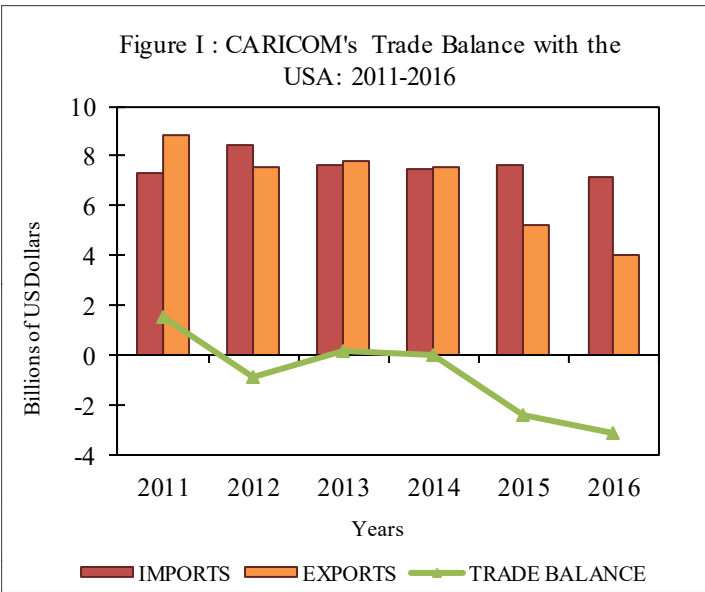

# CARICOM'S TRADE WITH UNITED STATES OF AMERICA: 2011 - 2016

- CARICOM's imports from the USA decreased from US\$7.3 billion in 2011 (all Member States reporting) to US\$7.1 billion in 2016 (twelve Member States reporting)<sup>1</sup>. Despite this decrease, CARICOM's imports from the USA as a percentage of its imports from all sources increased from 30.0% in 2011 to 33.2% in 2016.
- CARICOM's exports to the USA also declined from US\$8.8 billion in 2011 (twelve Member States reporting)<sup>1</sup> to US\$4.1 billion in 2016 (eleven Member States reporting)<sup>2</sup>. These values accounted for 41.6% and 32.9% of CARICOM's total exports in the respective years.
- Overall, CARICOM's trade balance with the USA *recorded trade surpluses* in 2011, 2013 and 2014 and deficits in 2012, 2015 and 2016. For 2011, trade surplus stood at *US\$1.5 billion* while the trade deficit in 2016 stood as *US\$3.1 billion*.

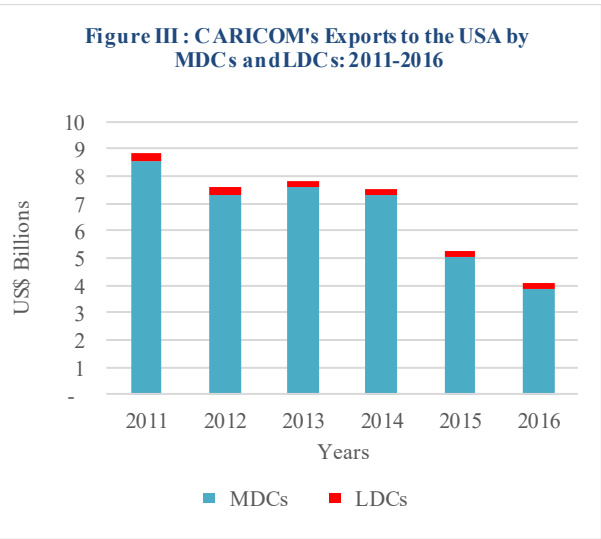
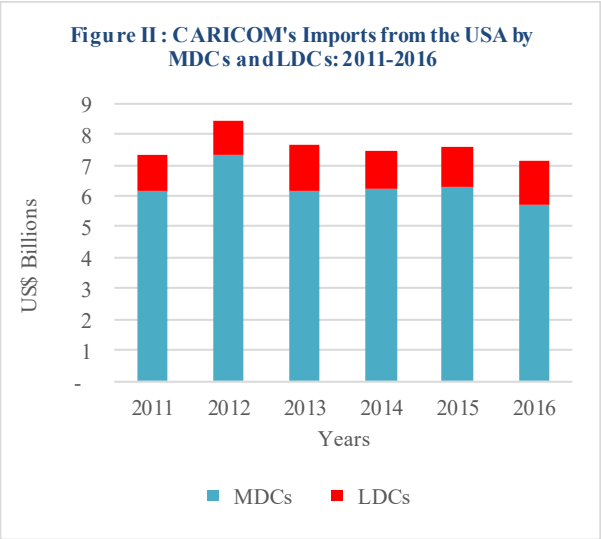
# Major Contributors

## Imports

- The MDCs dominated CARICOM’s imports from the USA with average percentage contribution of 82.9% over the period, 2011 - 2016. Imports of the MDCs from the USA decreased from US\$6.1 billion in 2011 to US\$5.7 billion in 2016, which accounted for 84.1% and 79.9% respectively of CARICOM’s imports from the USA.
- Imports of the LDCs from the USA expanded from US\$1.2 billion in 2011 to US\$1.4 billion in 2016, which represented 15.9% and 20.1% of CARICOM’s imports from the USA.

## Exports

- The MDCs also dominated CARICOM’s exports to the USA, accounting on average for 96.4% over the period. Exports of the MDCs to USA decreased from US\$8.5 billion in 2011 to US\$3.9 billion in 2016, which represented 96.4% and 95.8% of CARICOM’s exports to the USA in the respective years.
- The LDCs contributed between approximately 3.2% and 4.6% of CARICOM’s exports to the USA over the period.



# Member States Contributions

- Regarding the performance of individual Member States trade with the USA during this period, *Trinidad and Tobago* and *Jamaica* were CARICOM’s leading importers from and exporters to the USA.
- Trinidad and Tobago* on average accounted for 36.5% of CARICOM’s imports from the USA over the period while *Jamaica* on average represented 27.4%.
- On the exports side, *Trinidad and Tobago* dominated accounting for more than 75% of CARICOM’s exports to the USA for the majority of the period. *Jamaica* reflected an average percentage contribution of 9.6%.
- Regarding Member States’ trade balance with the USA, *Trinidad and Tobago* was the only Member State to record *surpluses* over the period. All other Member States reflected trade deficits with the USA.

Figure IV : Average Percentage Distribution of CARICOM's Imports from the USA : 2011-2016

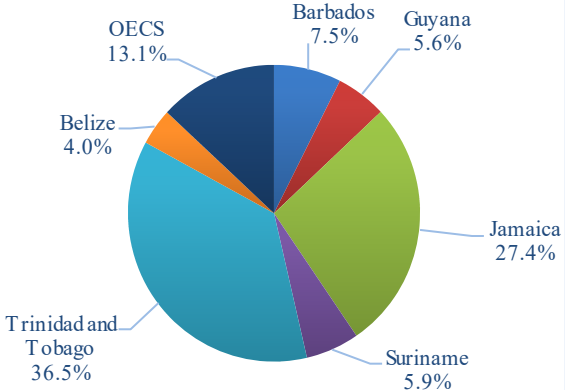
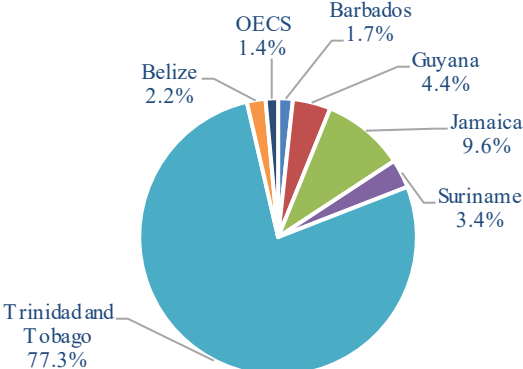


Figure V : Average Percentage Distribution of CARICOM's Exports to the USA : 2011-2016

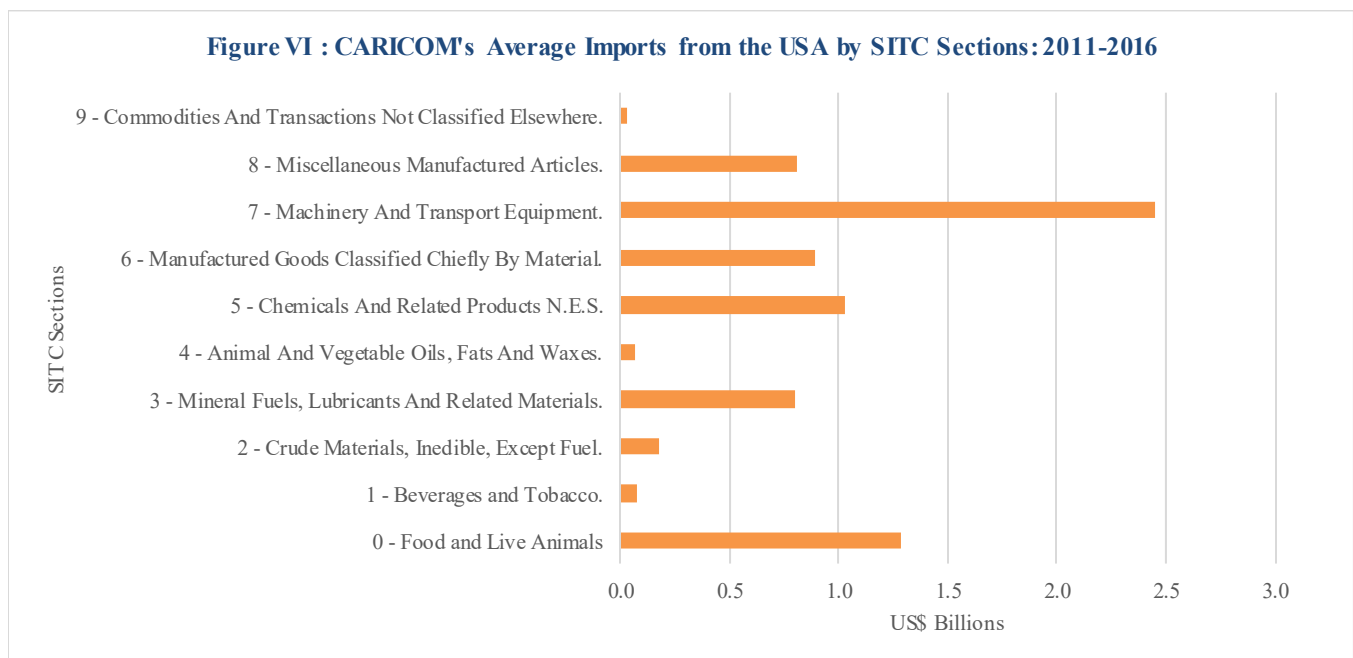


# Major Commodity Groupings

- Machinery and Transport Equipment, Food, and Chemicals and related products* represented the highest imported commodity groupings from the USA for the Region while *Mineral Fuels,*

