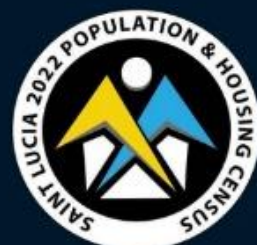

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Statement of Confidentiality

The information collected during the Population and Housing Census for 2022 is strictly confidential and will not be divulged to a third party without the consent of the individual(s) who provided the data. We want to assure census participants that extensive measures were taken to anonymize the names and demographic particulars of everyone who provided information to the Central Statistical Office. The collected data will not be shared with a third party if the information leads to respondents' direct or indirect identification. Every census worker, including non-permanent employees of the Central Statistics Office, is under an oath of secrecy and is criminally liable if in any form or manner disseminates the information collected to a third party during or after the data collection exercise. Mechanisms are built into the system to report potential breaches of census procedures and confidentiality.

Legal Basis for the 2022 Census

A census is the primary source of information about a country's population and is conducted every 10 years at a minimum. Saint Lucia's Central Statistical Office is mandated by the Statistics Act, Cap. 17.12 of the Laws of Saint Lucia, Section 3(1)(a) to conduct the Population and Housing Census. According to Sections 2 and 5 of the Census Act, Cap. 17.02 of the Revised Laws of Saint Lucia, the requisite order, and regulations were made to direct that a Census be taken for Saint Lucia and subsequently gazette in the public journal of the government.

Improvements to the 2022 Census

The 2022 Census incorporated significant advancements in technological development, with a clear focus on enhancing efficiency and data quality relative to previous censuses. The census leveraged digital tools, including satellite imagery, essential for a comprehensive mapping and listing of all structures and households. This process was further bolstered by adapting the WB Computer-Assisted Personal Interview (CAPI) software where training and fieldwork materials were preloaded onto tablet PCs, reducing the need for extensive printing of manuals and questionnaires.

The technologies used for the 2022 Census supported the recording of GPS coordinates of households, enabling the integration of household locations with their associated social and economic facilities into the system. GPS technology is recognized for enhancing census coverage by identifying omissions during the mapping and listing phases. but also, to enable the validation of collected data. Two distinct types of questionnaires were employed: the Household questionnaire, designed to gather information on household characteristics, and the Person questionnaire, intended to capture individual characteristics. While the content of the 2022 census questionnaires mirrored that of previous census questionnaires, some modifications were made to address specific needs.

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Foreword

The 2022 Population and Housing Census marks a significant milestone in the Central Statistical Office's (CSO) ongoing statistical activities to unravel our small island developing state demographic, social, and economic dynamics

Conducting a population and housing census (PHC) is a comprehensive, complex, and costly statistical undertaking to provide a snapshot of a country's population distribution at a specific point in time. Census data serves as a benchmark for a country's demographic statistics, from the national level down to the smallest statistical geographical unit, the "enumeration district" (ED).

The data collection for the 2022 census saw a transition from the Paper-Assisted Personal Interview (PAPI) to the Computer-Assisted Personal Interview (CAPI) approach, improving the capturing, management, and organization of large datasets, and ensuring data quality and accuracy. Preparations began in 2019, guided by recommendations from the UN ECLAC User Guide for Population and Housing Censuses - Rev 3. The COVID-19 pandemic interrupted critical components of the preparatory phase, leading to a twelve-month hiatus of all census activities. Despite these challenges, with additional resources from the Government of Saint Lucia, the Central Statistical Office was able to meet the revised timeline for completing the census activities.

Stakeholders and international partners can be assured that the 2022 census was designed using best practices, tailored to reflect the unique characteristics and needs of the general public. The pre-enumeration process included comprehensive training for census personnel, by adopting innovative data collection strategies combined with active community engagement throughout the EDs to ensure thorough coverage of households.

This report will be made available in a series of three releases. The results in this report detail population size and structure by enumeration district, annual population growth rates, population density, health, education, and population standard of living. The census tables in this document are CARICOM Regional Census Strategy - 2020 Round of Population compliant and conform to the recommendations for publishing census data for the Caribbean region.

The Statistics Department is delighted to provide the census information that we believe is crucial for effective data-driven governance and equitable resource distribution and to support informed decision-making in policy, economic planning, and social services.

The census data was analyzed by applying geographical and spatial information to examine variations in demographic and socio-economic factors, utilizing multiple levels of statistical analysis to derive meaningful insights into statistical trends and patterns within the Saint Lucian space. Hyperlinks are provided for easy navigation of this report, comments are welcome.

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Terms and Definitions

Term	Definition
Age dependency ratio	The age dependency ratio relates the number of children (0-14 years old) and older persons (65 years or over) to the working-age population (15-64 years old).
Building	A building is an independent free-standing structure comprising one or more rooms or other spaces, covered by a roof, and usually enclosed within external walls or dividing walls from adjoining buildings that extend from the foundations to the roof. A building may be a factory, shop, detached dwelling, apartment building, warehouse, repair shop, poultry pen, etc. Detached rooms relating to the main buildings are treated as part of the main building, for example, detached kitchens, toilets, servants' quarters, garages, etc.
Business	A business is an activity that is carried on in a systematic, continuous, and regular manner. It carries an expectation of financial return or profit, from exchanging money for work, accepting risk, and selling goods and/or services.
Census night	Point of reference for the census, usually the night just before the field count begins. For the St. Lucia 2022 Census, this was the night between 12 and 13 March 2022. Respondents were asked to provide information about their situation at that time.
“De facto” population	The respondents are enumerated where they are found, regardless of their usual place of residence
“De jure” population	The respondents are enumerated at their usual place of residence, regardless of where they stayed on census night.
Demographic dividend	Countries are going through a transition process in which the birth rate strongly decreases. At the same time, the number of older people is still relatively small due to the former pyramid-like shape of the age-sex distribution. This temporarily leads to a low dependency ratio, which countries may exploit to improve their economic situation: the demographic dividend.
Dwelling	A dwelling unit is any building or separate and independent part of a building in which a person or group of persons is living at the time of the census enumeration. There must be direct access from the street or common landing, staircase, passage, or gallery where occupants can enter or leave without passing through anybody else's living quarters. A dwelling unit is one in which one or several households reside. This may be a single house, flat, apartment, out-room, part of a commercial building, or a boarding house catering for less than six people.
Household	A group of people related or unrelated, who live together in the same dwelling unit and share living accommodations. This can include family members as well as non-family members such as roommates
Institutional Population	The institutional population comprises people who are not members of private households. These include the residents of dormitories of schools and universities, religious institutions, hospitals, and correctional and penal institutions.

Labour force	The labour force, or economically active population, consists of the population ages 15 and older that have worked at least one hour for pay, profit or family gain over the last week for the census, plus those who have been actively looking for work during this period.
Net migration rate	Net migration rate compares the difference between the number of persons entering and leaving a country during the year per 1,000 persons.
Number of inhabited buildings	The total count of buildings that are occupied and used as residences by people. This includes any structure where people live, such as houses, apartments, flats, or other residential dwellings. The term helps to distinguish between buildings that are used for habitation and those used for other purposes (e.g., commercial, industrial, vacant, or abandoned buildings). The number of inhabited buildings is an important statistic in understanding housing availability, population distribution, and urban development within a given area.
Labour force participation rate	The labour force participation rate is the proportion of the population ages 15 and older that is economically active.
Person 1	For census enumeration purposes, every private household must have a Person 1. In the past, this person was called Head of the household. It is the person recognized from the household who is the main respondent. Since the notion of Head of household is no longer broadly supported, the role of Person 1 can be assigned to any responsible adult in the household.
Population and Housing Census	A population and housing census involves a comprehensive process of planning, collecting, compiling, evaluating, disseminating, and analyzing demographic, economic, and social data at the smallest geographic level at a specific time. Its goal is to account for all individuals in a country and the condition of all housing units and facilities available to households. This data is crucial for economic and social development, administrative activities, and scientific research, as it provides reliable and detailed information on the population's size, distribution, and composition. The census also includes information on homeless individuals and gathers sufficient demographic, social, and economic data to describe housing conditions and analyze housing deficiencies for potential remedial actions.
Post-enumeration survey	The purpose of a post-enumeration survey is to measure the accuracy of a census. The survey determines the quality of the census by independently surveying a sample of the population.
Private household	A household consists of one or more persons living together, sleeping in the same dwelling most nights, and sharing at least one daily meal. A member of a household need not be a relative of the main family. For example, a boarder or a domestic servant who sleeps in most nights of the week is considered a member of the household. A household can consist of just one person, or of more than one family if they share living arrangements. A group of unrelated persons living together can also comprise a household.
Sex ratio	The number of males per 100 females.

Introduction

The insights presented in this report stem from a rigorous analysis of data collected during Saint Lucia's 2022 Population and Housing Census. These results were carefully derived utilizing a process of data cleaning and rigorous consistency verification. This work is under review, and any changes will be communicated to users in a subsequent release. The Central Statistical Office endeavors to add relevant tables and other forms of information dissemination as the census dataset undergoes further analysis, in keeping with prescribed regional and international standards for releasing a more extensive set of results.

Additionally, definitional, and other analytical variations may affect the comparisons between the 2022 and previous censuses. Therefore, users of census information should approach the related tables with discernment.

The differences in definition between terms such as “Household Population” and “Total Population” must also be considered. Note that the Household Population is the sum of all people recorded on visitation records and/or electronic census questionnaires, on which a set of geographically dependent weight factors has been applied to arrive at estimated full values. The Total Population is the household population plus an estimate of Long-time residents who on census night, 12/13 March 2022, resided in institutions for collective living such as hospitals, hotels, and correctional institutions.

The household enumeration encountered challenges of undercounting due to reasons like non-cooperation from respondents. To estimate undercounts, some countries conduct post-enumeration surveys, a cost-prohibitive process that proved resource-intensive for a small nation-state like Saint Lucia. For the 2022 Saint Lucia census, the Department's Mapping and Listing operations achieved better coverage of households than the actual household count. These operations uncovered significant discrepancies in the reported numbers of inhabited buildings, dwellings, and households. This undercount varied across enumeration districts, leading to the application of weighted factors to adjust population and housing statistics.

The provisional results from the 2022 census indicate an increase in Saint Lucia's resident population, reaching a total of 172,948 individuals, compared to the count of 2010. The population density now stands at approximately 721 persons per square mile. The increase in population contrasts sharply with the mid-year population estimates of 182,289 for 2022 ([Mid-Year Estimates](#)). The aggregate is derived by factoring in births, deaths, and migration data to the previous year's estimate¹. The age dependency ratio declined from 46.47 in 2010 to 44.5 in 2022. The sex ratio decreased to 97.2 from 101.5. Health concerns include a high prevalence of diabetes and hypertension. Geographic distribution trends reveal Castries remains the most populated district despite a decline observed for the census count, while Gros Islet, Vieux Fort, Laborie, and Choiseul, saw significant growth. Household size has decreased over time, and educational attainment shows a sizable portion of the population lacks formal education. Crime statistics indicate theft as the most common offense, and the population pyramids illustrate a youthful demographic.

