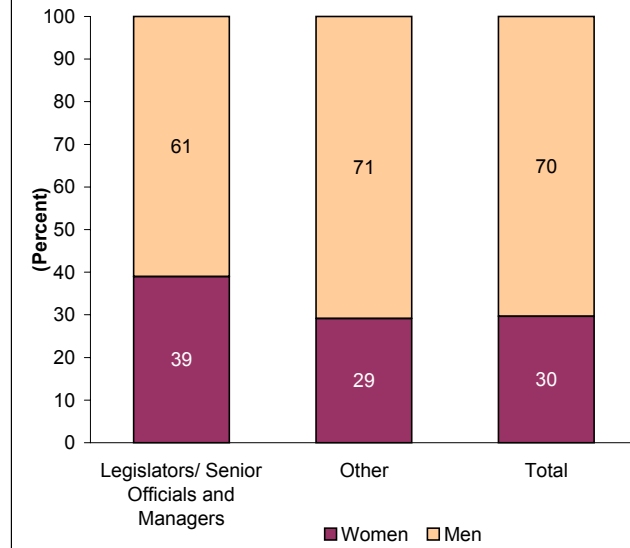
**FIGURE 5.4: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONS EMPLOYED BY OCCUPATION GROUP - LEGISLATORS, SENIOR OFFICIALS AND MANAGERS 1980**

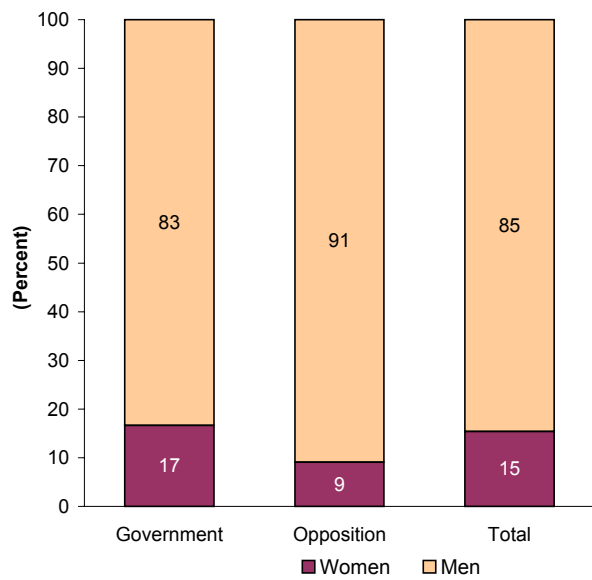

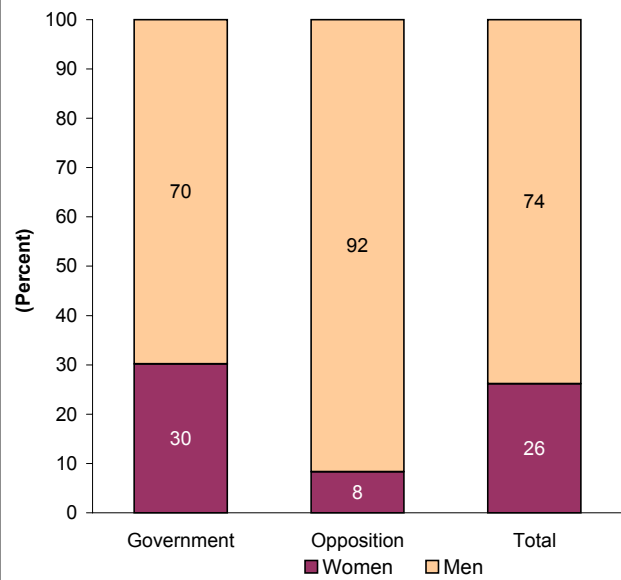

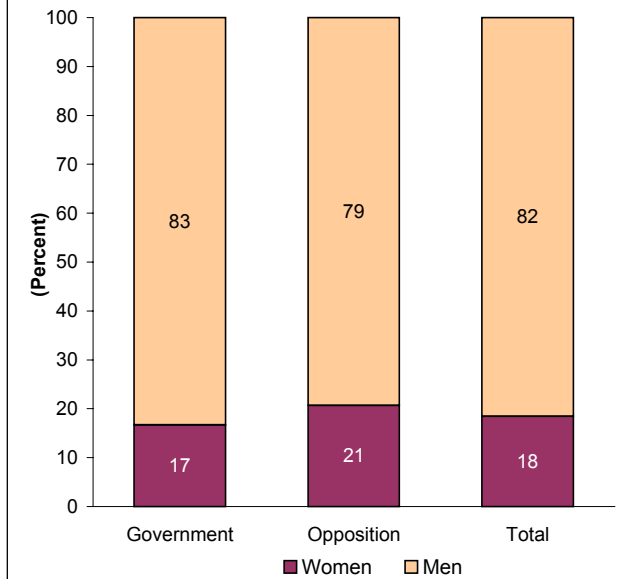
**FIGURE 8.1: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENTARY ASSEMBLY BY POSITION - 1981**