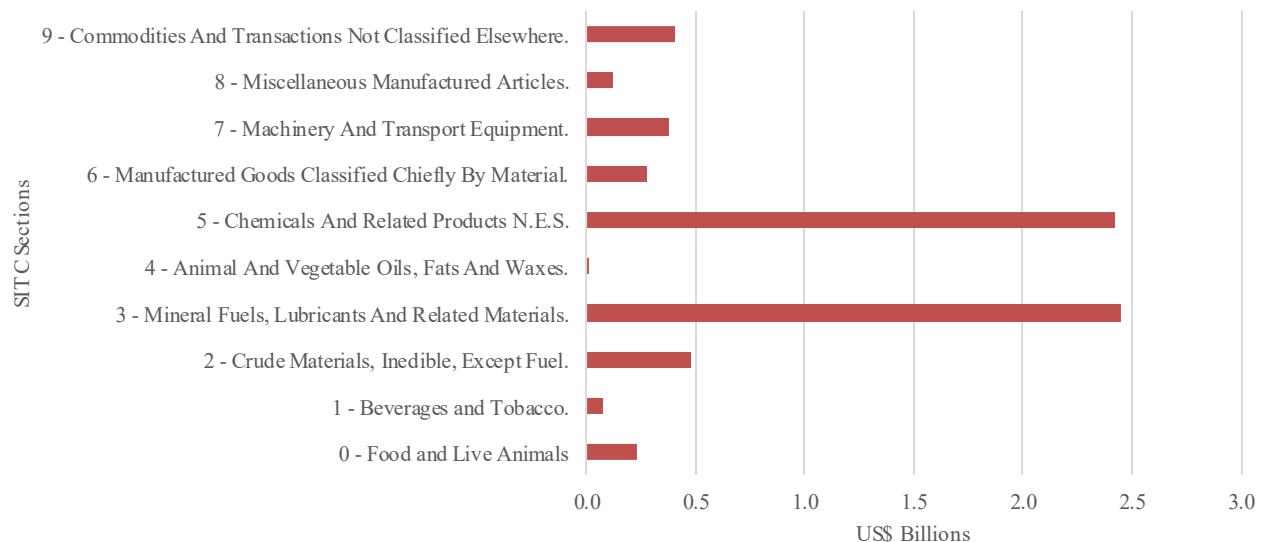
*Lubricants and related materials and Chemicals and related products* were the Region's highest exported commodity groupings to the USA.

- *Machinery and Transport Equipment* on average accounted for 32.2% of CARICOM's imports from the USA. *Food*, the second highest imported commodity grouping from the USA on average represented 16.9% and *Chemicals and related products*, the *third* highest imported commodity grouping on average accounted for 13.5% of the Region's imports from the USA.



- *On the exports side, Mineral Fuels, Lubricants and related materials; and Chemicals and related products n.e.s* on average accounted for 35.7% and 35.4% respectively of CARICOM's exports to the USA.

### Top items traded with the United States of America - 2016

For 2016, CARICOM's top ten imports from the USA accounted for 27.6% of CARICOM's total imports from USA. The top five commodities were:

- *Petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous minerals (other than crude);*
- *Ships, boats (including hovercraft) and floating structures;*
- *Edible products and preparations, n.e.s.;*
- *Telecommunications equipment, n.e.s., and parts, n.e.s., and accessories of apparatus falling within division 76;*
- *Civil engineering and contractors' plant and equipment; parts thereof.*

These top five commodities collectively accounted for 18.6% of CARICOM's total imports from the USA.

CARICOM's top ten domestic exports to the USA for 2016 accounted for 87.5% of CARICOM's domestic exports to the USA. The top five commodities exported to the USA were:

- *Inorganic chemical elements, oxides and halogen salts;*
- *Fertilizers (other than those of group 272);*
- *Petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous minerals (other than crude);*

- *Natural gas, whether or not liquefied; and*
- *Gold, non-monetary (excluding gold ores and concentrates)*

These top five commodities collectively accounted for 69.4% of CARICOM's total domestic exports to the USA.