Census 2022 can be described as a “De jure” census. People were enumerated at their usual place of residence during census night, which means that absent household members were included in the enumeration exercise.

¹ Due to an inefficient National Statistical System (NSS), the required births, deaths and migration data is not easily obtainable and provided timely. The NSS consist of the CSO and all other producers of official statistics in St. Lucia.

Weighting Procedure

One well-known aspect of censuses is that they are prone to both overcounts and undercounts. Overcounts occur when households or individuals are counted more than once; a common example is when enumerators inadvertently cross into their colleague's assigned areas. Undercount is more common in enumeration exercises and occurs when households are missed or are not counted for several reasons. A common example is when individuals refuse to be included in the census, forcing the enumerator to rely on last-resort information. Countries estimate undercounts through post-enumeration triangulation exercises, canvassing a sample of districts thoroughly to enhance accuracy. These results are compared with regular census data to assess the coverage error. Such exercises are cost-prohibitive and often unfeasible for island states.

Mapping and listing operations conducted by qualified statisticians often result in more comprehensive household data coverage when compared to data from census enumeration exercises.

This is attributed to the systematic and meticulous nature of these operations which typically involve direct observation and verification by these skilled professionals (Table 1). Studies, including those by the U.S. Census Bureau, support this approach by showing improved data quality and coverage when geospatial operations are utilized during census processes ([Census.gov](https://www.census.gov)).

Table 1 shows both operations recorded approximately the same number of buildings. The census enumeration recorded fewer dwellings, households, and inhabited buildings than the electronic mapping exercise. Since the mapping and listing team can only observe dwellings externally, the records of inhabited buildings are unlikely to match those reported by enumerators. Consequently, the mapping and listing data were used to estimate the undercount. As a result of the undercount in Table 1, weighted factors were calculated in Table 2 and applied to generate the population and housing statistics.

Considering that [94%](#) of households are domestic electricity consumers (Table 19), it would be reasonable to validate the household data in Table 1, using the number of LUCELEC's domestic consumer accounts for accuracy. Since the number of domestic consumers rose from 53,566 in December 2010 to 63,222 in 2021, and 63,849 by the end of 2022 given that 94.1% of households use electricity for domestic consumption ([Table B.5](#)). An interpolation of LUCELEC data of 63,350 domestic consumers, while maintaining a 94.1% rate for all private households, results in an estimate of 67,322 households. Given that some households have multiple electricity accounts, the resultant estimate closely matches the number of households in Table 1 and validates the housing data for Census 2022.

International research on census undercounts is ongoing, in many countries, this phenomenon has been discussed in the 2020 Round of Censuses and is important in the Eastern Caribbean Region. Research could give rise to improved methods of estimating the undercount and could eventually lead to a revision of the provisional numbers of the census report ([census undercount](#)).

Population Size

Saint Lucia recorded an overall household population increase of 3.8% ([Table A.1](#)) on 12/13 March 2022, this increase was based on a point-to-point calculation of the two censuses. At midnight on Census Night, 12/13 March 2022, the total resident population stood at 172,948 people. The total population including visiting non-resident people was estimated to be 178,807, the reported number of non-resident visitors was 5,859. Out of the resident population, 1,114 individuals live in institutions, while the household residents comprise 171,834 people. (Table 3), made up of 84,716 males and 87,119 females ([Tables A.1](#) and [A.3](#)). Among the ten enumeration districts, household population declines were observed in Castries, Anse La Raye, and Soufriere, with Castries experiencing the largest decrease ([Table A.2](#)).

From Table 3 we note that the largest age group, 35-39, accounts for 13,335 individuals and comprised 7.76% of the total population. The age group with the smallest population is 90 years and over, with 858 individuals, making up less than one percent of the population. We note that the population is evenly split between males and females, with females slightly outnumbering males 51: 49. The age groups 30 -34 and 35-39 reported a higher percentage of females.

Saint Lucia Population Density

Provisional Census results for 2022 indicate that Saint Lucia's population density is 721 people per square mile ([Table A.6](#)). This figure was derived using the land mass area of 238.2 square miles, which includes the country's forest reserve areas. This forest reserve areas cover approximately 30 square miles. The enumeration district of Castries had a population density of 1,529 people per square mile ([Table A.6](#)). Canaries the least densely populated district, has a density of 231 people per square mile. The district of Gros Islet experienced a rapid population expansion, recording a population density of 773 individuals per square mile, up from 643 in 2010. In 1991, census data reported a population density of 345 persons per square mile for the enumeration district of Gros Islet.

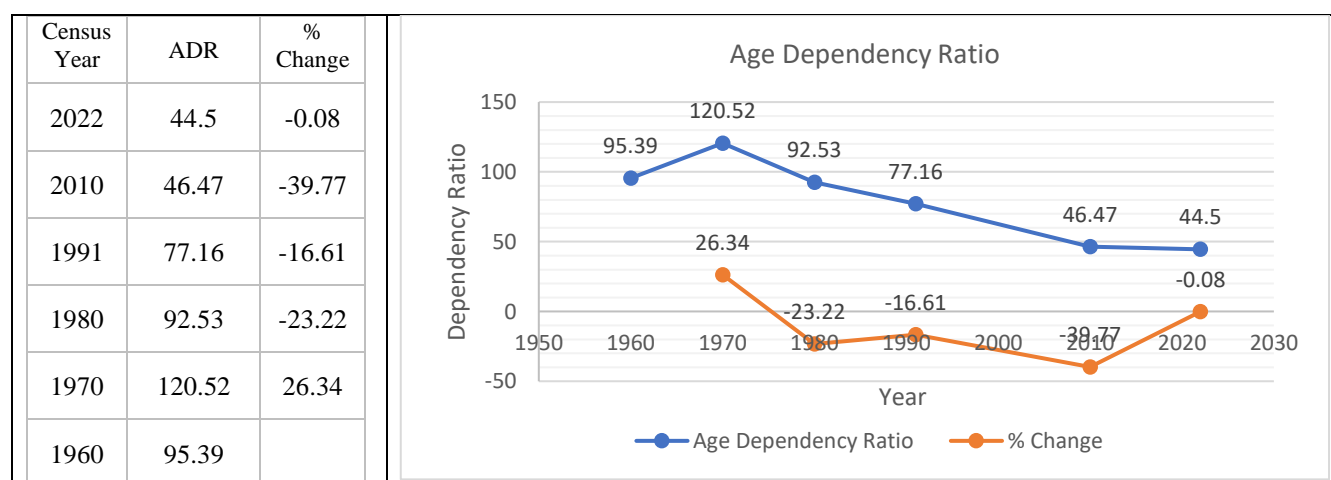
Age Dependency Ratio

The Age Dependency Ratio is a measure used to assess the pressure on the “productive population” by comparing the number of “dependents” (young and old) to the working-age population. That number is typically expressed as a percentage. The age dependency ratio is calculated using the following approach,

$ADR = (\text{Number of Dependents} / \text{Working Age Population}) \times 100$ Where: Number of Dependents includes individuals classified as young dependents (typically under age 15) and elderly dependents age 65 and over. The working-age population consists of individuals aged 15 to 64.

The age dependency ratio based on 2022 census data is 44.5 (Figure 1). This figure places Saint Lucia among countries with a lower age dependency ratio, indicating that a smaller proportion of the population depends on the working-age population. The enumeration districts with the highest prevalence of dependent population are Micoud, Soufriere, and Choiseul ([Table A.3](#)). The ADR places Saint Lucia in position 35 in the World Bank's ranking of 240 ADR countries.

Sex Ratio

The overall sex ratio for 2022 was 97.2 ([Table A.3](#)). Notably, the sex ratio was higher in rural communities of Canaries and Anse La Raye for 2022. Compared to 2010, the sex ratio was 98.5, indicating a slight decrease in males per 100 females. A decline in the sex ratio signals a demographic shift in population trends brought about by higher female birth rates, increased male mortality, and increased emigration flows. Changes in the sex ratio have implications for Saint Lucia's social dynamics, health, and social services for balanced and equitable development.

Population Health

Diabetes and Hypertension continue to rank as the highest NCDs on the island with the prevalence of diabetes in the enumeration districts of Castries and Gros Islet and Hypertension; Castries, Gros Islet, Micoud, and Vieux Fort⁴ ([Table D.4](#)). This raises concerns about the widespread occurrence of these NCDs and their impact on the population, productivity, mental factors such as stress and depression, resource constraints, diet, and lifestyle. The high prevalence of medical conditions such as heart disease, cardiovascular disease, asthma, and depression in the Castries enumeration district ([Table D.4](#)), places pressure on the healthcare infrastructure particularly, for access to specialized care and improved socioeconomic conditions and removal of barriers to healthcare.

Geographic Distribution and Population Movement

Geographic Distribution of Population

Provisional data from St. Lucia 2022 Population and Housing Census show that the largest proportion of Saint Lucia's population resides in Castries ([Table A.2](#)). Even with a contraction of 7.7% ([Table A.5](#)), Castries still represents a substantial proportion (35.3%) of Saint Lucia's total population, while the lowest populations concentration is observed in Anse-La-Raye and Canaries. Districts like Micoud and Dennery have stable populations with notable slight increases. The population distribution has experienced a subtle yet noteworthy shift, with areas like Gros Islet and Vieux Fort becoming more prominent. Consequently, these areas could see significant development and growth, reshaping the social and economic landscape of Saint Lucia

Population Movement

Successive population counts show a substantial migration of people from Castries to Gros Islet district, Gros Islet has the second most populated district with a population share of 17.4% for 2022, up from 15.2% in 2010 ([Table A.2](#)). This represented an 18.8% increase in population growth, rising from 25,210 in 2010 to 29,953 in 2022. The least populated district in Saint Lucia is the enumeration district of Canaries, accounting for 1.3% of the total population of Saint Lucia. Among the ten districts, seven districts experienced population growth. Anse La Raye, Canaries, and Soufriere recorded declining growth rates ([Table A.2](#)) for the intercensal period. The population movement from 2010 to 2022 demonstrates some interesting trends. The total household population grew by 3.8%, from 165,595 in 2010 to 171,834 in 2022.

According to [Table A.2](#), while most districts saw an increased number of households, many also experienced decreases in household size. Some districts, like Castries and Anse La Raye, faced a population decline despite a notable increase in household total, suggesting migration or demographic

changes such as an aging population. In contrast, districts like Choiseul, Laborie, Vieux Fort, and Gros Islet saw substantial population and household growth, indicating these areas might be more attractive for settlement or have better living conditions and opportunities.