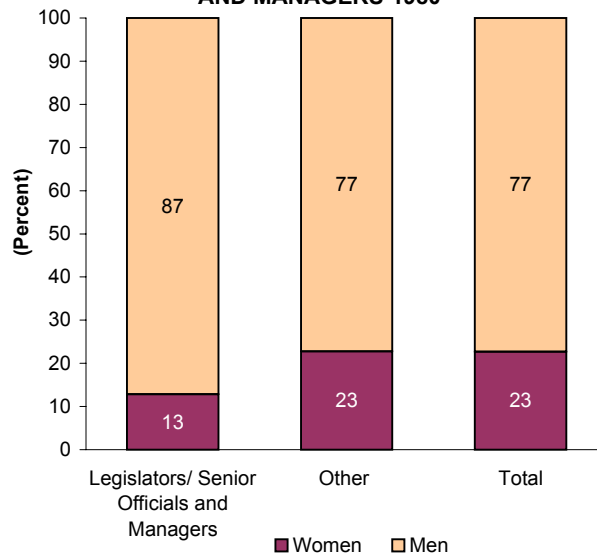

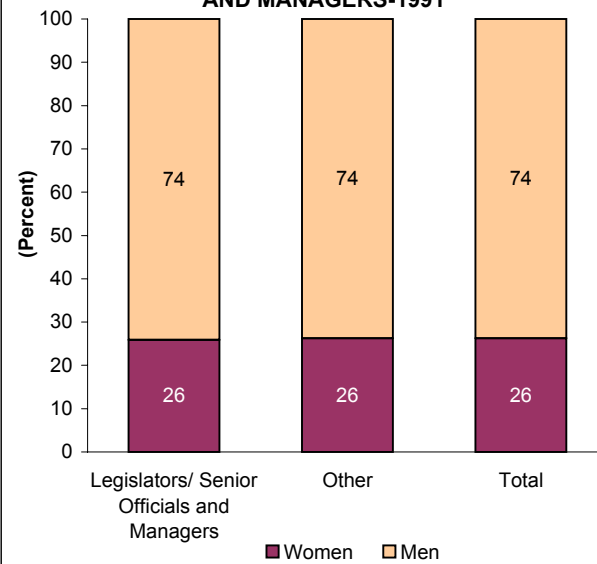

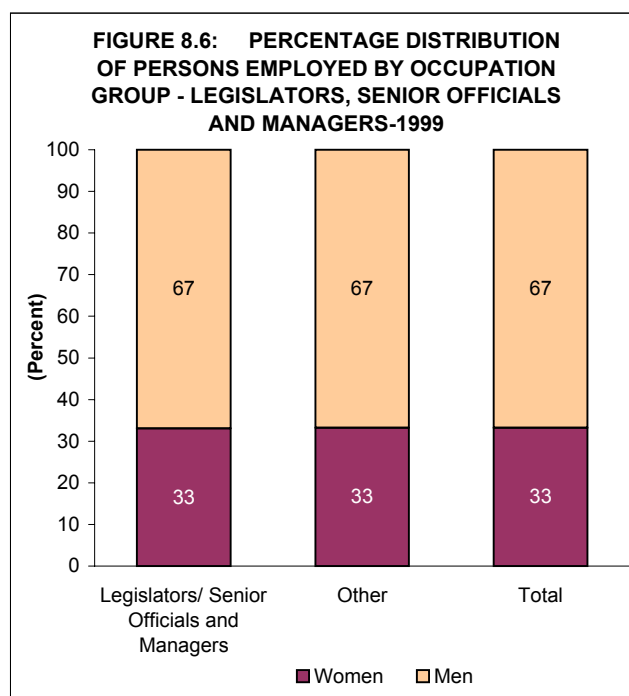

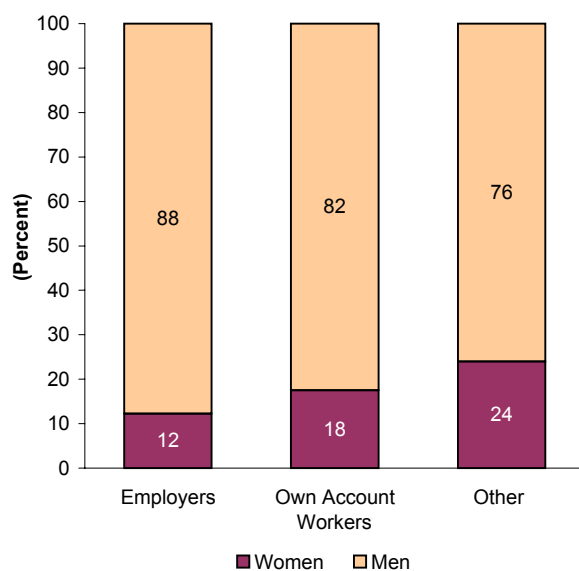

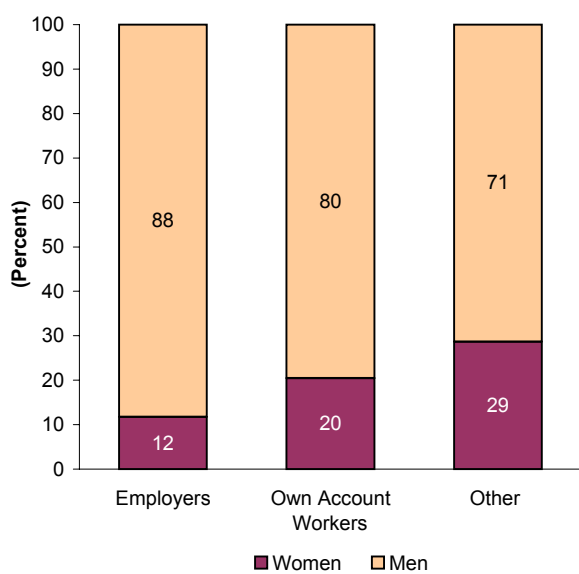

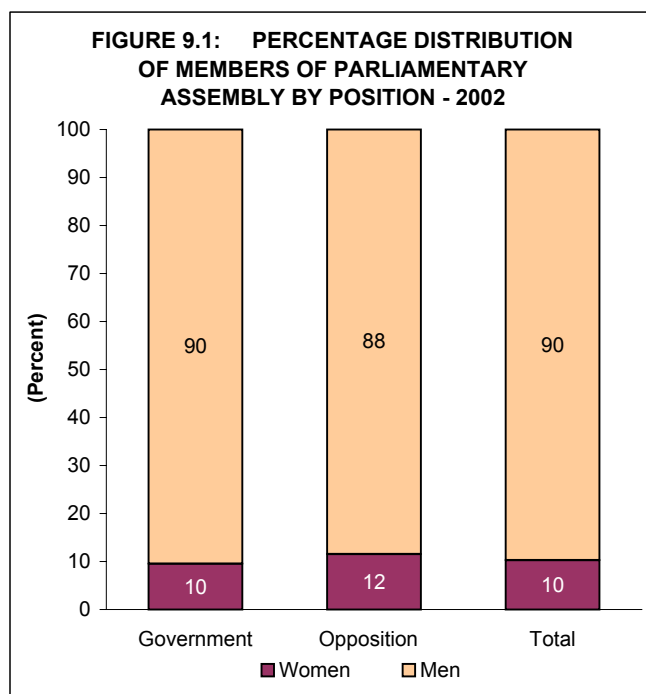

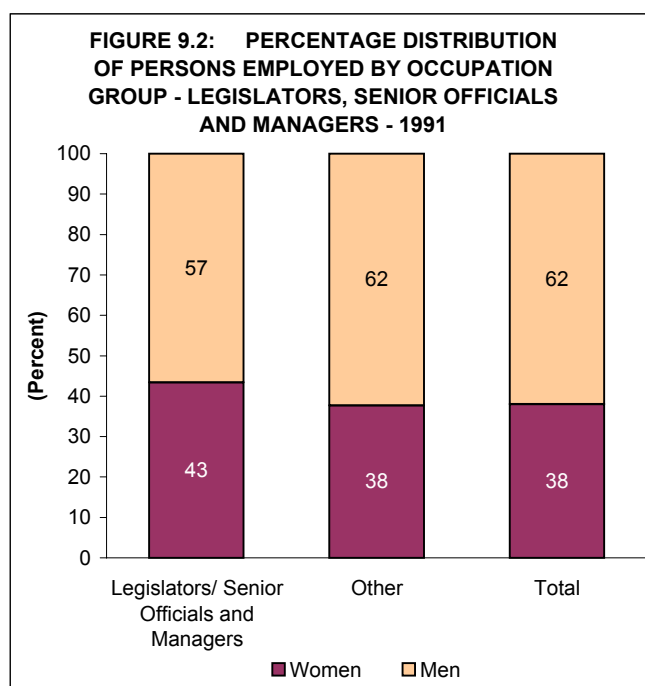

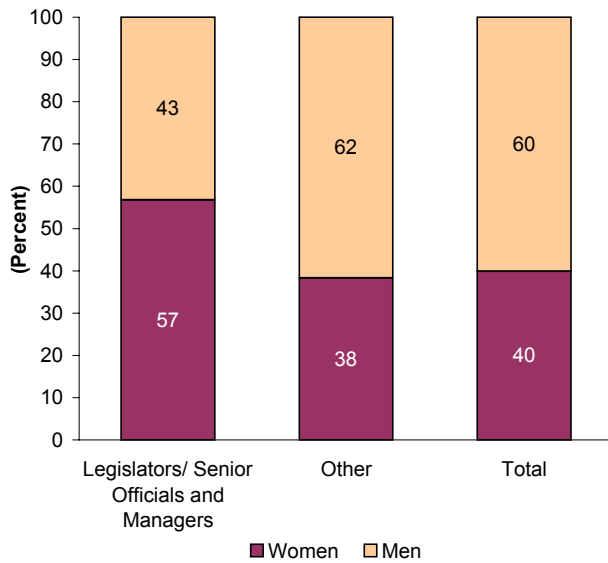

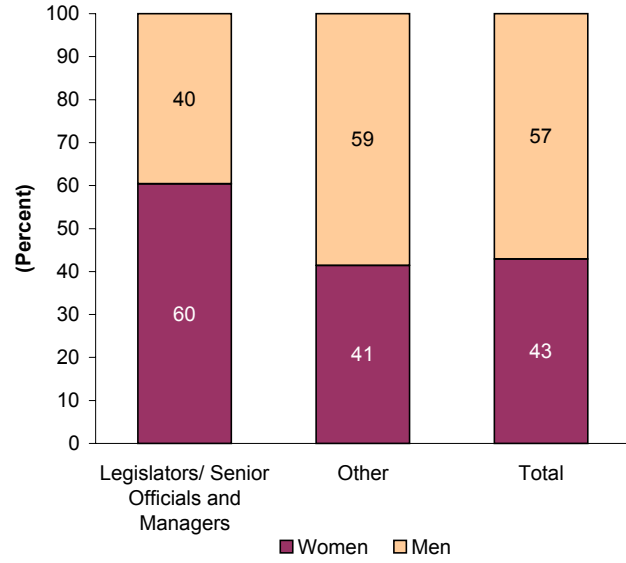

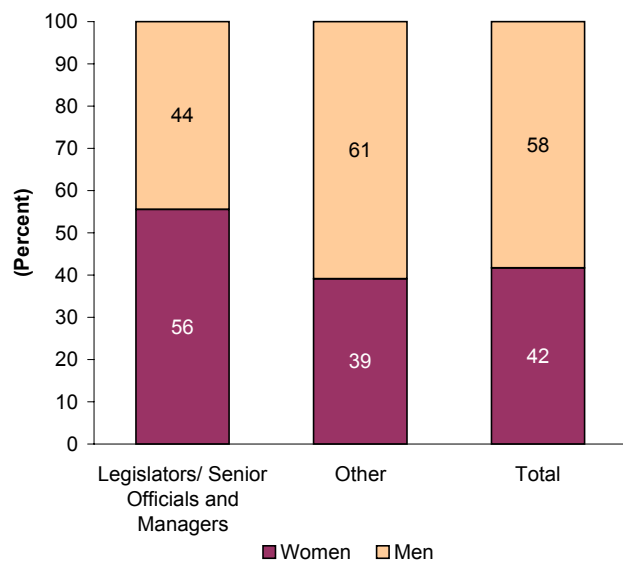
**FIGURE 9.3: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONS EMPLOYED BY OCCUPATION GROUP - LEGISLATORS, SENIOR OFFICIALS AND MANAGERS - 1984**

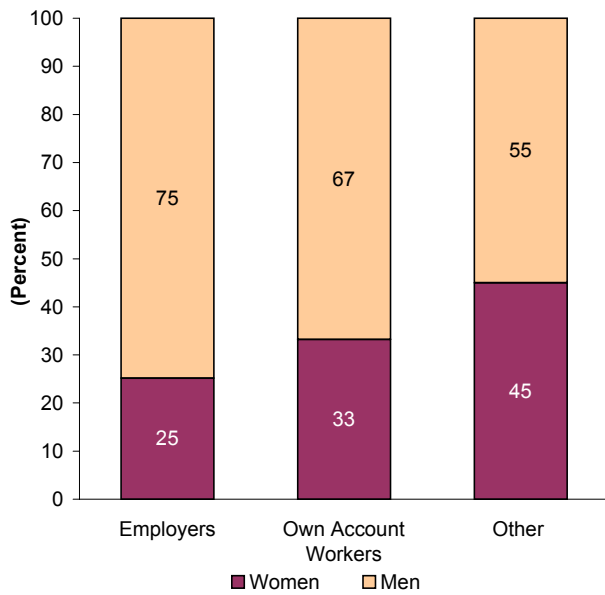