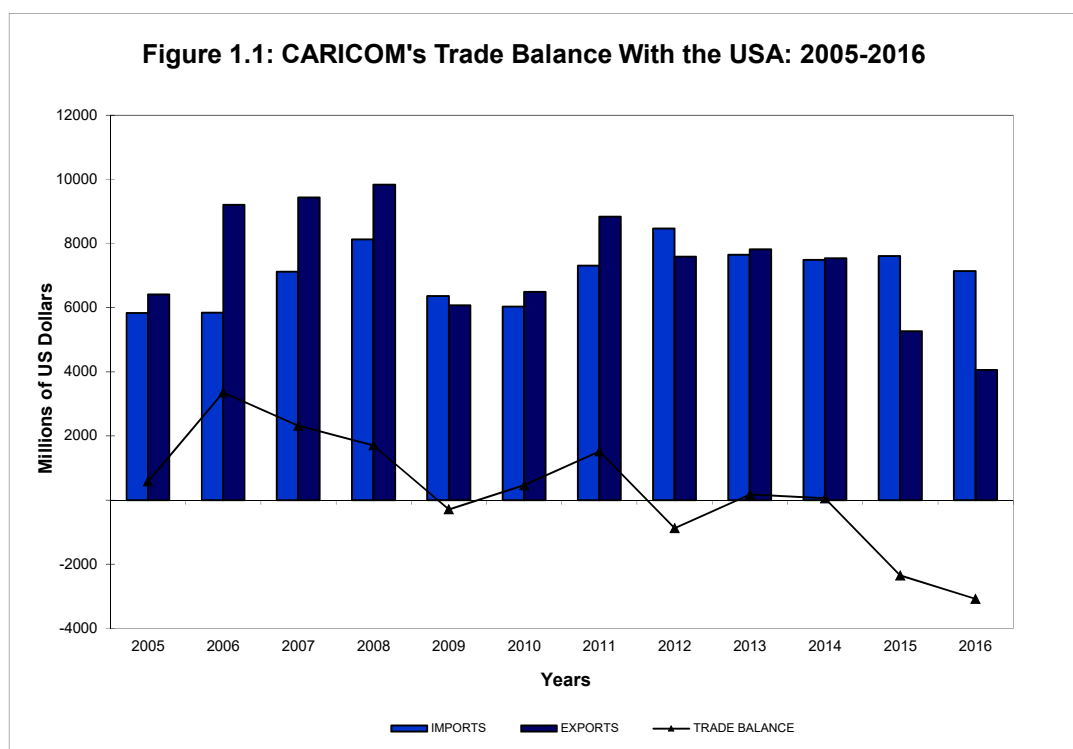

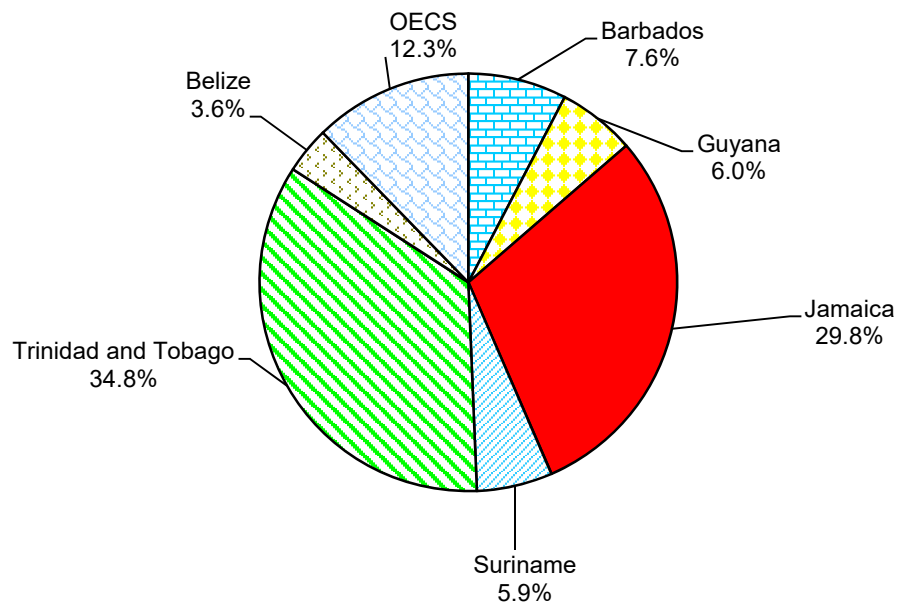




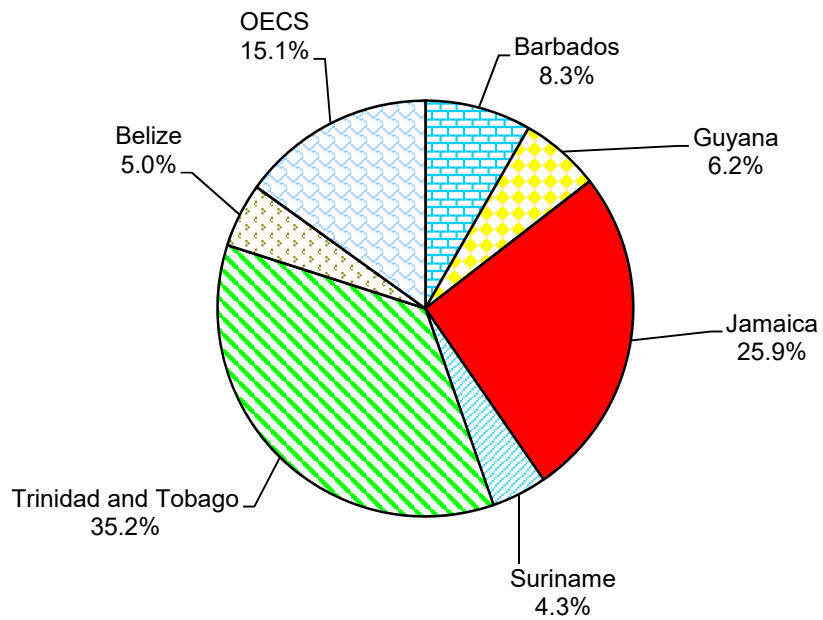

**Figure 1.3: Percentage Distribution of CARICOM's Imports from the USA: 2016**



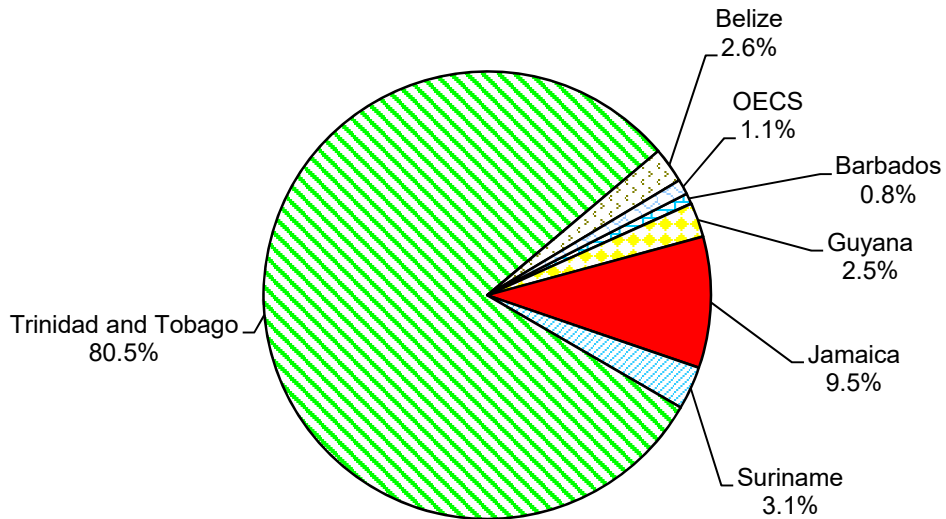

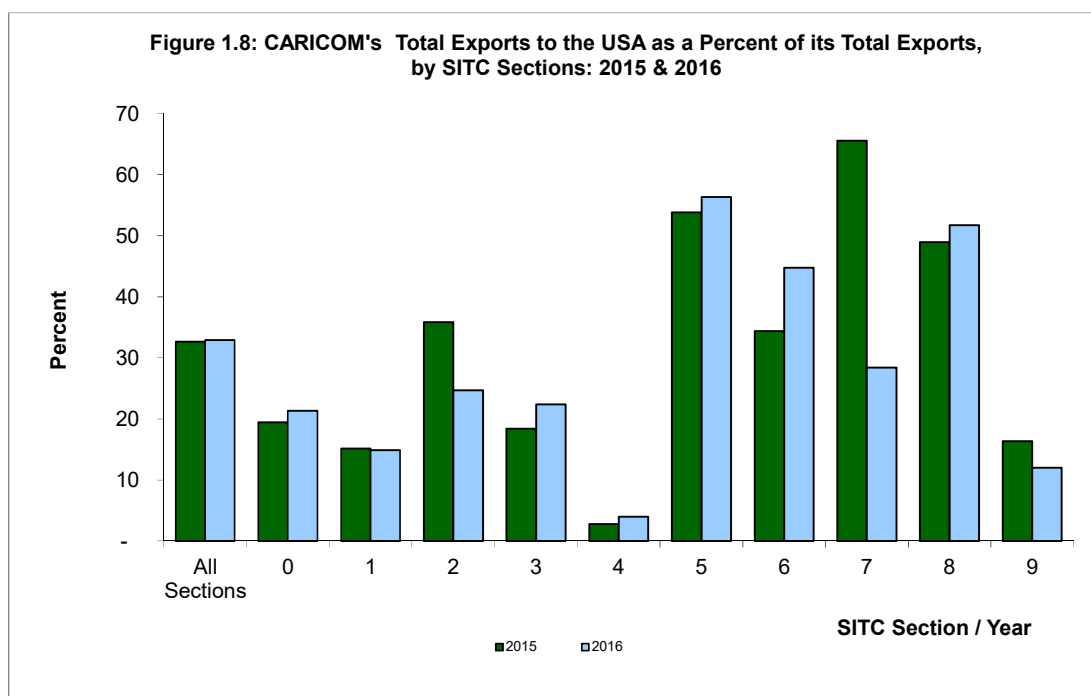

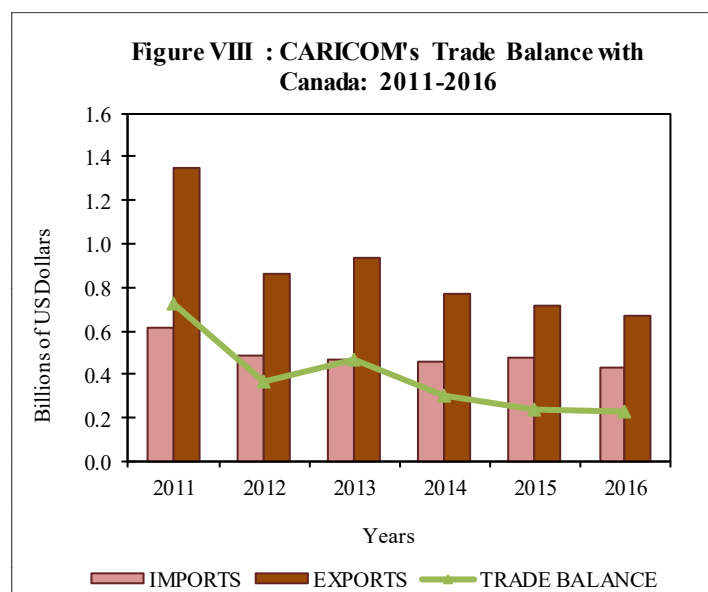

## CARICOM's TRADE WITH CANADA: 2011-2016

- CARICOM's imports from Canada decreased from US\$0.6 billion in 2011 (all Member States reporting) to US\$0.4 billion in 2016 (twelve Member States reporting)<sup>1</sup>. Canada as a source of CARICOM's imports accounted on average for 2.0% of CARICOM's total imports over the period, 2011-2016.
- CARICOM's exports to Canada also declined from US\$1.3 billion in 2011 (twelve Member States reporting)<sup>1</sup> to US\$0.7 billion in 2016 (eleven Member States reporting)<sup>2</sup>. As a destination for CARICOM's exports, Canada accounted for 4.7% of CARICOM's total exports to all destinations over the period.
- Overall CARICOM's trade balance with Canada *reflected surpluses over the period* moving from US\$0.7 billion in 2011 to US\$0.2 billion in 2016.



## Major Contributors

### Imports

- The MDCs dominated CARICOM's imports from Canada with an average percentage contribution of 90.0% over the period. MDCs' imports from Canada moved from US\$0.6 billion

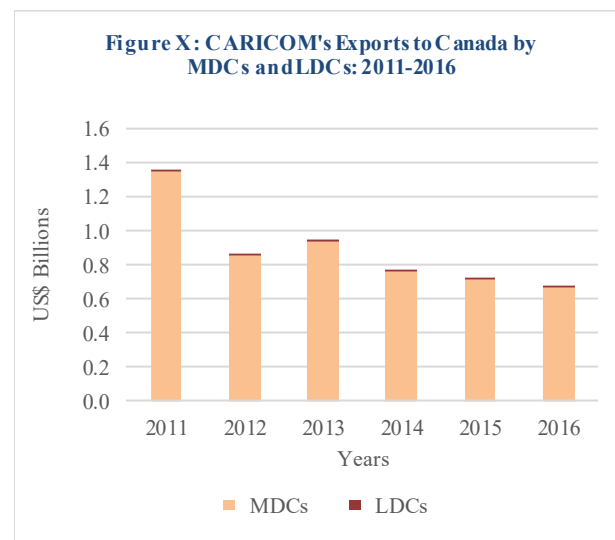
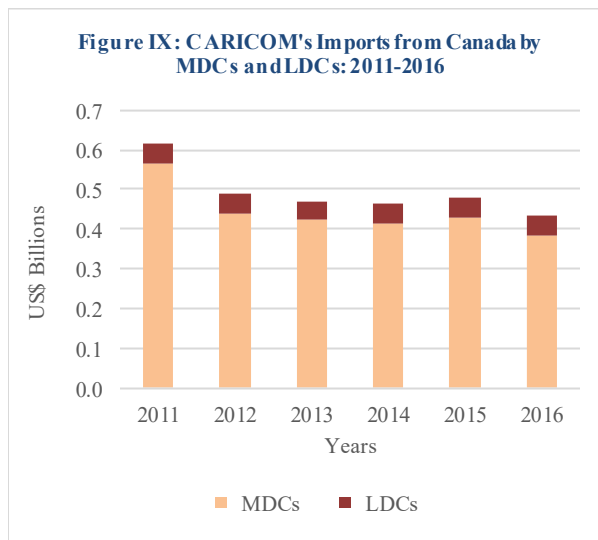

in 2011 to US\$0.4 billion in 2016 which accounted for 91.3% and 88.6% in 2011 and 2016 respectively.

- The percentage contribution of the LDCs to CARICOM's imports from Canada increased from 8.7% in 2011 to 11.4% in 2016.