Previous censuses showed considerable internal migration from the southern districts to the north, a trend that has slowed down over the intercensal period. In terms of international migration during the intercensal years, among those who resided abroad and since returned to Saint Lucia, 3,000 of the emigrants were born abroad. The total number of recorded emigrants stands at 3,236 ([Table C.2](#)). The disparity between the two totals can be explained as an underestimation of emigrant totals since the departure of households would not be noticeable in the census, given those households were not present to be enumerated. The net migration rate is comparatively small relative to Saint Lucia's population size, as there is a small excess of departures recorded.

The movement of individuals is primarily influenced by factors such as family migration, economic opportunities, and the various free movement arrangements within the CARICOM framework ([Annex Table 7.1](#)). Most of the immigrant population comprises individuals migrating for family-related reasons—such as those accompanying parents during childhood, and those relocating for work-related reasons. Economic migration, in particular, exhibits a higher prevalence among males. Alternatively, migration motivated by unspecified reasons and humanitarian circumstances shows a higher prevalence among females. Immigration cases linked to natural disasters, humanitarian situations, and deportation are rare.

Household Size and Structure

In total, 65,951 households were recorded in the 2022 Population and Housing Census, compared to 58,891 households in May 2010. This represents an increase of 7,060 residential units, or 12%, over the intercensal period ([Table A.5](#)). Despite a modest Total Resident population increase of 3.9% ([Table A.1](#)), the average household size has decreased significantly, dropping from 2.8 per household in 2010 to 2.6 in 2022 ([Table A.5](#)).

The average household size has steadily declined during the intercensal years, from 4.0 people per household in 1991 to 3.3 in 2001, 2.8 in 2010, and 2.6 in 2022. At the district level, the average household size varied, with Soufriere at 2.8 and Canaries at 2.5. A comparison of the 2022 and 2010 censuses reveals a decline in average household size across all enumeration districts in Saint Lucia - Laborie experiencing the most significant decrease, from 3.1 people per household in 2010 to 2.6 in 2022 ([Table A.5](#)).

Education

Based on ([Table D.5](#)), we observe that the educational landscape exhibits several notable features and weaknesses. It is important to note that most of the population achieved only primary or secondary education as of Census Day, 12/13 March 2022 ([Table 4](#)). The data shows that 10,446 individuals have no formal schooling - a gap in early childhood education access or retention. A small fraction of the population holds a university degree, and educational attainment varies throughout the ten enumeration districts. Gros Islet has a larger percentage of individuals with tertiary education ([Table D.5](#)). The gap in male-to-female university education can be attributed to several factors in males acquiring degrees.

[Table D.6](#) delineates a diverse spectrum of qualifications spanning various education levels, revealing a considerable proportion of individuals lacking formal education. From Table 5, women surpass men in higher education levels, particularly in bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees. This trend reflects a more significant female presence in post-secondary and tertiary education.

Crime

A comprehensive set of crime statistics collected at the household level ([Table B.22](#)) revealed that “common theft from homes while the occupants are out” is the most common criminal offense committed on the island. Non-violent crimes - theft of personal items while away ranked second, affecting less than 0.5% of households annually.

[Table B.22](#) revealed that Castries has the highest crime frequency, leading in incidents of theft from home while away (155), motor vehicle theft (71), and physical assault (64). Castries also ranks high for theft of personal items while away (84) and rape (21).

Other districts show significant crime concentrations as well. Gros Islet records high numbers of theft of motor vehicles (26), theft of motor vehicle parts (23), and physical assault (30). Vieux Fort residents experienced notable incidents, particularly in theft from home while away (72) and rape (12). Micoud has the highest number of reported rapes (29), while Castries stands out with the highest number of homicides (19).

From the data, ICT crimes were reported specifically, Cyber Bullying. ICT crime documented 28 incidents, with concentrations in Vieux Fort (23) and Castries (1). Cyberbullying should be recognized as a significant issue, particularly in Vieux Fort, where it is most prevalent. A summary of crimes experienced by households twelve months before the Census enumeration exercise is documented in Table 6.

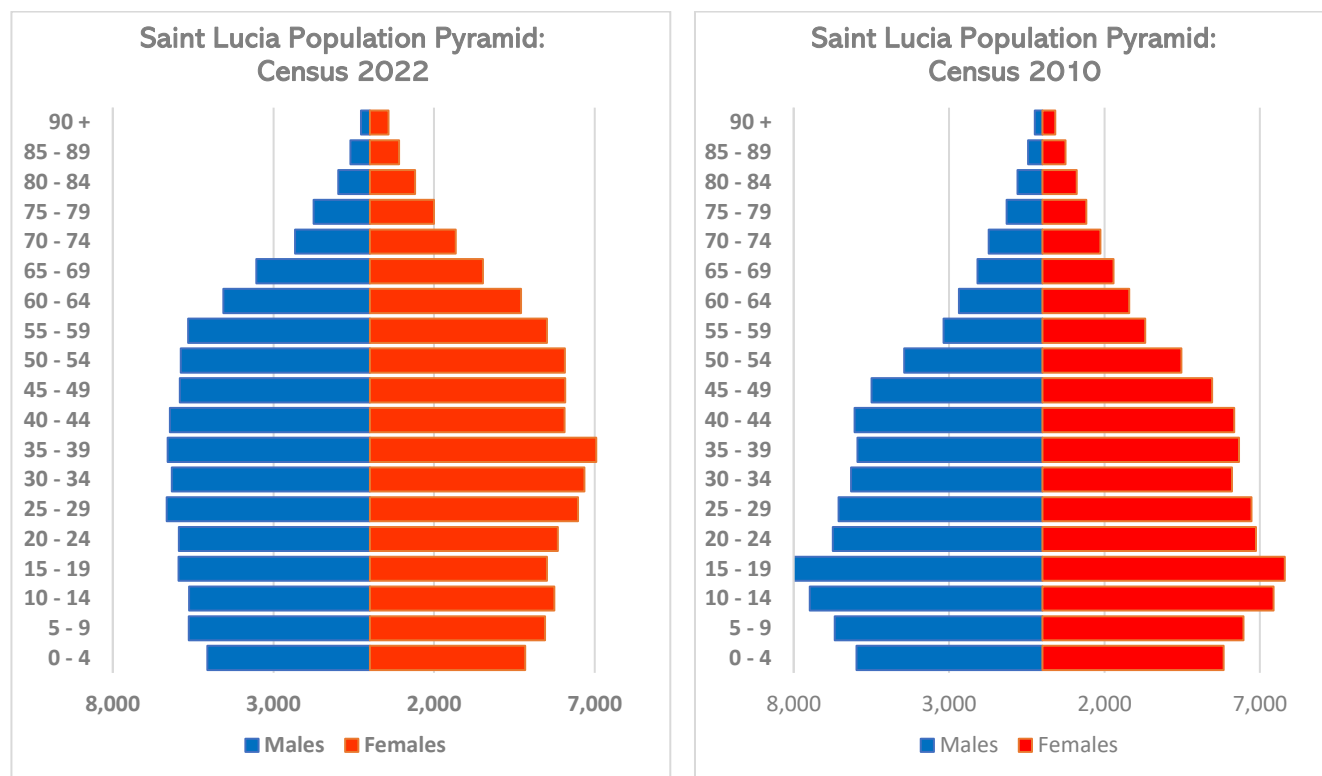

The population pyramids for 2022 and 2010 show how the Saint Lucian population is aging, this can be attributed to several key factors, declining birth rates, increased life expectancy, emigration of young people, changes in mortality rates, economic and social aspects, and the impact of public health initiatives.

Figure 2: Comparative Population Pyramid for 2010 and 2022



Saint Lucia has a youthful population; Figure 2 illustrates a broad base that narrows progressively in older age groups indicating the potential for demographic dividends. The symmetrical distribution indicates a balanced ratio of males to females for most age ranges. We note that there are fewer men in the oldest age categories, reflecting a higher life expectancy for women. The middle-age groups (30-44) show stability, while the population significantly declines at ages 70 and above. The 2022 population pyramid displays a typical age-sex structure, with the population distributed across different age cohorts of males and females.

Compared to the 2010 census, the population pyramid reveals several demographic trends and changes over the intercensal years. In both 2010 and 2022, the base of the pyramids (0-4 age group) is broad, indicating high birth rates. However, the base in 2022 appears slightly narrower, suggesting a potential decrease in birth rates over the intercensal years. The middle age groups (30-44) have grown slightly in 2022 compared to 2010, indicating a progression of the population into these age groups. This could be due to the aging of individuals who were in younger age groups in 2010.

The older age groups (60 and above) increased in 2022, reflecting an aging dynamic. This is visible in the slightly wider bars for those age groups in the 2022 pyramid compared to 2010. Both pyramids exhibit a balanced gender distribution amongst most age groups. However, the slight gender imbalance in the oldest age categories (more females than males) remains consistent in 2010 and 2022.

The overall shape of the pyramid remains consistent with a broad base that gradually narrows with age. The narrowing is slightly more pronounced in 2022 with fewer young children relative to the overall population.