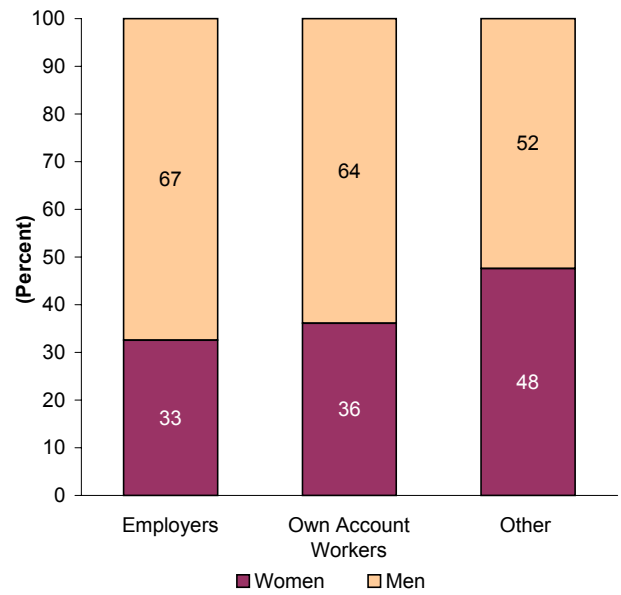

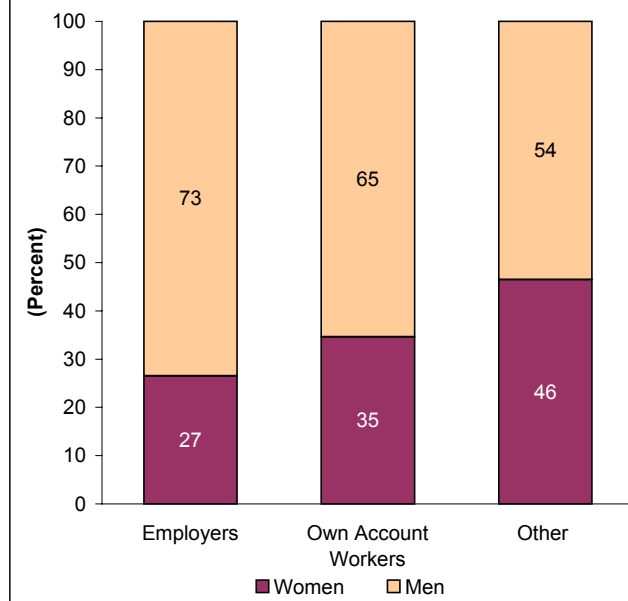
**FIGURE 9.6: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONS EMPLOYED BY STATUS IN EMPLOYMENT - 1984**

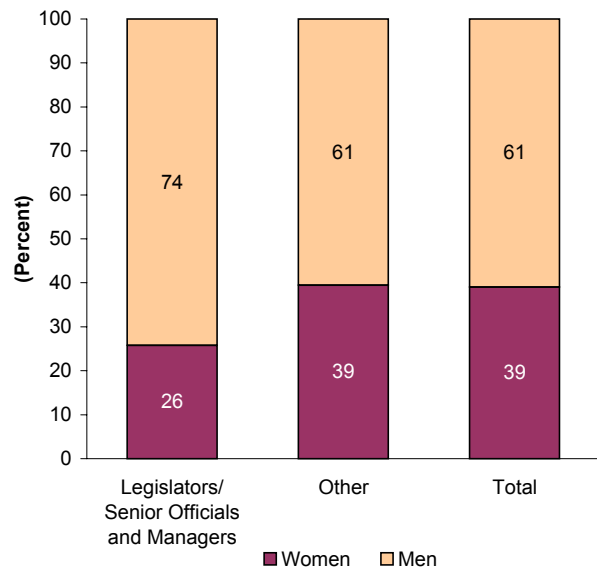

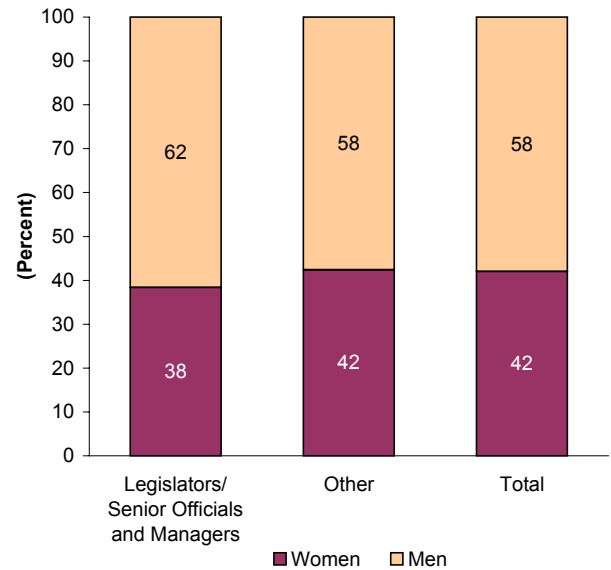

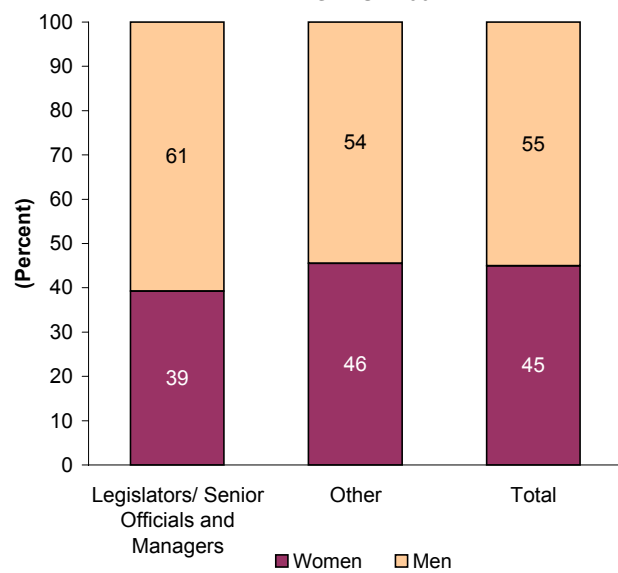
**FIGURE 10.2: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONS EMPLOYED BY OCCUPATION GROUP - LEGISLATORS, SENIOR OFFICIALS AND MANAGERS - 1980**