## Exports

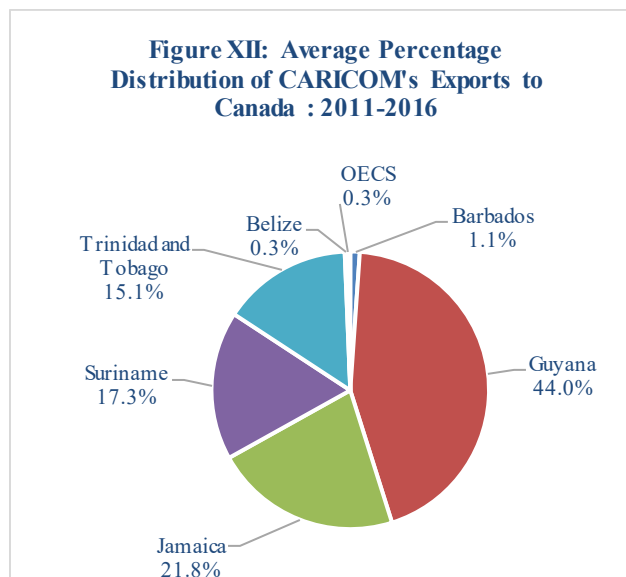
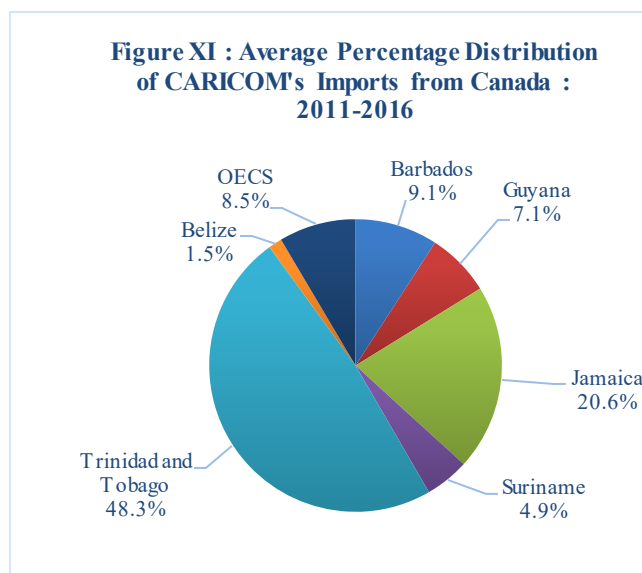
- The MDCs totally dominated CARICOM's exports to Canada with an average percentage contribution of 99.4%. Exports of the MDCs to Canada decreased from US\$1.3 billion in 2011 to US\$0.7 billion in 2016, which represented 99.7% and 99.4% of CARICOM's exports to Canada in the respective years.
- The percentage contribution of the LDCs to CARICOM's exports to Canada was less than 1% for the majority of the period.



## Member States Contributions

- *Trinidad and Tobago* and *Jamaica* were CARICOM's two leading Member States to access the Canadian market. These Member States on average accounted for 48.3% and 20.6% of the Region's imports from Canada over the period.
- The OECS countries on average accounted for 8.5% of CARICOM's imports from Canada over the period.

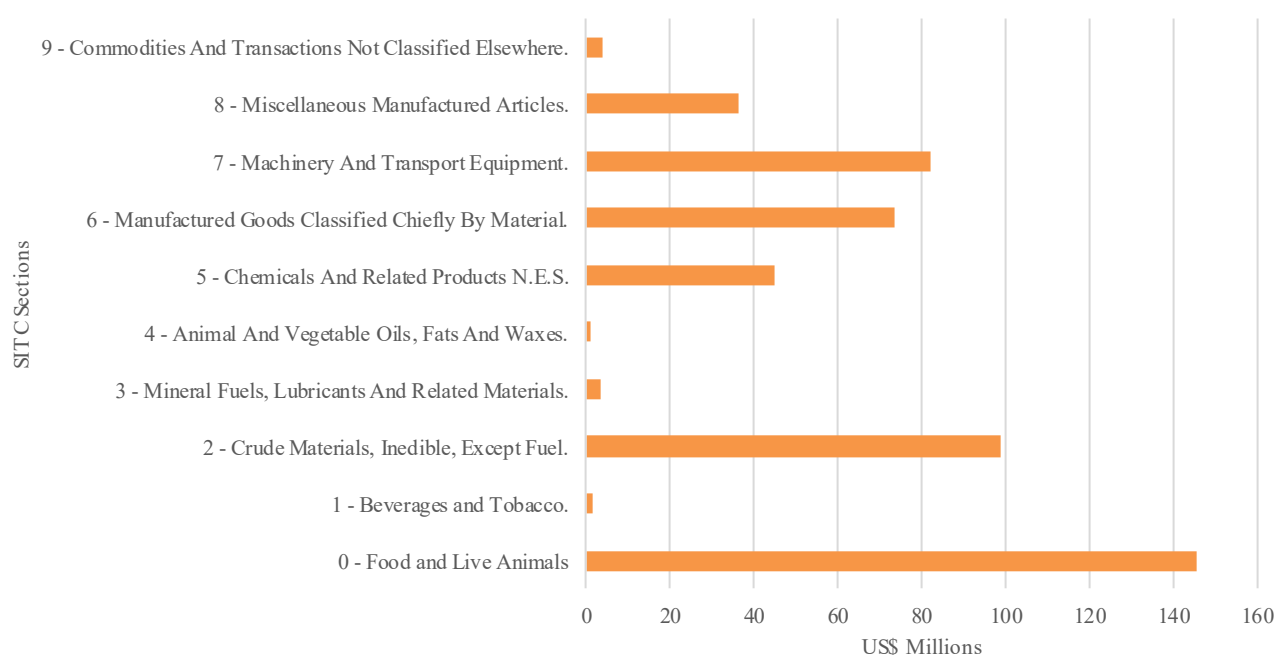
- With regards to exports, *Guyana* and *Jamaica* were CARICOM's largest exporters to Canada. These Member States reflected average percentage contributions of 44.0% and 21.8% respectively.
- *Belize* was the top LDCs Member State to export to Canada with an average percentage contribution of 0.3% of the Regions' exports to Canada over the period.



### Major Commodity Grouping

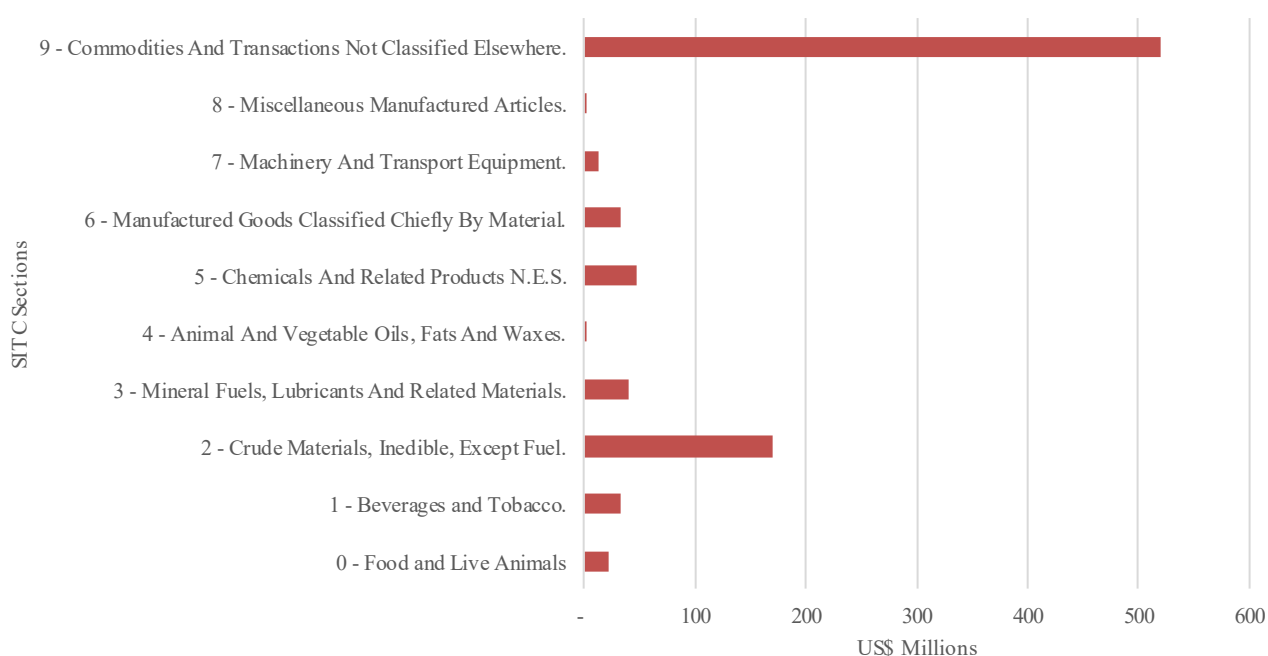
- CARICOM's major commodity groupings imported from Canada were *Food*, *Crude Material, inedible, except Fuel*; and *Machinery and Transport Equipment* while the major commodity groupings exported to Canada were *Crude Material, inedible, except Fuel* and *Commodities and Transactions not classified elsewhere*.
- With regards to CARICOM's imports from Canada, *Food* on average accounted for 29.6% while *Crude Material, inedible, except fuel*; and *Machinery and Transport Equipment* represented for 20.1% and 16.8% respectively. Collectively these three commodity groupings accounted for an average percentage contribution of 66.5% of CARICOM's imports from Canada over the period.

- The top commodity groupings exported to Canada were *Commodities and transactions n.e.s.* and *Crude Material, inedible, (except fuel)*. These groupings on average accounted for 59.0% and 19.2% respectively of the Region's exports to Canada.