Figure 3: Sex Ratios – Census 2022

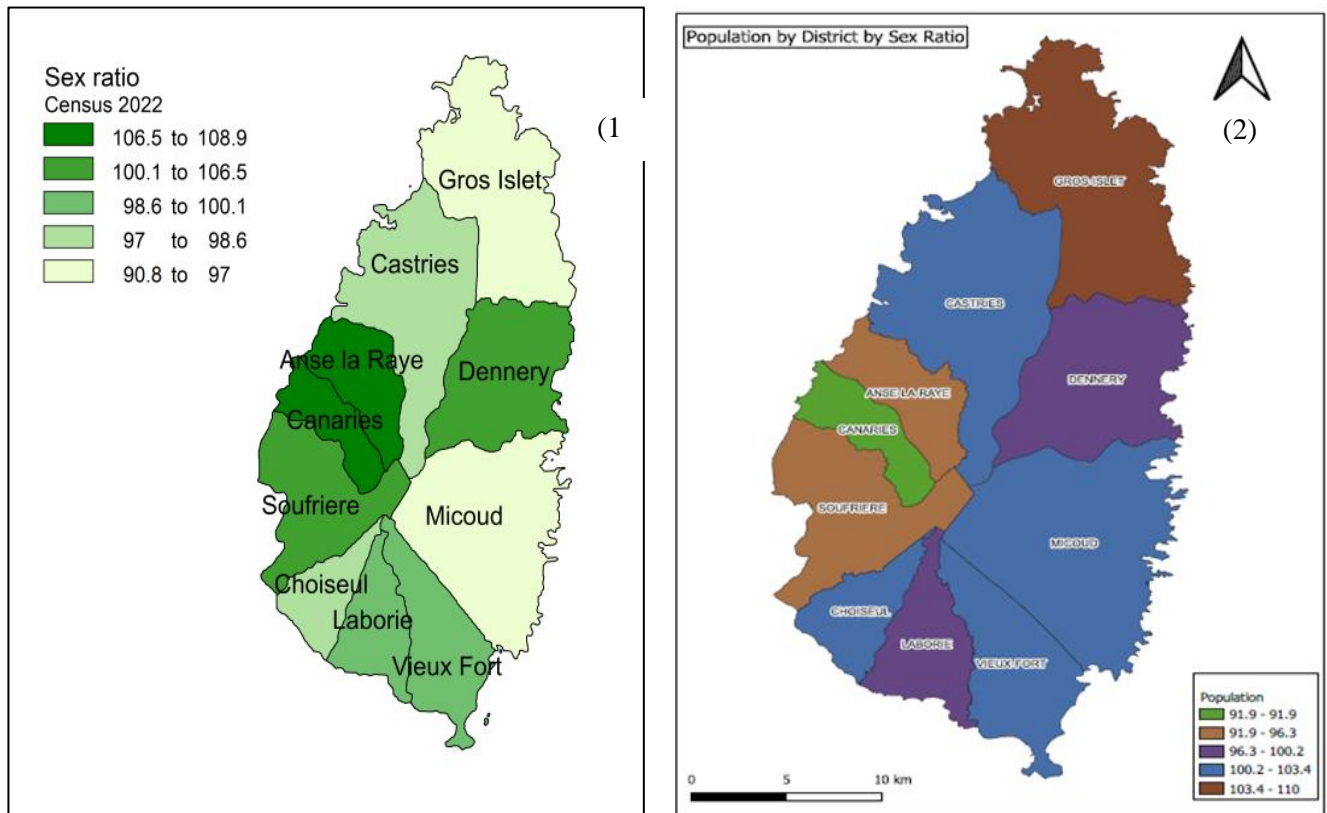


Figure 3 (1) is a snapshot of the sex ratio across the different geographic regions of Saint Lucia on census night. The sex ratio (Males per 100 females) is high in Anse La Raye, Canaries, and Dennerly denoted by the dark green colour code or range of 106.5 to 108.9. Districts like Soufriere and Dennerly fall into the high ratios group, 100.1 to 106.5). This category shows a balanced number of males to females but slightly more males. Castries shows a balanced ratio (98.6 to 100.1) of an equal number of males and females. Choiseul and Micoud have lower ratios (97 to 98.6), indicating fewer males than females, but the ratio remains fairly balanced. Regions like Gros Islet and Vieux Fort have the lowest ratios (90.8 to 97): the lowest sex ratios indicate more female presence than males.

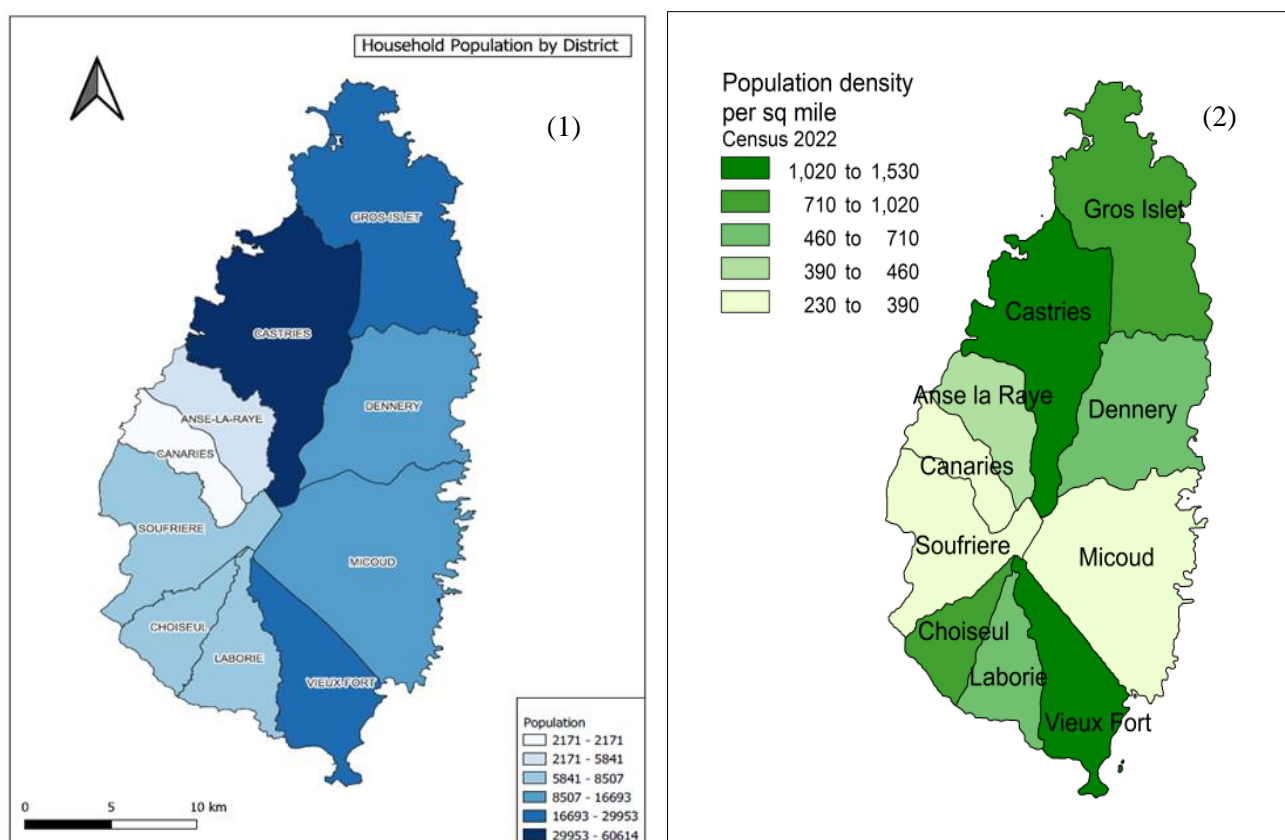
Figure 3 (2) is a choropleth⁵ map that displays the population distribution by district based on the sex ratio in a certain region. From the choropleth map, there seems to be a geographic trend in sex ratio distribution, where certain areas have notably higher or lower sex ratios, which could be indicative of underlying demographic or social factors.

Saint Lucia's sex ratio indicates a slight imbalance, with a slightly higher number of females compared to males, particularly in older age groups. This disparity is more pronounced in the elderly population due to higher life expectancy among women. In younger demographics, the gender ratio is balanced. However, a trend emerges in which the proportion of females increases as the population ages, indicating a growing female majority in older age groups. This shift reflects broader demographic

trends, which include higher male mortality rates and outmigration patterns affecting the working-age population.

Figure 4: Household Population by District: Population Density



Population density⁶ measures the number of people living in a particular area and is usually expressed as people per square kilometer or square mile. It is calculated by dividing the total population of a region by the area of that region. Population density provides insights into the distribution of people within a geographic space and helps in understanding that region's social, economic, and environmental aspects. High-population-density areas are often urban communities, while low-population-density areas are usually rural.

Figure 4 (1) visually depicts demographic patterns and settlement distribution across Saint Lucia. Castries district, with a population density ranging from 1,020 to 1,510 people per square mile, has the highest population density. With its concentrated population, Castries is likely to have a more developed infrastructure and accessible services than other districts on the island.

Gros Islet and Vieux Fort Districts have the second-highest population density (773 and 1,020) per square mile (Table A.6). These districts are fairly well-developed and less congested than Castries. Dennery and Laborie districts fall into the range of 390 to 710 people per square mile with a moderate population density, balancing available space and services.

Soufriere, Canaries, and Micoud Districts have the lowest population density (less than 389 people per square mile) (Table A.6). These districts are more rural, offering more space per individual but

potentially fewer services. Castries and Vieux Fort have historically been the most densely populated districts, as observed in the intercensal years 1991, 2001, and 2010.