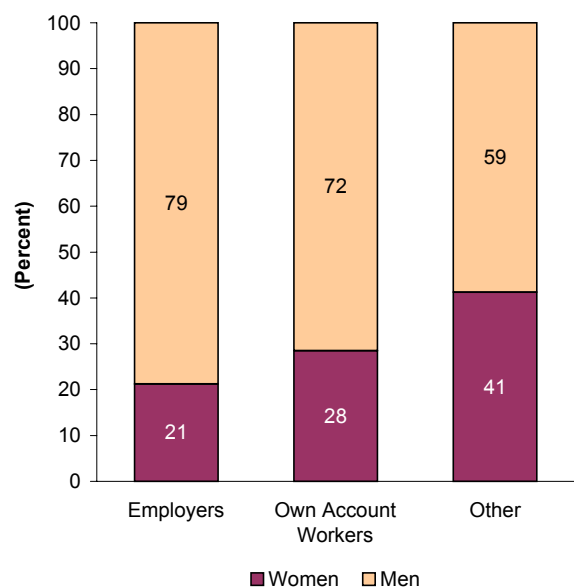

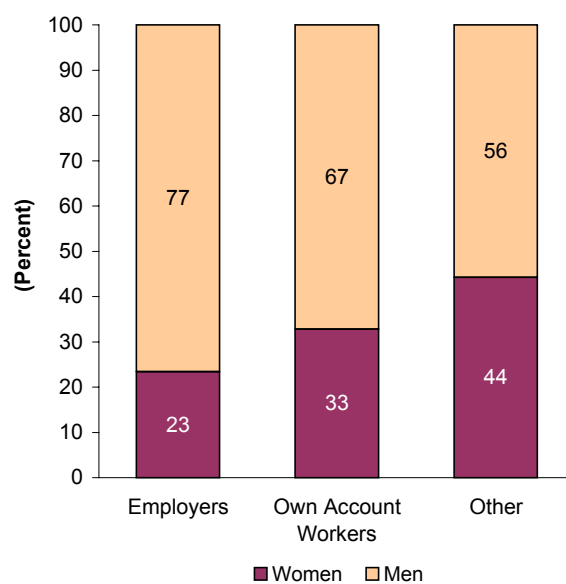

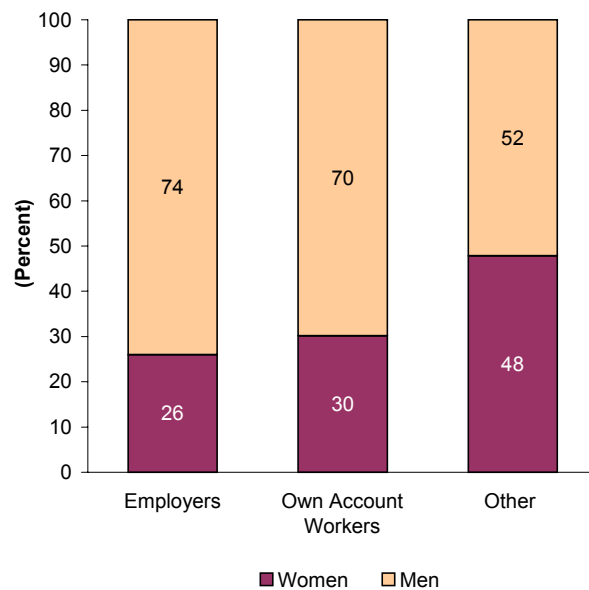
**FIGURE 10.5: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONS EMPLOYED BY STATUS IN EMPLOYMENT - 1980**

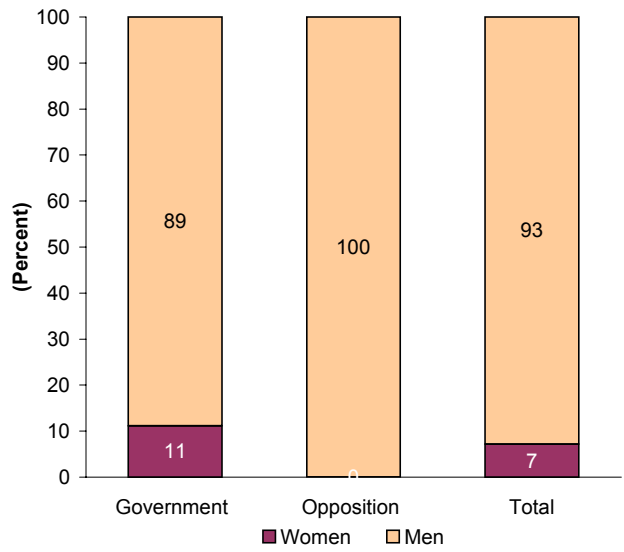

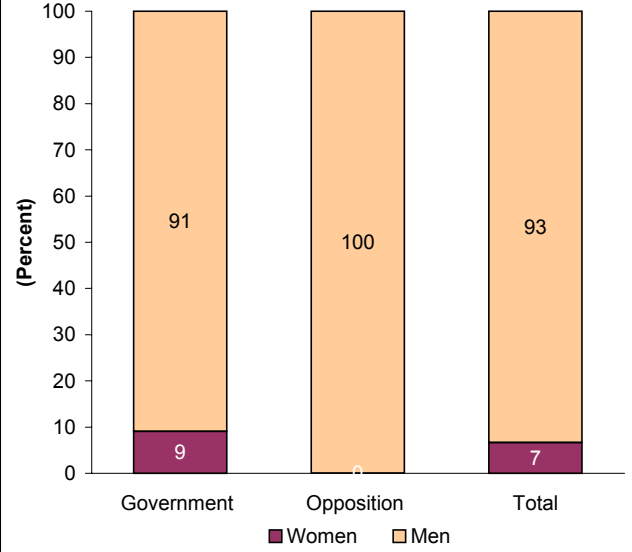

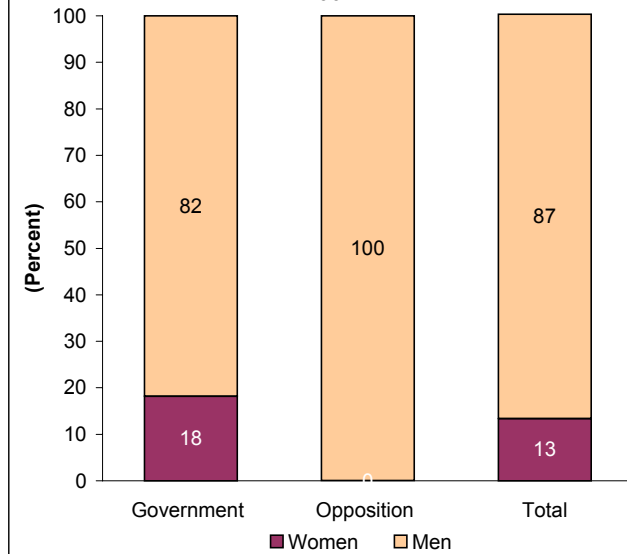
**FIGURE 11.1: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENTARY ASSEMBLY BY POSITION - 1980**