## Top items traded with Canada - 2016

- CARICOM's top ten imports from Canada for 2016 accounted for 47.9% of its total imports from Canada. The top five commodities were:
  - *Iron ore and concentrates;*
  - *Vegetables, fresh, chilled, frozen or simply preserved (including dried leguminous vegetables); roots, tubers and other edible vegetable products, n.e.s., fresh or dried;*
  - *Medicaments (including veterinary medicaments);*
  - *Fish, dried, salted or in brine; smoked fish (whether or not cooked before or during the smoking process); flours, meals and pellets of fish, fit for human consumption;*
  - *Wheat (including spelt) and meslin, unmilled.*

These five commodities collectively accounted for 34.0% of CARICOM's total imports from Canada.

- On the exports side, CARICOM's top five domestic exports to Canada accounted for 98.0% of its total domestic exports to Canada in 2016. The top five commodities were:
  - *Gold, non-monetary (excluding gold ores and concentrates);*
  - *Aluminium ores and concentrates (including alumina);*
  - *Alcohols, phenols, phenol-alcohols, and their halogenated, sulphonated, nitrated or nitrosated derivatives;*
  - *Alcoholic beverages; and*
  - *Fertilizers (other than those of group 272).*

These five commodities collectively accounted for 95.3% of CARICOM's total imports from Canada.