Figure 5: Change in Population over the Intercensal period

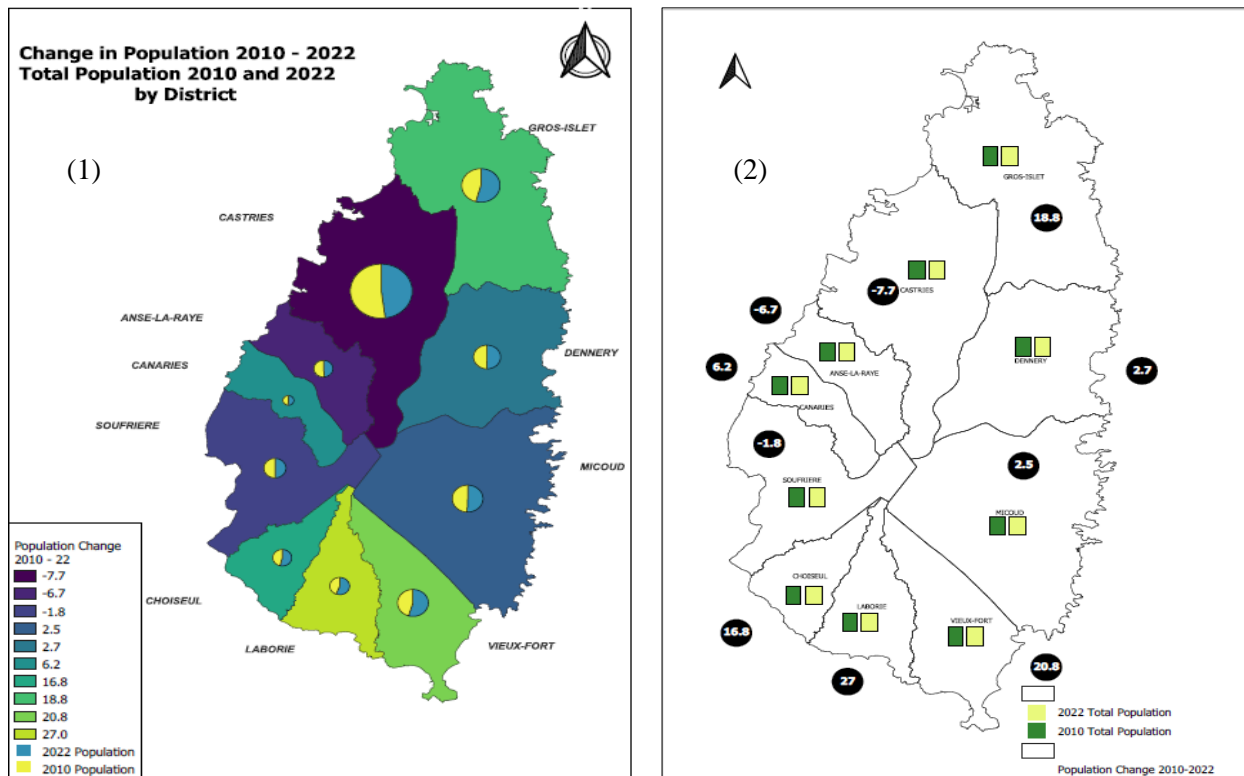
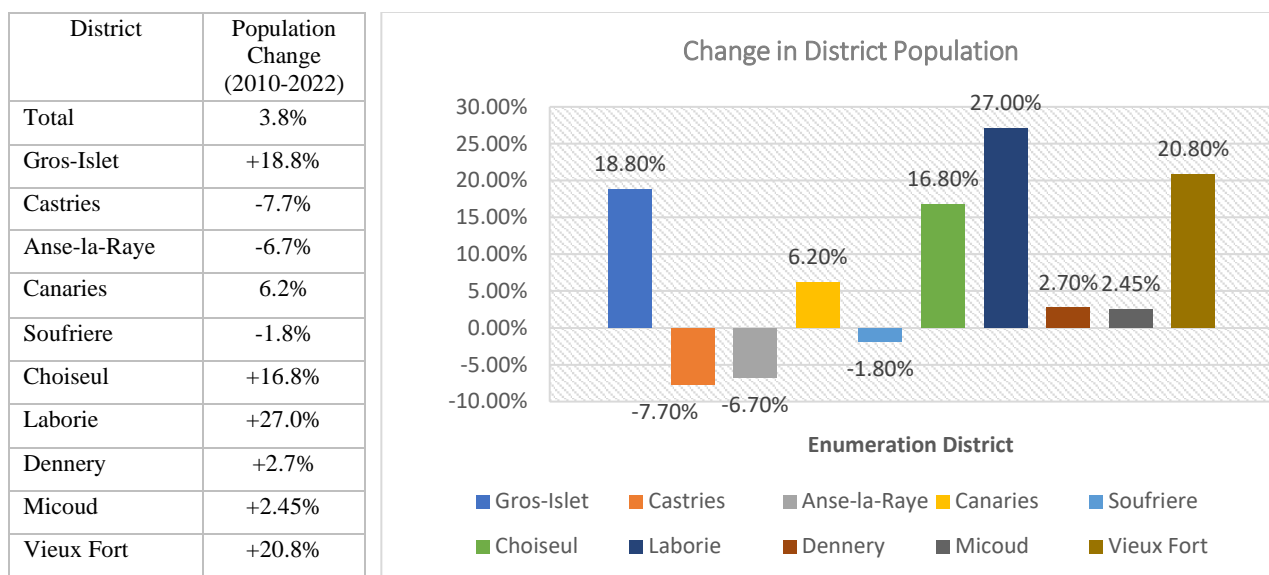


Figure 5 (1) visually represents Saint Lucia's population trends over the intercensal years throughout the enumeration districts, highlighting areas of both growth and decline. The map employs distinct colors to indicate the percentage change in population for each district, with shades of green denoting growth and shades of light green representing decline. Additionally, pie charts within the respective area on the map provide a comparative view of the total population between 2010 and 2022, offering a clear visual contrast. Figure 6 complements this by detailing the percentage change in population by district from 2010 to 2022. Figure 5 (2) further breaks down the population changes by district, offering a more granular view of how each area has evolved over the 12 years.

The population trends in Saint Lucia from 2010 to 2022 revealed significant variations throughout the different districts. Figure 5 (1) visually depicts these changes, showing areas of both growth and decline. The map highlights the percentage change in population for each district with Figure 5 (2) visually illustrating population changes within each district - highlighting the demographic dynamics over the intercensal years.

Figure 7: 2022 Population: Males and Females

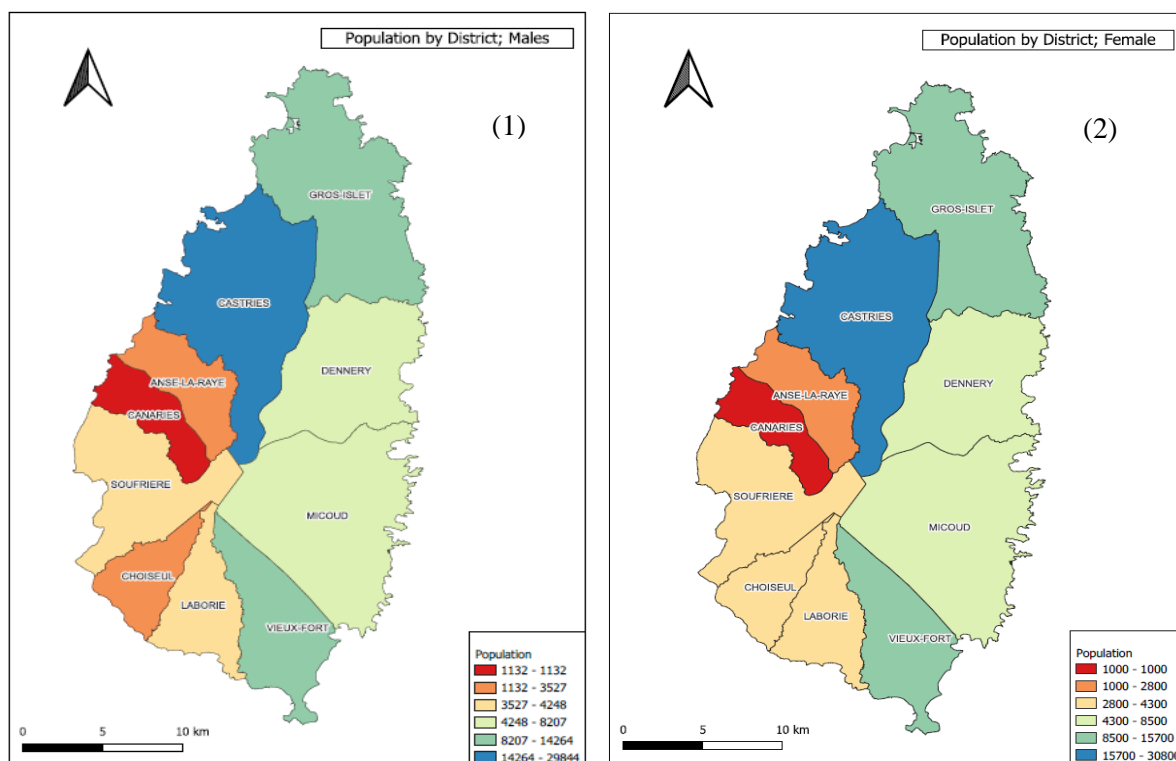


Figure 7 (1) shows the population distribution⁷ of males by district. The northern and central parts of the region of Gros-Islet and Castries have higher populations of males. The western districts: Canaries, Soufriere, Choiseul, and Laborie have lower populations of males while the eastern districts; Dennery, Micoud, and Vieux Fort have moderate populations of males.

Similar to the male population map, the northern and central parts of the regions of Gros-Islet and Castries have higher populations of females, Figure 7 (2). The western districts: Canaries, Soufriere, Choiseul, and Laborie have lower populations of females. The eastern districts: Dennery, Micoud, and Vieux Fort have moderate to higher populations of females with Vieux Fort having a higher female population. Both maps show Gros-Islet and Castries as having the highest populations for both males and females. Gros-Islet consistently has the highest population range on both maps. Districts such as Canaries, Soufriere, Choiseul, and Laborie show lower male and female populations. Anse-la-Raye, Dennery, Micoud, and Vieux Fort have moderate populations across all genders, with only slight variations in range. The maps illustrate a higher concentration of the population in the northern and central districts of Gros Islet and Castries. The western districts show consistently lower populations for both males and females. Vieux Fort stands out with a notably higher concentration of females compared to males in the same district.

Figure 8: Population by Political Constituency and Enumeration District

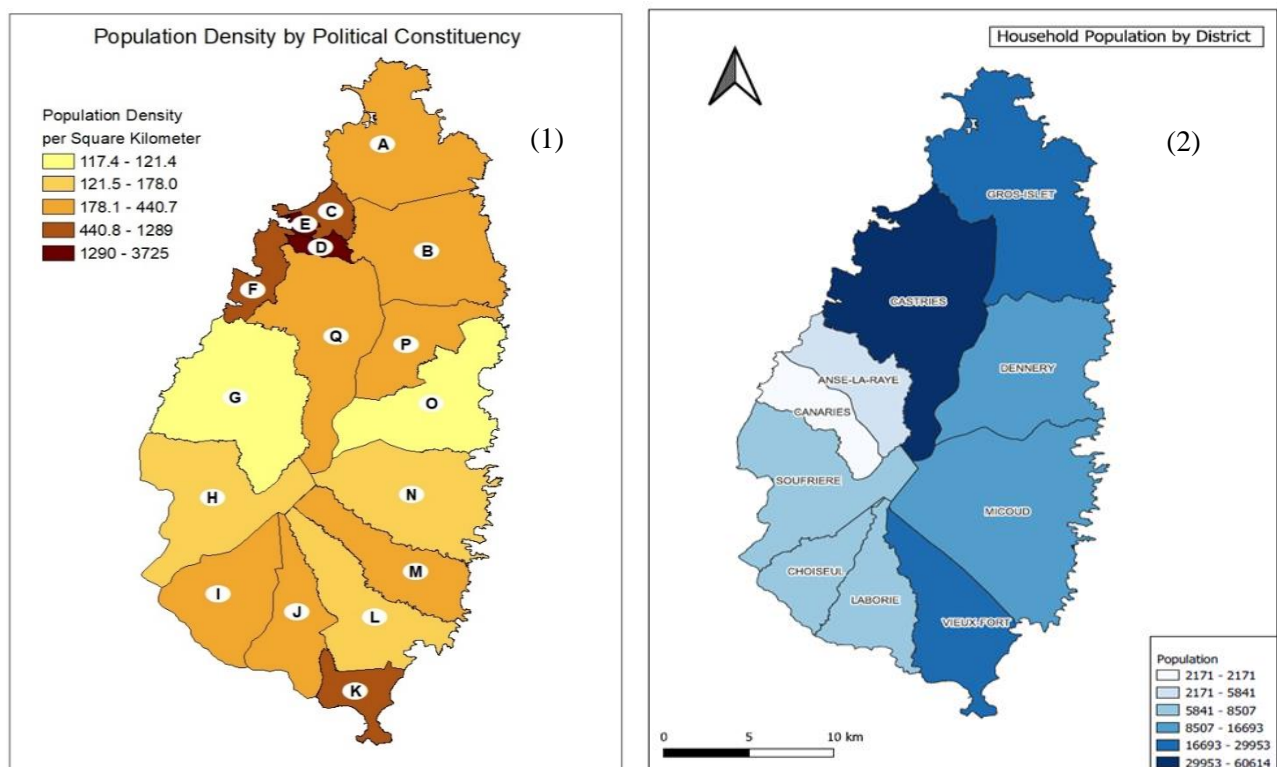


Figure 8 (1) shows the population density of Saint Lucia by political constituency. The highest density areas are concentrated in the northwest (around constituencies C, D, and E), where population densities range from 1,290 to 3,725 people per square kilometer (3,342 to 9,646 people per square mile). In contrast, the southwestern and southeast constituencies (such as I, J, and M) have significantly lower population densities, ranging from 117.4 to 121.4 people per square kilometer (304 to 314 people per square mile). This distribution suggests that population density is highest near the capital and urban

centers, while rural areas have much lower densities. Figure 8 (2) shows demographic patterns and settlement in the administration districts highlighting the district population density.

