Key Observations:

Largest decline: Dominica (-22.06 pp), followed closely by Bahamas (-21.91 percentage points).

Only increases: Montserrat (+5.03 percentage points) and Jamaica (+2.11 percentage points).

Most countries experienced turnout declines.

The average trend across the region shows a general decrease in voter participation between elections.