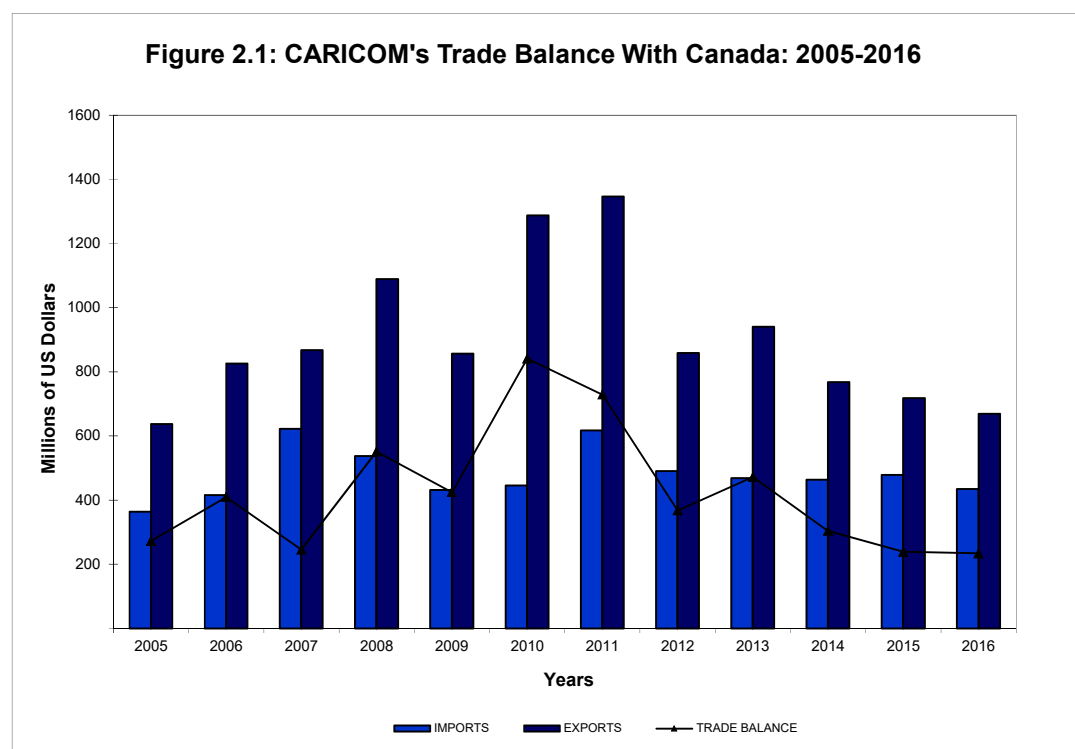

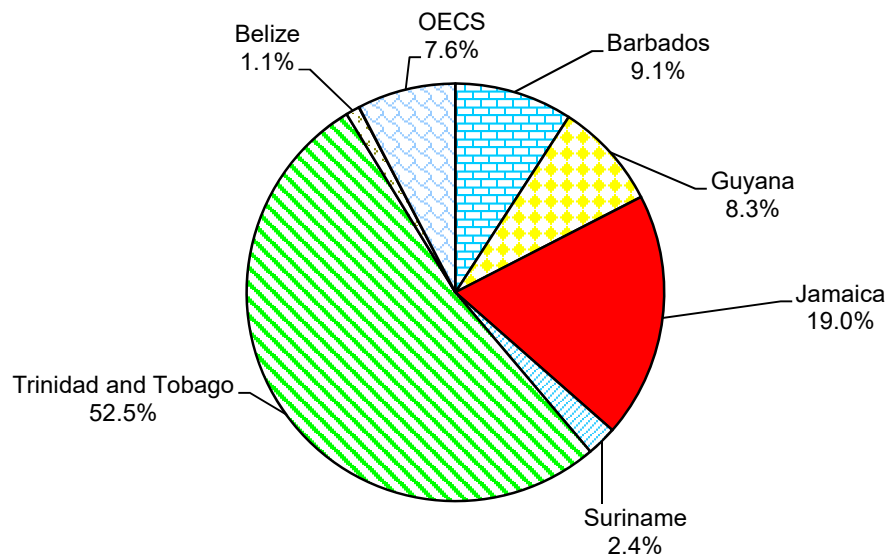




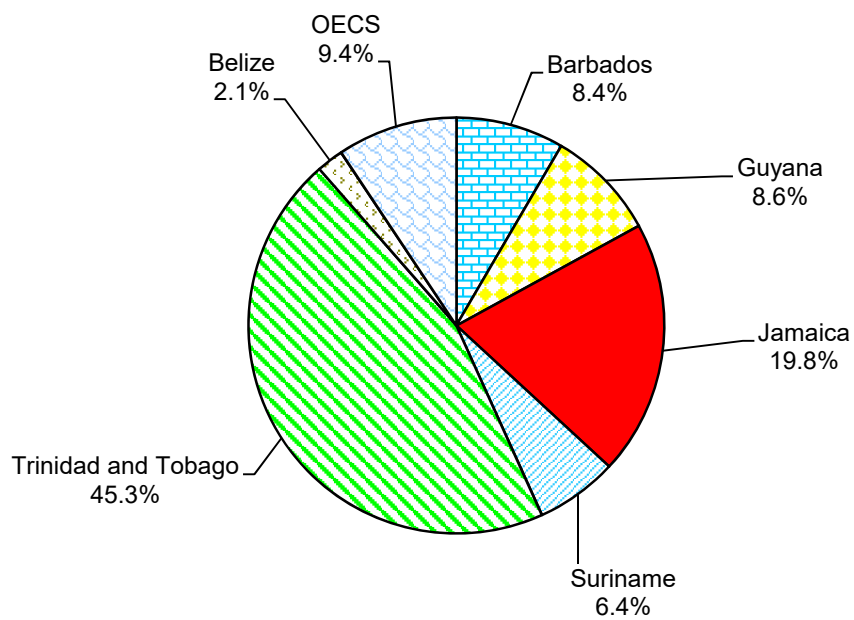

**Figure 2.3: Percentage Distribution of CARICOM's Imports from Canada: 2016**



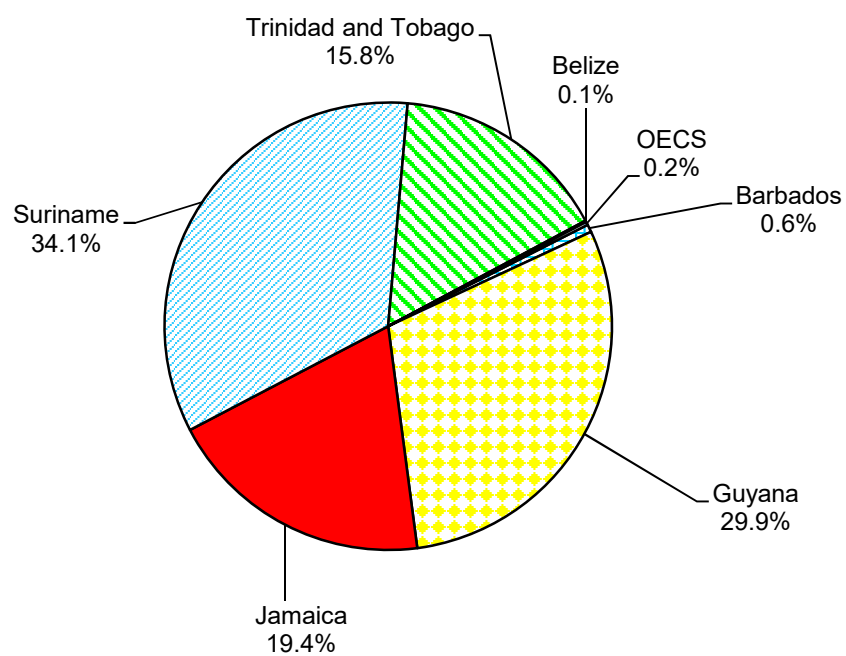

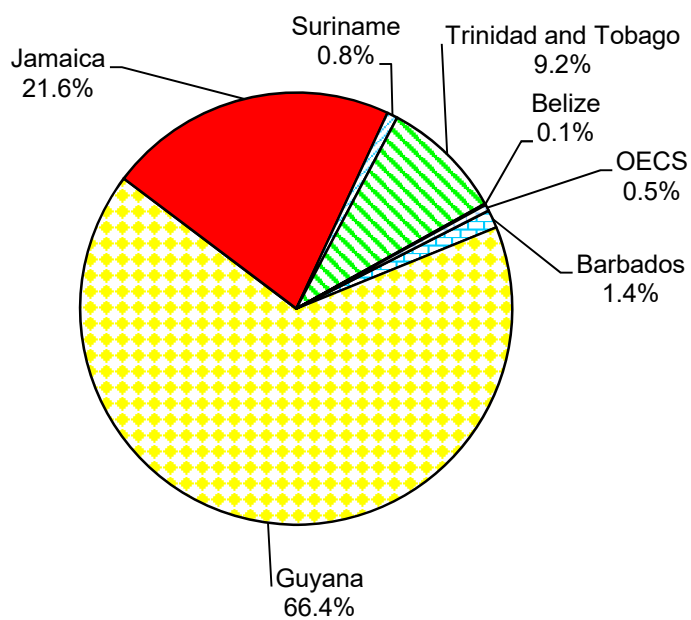

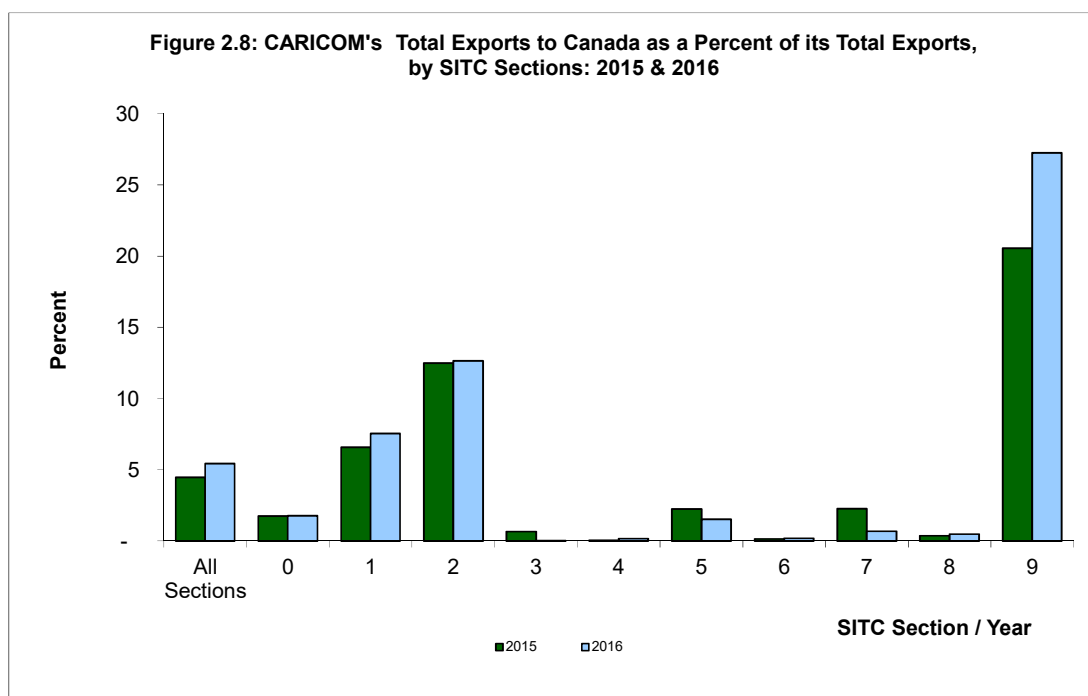

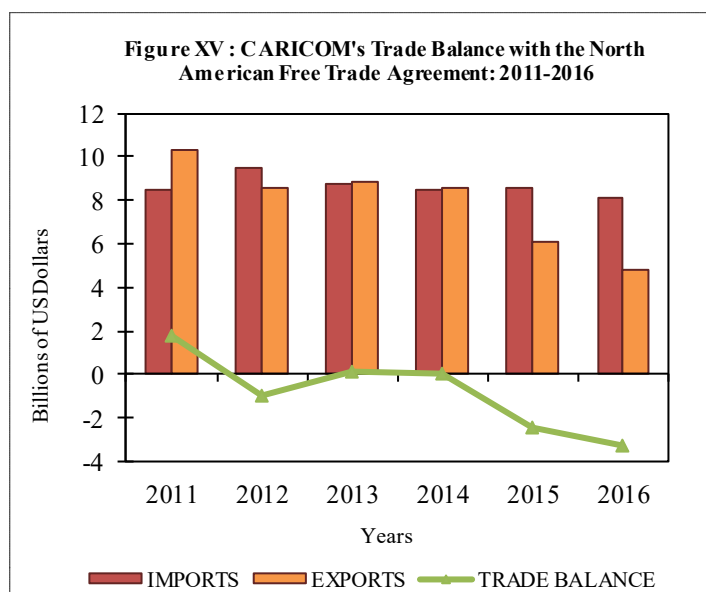

## CARICOM'S TRADE WITH NORTH AMERICAN FREE TRADE AGREEMENT (NAFTA): 2011 - 2016

- For 2011 – 2016, CARICOM's imports from the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) decreased from US\$8.5 billion in 2011 (all Member States reporting) to US\$8.1 billion in 2016 (twelve Member States reporting)<sup>1</sup>. The percentage contribution of NAFTA to CARICOM's total imports increased from 34.7% in 2011 to 37.6% in 2016. On average this trading bloc accounted for 34.8% of CARICOM's total imports over the period.
- CARICOM's exports to NAFTA declined from US\$10.3 billion in 2011 (twelve Member States reporting)<sup>1</sup> to US\$4.8 billion in 2016 (eleven Member States reporting)<sup>2</sup>. The percentage contribution of NAFTA to CARICOM's total exports declined from 48.4% in 2011 to 39.3% in 2016.
- Overall, CARICOM's trade balance with the NAFTA *recorded trade surpluses* in 2011, 2013 and 2014 and *deficits* in 2012, 2015 and 2016. For 2011, trade surplus stood at US\$1.8 billion while the deficit in 2016 stood as US\$3.2 billion.

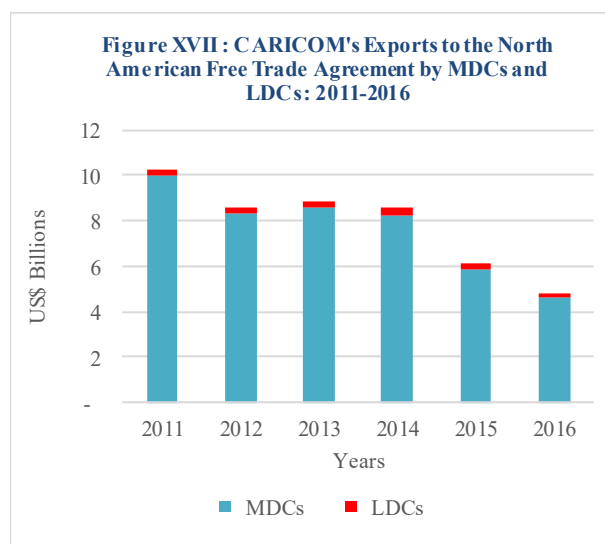
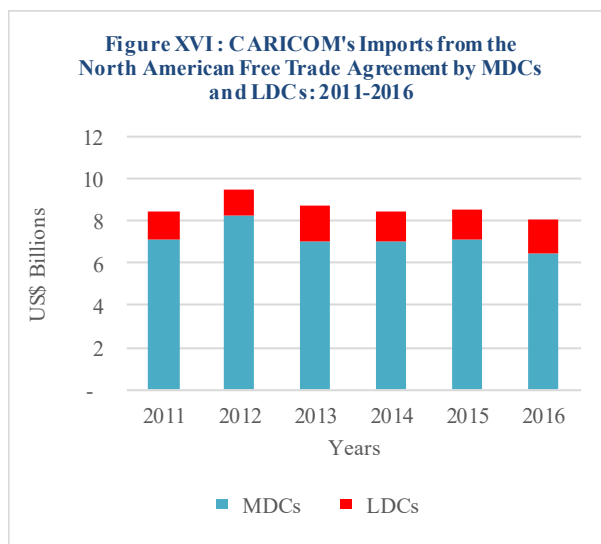
## Major Contributors

### Imports

- CARICOM's imports from NAFTA was dominated by the MDCs which accounted for an average percentage contribution of 83.0% over the period. The imports of the MDCs moved from US\$7.1 billion in 2011 to US\$6.5 billion in 2016, which accounted for 84.5% and 80.2% of CARICOM's imports from NAFTA.
- The percentage contribution of the LDCs moved from 15.5% in 2011 to 19.8% in 2016.

### Exports

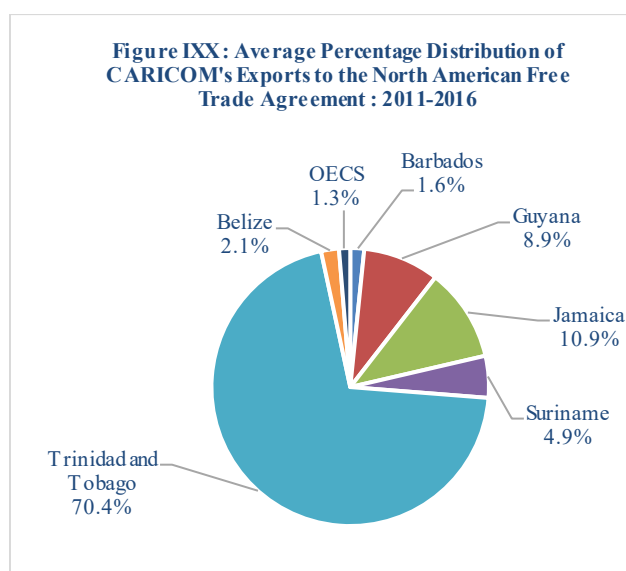
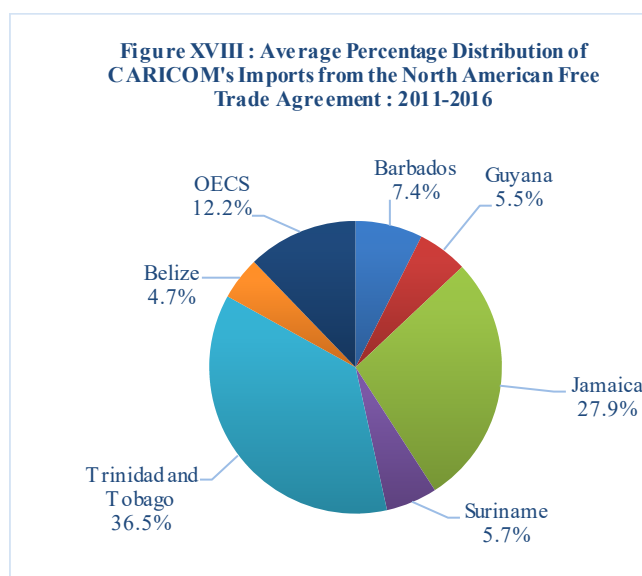
- The MDCs also dominated the Region's exports to NAFTA registering an average percentage contribution of 96.6% over the period. Earnings from exports of the MDCs decreased from US\$9.9 billion in 2011 to US\$4.7 billion in 2016 (all Member States reporting) which accounted for 96.8% and 96.4% respectively of CARICOM's exports to NAFTA.
- The LDCs percentage contribution to the Region's exports to NAFTA increased from 3.2% in 2011 to 3.6% in 2016.