Table 9 highlights demographic shifts across 17 political constituencies between the 2010 and 2022 censuses. The overall population increased by 3.8% during this period. Choiseul experienced the most significant population growth, succeeded by Micoud South with a 19.2% rise, and Micoud North with a 16.0% increase. Conversely, Castries Central saw the largest population decline of 14.9%, trailed by Castries East with a 13.8% decrease, and Laborie 12.5% drop. Gros Islet, with 24,435 residents accounted for 14.2% of the total population, while Castries Central with 6,296 residents, comprised 3.7% of the population.

Figure 9 provides an overview of the social infrastructure in the major towns of Castries, Gros Islet, and Vieux Fort. The chart highlights the distribution and variety of facilities available, illustrating the differing levels of development and resource allocation in each area. This comparative view allows for a deeper understanding of the urban landscape and the degrees of access to essential services across these towns. We note that Gros Islet has the largest area per sq mile, followed by Castries, Vieux Fort has the smallest land area, and is half the size of Castries.

Figure 9: Snapshot of Castries, Vieux Fort, and Gros Islet

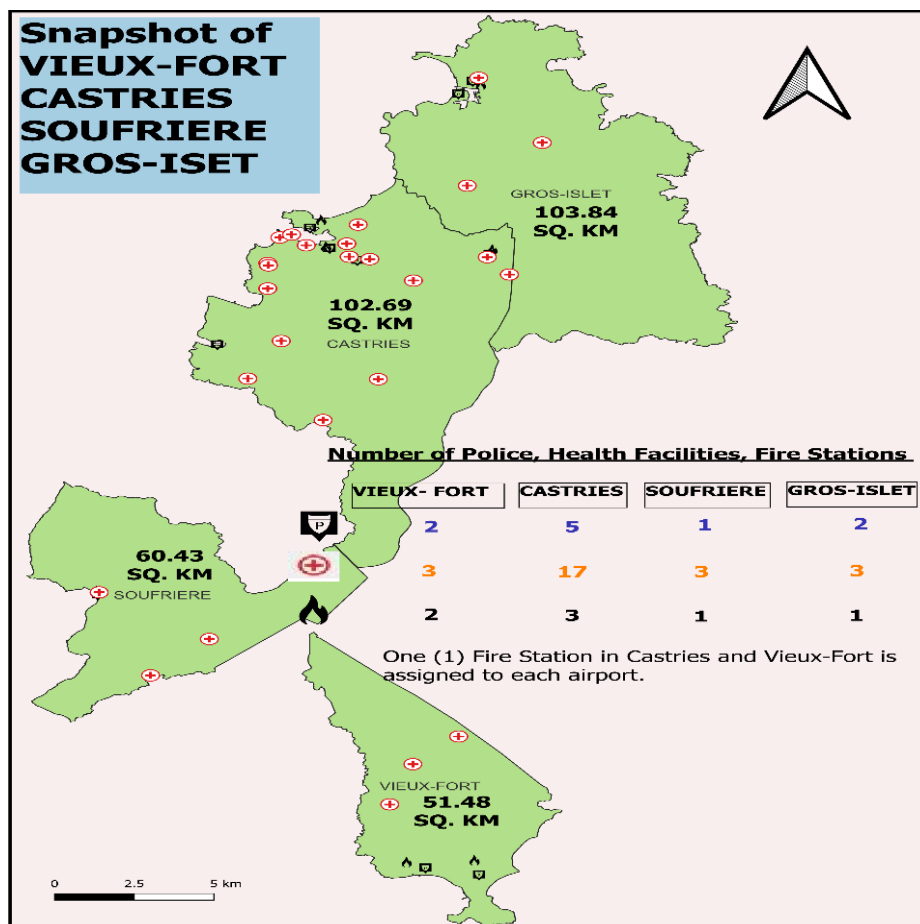

According to Table 9, Castries has the highest concentration of health facilities, police stations, and fire services, underscoring its role as a central or more urbanized area. Vieux-Fort is second in the number of social infrastructures available given the strategic importance of the town and its proximity to Hewanorra International Airport. Soufriere has fewer infrastructural services overall, given that the town has a larger land mass than Vieux Fort. In contrast, Gros-Islet has the largest land area but limited social infrastructural services given its population potential ([Table A.2](#)).

Population and Housing

Primary Material Used for Exterior Walls of Dwellings

According to [Table B.2](#), 62% of households live in homes with outer walls made of concrete blocks. Additionally, 12.7% of people reside in homes constructed entirely from wood, while 10.2% live in houses

made of concrete and wood. Ten percent occupy homes built from plywood and 4.9% live in houses with outer walls made of concrete and plywood ([Table B.2](#)).

Housing Tenure by Type of Dwelling

Table 11 provides a breakdown of household tenure with ownership status by type of ownership; fully owned, owned with mortgage, rented, or leased. On census night, the majority of dwelling units were fully owned. Sixty-nine percent of housing was owned jointly and individually. Female ownership is 25.5%. Only 5.6% of houses are owned with a mortgage, indicating low mortgage uptake, or underreporting at the time of the census count (Table 11). Joint ownership with a mortgage is more common among the group of households who take out a mortgage to acquire their homes, 2.5% owned their property jointly, this compares to 1.2% of males and 1.9% of females. Private tenancy accounts for 15.1% of dwelling arrangements, this ratio is significantly higher than the share of government rentals of private dwellings. 7.5% of households live rent-free while 1.2% lease, squat, or have non-specified living arrangements (Table 11).

Type of Housing Units

Most housing stock consists of detached single-family homes⁸ this is followed by a smaller percentage of attached houses, apartment buildings, and other unique housing types (Table 11).

One-family detached houses are standalone structures and comprise the largest portion of the housing stock, totaling 50,889 units. This represents 77.2% of the total housing stock (Table 11), indicating that detached single-family homes constitute the majority of the housing stock. One-family House attached refers to row houses or townhouses that share at least one wall with another unit. There are 1,668 such units, making up 2.5% of the total stock of houses. The building with 2 apartments contains two separate dwelling units, totaling 7,307 units or 11.1% of the total stock of housing units. Buildings with 3 or 4 dwellings include smaller multi-family buildings with three or four units making up 6.0% of the housing stock. There are 40 buildings with 15 to 19 apartments, comprising 0.1% of the total housing units. Improvised housing includes makeshift or temporary housing structures. There are 101 such units, which represent 0.2% of housing on the island.

Agriculture

Livestock Owned by District

Table 12 reveals a varied distribution of livestock ownership in enumeration districts, with Vieux Fort, Gros Islet, and Dennery showing particularly high numbers of livestock in specific categories.

We note that poultry farming is the predominant livestock activity throughout the enumeration districts, accounting for 80,409 hens. Pig farming is the second most common livestock activity with pig farms in Vieux Fort, Gros Islet, and Micoud. Goats are more widespread than sheep, with notable populations in Vieux Fort and Dennery. Beehive production is spread thinly across the districts, with Gros Islet having the highest number of beehives followed by Dennery with 69 and Castries with 59 hives.

Agricultural Land Used by District⁹

Figure 10: Households Operating Land for Agricultural Purposes by Type of Land Used

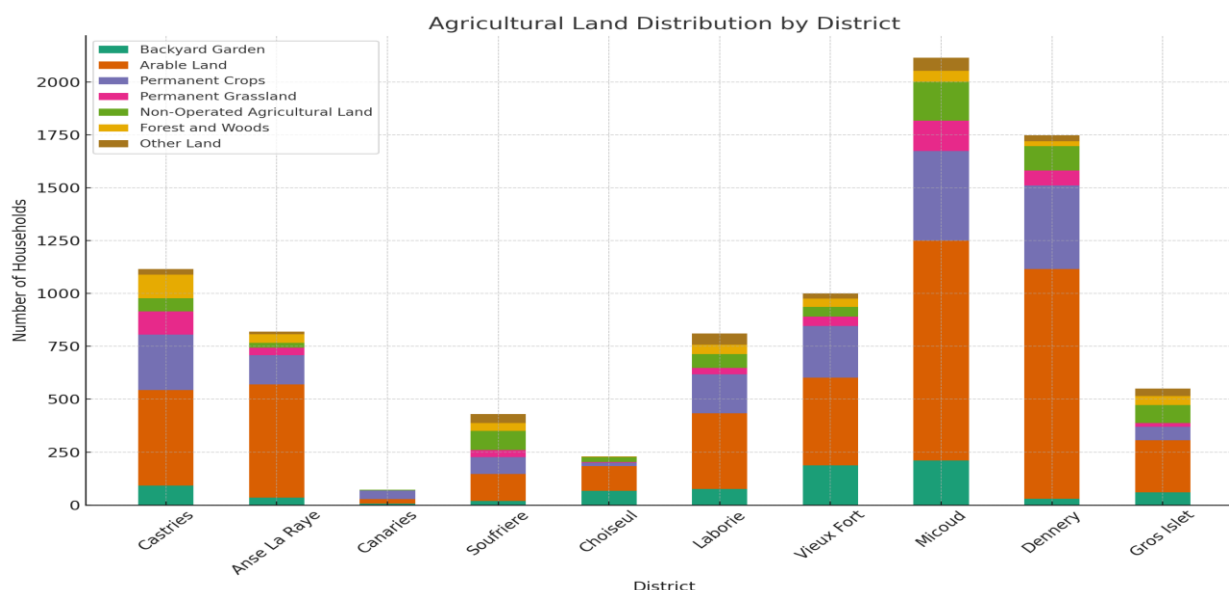


Figure 10 reveals that Micoud and Dennery hold the largest proportion of total arable land (23.8%) and contribute 20% of total permanent crop production, Dennery also possesses a substantial share of arable land, accounting for 24.69% of total agricultural land. Although Castries has the highest number of households involved in farming, agricultural production yield per household is relatively low ([Table A.11](#)). Gros Islet and Soufriere possess significant amounts of non-operated agricultural land, suggesting opportunities for agricultural expansion. Additionally, Laborie is distinguished by its extensive backyard gardens and forests, which support agriculture and biodiversity.