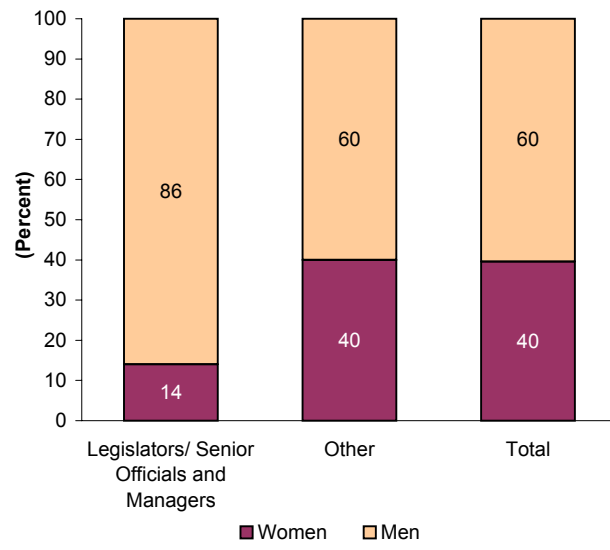

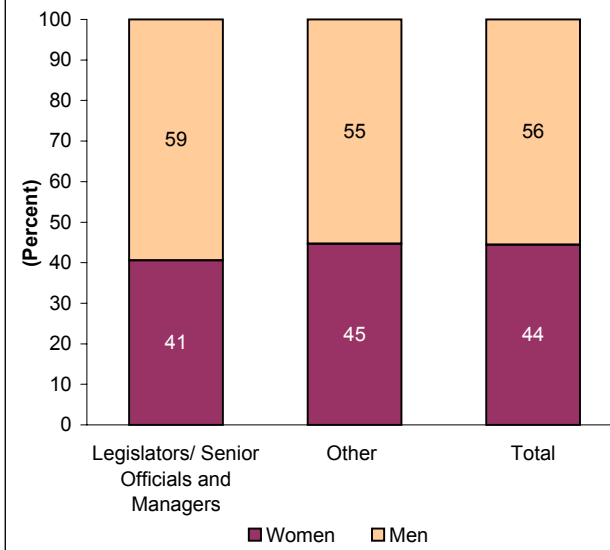

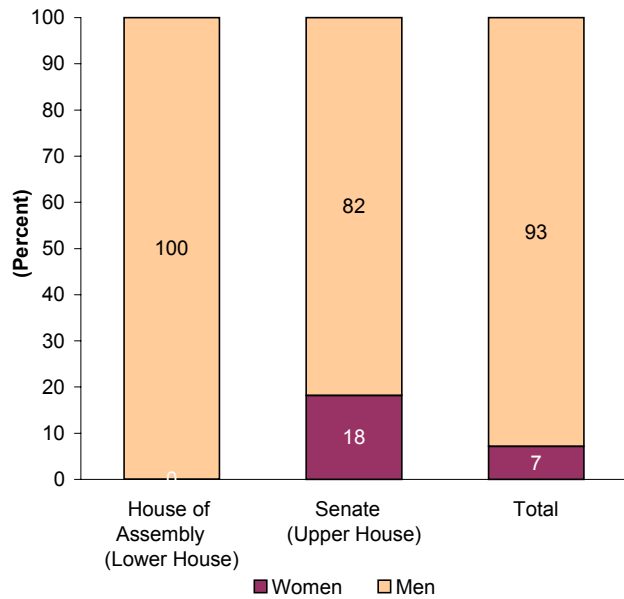

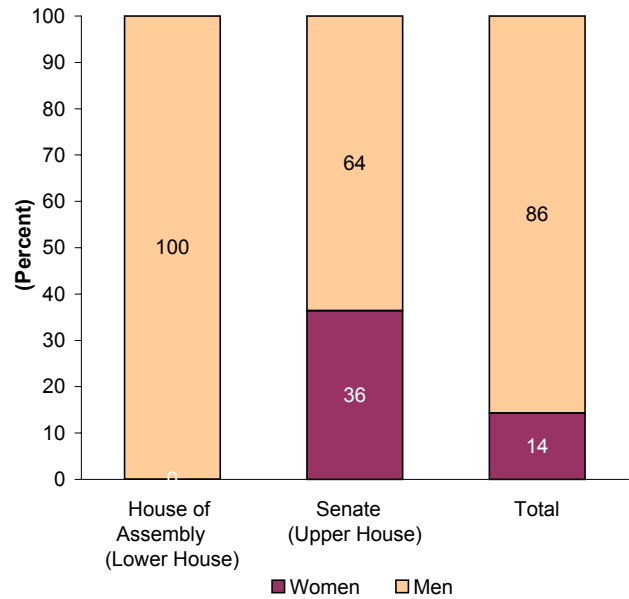

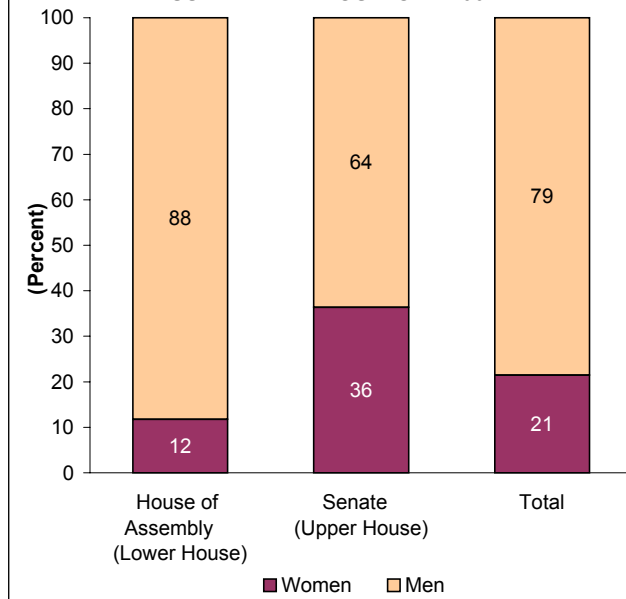
**FIGURE 12.1: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENTARY ASSEMBLY BY POSITION - 1980**

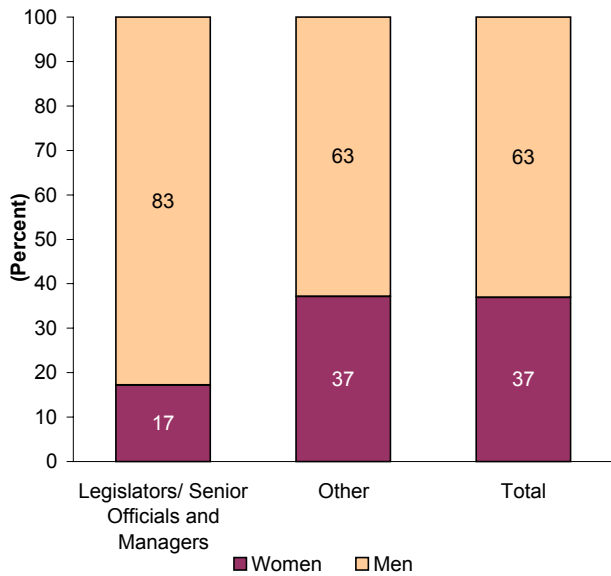

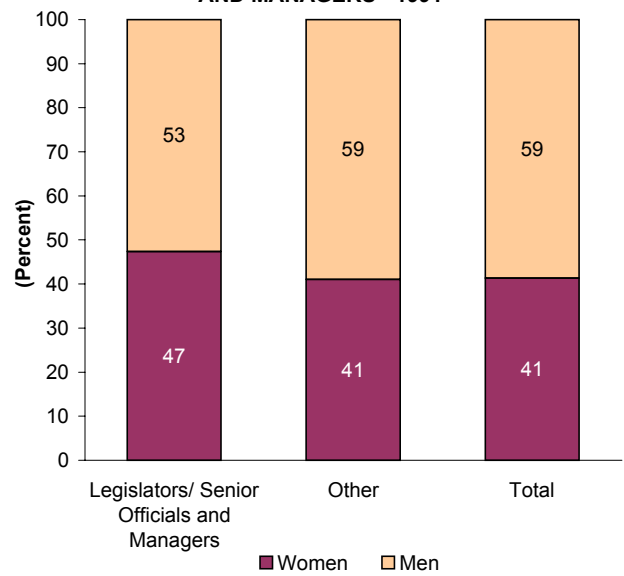

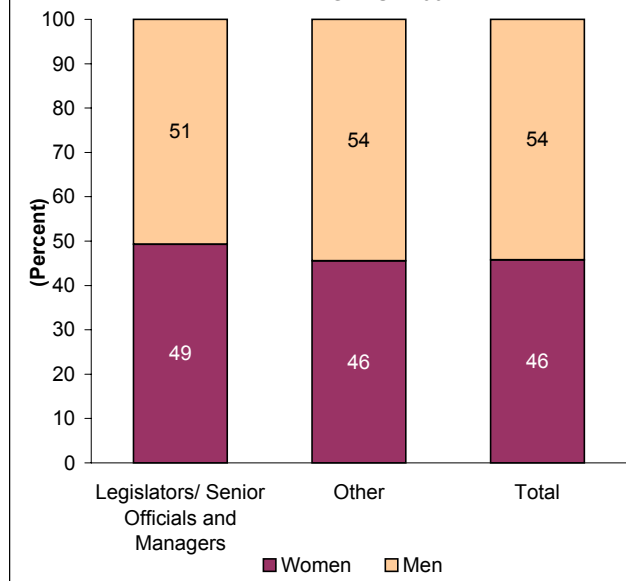
**FIGURE 12.4: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONS EMPLOYED BY OCCUPATION GROUP - LEGISLATORS, SENIOR OFFICIALS AND MANAGERS - 1980**