### Member States Contributions

- *Trinidad and Tobago* was CARICOM's top importer to from the NAFTA trading bloc accounting on average for 36.5% of CARICOM's imports from NAFTA over the period. *Jamaica* was the second highest importer from NAFTA with an average percentage contribution of 27.9%.

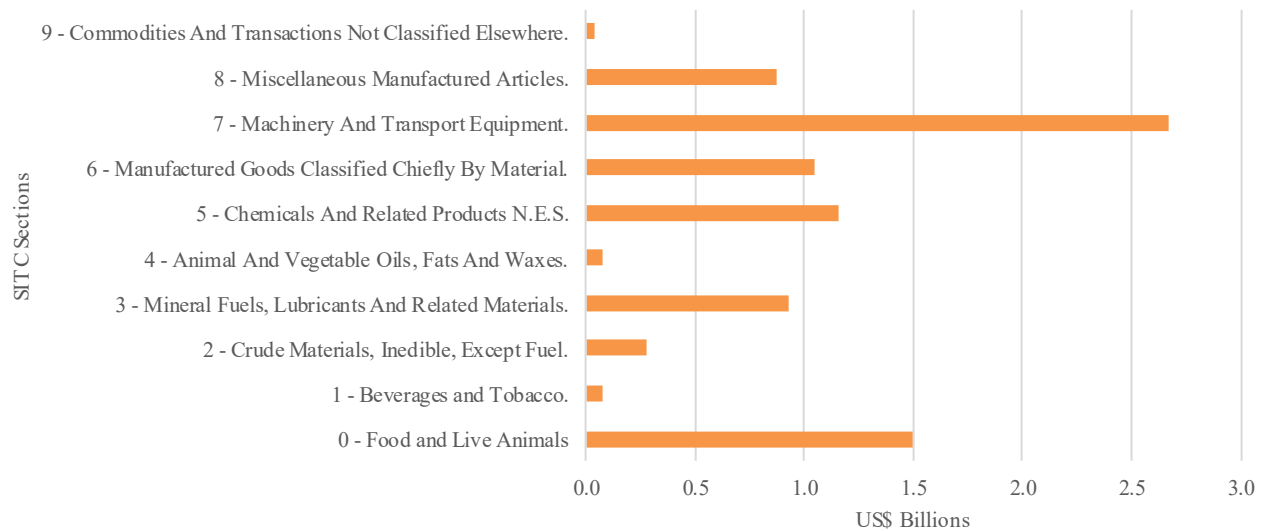
- CARICOM's highest exporting country to NAFTA was also *Trinidad and Tobago*. This Member State on average accounted for 70.4% of the Region's exports to NAFTA. *Jamaica* was the next Member State to follow with an average percentage contribution of 10.9%.
- *Trinidad and Tobago* and *Guyana* registered trade surpluses with NAFTA throughout the period. Suriname recorded surpluses in 2011 and 2014 and deficits for the other years while the other Member States reflected deficits with the trading bloc throughout the period, 2011-2016.



## Major Commodity Groupings

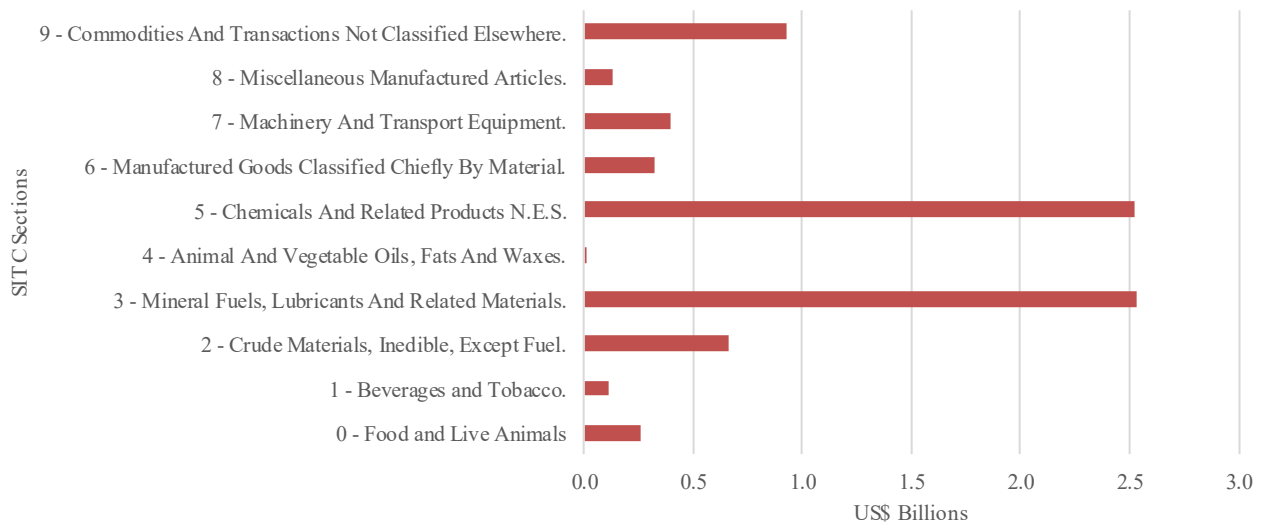
- During the period 2011-2016, CARICOM's major commodity groupings imported from NAFTA were *Machinery and Transport Equipment*; *Food and Chemical and related products* while the Region's top commodity groupings exported to NAFTA were *Mineral Fuels, Lubricants and related materials* and *Chemical and related products n.e.s.*
- CARICOM's imports of *Machinery and Transport Equipment* from NAFTA recorded an average percentage contribution of 30.9% over the period while *Food and Chemical and related products* reflected average percentage contributions of 17.3% and 13.4% respectively.

- For exports, *Mineral Fuels, Lubricants and related materials* on average accounted for 32.2% of CARICOM's exports to NAFTA while *Chemical and related products n.e.s* reflected an average percentage contribution of 32.2% over the period, 2011-2016.

## Top Items traded with NAFTA

For 2016, CARICOM's top ten imports from NAFTA accounted for 25.7% of CARICOM's total imports from NAFTA. The top five commodities imported were:

- *Petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous minerals (other than crude);*
- *Ships, boats (including hovercraft) and floating structures*
- *Edible products and preparations, n.e.s.*
- *Telecommunications equipment, n.e.s., and parts, n.e.s., and accessories of apparatus falling within division 76*
- *Feeding stuff for animals (not including unmilled cereals)*

These commodities collectively accounted for 17.0% of CARICOM's total imports from NAFTA.

In 2016, earnings from CARICOM's ten major domestic exports to NAFTA accounted for 88.3% of its total domestic exports to NAFTA. The top five commodities exported to this trading bloc were:

- *Inorganic chemical elements, oxides and halogen salts*
- *Fertilizers (other than those of group 272)*
- *Gold, non-monetary (excluding gold ores and concentrates)*
- *Aluminium ores and concentrates (including alumina)*
- *Petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous minerals (other than crude)*

These commodities collectively accounted for 71.1% CARICOM's total domestic exports to NAFTA.