From Table 14 we note that Arable Land comprises half (49.5%) of the total land households use for agricultural production- an indicator of a strong focus on crops that require annual planting and harvesting. Permanent crops comprise 20.8% of the total land used by households, suggesting a substantial investment in crops that do not require replanting perennially.

⁹ The data quality is influenced by the respondents' honesty and recall ability. Respondents may have difficulty accurately recalling the exact size and usage of their land, leading to potential inaccuracies in the reported data.

Backyard gardens account for 8.8% of agricultural land, highlighting the importance of small-scale, subsistence gardening. At 7.8%, non-operated agricultural land represents a notable portion of areas that could be brought under cultivation or used for other productive purposes.

Permanent grassland makes up 5.5% of the land that can be used for grazing livestock and supporting dairy and meat production. Forest and Wood cover 4.4%, contributing to biodiversity, potentially providing wood products, and serving as important environmental conservation areas. 3.2% of other land might include areas for infrastructure development, buildings, or other non-agricultural uses. One hundred and forty household members operate hydroponic farms. The number of women engaged in agricultural activity does not include women working in agriculture administration (([Table A.11](#)).

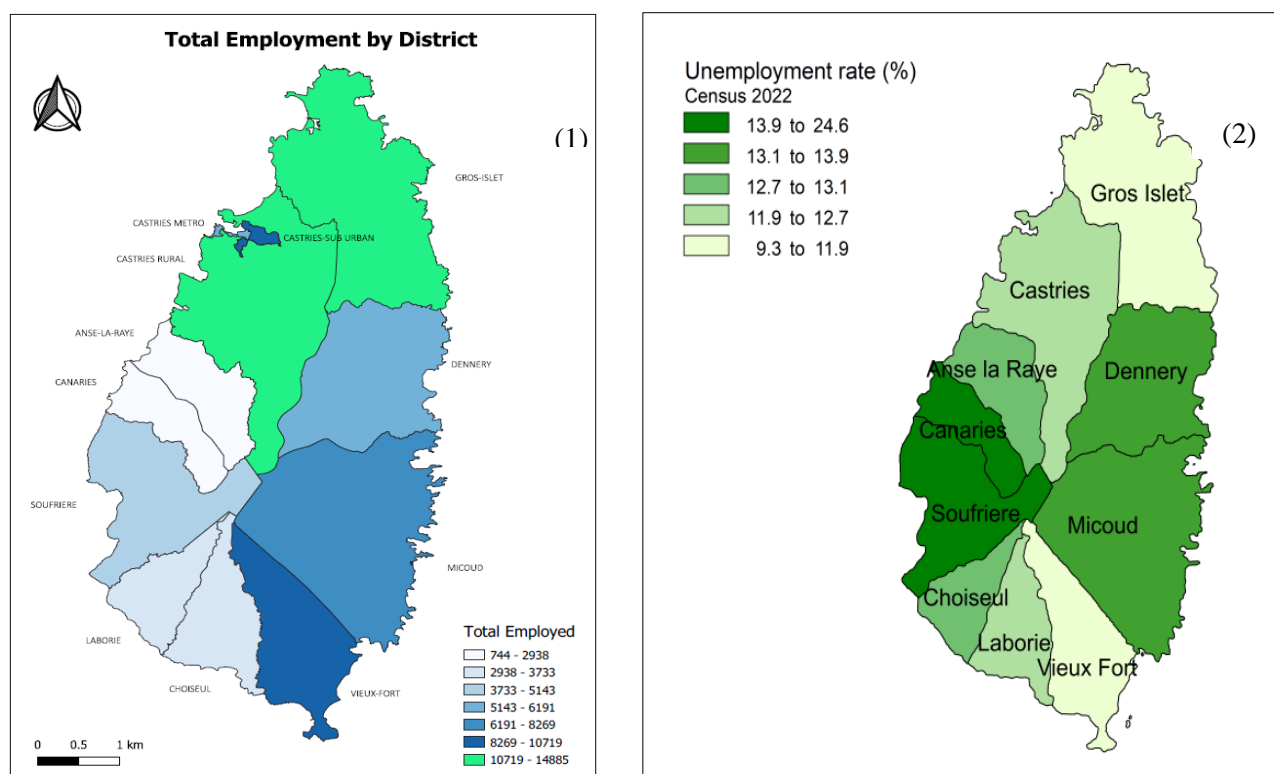
Saint Lucia Labour Force

Tables [D.8-D.12](#) provide a detailed overview of the current state of the labour market including labour force, employment, and unemployment in Saint Lucia, drawing comparisons with census data from 2010 to illustrate key trends and areas of future focus ([Table D.11](#)). The labour market in Saint Lucia has shown notable improvement from 2010 to 2022 (Table 16). The unemployment rate has decreased significantly, and the number of employed individuals has increased (Table 15). Despite this positive trend, certain age groups, particularly the youth continue to face high unemployment rates ([Table D.9](#)).

Gender disparities in unemployment are minimal, with males and females experiencing similar rates across most age groups. The ten districts show variations in unemployment rates, with Canaries experiencing the highest rate and Gros Islet the lowest ([Table D.12](#)). Based on the census information, Saint Lucia can boast a growing and dynamic labour force with substantial increases in overall employment and workforce participation. The unemployment rate has decreased markedly, indicating positive strides toward economic stability and improved livelihoods for Saints Lucians.

From Figure 11 (1), we observe that the unemployment map utilizes different shades of green to illustrate specific levels of unemployment. The darkest green corresponds to the highest unemployment rates, from 13.9% to 24.6%, as shown in Figure 11 (2). Conversely, the lightest green indicates the lowest unemployment levels, from 9.3% to 11.9%. This map illustrates unemployment disparities across Saint Lucia on census night. Gros Islet and Vieux Fort exhibit lower unemployment rates, within the lighter green range of 9.3% to 11.9%. Castries and Laborie display moderate unemployment rates, between 11.9% and 12.7%. Anse la Raye and Canaries fall into the intermediate range of 12.7% to 13.9%. Dennery and Micoud show slightly higher rates of 13.1% to 13.9%, while Soufriere has the highest rates, ranging from 13.9% to 24.6%. These variations must be considered when addressing employment challenges.

Table 15 illustrates the distribution of religious affiliations on the island. The Roman Catholic Church is the predominant group, with 86,967 adherents, accounting for 50.6% of the population. Seventh Day Adventists form the second-largest group, with 18,601 members (10.8%), followed by Pentecostals comprising 15,515 followers (9.0%). Other significant religions include Mennonite, Rastafarian, Baptist, and Jehovah's Witnesses, representing 1.5% and 2.5% of the population. In contrast, the Bahai Faith, Brethren, Buddhism, Mormonism, and the Universal Church have minimal followers, each constituting less than 0.2% of the population. Notably, 14.1% of the population has no religious affiliation but believes in God, while 0.3% identify as Atheists. Additionally, 4.1% did not report their religious affiliation.

The data reveals that traditional religious groups like the Anglican, Methodist, and Baptist denominations have small memberships, with shares of 1.3%, 0.4%, and 1.7%, respectively. This suggests that these once-prominent organizations are becoming minor faiths compared to the rising number of individuals with no religious affiliation or who believe in God without adhering to a specific faith. Meanwhile, other denominations like Pentecostal (9%) and Seventh Day Adventist (10.8%) hold more substantial shares, reflecting a shift in religious affiliation within the population.

Information and Communication Technology (ICT)

[Table 19.1](#) highlights significant variations in technology and media access across districts (Table 17). Gros Islet stands out with the highest penetration of personal computers and internet access, indicating better digital connectivity. Conversely, Canaries exhibit the lowest in these categories, suggesting areas for improvement in digital inclusion. Landline telephones and transistor radios are less prevalent overall, the television remains the most common household item across all districts.

Broadband internet service is more dominant than cellular data plans in most districts, with an overall total count of 50,711 plans ([Table B.13](#)). The highest Cellular Usage is noticeable in Gros Islet with

subscriptions of 7,889, indicating a significant reliance on mobile internet in that district. Canaries has the distinction of being the lowest subscribed Districts. Castries Rural and Vieux Fort show a high percentage of people without internet connectivity.

Disability

Disabilities cover a wide spectrum of conditions that impact individuals in diverse ways. Physical disabilities include mobility impairments, such as those requiring wheelchairs, crutches, or prosthetic limbs. Sensory disabilities, such as visual impairments, can range from partial vision loss to complete blindness, requiring assistance devices like glasses or white canes. Other physical disabilities may involve hearing impairments, necessitating hearing aids or sign language for communication.

[Table 11.1](#) provides detailed disability data disaggregated by age group and district. The data include the total population from age 5 to 90+, the number of people with “some disability”, those with no reported disability, and the percentage of the disabled population.

The overall disability rate is 3.8%. We note that the percentage of disabled individuals in the 5-9 age group is 0.8% but that statistic rises dramatically to 53.3% in the 90+ age category (Table 20).

Castries, the district with the largest population, has a disability rate of 3.5% (Table 17) in contrast, Canaries, despite having a small population, has the highest disability rate. Gros Isle, the second most populous district, has the lowest disability rate. Vieux Fort and Micoud both have a moderate disability rate slightly above the national average.

[Table 11.1](#) highlights the varying prevalence of disabilities in the enumeration districts by age group. Districts such as Canaries and Anse La Raye have higher disability rates, when compared to the other districts, while Gros Islet has the lowest disability rate among the elderly population. The data provided in Table 18 indicate that as the population ages, the disability rate increases, suggesting a strong correlation between age and disability. The variation in disability rates among different districts could be influenced by factors such as access to healthcare, socioeconomic status, and community support systems. While Saint Lucia’s disability rate may appear modest, the disparities revealed by the data point to significant underlying issues that need to be addressed.

There is a high probability that age-related factors are contributing to disability. For the intercensal years, the data recorded a noticeable sharp increase in disability rates, starting from the 70 -74 age group onwards (Table 18). This implies that disabilities become more common in the later stages of

life. Empirical evidence suggests that age-related disabilities increase due to various health factors that commonly worsen with age. Common key health factors include Chronic Diseases (Cardiovascular Diseases, Hypertension - increased blood pressure can lead to heart disease and stroke).