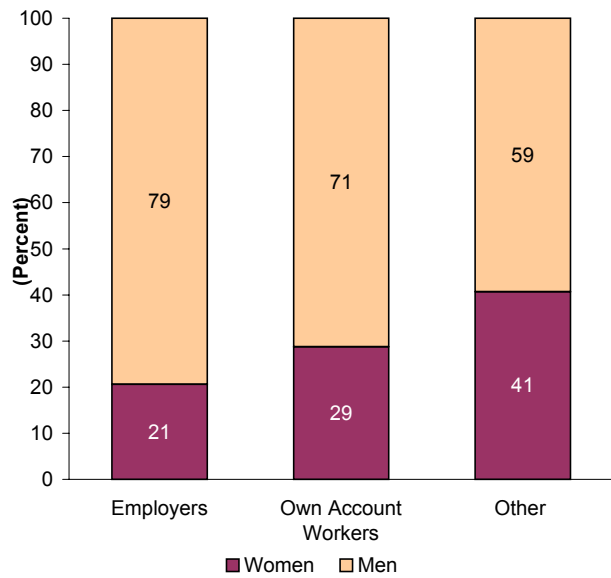

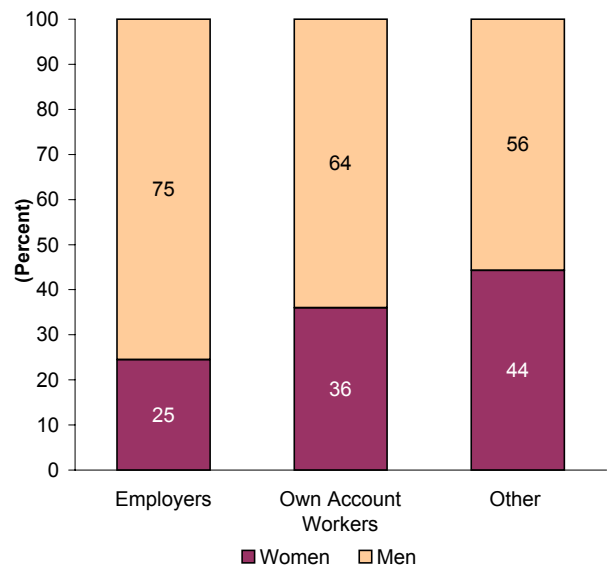

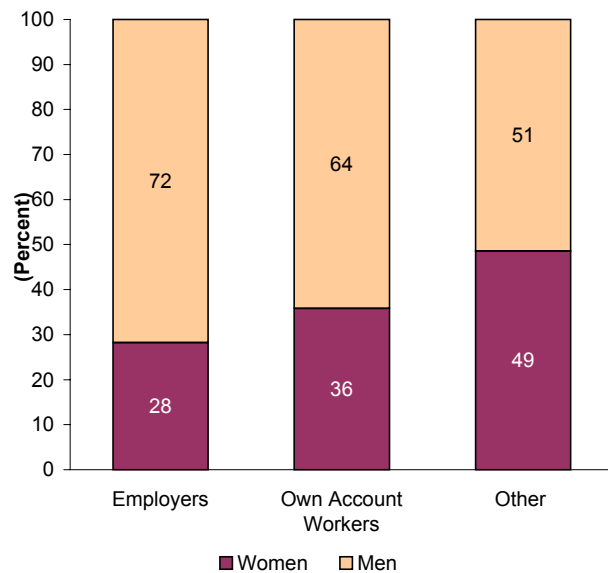
**FIGURE 12.7: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONS EMPLOYED BY STATUS IN EMPLOYMENT - 1980**

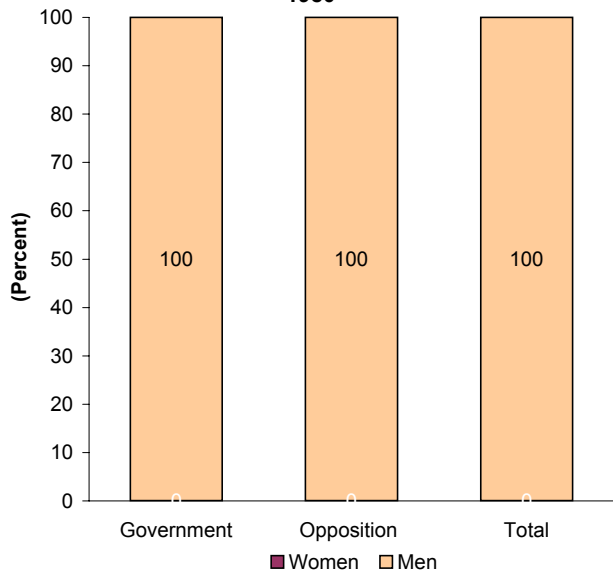

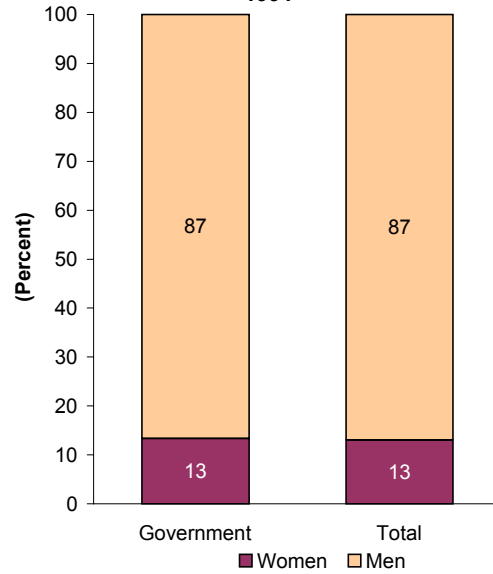

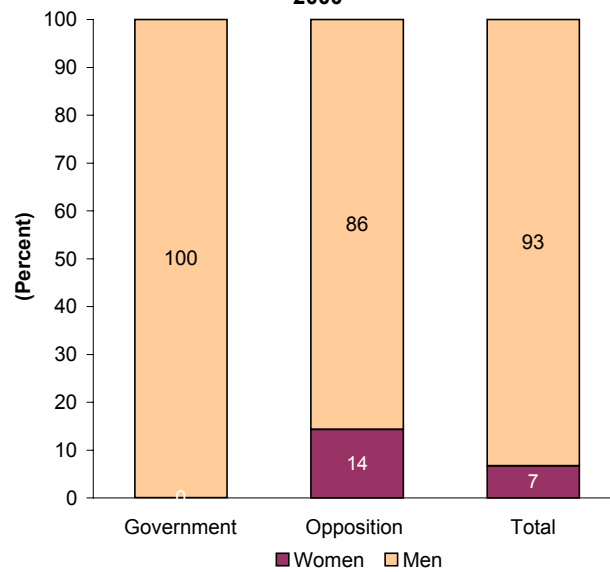
**FIGURE 13.1: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENTARY ASSEMBLY BY POSITION - 1980**