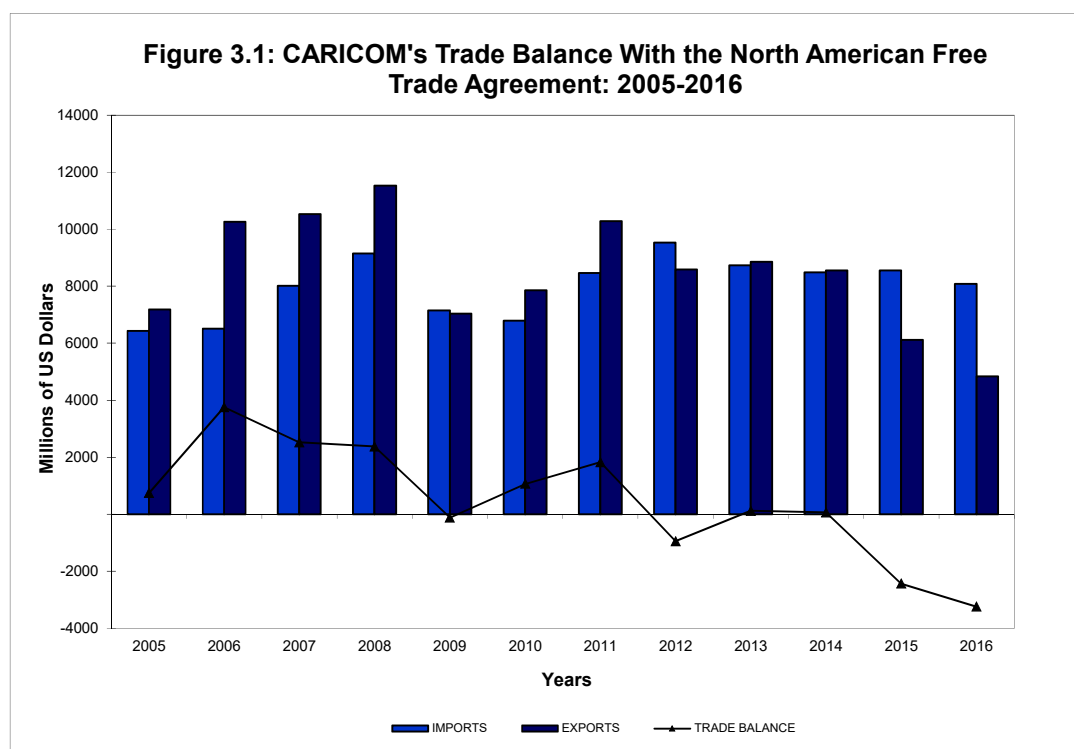

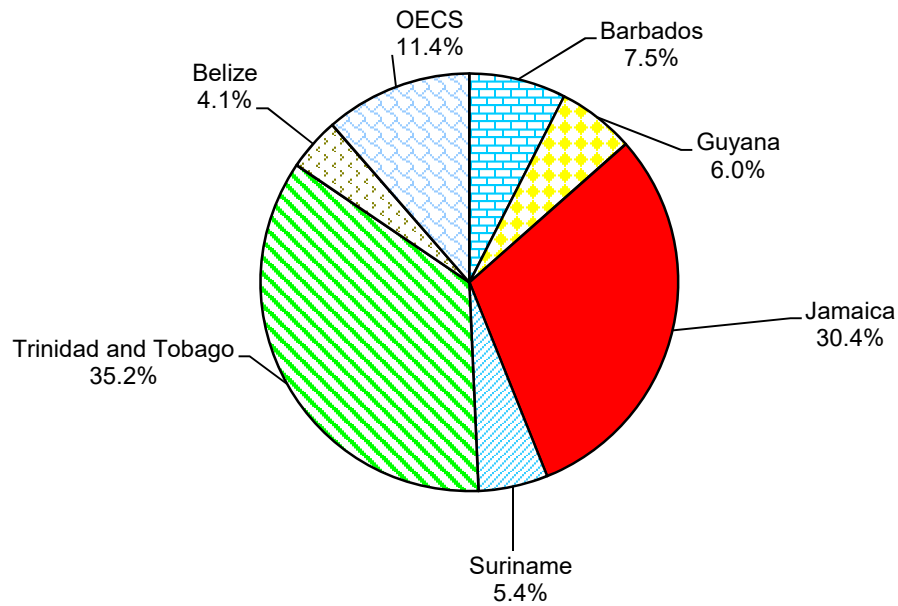




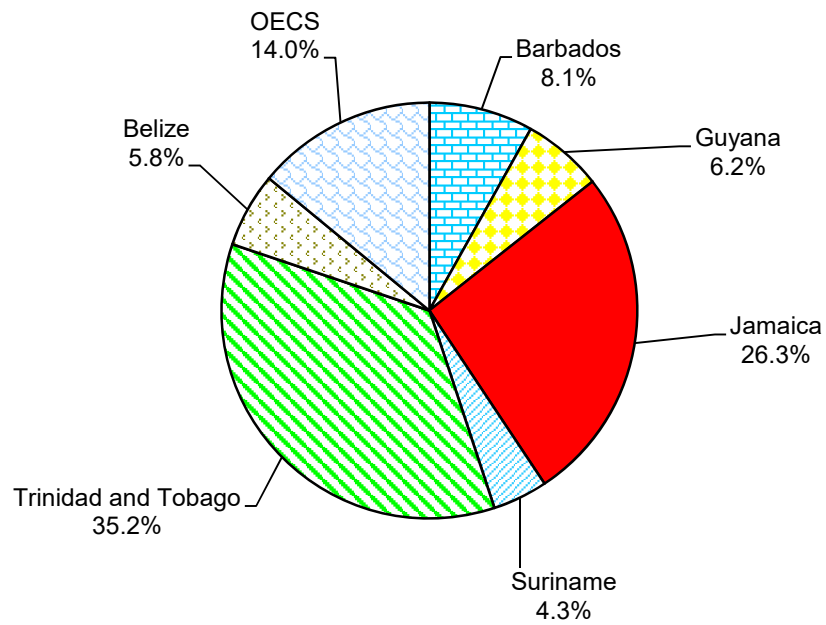

**Figure 3.3: Percentage Distribution of CARICOM's Imports from the North American Free Trade Agreement: 2016**



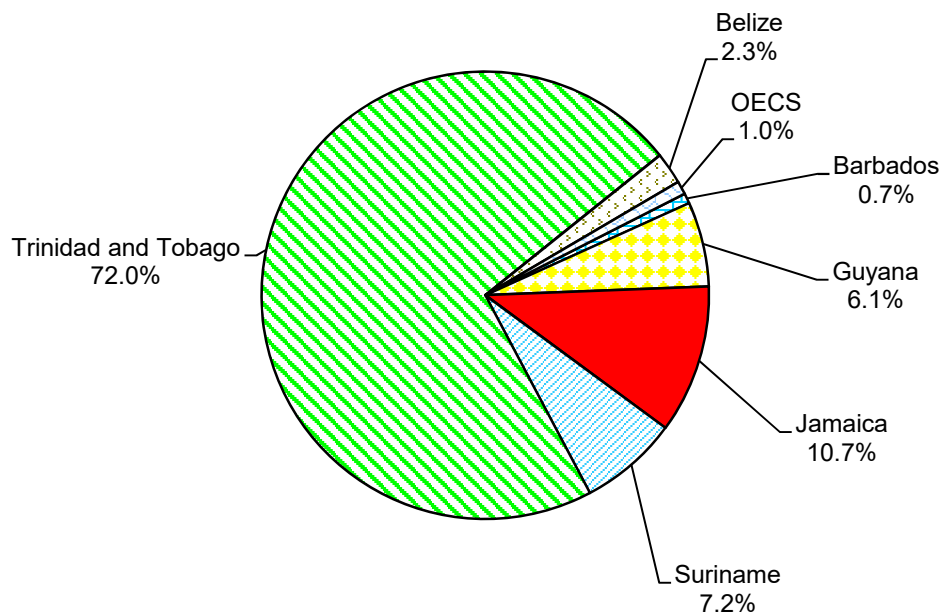

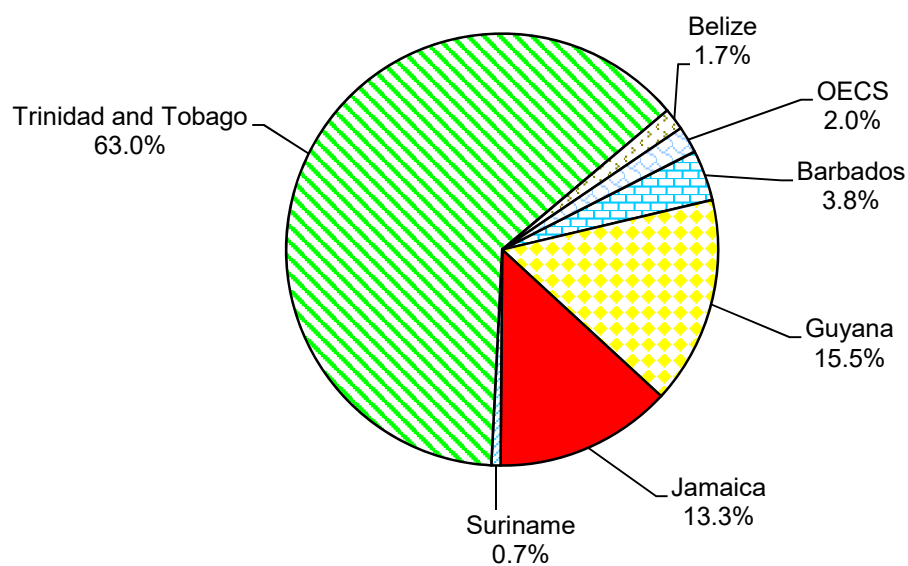

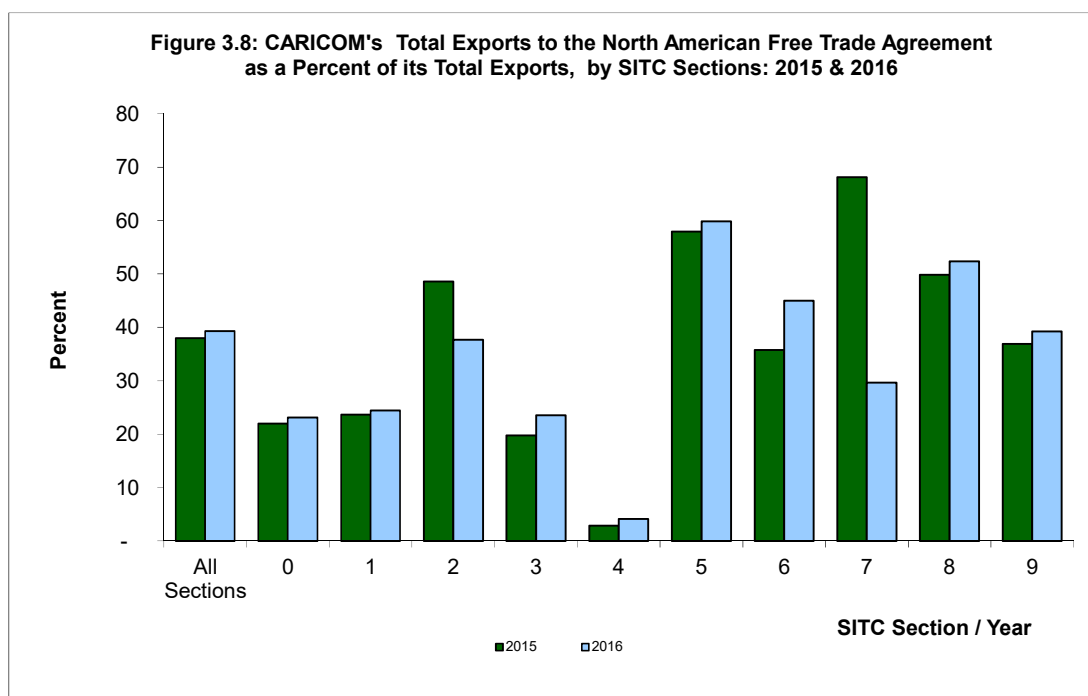
