The Regional Statistics Programme (RSP) of the CARICOM Secretariat usually produces a publication on **CARICOM's Trade:** A Quick Reference to Some Summary Data. However, given the enormous size of this publication and the lack of resources, it is not always possible to produce it in a timely manner.

In this context, the RSP has decided to produce a series of publications and to publish these as soon as they are finalised rather than to wait for the completion of the entire publication. 

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
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CARICOM'S TRADE WITH THE EUROPEAN UNION: 2011-2016

- CARICOM's imports from the European Union (EU) increased from US\$2.1 billion in 2011 (all Member States reporting) to US\$2.4 billion in 2016 (twelve Member States reporting)¹. CARICOM's imports from the EU as a percentage of its imports from all sources also expanded from 8.4% in 2011 to 11.4% in 2016.
- CARICOM's exports to the EU declined from US\$3.1 billion in 2011 (twelve Member States reporting)¹ to US\$1.6 billion in 2016 (eleven Member States reporting)². These values accounted for 14.4% and 13.3% of CARICOM's total exports in the respective years.
- Overall, CARICOM's trade balance with the EU *recorded trade surpluses* in 2011 and 2012 and deficits in the period 2013 2016. For 2011, the trade surplus stood at *US\$1.0 billion* while the trade deficit in 2016 was *US\$0.8 billion*.


Major Contributors


Imports

- The MDCs dominated CARICOM's imports from the EU with average percentage contribution of 89.6% over the period, 2011 2016. Imports of the MDCs from the EU expanded from US\$1.8 billion in 2011 to US\$2.2 billion in 2016, which accounted for 88.7% and 88.9% respectively of the Region's imports from the EU.
- Imports of the LDCs from the EU also increased moving from US\$0.2 billion in 2011 to US\$0.3 billion in 2016, which represented 11.3% and 11.1% respectively of CARICOM's imports from the EU.

Exports


- The MDCs were the key exporters to the EU, accounting on average for 93.4% of the Region's exports to this trading bloc over the period. Exports of the MDCs to EU decreased from US\$3.0 billion in 2011 to US\$1.5 billion in 2016, which represented 96.9% and 90.1% of CARICOM's exports to the EU in the respective years.
- The percentage contribution of the LDCs to CARICOM's exports to the EU increased from 3.1% in 2011 to 9.9% in 2016.






Member States Contributions

- *Trinidad and Tobago, Jamaica* and *Suriname* were CARICOM's leading importers from and exporters to the EU over the period, 2011-2016.
- For imports, *Trinidad and Tobago* on average accounted for 41.4% of CARICOM's imports from the EU while *Jamaica* and *Suriname* on average represented 17.4% and 16.2% respectively.
- On the exports side, *Trinidad and Tobago* dominated accounting on average for 59.9% of CARICOM's exports to the EU over the period. *Jamaica* and *Suriname* reflected average percentage contributions of 11.4% and 10.9% respectively.
- Regarding Member States' trade balance with the EU, Guyana and Belize were the only two Member States to record surpluses for the entire period. Trinidad and Tobago reflected surpluses for the period 2011-2015 and a deficit in 2016 while Suriname recorded a surplus in 2011 and deficits in the remaining years of the period. All other Member States reflected deficits with the EU.







Major Commodity Groupings

 Machinery and Transport Equipment, Chemicals and related products, and Manufactured Goods classified chiefly materials represented CARICOM's highest imported commodity groupings from the EU while *Chemicals and related products* and *Mineral Fuels*, *Lubricants and related materials* were the Region's highest exported commodity groupings to this trading bloc.

• *Machinery and Transport Equipment* on average accounted for 40.7% of CARICOM's imports from the EU. *Chemicals and related products*, the second highest imported commodity grouping from the EU on average represented 13.9% and *Manufactured goods classified chiefly materials*, the *third* highest imported commodity grouping on average accounted for 13.8% of the Region's imports from the EU.



• On the exports side, Chemicals and related products n.e.s and Mineral Fuels, Lubricants and related materials on average accounted for 26.0% and 23.9% respectively of CARICOM's exports to the EU.



Top items traded with the EU - 2016

For 2016, CARICOM's top ten imports from the EU accounted for 42.3% of its total imports from EU. The top five commodities were:

- Ships, boats (including hovercraft) and floating structures;
- Motor cars and other motor vehicles principally designed for the transport of persons (other than
 motor vehicles for the transport of ten or more persons, including the driver), including stationwagons and racing cars;
- *Medicaments (including veterinary medicaments);*
- Alcoholic beverages; and
- Heating and cooling equipment and parts thereof, n.e.s..

These top five commodities collectively accounted for 32.2% of CARICOM's total imports from the EU.

CARICOM's top ten domestic exports to the EU for 2016 accounted for 89.2% of CARICOM's domestic exports to the EU. The top five commodities exported to the EU were:

• Alcohols, phenols, phenol-alcohols, and their halogenated, sulphonated, nitrated or nitrosated derivatives;

- Aluminium ores and concentrates (including alumina);
- *Iron ore and concentrates;*
- Natural gas, whether or not liquefied; and
- Sugars, molasses and honey

These top five commodities together accounted for 62.1% of CARICOM's total domestic exports to the EU.