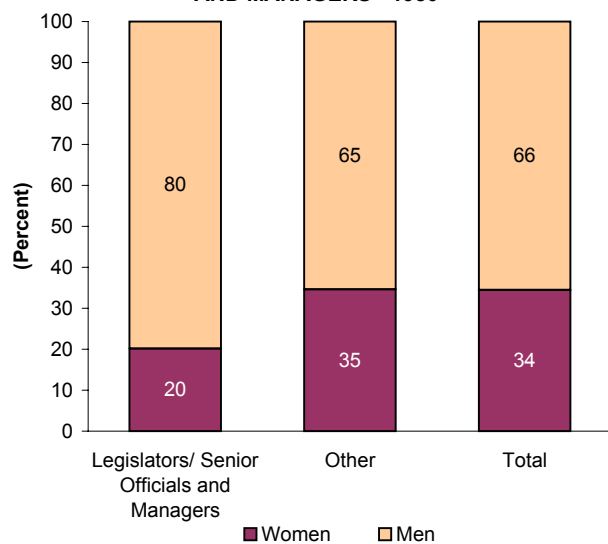

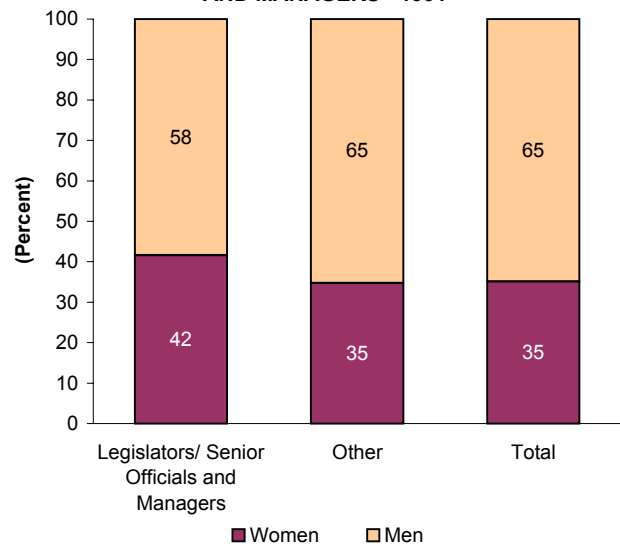

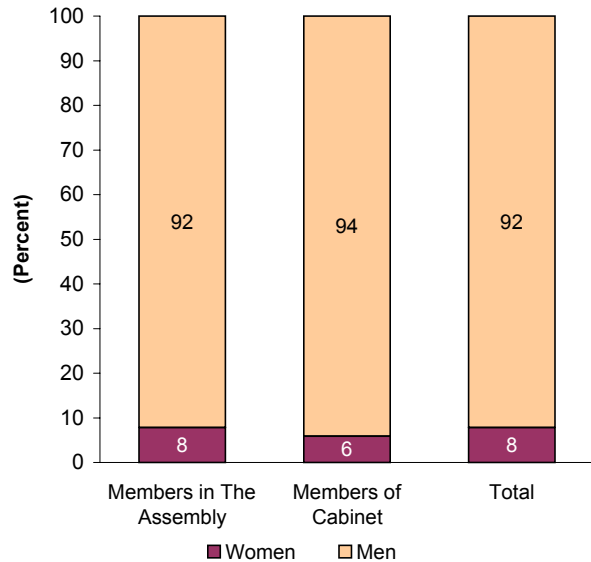

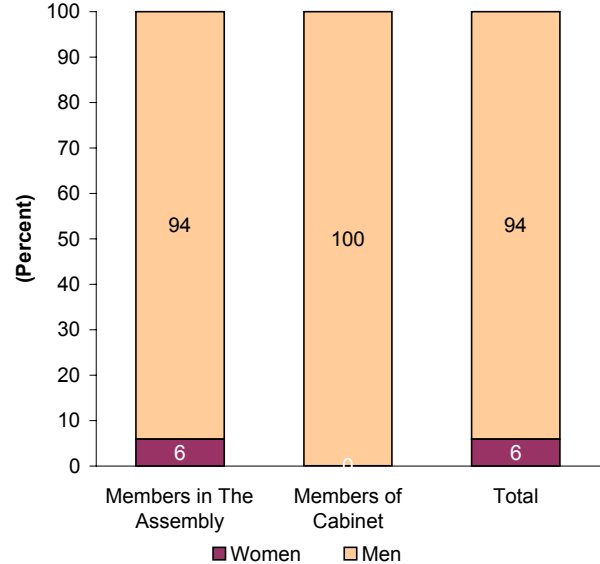

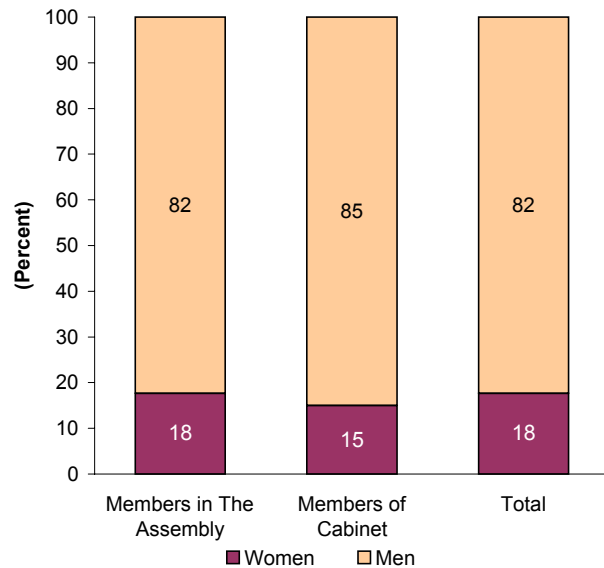
**FIGURE 14.1: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENTARY ASSEMBLY BY POSITION - 1987**

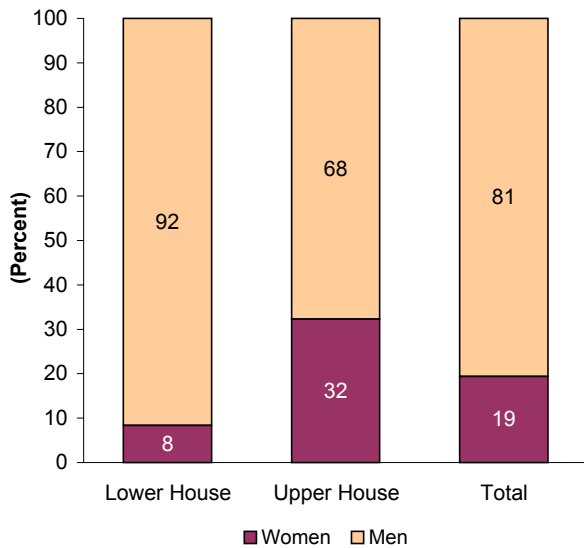

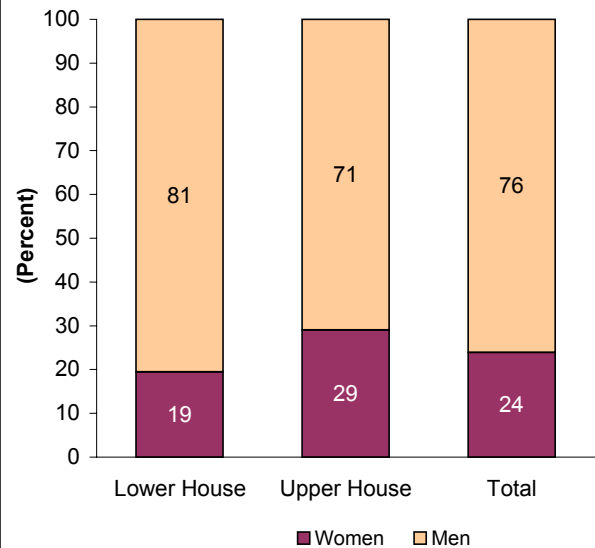

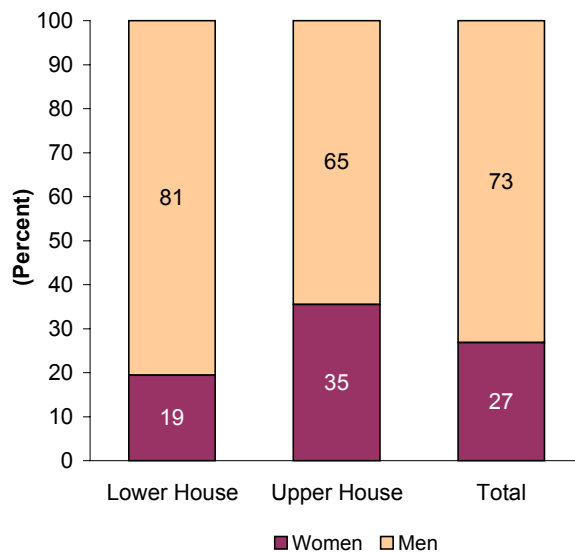
**FIGURE 15.1: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENTARY ASSEMBLY BY POSITION - 2000**