Type 2 Diabetes often develops in older adults and can lead to complications such as neuropathy, vision loss, and kidney disease. Osteoarthritis and Rheumatoid Arthritis - Joint Degeneration - wear and tear of joints can lead to pain, mobility issues, and inflammation. Chronic inflammation can cause joint damage and disability.

While the overall disability rate in the population is low at 3.8%, it escalates sharply among those aged 70 and above, reaching over 50% in the 90+ age category. This suggests that age-related health issues, such as chronic diseases and joint degeneration, are major contributing factors to disabilities in the elderly. Additionally, there is variability in disability rates among different districts, with smaller districts like Canaries showing higher rates, potentially influenced by factors such as healthcare access and socioeconomic conditions.

Economically Active Population

Annex ([Table 9.10](#)) presents employment status data segmented by age group and sex. The categories are "Worked for pay, profit or family gain," "Worked for tending household, children, etc." "Did not work," and "Not reported."

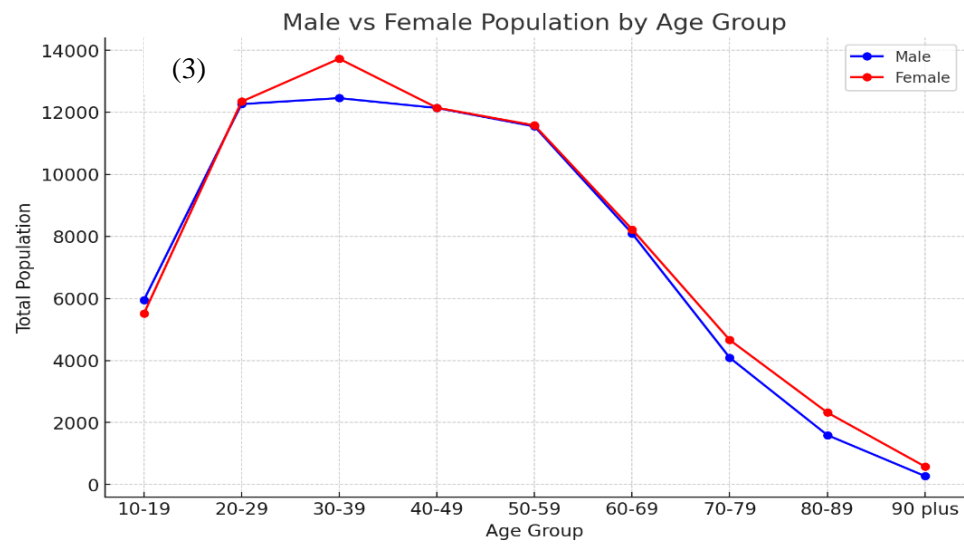
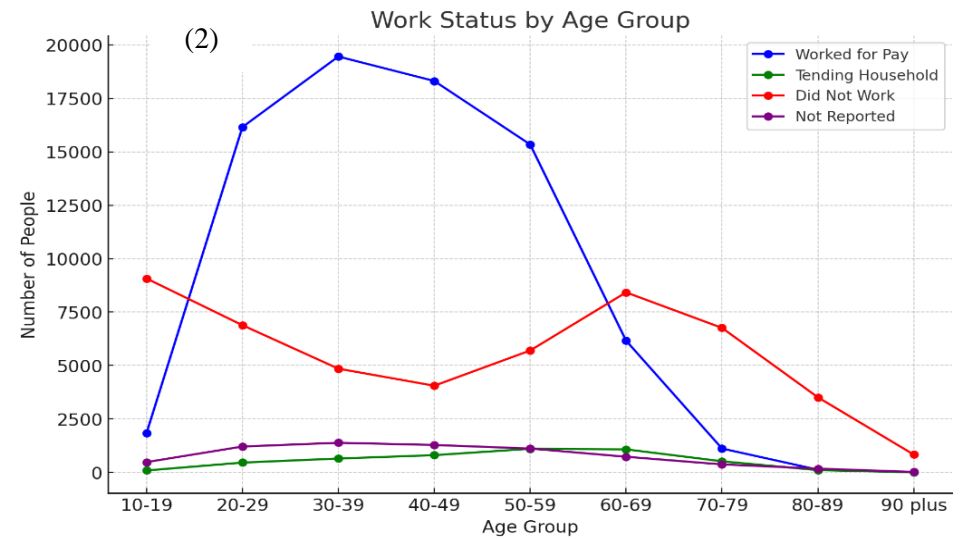
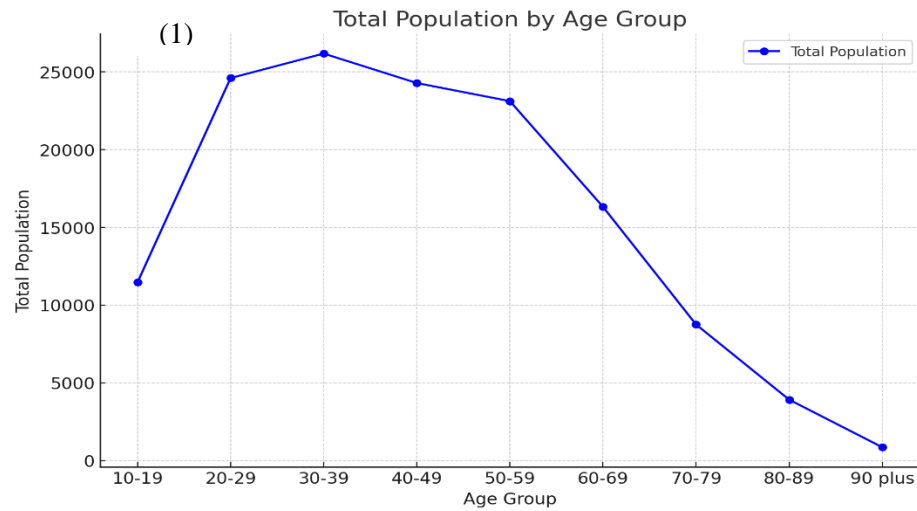
From Figure 12 (1) we observe that a larger proportion of the Economically Active Population is concentrated in the younger to middle-aged groups, specifically 20-49 years. There is a sharp decline in population as age increases, particularly beyond 50 years, which is typical as mortality rates increase with aging. The graph highlights the aging pattern in the population, showing fewer people in the older age groups.

Employment status is heavily influenced by age, with the highest employment rates in the 30-49 age range (Figure 12 (2)). Females are more likely to be involved in household duties compared to males. From Figure 12 (2) the employment rate drops sharply in the older age groups (60+).

The "Total Population by Age Group" identifies the 20-29, 30-39, and 40-49 age ranges as having the highest work populations (Figure 12 (2)). The "Work Status by Age Group" delineates the number of individuals in various work statuses throughout the respective age group, with the "Worked for Pay" category peaking in the 30-39 age group and the "Did Not Work" category, the highest among those aged 10-19 followed by 60 - 69 age range. The "Male vs Female Population by Age Group" compares the male and female populations, revealing similar distributions, with notable differences in the 60-69 to 90+ age groups (Figure 12 (3)).

The Economically Active Population remains the backbone of Saint Lucia's economic output, with people in the prime working-age groups (30-49 years) contributing most significantly to productivity and economic growth. The decline in employment among older age groups (Figure 12 (2)), particularly people over 60, reflects the transition toward retirement which, while expected, underscores the importance of policies that support active aging and the integration of older workers who may wish to remain in the workforce particularly as populations age and life expectancies increases.

Population Insurance Coverage – by Type of Insurance

Table 19 provides an overview of the various health and life insurance coverages, disaggregated by age group and gender. The potential impact on the quality of life is articulated under the key findings of Table 19.

Despite the comprehensive coverage provided by the National Insurance Corporation (NIC), a sizable portion of the population is at risk and remains uninsured. This underscores a pressing need to broaden access to health and life insurance, particularly among the elderly and individuals who currently do not have coverage. Addressing these deficiencies is crucial for enhancing health security and improving the overall quality of life in Saint Lucia.

Population's Quality of Life

The standard and quality of life in Saint Lucia can be assessed through various indicators such as access to basic amenities, housing conditions, and ownership of appliances and vehicles. Table 20 provides a snapshot of the standard of life in Saint Lucia on Census night, 2022.

Table 21 offers a snapshot of various aspects of life in Saint Lucia, however, it does not comprehensively attest to the quality of life¹⁰ of the Saint Lucian public. A breakdown of what the data suggests and areas where improvements may be warranted are as follows.

The quality of life in Saint Lucia is moderate to good, with widespread household ownership and access to essential amenities, including the Internet, reflecting a stable standard of living. While healthcare services are accessible, challenges remain for individuals with disabilities. The labour force is active, but employment opportunities could be improved to reduce economic disparities. Fertility rates are stable and supported by essential services. There is a need for enhanced social services, healthcare accessibility, and employment opportunities to further uplift the overall quality of life for all Saint Lucians.

Conclusion

Saint Lucia is at a pivotal juncture, as indicated by the 2022 Population and Housing Census, which provides a nuanced understanding of the island's demographic, social, and economic realities. The 2022 census revealed a complex landscape marked by population growth and internal migration, driven by urbanisation and individual economic aspirations. While the labour force demonstrates resilience, persistent challenges such as youth unemployment and the evolving nature of the housing market underscore the need for targeted interventions.

The educational advancements reflected in the census are significant, yet gender disparities in higher education persist, indicating areas that require further progress. Likewise, the data on crime, particularly in urban centers, underscores the need for a comprehensive strategy that combines community engagement with law enforcement and socio-economic interventions.

The census also highlights the challenges faced by the disabled population, who often encounter substantial barriers to full participation in society. This underscores the urgent need for inclusive policies that ensure accessibility and equal opportunities for all citizens.

Moreover, the ongoing public health challenges, particularly the prevalence of non-communicable diseases, pose serious risks to the population's well-being and the island's economic productivity. Addressing these issues will require robust public health initiatives focused on prevention and education.

While the data suggests a positive quality of life, with high homeownership rates, widespread electricity access, and decent housing, there are gaps in essential services, such as sanitation, and environmental health, that could be addressed to enhance living standards.

The Population and Housing Census reveals a nation in transition, confronted by opportunities and challenges. Achieving sustainable development depends on addressing key issues like crime, unemployment, and health disparities, and ensuring equitable access to resources. To effectively address these issues, policies should emphasize sustainable development focusing on enhancing healthcare, ensuring accessible housing, and strengthening social support systems. Prioritizing investments in education, workforce development, and inclusive infrastructure will be crucial for fostering a resilient and adaptable society. By taking proactive measures, Saint Lucia can navigate these demographic shifts and improve the overall well-being of its citizens.