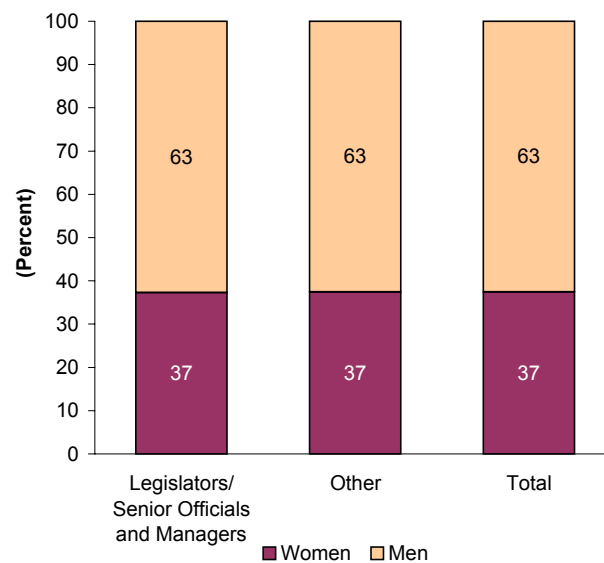
**FIGURE 15.6: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONS EMPLOYED BY OCCUPATION GROUP - LEGISLATORS, SENIOR OFFICIALS AND MANAGERS - 1991**

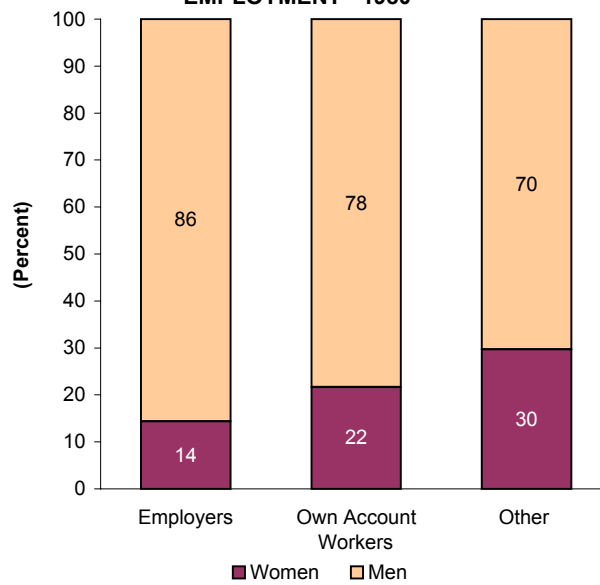

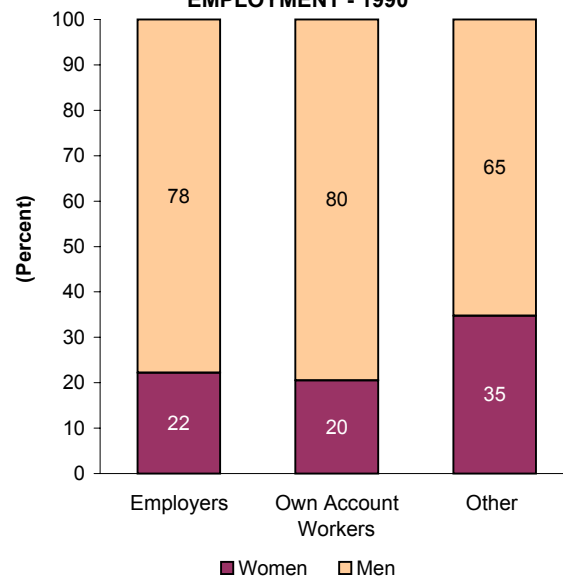

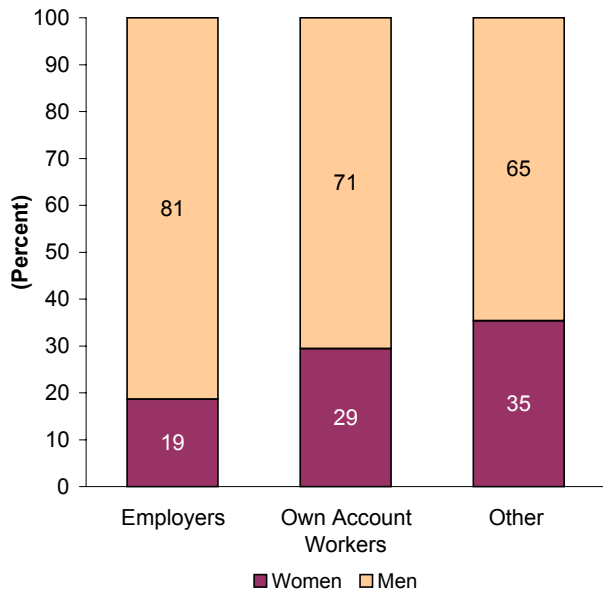

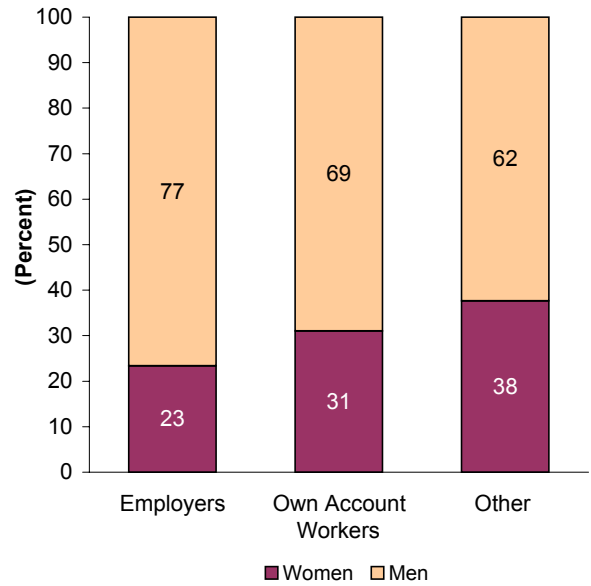

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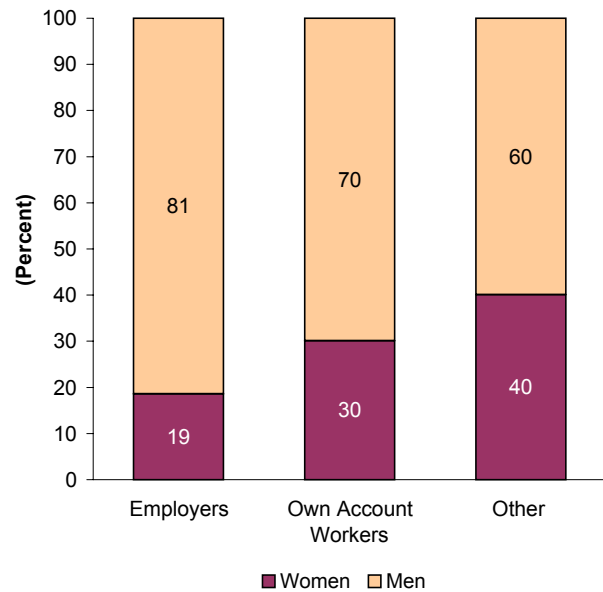
**FIGURE 15.11: PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONS EMPLOYED BY STATUS IN EMPLOYMENT - 1991**
